A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and forty-four of the Land Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor-General in Council may by Proclamation resume possession of any land leased under Part IV of the said Act, or under any corresponding Part of the Land Act, 1892, which in his opinion is required for any public purpose:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto is held on small-grazing-run lease from His Majesty the King, issued under Part V of the Land Act, 1892, dated the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen:

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled the Prisons Act, 1908, it is provided that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison, and from and after the gazetting of any such Proclamation, or from any time later specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, and all buildings and enclosures used or occupied thereon, shall, from and after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Gazette*, be a prison known as the Point Halswell Prison, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Prisons Act, 1908.

8. No person shall use any bait or lure other than the natural or artificial fly, or natural or artificial minnow, and any small indigenous fish, insect, grasshopper, beetle, or spider. The use of shellfish, koura, or the houhou or matai grub, or of earthworms shall be a breach of the regulations:

Provided that no bait other than artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in that portion of the Puniu River above Kihikihiki:

Provided further that no bait other than natural and artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in the South Wairoa River, the Maungatawhiri River, Hay's Creek (otherwise

known as Hunua Gorge Creek), Ararimu Creek, the Ongaruru River, the Waimiha River, and the Pokaiwhenua River.
 Provided further that no bait other than the natural or artificial fly, or natural or artificial minnow, shall be used for taking fish in the Waipa River and its tributaries.
 The fine for every breach of this regulation shall not be less than £2 or more than £50.

In addition to the matters specified in paragraphs (a) to (j) of section 21 of the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, and in previous regulations made thereunder, the Statistician shall, subject to that section, collect statistics in regard to stocks of wheat and oats in the hands of farmers, and in regard to areas sown in wheat and oats, and in the case of wheat the area sown in each variety thereof.

2. Every person who has on property occupied or farmed by him any stock of wheat or oats, or any area sown or intended to be sown in either wheat or oats, shall on request, within such time or times as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish particulars regarding such stocks or areas, and in the case of areas sown or intended to be sown in wheat he shall also furnish particulars of the variety or varieties thereof.

3. In order to comply with the last preceding regulation the person occupying or farming any land and having in his possession any stocks of wheat or oats, or any area or areas sown or intended to be sown in wheat or oats during the season in which the statistics are collected, shall fill in and supply to the Statistician, or to any officer authorized by him in writing, the particulars specified in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions on or accompanying that form, and shall sign the form certifying to the correctness of the information entered therein; and if called upon to do so he shall at any later date fill in and supply to the Statistician or to any such officer the particulars specified in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions on or accompanying that form, and shall sign the form certifying to the correctness of the information entered therein.

4. If any person shall have previously had stocks of wheat or oats in his possession, or shall previously have grown wheat or oats, but shall not have any such stocks nor have sown nor intended to sow any such crops during the season for which the statistics are collected, but shall have been furnished by the Statistician with a form or forms as set out in the First or Second Schedule hereto, then such person shall complete the form by the insertion of the word "nil" where applicable, and shall sign the form and deliver or transmit it to the Statistician or to any officer authorized by him in writing.

5. In the three last preceding regulations "person" includes any one whether beneficially interested in the stocks of wheat or oats, or the building in which such stocks are stored, or in the land on which wheat or oats is sown, or otherwise, who is for the time being managing or acting as agent for the person owning such stocks or occupying or farming such land.

Revival of Treaty between the United Kingdom and Germany.

REVIVAL OF TREATY BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND GERMANY.

Foreign Office, June 25, 1920.

In accordance with Article 289 of the Treaty of Versailles of the 28th June, 1919, notice was given to the German Government on 25th June, 1920, that the following bilateral

treaties between the British Empire and Germany are revived from the date of this notice:—

I.—*Extradition.*

(a.) Treaty signed in London on the 14th May, 1872, between Great Britain and Germany for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals.

(b.) Treaty signed in Berlin on the 17th August, 1911, relating to the extradition of fugitive criminals between certain British Protectorates and Germany.

II.—*Parcel Post.*

Agreement signed in London on the 3rd November, 1894, and in Berlin on the 14th November, 1894, between the British and German Post Offices concerning the exchange of parcels by parcel post; with the modifications subsequently effected directly between the respective postal administrations, including the exchange of notes between those administrations dated respectively the 24th January, 1920, and the 6th February, 1920, in regard to the method of settlement of accounts.

III.—*Money Orders.*

(a.) Agreement signed in London on the 9th January, 1908, and in Berlin on the 8th February, 1908, between the Post Office of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Post Office of the German Empire for the exchange of money orders, including the modification effected by exchange of notes between the British and German postal administrations dated respectively the 24th January, 1920, and the 6th February, 1920, in regard to the method of settlement of accounts.

The use of the words "German Protectorates" and "German Postal Agencies in foreign countries" in Articles 1, 5, 8, and 17 is contrary to the stipulations of the Treaty of Versailles. These words are therefore not included in the revival, and must be regarded as excised from the agreement.

(b.) Arrangement between the Money Order Department of the Government of India and the Post Office Department of the German Empire, signed in Berlin the 20th May, 1880, and in Simla the 22nd June, 1880, for the exchange of money orders.

- “Brigade” means the Te Aroha Fire Brigade established and enrolled under the provisions of these by-laws:
- “District” means the Te Aroha Fire District as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 25, of the 11th day of March, 1920:
- “Secretary” means the Secretary appointed by the Te Aroha Fire Board:
- “Superintendent” and “Deputy Superintendent” mean respectively the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent of the Te Aroha Fire Brigade appointed by the Te Aroha Fire Board:
- “Street” means any public or private street, and includes public places:
- “The Act” means the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, and any amendment thereof:
- “Petroleum” means petroleum as defined by the Explosive and Dangerous Goods Act, 1908:
- “Inspector” means the Inspector of the Te Aroha Fire Board who shall from time to time be appointed:
- “Inflammable material” means and includes empty crates, cases, and other packages, shavings, hay, straw, and other inflammable substances.

1. The brigade shall consist of a Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, with such other officers as the Board may from time to time determine, and not more than fourteen firemen, with such numbers of auxiliaries as the Board may from time to time determine.

ENROLMENT.

2. Candidates for enrolment as members of the brigade must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight. They must not be less than eighteen years of age nor more than forty-four years of age, unless they have previously and recently been engaged as active and efficient firemen or are otherwise thoroughly competent. They may be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They may be required to undergo a medical examination by such duly qualified medical practitioner as the Board may appoint. Members of the brigade acting in that capacity on the coming into force of this by-law shall be exempted from these requirements.

APPLICATION FOR ENROLMENT.

3. Applications for enrolment must be made on the form set out and printed by the Board, and applicants shall only be enrolled as members of the brigade on their application being approved by the Board.

PROBATION.

4. Candidates when approved will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which shall be three months. If at the end of that term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, and shall at a meeting of the brigade receive an affirmative vote of not less than three-fifths of the members there present, his acceptance as an enrolled member shall be confirmed by the Board.

5. Members of the brigade are subject to the provisions of clause 4 hereof, enrolled for service from year to year, subject to one month's notice on either side, except as hereinafter provided.

APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION OF OFFICERS.

6. The appointment of Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent shall be made by the Board as provided by section 30 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, due consideration being given in each case to the claim of men already in the service of the Board. Such appointments may be terminated by one month's notice on either side.

RETIRING-AGE.

7. The age at which members of the brigade must retire from the brigade shall be as follows: Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent, sixty-five years; firemen, fifty-five years; but the Board may, if it thinks fit in any special case, extend these limits.

CARE OF UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT.

8. Uniforms and equipment of a pattern and design approved by the Board shall be issued to members of the brigade on enrolment, but shall remain the property of the Board.

9. On discharge from the Board's service either by resignation or dismissal each member must return to the Secretary, in good order and condition (fair wear-and-tear excepted), every article of clothing or equipment the property of the Board which may be on issue to him; in the event of his failing to do so the cost of any article of clothing not returned, or returned in a damaged condition, shall be charged to such

member and deducted from any pay or money that may be due to such member, or recovered by process of law.

PLANT NOT TO BE REMOVED WITHOUT PERMISSION.

10. Except for the purposes of answering any alarm of fire or false alarm, or for *bona fide* brigade practices ordered by the Superintendent, no plant or appliance of any kind shall be removed from the brigade premises unless such person removing same shall have first received the permission of the Superintendent to do so. Any person removing any plant or appliance without such permission as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

THE SUPERINTENDENT.

11. The duties and powers of the Superintendent, in addition to those conferred on him by the Act, shall be as follows:—

- (1.) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the brigade and all gear used in its service.
- (2.) He shall have power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must at once report such suspension to the Board. The member so suspended may appeal to the Board, which may hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member may be present and have the right to speak in his defence, and, if he so desires, to bring witnesses in support of such defence.
- (3.) He shall keep an order-book, in which from time to time all orders affecting the working of the brigade shall be entered. Such order-book or a copy of the orders therein shall be available for inspection by members of the brigade at all times.
- (4.) He shall allot such duties to the members of the brigade as he may deem necessary for ensuring the efficiency thereof, and may withdraw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.
- (5.) He shall keep a service-record book, containing the names, occupations, places of birth, dates of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the brigade, with awards and punishment by the Board, in a proper manner.
- (6.) He shall perform any other duty in connection with his position which the Board may from time to time assign to him.

FIREMEN TO TAKE CHARGE IN OFFICERS' ABSENCE.

12. In the event of the absence of all of the Board's officers at any fire or false alarm of fire, the senior fireman there present shall take charge of the brigade.

DISCIPLINE.

13. A member of the brigade guilty of any of the following offences whilst on duty in the Board's service shall be liable to suspension from duty by the Superintendent:—

- (a.) Being in an intoxicated condition;
- (b.) Disobeying any lawful order of his superior officer;
- (c.) Using abusive or insubordinate language to his superior officer;
- (d.) Striking his superior officer;
- (e.) Using obscene language.

14. A member of the brigade committing either of the following offences shall be suspended, and reported to the Board by the Superintendent:—

- (a.) Wilfully damaging any portion of the brigade premises or other the property of the Board;
- (b.) Absenting himself without sufficient excuse from any drill or practice ordered by the Superintendent, or from any false alarm of fire.

15. No member of the brigade shall under any circumstances write any letters or furnish any information to the Press on matters connected with the Board or brigade, save that in the event of no superior officer being present the senior firemen on duty may give particulars regarding any fire which has been attended by the brigade.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

16. Leave of absence for any period not exceeding fourteen days may, on the application of a member of the brigade, be granted by the Superintendent, who shall record the same in his occurrence-book. Any member of the brigade desiring leave of absence for a longer period than fourteen days shall apply in writing addressed to the Superintendent, who shall forward such application to the Secretary of the Board, with such recommendation as he may think fit, and leave of absence for such longer period shall only be granted by the Board.

BRIGADE MAY MAKE RULES.

17. Subject to the approval of the Board, and provided they in no way conflict with these by-laws, the brigade may make rules and regulations for its own government.

GRATUITIES FOR VOLUNTEER AND OTHER SERVICES.

18. For the performance of any volunteer or special services rendered by any person, whether a member of the brigade or not, in respect of any fire, there may be paid out of the funds of the Board such sum as the Board or any Committee authorized by the Board may direct.

ELECTRIC FIRE-ALARM CIRCUITS.

19. The Board may establish, or contract with any person or corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm circuit, and may from time to time extend such circuit and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings or premises. All connections of alarms installed in public or private buildings or premises, or any alterations to same, shall be carried out to the approval of the Board at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected, and the cost of maintenance and of the periodical examination and testing of such connections shall be borne by the owner of the property connected, and all such connections shall be efficiently maintained to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner, such cost may be commuted to the payment of such annual sum as may be agreed on between the Board and such owner.

DONATIONS IN RECOGNITION OF THE BRIGADE'S SERVICES.

20. Donations by the public in recognition of the brigade's services shall be the property of the brigade, and shall be used in providing for the comfort and recreation of the members thereof, or otherwise for the benefit of the members of the brigade.

MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AND GOOD CONDUCT ON THE PART OF OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE BRIGADE.

21. No person shall interfere with or in any way obstruct any officer or member of the brigade while such officer or member of the brigade is in the execution of his duty.

22. No person shall interfere with or obstruct any volunteer described in section 18 of these by-laws while such volunteer is in the execution of his duty.

23. No person shall aid, abet, or encourage any member of the brigade in any act of disobedience of orders, or insubordination, or in the use of abusive or obscene language while such member is on duty.

24. No person shall supply any intoxicating liquor to any officer or member of the brigade while such member or officer shall be on duty, unless he shall first have received from the officer in charge of the brigade at the time permission so to do.

25. No person other than a member of the Board or its Secretary, or members of the brigade, shall enter any fire-station controlled by the Board unless such person shall first have received permission to do so from the officer in charge of the station or a member of the brigade, and no person shall, after having been requested by the officer in charge of the station to leave any such station, remain in any such station or on or about the station premises.

26. No person other than an officer of the brigade, or a member thereof, or the wife or child of such officer or member, shall sleep in or on any station, or in any of the Board's premises, without first having received the written permission of the Superintendent to do so.

PREVENTION OF FIRE.

27. No person other than a person licensed by the Te Aroha Borough Council to keep petroleum for sale shall keep in stock within the Te Aroha Fire District more than 16 gallons of petroleum except in a magazine or such other structure as may be approved by the Inspector. Such magazine or other structure shall, unless constructed in brick or other similar material, be placed not less than 20 ft. from any other building.

28. No person licensed by the Te Aroha Borough Council to store petroleum for sale shall store petroleum within the Te Aroha Fire District except in a magazine or such other structure as may be approved by the Inspector.

29. No such magazine or other structure mentioned in sections 27 and 28 hereof shall be used for the storage of petroleum until the person occupying such magazine or other structure shall have received a certificate in writing from the Inspector that such magazine or other structure is suitable for the storage of petroleum, and any person using any such magazine or other structure for the storage of petroleum without having first received a certificate as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

30. All buildings used for the storage of petroleum shall be kept securely locked, and any person having the control of any such building and failing to securely lock such building shall be guilty of an offence.

31. Any person, whether licensed by the Te Aroha Borough Council or not, who shall store petroleum within the Te Aroha Fire District shall deposit with the Secretary of the Te Aroha Fire Board a plan of the building or buildings wherein such petroleum is stored, showing on such plan the exact position in such building or buildings where such petroleum shall be deposited.

32. Any person leaving any inflammable material on any part of such person's premises, and who shall, after having been requested by the Inspector to remove such inflammable material, fail to remove such inflammable material within forty-eight hours from the receipt of such notice shall be guilty of an offence.

IN RESPECT OF FIRES OUTSIDE THE TE AROHA FIRE DISTRICT.

33. If any brigade or portion of a brigade established and maintained by the Board within the Te Aroha Fire District attends or performs any service at a fire on any premises outside the Fire District of Te Aroha at the request of the owner or occupier of such premises, then such owner or occupier shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service at the undermentioned rates:—

FINANCE COMMITTEE.

34. A committee shall be appointed from time to time by the Board, which shall exercise supervision in all matters relating to the finances of the Board. This committee shall be known as the Finance Committee, and shall pay all accounts included in the then current year's estimate of expenditure, and in an emergency shall be empowered to authorize payment of any amount not exceeding £20 not included in such estimate.

PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS.

35. All payments shall be made by cheques upon the Board's bankers, signed by the Secretary and any two members.

COMMON SEAL.

36. The common seal of the Board shall be in the custody of the Secretary, and shall not be affixed to any document except by order of the Board as recorded in the minute-book, and shall only be affixed in the presence of at least two members of the Board, and every document bearing such seal shall be signed by two members of the Board and its Secretary.

NOTICES OF MOTION.

37. Any member of the Board may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be numbered and dated and given in writing to the Secretary at least seven clear days previous to the meeting at which such notice of motion is to be considered.

PENALTY CLAUSE.

38. Every person guilty of an offence against, or committing any breach of, or failing to perform any duty imposed upon any such person by any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be liable for such offence, breach, or failure to such fine not exceeding £20 as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit.

The foregoing by-laws were made by the Te Aroha Fire Board at a duly constituted meeting of the said Board held on the 10th day of September, 1920.

Subsidies to Public Libraries in Country Districts.

Education Department,
Wellington, 30th October, 1920.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries in country districts.

The distribution will take place about the 1st March, 1921, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that is not sent in due form and received by the Secretary, Education Department, Wellington, on or before the 25th January, 1921.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; and if it is within a borough a reading-room where the books may be read, and containing newspapers and periodicals, must be provided for the public free of charge; *in addition, it must not be situated in a borough, town, or town district the population of which exceeds fifteen hundred. The receipts for the year from subscriptions, donations, and voluntary contributions must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. The number of members subscribing to the library during the year must not have been less than eight, each of whom must have paid the subscription for at least six months. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.*

2. In the distribution of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; *but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £25—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £50.*

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase or loan of books for the library.

4. *It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, on books of more than merely passing interest.*

5. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and payments of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1920, and *such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—*

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1920, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under Part I of the Libraries and Mechanics' Institutes Act, 1908, or the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions and from net proceeds of entertainments, pounds shillings and pence; that the library is public in the sense of belonging to the public, and is not under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and payments of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received in the year 1920 was expended in the purchase of books for the library; *[and that by the rules of the library the reading-room is open to the public free of charge].*

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the Justices of the Peace Act, 1908.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1920.

With the exception of a few isolated places along the western coast and about Foveaux Strait all parts of the Dominion recorded a total rainfall above the average. The greatest difference was in the East Coast districts of the South Island, where, in places, as much as three times the average amount fell.

The first week, when an anticyclone ruled, proved the only period during which fair weather prevailed over the Dominion as a whole. The remainder of the month was extremely changeable, and at times very cold and stormy.

The heaviest rains were experienced about the 21st and 22nd and the 28th and 29th. On the former two days floods occurred in the Kaikoura district, and on the latter two severe floods were reported in the East Coast districts south of Banks Peninsula.

The chief disturbances were of tropical origin, and well-defined westerly low-pressure areas, which are usually frequent at this season, were notable by their absence. As a result easterly and south-easterly winds were more prevalent than usual, particularly in and southwards of Cook Strait.

Though regarded as the first month of Spring, September this year was of a wintry character, and vegetable growth made very little progress.

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The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

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2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
