HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of section forty-four of the Finance Act, 1916, regulations were made on the twenty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, altering the restrictions relating to the issue of notes by banks carrying on business in New Zealand: And whereas those regulations were amended by Orders in Council made on the third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and the twenty-second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, respectively: And whereas it is desirable to further amend those regulations by extending in manner hereinafter appearing the limit of the note-issue of such banks as defined by the said regulations:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority

so conferred upon him by section forty-four of the Finance Act, 1916, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby make the following amending regulations under that Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE limit of the note-issue of every bank empowered by law to issue bank-notes in New Zealand as determined by the aforesaid regulations made on the 21st day of August, 1916, the 3rd day of December, 1917, and the 22nd day of November, 1920, under section 44 of the Finance Act, 1916, is hereby extended by adding to the total amount of all coin, bullion, and public securities held by that bank in New Zealand (including the amount of all war-loan advances as defined in the said regulations) the amount of all wool advances, as hereinafter defined, made by that bank and for the time being and from time to time outstanding.

2. The term "wool advances" means such advances on wool as the bank may make on separate account—

(1.) To producers (with or without Government guarantee); or

(2.) To approved mercantile houses whose ordinary business includes advancing against wool; such advances being against store warrants for the wool, or declarations that the wool is stored to the bank's satisfaction and held on the bank's account, and debited in a special account kept in the books of the bank in that behalf.

3. It shall be the duty of every bank to certify to the Secretary to the Treasury, from time to time as required by him, the total amount of such wool advances made by that bank and for the time being outstanding; and if any bank makes default in so certifying within fourteen days after being so required, the limit of the note-issue of that bank shall, so long as such default continues, be determined in the same manner as if no such wool advances had been made by it.

4. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the aforesaid regulations of the 21st day of August, 1916, the 3rd day of December, 1917, and the 22nd day of November, 1920.

ON the recommendation of the Native Land Purchase Board, referred to in section three hundred and sixty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon him by that section, and by section one hundred and eleven of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913 (as amended by section eight of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1916), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby extend for a further period of eighteen months the Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and gazetted the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, but only in so far as it affects the Native land specified in the Schedule hereto, prohibiting all alienation other than alienation in favour of the Crown.

Licensing Hugh Cox to occupy Portions of the Land between High- and Low-water Marks in the Whirinaki River, Hokianga Harbour, and to reclaim such Land.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section thirty-nine of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that in the case of lands between high- and low-water marks which belong to the Crown, and on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for purposes of navigation, the Governor-General in Council may grant occupation licenses for periods not exceeding twenty-one years, at such rent and on such conditions as he thinks fit, and any such lease may contain a provision authorizing the lessee to reclaim the land the subject of the lease without complying with the requirements of section forty-one of the said Act :

And whereas it is desirable to license Hugh Cox (hereinafter called "the licensee") to occupy certain portions of the land between high- and low-water marks, belonging to the Crown, in the Whirinaki River, Hokianga Harbour, on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for the purposes of navigation :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license the licensee to

occupy those parts of land between high- and low-water marks of spring tides in the Whirinaki River, Hokianga Harbour, containing thirty-seven acres and fifteen acres, more or less, respectively, as shown edged red on plan marked M.D. 5245, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, and doth also authorize the licensee to reclaim such land, subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. In consideration of the concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Marine Department the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter a rental in advance each year of 1s. per acre per annum for the first ten years, and 2s. 6d. per acre per annum for the last eleven years, of the period of twenty-one years during which this license is in force, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

2. The licensee shall keep any stopbanks which he may construct for the purpose of reclaiming the land included in this license in good order and condition, and shall provide and maintain all necessary outlets for storm-water.

3. The licensee shall keep the land included in this license free from noxious weeds.

4. The licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any right, power, or privilege granted by this license without the previous written consent of the Minister of Marine.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, or privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

6. If the licensee commits or suffers a breach of any of the conditions of this license, the license may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council; and publication of a notice of such revocation in the *New Zealand Gazette* shall be sufficient notice thereof to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested in this license, that it has been revoked and determined.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Newton Julius Jensen (hereinafter called "the licensee") has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to use and occupy a part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, in Harold's Bay, Half-moon Bay, Stewart Island, in order to construct and maintain a boat-slip thereon, and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 5239, showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the boat-slip is to be constructed, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the said boat-slip thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the said licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the construction of the boat-slip as shown on plan marked M.D. 5239.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1, payable in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said boat-slip, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said boat-slip without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned boat-slip in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said boat-slip and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such boat-slip, requiring him, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said boat-slip shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said boat-slip may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boat-slip for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The construction of the said boat-slip shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

"(d.) Societies registered under the Industrial and Provident Societies Act, 1908."

Regulations relating to Vinegar.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 8th day of December, 1920.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto, the regulations made under the said Act on the fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the sixth day of the same month; and doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the said Act on the sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in the *Gazette* of the ninth day of the same month; and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATION 24 (1), (2), and (3), Part II, relating to vinegar, and Regulation 25 (1), (2), and (3), Part II, relating to imitation vinegar, are hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

24. VINEGAR.

General Standard for Vinegar.

(1.) Vinegar shall contain not less than 4 grammes of acetic acid in one hundred cubic centimeters; it shall not contain any sulphuric or other mineral acid, lead, or copper, nor more than 1/100 grain of arsenic per gallon, nor shall it contain any added substance or colouring matter except caramel.

Varieties of Vinegar.

(2.) (a.) Cider vinegar or apple vinegar shall be the product made by the alcoholic and subsequent acetous fermentations of the juice of apples, and shall conform with the general standard for vinegar.

(b.) Glucose vinegar shall be the product made by the alcoholic and subsequent acetous fermentations of solutions of starch, sugar, or glucose, and shall conform with the general standard for vinegar.

(c.) Honey vinegar shall be the product made by the alcoholic and subsequent acetous fermentations of solutions of honey, and shall conform with the general standard for vinegar.

(d.) Malt vinegar shall be the product made by the alcoholic and subsequent acetous fermentations of infusions of barley, malt, and [or] of cereals whose starch has been converted by malt, and shall conform with the general standard for vinegar.

(e.) Sugar vinegar shall be the product made by the alcoholic and subsequent acetous fermentations of solutions of sugar, syrup, or refiner's syrup, and shall conform with the general standard for vinegar.

(f.) Wine vinegar or grape vinegar shall be the product made by the alcoholic and subsequent acetous fermentations of the juice of grapes, and shall conform with the general standard for vinegar.

(g.) Fruit vinegar shall be the product made by the alcoholic and subsequent acetous fermentations of the juice of any fruit other than apples or grapes, and shall conform with the general standard for vinegar.

(h.) Spirit vinegar or alcohol vinegar shall be the product made by the acetous fermentation of dilute distilled alcohol. It shall conform with the general standard for vinegar, except that it shall not contain any caramel.

(i.) Distilled vinegar shall be the distillate of any variety of vinegar. It shall conform with the general standard for vinegar, except that it shall not contain any caramel.

(3.) Mixtures of two or more vinegars shall not be allowed.

Labelling.

(4.) There shall be written in the principal label attached to every package which contains vinegar, in types of not less size than twenty-four points face measurement, the word "Vinegar" (or alternatively the words "Brewed vinegar"), accompanied with a statement of the material or materials from which the vinegar was brewed, written in bold-faced sans-serif capital types of not less size than twelve points face measurement, and in the following form:—

Brewed from [*Here insert the names of the materials from which the contents were brewed.*]

25. IMITATION VINEGAR.

(1.) Acetic mixtures sold for the purpose of being used or which may be used as vinegar shall be dilutions of pure acetic acid in water containing not less than 4 grammes of acetic acid in one hundred cubic centimeters. They shall not contain any sulphuric or other mineral acid, lead, or copper, nor more than 1/100 grain of arsenic per gallon, nor any vinegar, nor any other added substance. They shall not contain any formates and not more empyreumatic matter in two cubic centimeters of real acetic acid than is allowed in *Acidum aceticum glaciale* by the latest addition of the British Pharmacopœia.

Labelling.

(2.) There shall be uniformly written in the principal label attached to every package which contains an acetic mixture sold for the purpose of being used or which may be used as vinegar the words "Imitation Vinegar" in bold-faced sans-serif capitals of not less size than eighteen points face measurement, and below these words in bold-faced sans-serif capitals of not less size than twelve points face measurement the words "Containing [*Here state in figures the percentage of acetic acid*] per cent. of acetic acid."

Prohibition

(3.) The word "vinegar" and expressions which include the word "vinegar" shall not be written on or attached to a package which contains an acetic mixture sold for the purpose of being used or which may be used as vinegar, unless it be conjoined with the word "Imitation."

*Regulations under the Crimes Amendment Acts, 1910 and 1920.—
Payment of Wages to Prisoners.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Auckland, this 13th day of December, 1920.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Crimes Amendment Act, 1910, as amended by the Crimes Amendment Act, 1920, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke, as from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the regulations made under the Crimes Amendment Act, 1910, on the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and gazetted on the tenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and doth hereby make in lieu thereof the regulations hereinafter set forth; and doth declare that such regulations shall come into force on the said first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

REGULATIONS.

Under the Crimes Amendment Acts, 1910 and 1920.

PART I.

Interpretation.

In these regulations—

"Minister" means the Minister of Justice:

"Controller-General" means the Controller-General of Prisons appointed under the Prisons Amendment Act, 1919:

"Visiting Justice" means a Justice appointed under section 17 of the Prisons Act, 1908, to visit and inspect prisons:

"Controlling Officer" means the Superintendent, Gaoler, or other officer in charge of a prison or prison institution in which prisoners are confined:

"Dependants" means those persons who are dependants of prisoners within the meaning of subsection (2) of section 26 of the Crimes Amendment Act, 1910, and of subsection (1) of section 12 of the Crimes Amendment Act, 1920.

PART II.

Payment to Prisoners for Industry combined with Good Conduct.

1. Persons undergoing sentences of imprisonment, including those sentenced to reformatory detention or declared habitual criminals or habitual offenders, shall be employed at such labour as may be assigned to them by the Controlling Officer.

2. While so employed they shall be paid a scale rate assessed under the marks system at 1d. per mark for each mark earned under the terms and conditions prescribed in regulation 6 hereof, provided that no marks shall be allotted to prisoners, other than cooks, cleaners, and others fully employed on such days, for Sundays, prison holidays, or days on which for any reason they do not proceed to labour.

3. Men who are skilled in any trade or occupation upon reception, or who afterwards become so skilled, may be paid at the rate of 1½d. per mark when employed at such trade or occupation, upon a recommendation to that effect being made by the Controlling Officer to the Controller-General.

4. The money earned by a prisoner shall be credited to him in an account kept by the Controlling Officer, but no earnings shall be so credited until each such prisoner has served the first three months of his sentence, and has passed out of the probationary grade prescribed by regulations or general orders made under the Prisons Act, 1908.

5. Any prisoner who has once been released upon probation and is rearrested and returned to prison, either for a breach of the conditions of his probationary license or for a further offence, shall not be eligible for the earning of pay marks until four months after his reception, unless the Controller-General otherwise directs.

6. (a.) During the first calendar month after passing out of the probationary grade every prisoner shall be allotted six marks per diem for each day upon which his industry is exemplary and his conduct good.

(b.) After a satisfactory record for the first month he shall be allotted seven marks per diem for the second month.

(c.) A similar record during the second month shall entitle him to an allotment of eight marks per diem for the third month, and with a continuance of industry combined with good conduct he shall be given the same number of marks per diem until the end of the first year of his sentence.

(d.) Every prisoner whose record during the second six months of his sentence is of such a nature as to satisfy the Controlling Officer that he has been carrying out the work

assigned to him to the best of his ability may be recommended by such Controlling Officer to the Controller-General for promotion to the "Special Labour Grade." When promoted to that grade he shall be allotted nine marks per day.

(e.) Cooks, cleaners, and others whose duties require them to work for the greater part of each Sunday or holiday shall be given the same number of marks for such days as they are allotted for ordinary working-days.

(f.) Stablemen, drivers, dairymen, and others who are required to work longer hours than those provided for in the routine of any prison may be recommended to the Controller-General for payment of overtime at the rate of 1d. per hour for every full hour worked in excess of the routine hours. All overtime is to be calculated on a weekly basis, and in specially deserving cases the Controller-General may award an extra gratuity in addition to the scale overtime payment.

(g.) Prisoners who are absent from labour on account of illness shall not be credited with marks carrying pay during such absence. All such cases shall be reported to the Controlling Officer by the Controlling Officer, who shall state in his report whether the absentee from labour is deserving of special consideration by way of allotment of pay marks during the period of his illness. The Controller-General shall then decide whether the whole or part of the pay marks lost shall be restored to the absentee or not.

7. Upon the coming into force of these regulations all hard labour prisoners, habitual criminals, and habitual offenders who have served more than three months of their sentences, and are considered by the Controlling Officers sufficiently able-bodied and industrious to deserve payment, shall be paid the commencing rate of 6d. per day. This rate shall be increased as provided by regulation 6 hereof until the maximum rate is reached. Prisoners serving sentences of reformatory detention shall continue to be paid the scale rate due to them under the regulations hereby revoked until the 31st day of January, 1921, when they shall be paid in accordance with the scale prescribed by these regulations.

Visiting Justices.—Infliction of fines, &c.

8. Visiting Justices appointed under the Prisons Act, 1908, in addition to or in lieu of any punishments they may impose upon prisoners under that Act, may inflict such further punishment for prison offences by way of fine or deprivation of pay marks under these regulations as they deem fit, provided that no fine so inflicted shall exceed the equivalent of 120 marks. They may also, within their discretion, reduce the daily marks that may be earned by an offender for any period not exceeding one calendar month after the date of conviction for the offence for which he is being punished, provided that the daily marks shall not be reduced to less than four.

PART III.

Payment of Daily Wages to Prisoners for the Support of Dependants.

9. All able-bodied male prisoners with proved dependants shall be paid, in addition to and exclusive of the industry and conduct allowance provided for in Part II, a daily wage which shall be used as the Minister directs towards maintaining such dependants. Prisoners with dependants shall be known as "wages-men."

10. Wages paid under this Part of the regulations shall be assessed on a scale rate, and shall be allotted by means of marks similarly to the payments made to all prisoners under Part II. The rate for labourers shall be 1s. per mark. Wages-men who are skilled in any trade or occupation on reception, or who afterwards become so skilled, may be paid a rate not exceeding 1s. 3d. per mark while employed at such trade or occupation, but this rate shall not be paid without the approval of the Controller-General. Officers when forwarding their recommendations for the payment of the skilled rate must state the degree of competency of each man so recommended in his particular trade or occupation, and the proportion of the additional rate to which he is entitled. No overtime shall be allowed or paid for except with the written consent of the Controller-General, and in no case shall payment for overtime be at a higher rate than 1s. per hour unless the Minister's approval is obtained for the payment of an additional sum as a reward for specially meritorious work.

11. No wages shall be paid to any wages-man until he has served the first three months of his sentence and has passed out of the probationary grade prescribed by regulations or general orders made under the Prisons Act, 1908.

12. Wages-men who have served more than three months of their sentences when these regulations come into force shall be paid the initial rate of 1s. per day, with such increments thereafter as are prescribed for men commencing their sentences.

13. Wages shall be credited to each wages-man in a separate account from that in which his earnings under Part II are entered. From the amount so credited there shall be deducted half the sum earned each week to cover the cost of maintenance and supervision, provided that the sum so deducted shall not

exceed half the ordinary labour rate of pay, and shall not include any additional payment for skilled work or for overtime.

14. The sum remaining at each man's credit at the end of every calendar month shall be paid over to the dependants during each succeeding month in such instalments, at such intervals, and under such safeguards as to its proper and economical use as may be directed by the Minister.

15. Wages-men, whether skilled or unskilled, shall be allotted half marks and half the daily rate of pay on Saturdays or other days when only half a day is worked. On wet days or on occasions when for any reason work is interrupted each prisoner or inmate who proceeds to labour shall have his marks and therefore his pay reduced proportionately according to the number of hours worked, provided that in no case shall he be credited with less than one-quarter of the total daily marks to which he is entitled for a full and satisfactory day's work.

16. Wages-men who are absent from labour on account of illness, accident, or other physical disability shall not be credited with marks carrying pay during such absence. All such cases shall be reported to the Controller-General by the Controlling Officer, who shall state in his report whether the absentee from labour is deserving of special consideration by way of allotment of pay marks during the period of his illness. The Controller-General shall then decide whether the whole or part of the pay marks shall be credited to the absentee or not.

17. The payment of wages under this part of the regulations shall be governed by the same rules in regard to the allotment of marks as those provided by regulation 6 of Part II.

18. Female prisoners with dependants may be paid wages to such extent and under such terms and conditions as the Minister shall direct.

19. Visiting Justices shall not impose as a punishment for any offence the deprivation of any part of the wages already earned by a wages-man, but if they deem such a punishment necessary in the interest of the good government and discipline of the prison or institution in which the offending prisoner is confined they shall report the matter to the Controller-General, with a recommendation as to the course that should in their opinion be followed. The Controller-General shall then exercise his discretion as to whether pay shall be stopped or not.

Method of Payment of Earnings to Dependants.

20. The payment of prisoner's earnings to proved dependants shall be made in such a manner and by such instalments as the Minister of Justice directs. If any amount is standing to a prisoner's credit after the full term of his sentence is completed, the Minister may direct the payment of the balance remaining to the prisoner himself or to his dependants, either in a lump sum or in instalments, as he deems fit.

21. Accumulated earnings under Part II of these regulations are subject to disposal by direction of the Minister in the same way as are wages earned under Part III.

22. Moneys earned either under Part II or Part III of these regulations may, if the Minister so directs, be paid into the Post Office Savings-bank to the credit severally of the prisoners confined in any prison or prison institution. Every such account shall be a trust account in the name of the Controlling Officer of the prison or institution, or other authorized person.

Commission to inquire into and report as to a System of Canals and Inland Waterways and other Transport Improvements in the Auckland District.

To all to whom these presents shall come, and to WILLIAM FERGUSON, Esquire, of Wellington, Civil Engineer; JAMES BEGG, Esquire, of Dunedin, Farmer; and ASHLEY HUNTER, Esquire, of Auckland, Civil Engineer: Greeting.

WHEREAS it is expedient that inquiry should be made into the necessity or expediency of having a system of canals and inland waterways and otherwise improving the means of transport in the Auckland District:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby constitute and appoint you the said William Ferguson, James Begg, and Ashley Hunter to be a Commission to inquire into and report as to the establishment of a system of canals and inland waterways, and otherwise improving the means of transport in the Auckland District, and with special reference to the following matters:—

- (1.) What should be the route or routes of one or more canals.
- (2.) The dimensions of these canals and the class of vessels to navigate them.
- (3.) The character and quantity of probable traffic thereon and the revenue to be derived therefrom.
- (4.) The estimated cost of works considered necessary.
- (5.) The working-expenses of these canals, including maintenance, interest, and sinking fund.
- (6.) What effect the construction of a canal or canals will have upon the revenue of the Government Railways.
- (7.) The contingent works necessary to enable the canals to be fully developed and used, such as roads, railways, wharves, and stores.
- (8.) As to the form of control or management of any such works as the Commission may recommend.
- (9.) As to the finance, construction, and maintenance thereof.
- (10.) As to whether any concession should be granted by the General Government or local governing authorities.
- (11.) As to whether the adjacent districts should be subject to rating to provide a guarantee for loans which might be necessary to provide funds for construction purposes, and as to whether those districts should be rated to provide for losses in working.
- (12.) As to the effect which the construction of canals or the improvement of existing waterways from a traffic point of view may have upon the drainage of any existing swamp lands and on lands adjacent thereto.
- (13.) The improvement of the navigation of the Waikato River and its tributaries, the effect on such rivers and on the adjacent swamp lands of the improvement works proposed or already executed by the Waikato River Board, and generally as to the navigation of those rivers.
- (14.) Whether a bridge should be constructed across Waitemata Harbour to connect the City of Auckland with the northern districts.

And generally to inquire into and report upon such other matters arising thereout as may come under your notice in the course of your inquiries and which you consider require to be investigated in connection therewith.

And, with the like advice and consent, I do further appoint you the said WILLIAM FERGUSON to be the Chairman of the said Commission.

And for the better enabling you the said Commission to carry these presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry un-

these presents at such times and places in the said Dominion as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath, or otherwise as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording you information in the premises; and you are also hereby empowered to call for and examine all such books, papers, plans, writings, documents, or records as you deem likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject-matters of the inquiry hereby directed to be made, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful means whatsoever.

And, using all due diligence, you are required to report to me, under your hands and seals not later than the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, your opinion as to the aforesaid matters.

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose, save to me in pursuance of these presents or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report so made or to be made by you.

And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry is not regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournment.

And, lastly, it is hereby further declared that these presents are issued under and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908.

Subsidies to Public Libraries in Country Districts.

Education Department,
Wellington, 30th October, 1920.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries in country districts.

The distribution will take place about the 1st March, 1921, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that is not sent

in due form and received by the Secretary, Education Department, Wellington, on or before the 25th January, 1921.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; and if it is within a borough a reading-room where the books may be read, and containing newspapers and periodicals, must be provided for the public free of charge; *in addition, it must not be situated in a borough, town, or town district the population of which exceeds fifteen hundred. The receipts for the year from subscriptions, donations, and voluntary contributions must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. The number of members subscribing to the library during the year must not have been less than eight, each of whom must have paid the subscription for at least six months. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.*

2. In the distribution of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; *but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £25—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £50.*

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase or loan of books for the library.

4. *It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, on books of more than merely passing interest.*

5. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and payments of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1920, and *such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—*

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1920, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under Part I of the Libraries and Mechanics' Institutes Act, 1908, or the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions and from net proceeds of entertainments, pounds shillings and pence; that the library is public in the sense of belonging to the public, and is not under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and payments of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received in the year 1920 was expended in the purchase of books for the library; [and that by the rules of the library the reading-room is open to the public free of charge].

THE following lists of assistant teachers employed in technical schools, and recognized technical classes, and recognized manual-training classes, or classified for employment in such schools or classes, are issued under the authority of the Minister of Education, in accordance with the regulations relating to technical schools, recognized technical classes, and recognized manual-training classes, made by Order in Council dated the 8th December, 1920.

Under the heading "Division" is shown the division and class in which a teacher is classified.

The class of salary corresponding with the class and division in which the teacher is placed is given in the Schedule to the aforementioned regulations for the classification of teachers in technical schools and classes and teachers of manual-training classes.

Attention is drawn to clause 8 of the regulations, under which any teacher who considers he has good grounds of objection to his classification may lodge an appeal by letter to reach the Director of Education not later than thirty-one clear days after the publication of these lists in the *New Zealand Gazette*—i.e., such appeals must reach the Director not later than the 16th January, 1921, and must contain the definite grounds on which the appeal is based.

NOTE.—In the last column of classification list T.S. stands for "Technical School," E.B. for "Education Board," S.A. for "School of Art," and D.H.S. for "District High School."

The total births registered for the four metropolitan areas amounted to 825, as against 792 in October—an increase of 33. The deaths in November were 431—a decrease of 36 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 227, females 204. Seventy-five of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 17.40 per cent. of the whole number. Fifty-two of these were under one year of age.

Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915.

Department of Internal Affairs,

THE following Order in Council passed on the 13th October, 1920, applying section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, to New Zealand, is hereby published for general information.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 13th day of October, 1920.

Present :

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, it is (amongst other things) enacted as follows :-

"Where His Majesty is satisfied that the law in force in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom makes due provision for the publication of banns or for the giving of notice in respect of marriages between British subjects intended to be solemnized or contracted in the United Kingdom, and for the recognition of certificates for marriage issued by Superintendent Registrars in England, and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars and certificates of proclamation of banns in Scotland, and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars in Ireland, as sufficient notice in respect of marriages between British subjects intended to be solemnized or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that this section shall apply to that part of His Dominions, and in such case :-

"(a.) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnized or contracted in the United Kingdom between a British subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland and a British subject resident in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, a certificate of the publication of banns or a certificate of notice of marriage issued in accordance with

such law shall in England have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Superintendent Registrar, and in Scotland and Ireland have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Registrar in Scotland and Ireland respectively; and

"(b.) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnized or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions between a British subject resident in that part and a British subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, a certificate for marriage may be issued in England by a Superintendent Registrar, or in Scotland or Ireland by a Registrar, in the like manner as if the marriage was to be solemnized or contracted under circumstances requiring the issue of such a certificate, and as if both such British subjects were resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, as the case may be."

And whereas by section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Amendment Act, 1916, it is enacted as follows :-

"If His Majesty is satisfied that, for the purposes of a marriage to be solemnized or contracted in any part of His Dominions outside the United Kingdom between a British subject resident in that part and a British subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, no notice of the marriage is, under the law in force in that part of His Dominions, required on the part of the person resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, shall apply to that part of His Dominions, notwithstanding that the law in force in that part does not make provision for the recognition of certificates for marriage issued in England, Scotland, and Ireland, and of certificates of proclamation of banns issued in Scotland, as sufficient notice in respect of such marriages as aforesaid, provided that the other conditions required by that section are fulfilled."

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that, for the purposes of a marriage to be solemnized or contracted in the part of His Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter men-

tioned between a British subject resident therein and a British subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, no notice of the marriage is under the law in force in that part of His Dominions required on the part of the person resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, and that under the said law the other conditions required by the hereinbefore-recited section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, are fulfilled:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Acts in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, shall apply to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

New Zealand.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
