WHEREAS by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, it is provided, *inter alia*, that on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, the Governor-General may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land:

And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land.

*Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Rotorua Acclimatization District.*

JELlicOE, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand,

do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red deer may be destroyed in the Rotorua Acclimatization District.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the Animals Protection Act, 1908, the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such General Manager, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said General Manager or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or any other reason.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 20th December, 1920.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said General Manager within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

NEW PLYMOUTH BOROUGH COUNCIL.

*Results of Polls to raise Loans.*

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, I hereby give notice that a poll of the ratepayers of the Borough of New Plymouth was taken on the 3rd day of November, 1920, on a proposal to raise a special loan of £22,500 for the following purposes:—

- To take, purchase, acquire, or otherwise provide for the purposes of the Council's electric tramway system, rolling-stock, tram-cars, shelter-sheds, land, buildings, plant, machinery, materials, and other things.
- To construct a triangle or triangles for turning cars.
- To complete the construction of the permanent-way of the said tramway system.
- For any other purposes incidental or in relation to any of the above-mentioned purposes.

The sum proposed to be borrowed for all such purposes is £22,500, at a rate of interest not exceeding £5 10s. per centum per annum, with a sinking fund of 1½ per centum per annum additional.

The proposed security for the said loan of £22,500 and the interest and sinking fund thereon is an annually recurring special rate of two-fifths of a penny in the pound on the

rateable value of all rateable property in the said borough, and it is proposed to repay the said loan on the 1st day of April, 1933. It is proposed to pay out of the said loan the cost of raising the said loan, and the interest and sinking fund thereon for the first year.

The number of valid votes recorded for the proposal was 794; the number of valid votes recorded against the proposal was 293; the total number of valid votes recorded was 1,087.

I therefore declare the said proposal carried.

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, I hereby give notice that a poll of the ratepayers of the Borough of New Plymouth was taken on the 3rd day of November, 1920, on a proposal to raise a special loan of £27,300 for the following purposes:—

- (a.) To provide and establish a service or services for the conveyance of passengers and goods upon the railless electric traction or the trolley omnibus traction system.
- (1.) From the railway-station, St. Aubyn Street, in the Borough of New Plymouth, via Standish Street and other streets, to the junction of Tukapo Street and Wallath Road in the said borough; and
- (2.) From the said railway-station to the junction of Carrington and Brooklands Roads in the said borough.
- (b.) To take, purchase, or otherwise acquire and provide in connection with such service or services lands, buildings, cars, vehicles, machinery, plant, material, and other things.
- (c.) To pay compensation to any person or persons injuriously affected.
- (d.) Any other purposes incidental or in relation to any of the above-mentioned purposes.

The number of valid votes recorded for the proposal was 449; the number of valid votes recorded against the proposal was 593; the total number of valid votes recorded was 1,042.

I therefore declare the said proposal rejected.

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, I hereby give notice that a poll of the ratepayers of the Borough of New Plymouth was taken on the 3rd day of November, 1920, on a proposal to raise a special loan of £43,500 for the following purposes:—

- (a.) £25,500 for the construction of an extension of the Council's overhead electric tramway system with rails and permanent-way from the present terminus near the intersection of Devon and Morley Streets in the Borough of New Plymouth to David Street in the said borough, via Morley Street, Wallace Place, and Tukapo Street; for purchasing, taking, or otherwise acquiring necessary land, buildings, machinery, plant, and materials therefor; for payment of compensation to persons injuriously affected thereby; for forming, re-forming, and improving the streets, carriage-ways, and footways on the route of such extension; and for any other purposes incidental or in relation to any of the above-mentioned purposes.

Notice fixing Closing-hours of (1) Booksellers, (2) Stationers, and (3) Fancy-goods Dealers' Shops in the Borough of Gisborne, under the Shops and Offices Act, 1908.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the shops in each of the trades of (1) bookseller, (2) stationer, and (3) fancy-goods dealer in the Borough of Gisborne, has been forwarded to me, desiring that all such shops in the borough shall be closed in the evening of working-days as follows: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays at 5.30 p.m., and on Saturdays at 9 p.m., with the following exceptions,—

(1.) On the working-day immediately preceding Christmas Day and on the working-day immediately preceding New Year's Day, when there shall be no fixed closing-hour;

(2.) When any day is generally observed as a holiday in the district, any shop that is closed not later than 1 o'clock on that day and that is usually closed for the statutory half-holiday on another day of the week may remain open on the latter day until the hour fixed by this notice for the day on which the holiday is observed, provided that should such day fall on a Saturday, then the closing-hour for any such shop on Thursday in that week shall be 5.30 p.m., and on Friday 9 p.m.; and

(3.) Should the occupier of any shop affected by this requisition observe (pursuant to section 11 (2) of the Shops and Offices Act, 1908) Saturday as the statutory closing-day, then and in such case the closing-hour on Thursdays for any such shop shall be 5.30 p.m., and on Fridays 9 p.m.:

And whereas the Gisborne Borough Council has certified that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the shops in each of the trades of (1) bookseller, (2) stationer, and (3) fancy-goods dealer within the Borough of Gisborne:

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Distant about five miles from the Gisborne Post-office, and two miles from the Mangapapa Town District, by good

metalled road (Gisborne-Ormond Road). The King's Road Railway-station is distant about a mile and a half from the eastern end, and Makauri Railway-station about the same distance from the western end of the settlement. The Makauri School is about one mile away.

4. TRAVELLING-EXPENSES.

When working under Class 1 actual travelling-expenses is to be charged. Under Classes 2 and 3 a commuted allowance of 4s. 6d. per mile by road, or 2s. 3d. per mile by railway (reckoned one way), from the place of business of the surveyor, or in special cases by mutual agreement.

5. DAILY RATE.

When employed in the field by daily rate the surveyor's fee is to be £4 4s. per day, inclusive of the time taken in going to and from work, but exclusive of cost of labour, travelling, and other necessary expenses; and the rate for office work shall be £3 3s.

6. ENGINEERING CHARGES.

(a.) These charges apply to the road-construction required by subsection (2) of section 116 of the Public Works Act, 1908:—

On work not exceeding £300 in value, 7½ per cent., but not less than £10.

On work over £300 up to £600 in value, 7 per cent., but not less than £20.

On work over £600 up to £1,000 in value, 6 per cent., but not less than £40.

For work over £1,000, 5 per cent., but not less than £60.

(b.) 50 per cent. of the amount is payable on completion of the plans, specifications, and estimate, and the balance on the completion of the work.

(c.) 25 per cent. of the above engineering charges may be deducted when only plans, specifications, and estimates are supplied, and where no supervision is required.

7. GENERAL CONDITIONS.

(a.) All rates and charges in Classes 1, 2, 3, and 6 include costs of labour, also all field and office expenses, except pegs and plan-forms, which shall be charged at cost.

(b.) For the survey of country lands it shall be optional for the surveyor to undertake the work at either acreage, mileage, or by daily rate.

(c.) Equitable arrangements on the basis of these charges to be made in cases unprovided for, or which may not come strictly within the foregoing rates, or for which, through special circumstances, the scheduled charge is inapplicable.

(d.) The plan of a survey is included in the survey charge, but a duplicate plan, or a tracing of the plan, is to be charged extra.

(e.) Duty stamps are to be charged at value.

(f.) In large surveys the surveyor shall be entitled to progress payments. In all cases fees are due and payable on completion of the plan.
