HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twentieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, regulations were made under the authority of the Public Trust Office Act, 1908, and its amendments, providing (inter alia) for the fees to be charged for the transaction of legal business for the Public Trustee: And whereas it is desirable to amend such regulations in the manner hereinafter set

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities him in that behalf enabling,

doth hereby revoke regulation number seven in the aforesaid Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth further declare that such revocation and the regulation hereby made shall come into force on the day of the publication of this Order in Council in the New Zealand Gazette.

7. (1.) THE Public Trustee may fix the scale of charges to be paid to solicitors in respect of the preparation, perusal, and completion of securities to or instruments for the Public Trustee, and for the discharge, renewal, or variance of such securities, and generally for the transaction of legal business for the Public Trustee.

(2.) Such scale, with such modifications as the Public Trustee directs, shall apply where the work is done by the office solicitor or other officers of the Public Trust Office, and in that case the money received shall be paid into the Public Trustee's Account.

Shooting Season for Imported and Native Game, License Fee, &c., Otago Acclimatization District.

## JELLICOE, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify that the following imported game—viz., mallard duck (English wild duck)—may be killed within the Otago Acolimatization District as described hereunder (except in the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto) from the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, both days inclusive; and Californian quail may be killed in the said district described hereunder (except in the areas mentioned in the First and Second Schedules hereto) from the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, to the

district described hereunder (except in the areas mentioned in the First and Second Schedules hereto) from the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, to the trirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, both days inclusive:

All that area in the Otago and Southland Districts comprising the Counties of Vincent, Maniototo, Waihemo, Waikouaiti, Taieri, Peninsula, Tuapeka, Bruce, Clutha, and part of the County of Southland. Bounded on the east and south by the ocean from Shag Point to the mouth of the Mataura River, on the west by the Mataura River and the County of Lake, on the north-west by the County of Westland, and on the north-east by the County of Waitaki; including the City of Dunedin and the boroughs within the above-described area (excepting therefrom the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto).

And I do also notify that licenses to kill such imported game within the said district shall be issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings; and the Chief Pottmaster at Dunedin and the Postmasters at Alexandra, Utyde, Cromwell, and Roxburgh are hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses to kill imported game.

And I do hereby restrict the number of mallard duck that may be killed by any one person in any one day to not more than twelve head in all.

And I do hereby restrict the number of Californian quail that may be killed by any one person in any one day to not

than twelve head in all.

And I do hereby restrict the number of Californian quail that may be killed by any one person in any one day to not more than twenty head in all.

And I do hereby notify that the following native game—viz., grey duck, spoonbill duck (or widgeon), teal (except black teal), and black swan—may be killed within the abovementioned district (except in the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto) from the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, both days inclusive.

And I do further notify that pukeko may be killed within the above-mentioned district (except in the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto) from the second day of May, in the Second Schedule hereto) from the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, to the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, both days inclusive; and that paradise duck may be killed within the above-mentioned district (except in the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto) from the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the heat days inclusive.

And I do hereby restrict the number of the above-stated native game that may be killed by any one person in any one day to not more than twenty-five head in all, exclusive of black swan. Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Ashburton.

# JELLICOE, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red deer may be destroyed in the Ashburton Acclimatization District.

# REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, the Secretary of the Ashburton Acclimatization Society at Ashburton, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such secre tary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red

deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 31st December, 1920.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed

shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. The said Secretary may, with the authority of the said society, authorize the sale, either by auction or otherwise, during the currency of these regulations, of deer destroyed pursuant to these regulations, and of the meat and skins of such deer; provided that the proceeds derived from such sale shall be devoted to patriotic purposes.

4A. The said Secretary shall, on or before the 31st day of January, 1921, furnish a statement of the moneys received from such sale and of the patriotic purposes or purpose to

which they were devoted.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; and if it is within a borough a reading-room where the books may be read, and containing newspapers and periodicals, must be provided for the public free of charge; in addition, it must not be situated in a borough, town, or town district the population of which exceeds fifteen hundred. The receipts for the year from subscriptions, donations, and voluntary contributions must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. The number of members subscribing to the library during the year must not have been less than eight,

each of whom must have paid the subscription for at least six months. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the distribution of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus sugmented. will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £25—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £50.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase or loan of books for the library.

4. It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, on books of more than merely passing interest.

# SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1920.

Between the 6th and 12th and the 18th and 23rd anticyclones accounted for fair weather in most parts of the Dominion. During the remainder of the month conditions were dominated by a succession of depressions in higher latitudes, and as a result dull, unsettled, and windy weather was the rule, particularly in all the west coast districts. Rainfall was above the average in Taranaki and Manawatu and in parts of Hawke's Bay in the North Island, and in the western half of the South.

Elsewhere precipitation was below normal.

Heavy rain fell over most of the North Island between the 25th and 28th, and severe floods occurred at this time in the west coast and central districts. At Inglewood, in Taranaki, a fall of 7.34 in. was recorded on the 25th.

Thunderstorms were experienced in various parts about the 15th and 16th, while a rather intense westerly disturbance was in evidence. At Waitakaro, in Gisborne district, 1.27 in. of rain fell in one hour during a thunderstorm.

CR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.

2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.

3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
