A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the respective Councils of the City of Wellington and of the Borough of Miramar, by petitions under the respective common seals of the Corporations of such city and borough, as provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, have prayed the Governor-General that such city and borough (forming one continuous area) be constituted one united borough:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, do hereby proclaim that the said City of Wellington and the said Borough of Miramar are hereby constituted one united borough, and also that the said borough so constituted is a city by the name of the City of Wellington, and also that the boundaries of the said city so constituted and named shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

And I do also proclaim that the said borough shall be an undivided borough, and that the number of Councillors to be elected to the Council thereof shall be fifteen, exclusive of the Mayor.

And I do hereby appoint John Richard Palmer (the Town Clerk to the existing City of Wellington) to be the Town Clerk temporarily of the said united borough; and I do hereby appoint James Ames (the Returning Officer to the said existing city) to be the Returning Officer temporarily to the said united borough.

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF WELLINGTON.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded towards the north-east generally commencing at a point on high-water mark of Lambton Harbour in line with the south-western boundary of Section 7, Harbour District; thence to and by the south-western and north-western boundaries of Section 7 aforesaid to the easternmost corner of Section 4, Porirua District; thence by the north-eastern boundary of Section 4 aforesaid to the Wellington-Marton Railway Reserve in Section 5, Porirua; thence by the aforesaid railway reserve to the north-eastern boundary of Section 5, Porirua,

and by the north-eastern boundary of that section to the south-western boundary of Section 107, Ohariu; thence by the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Section 107 aforesaid, the south-western boundary of Section 95, Ohariu, to the southernmost corner of Section 94; thence by a right line to the northernmost corner of Section 94 aforesaid and that line produced across the old Ohariu Road, and by the northern side of that road to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 93, Ohariu; thence towards the west generally by a line to and by the north-western boundary of Section 93, Ohariu, a right line to the northernmost corner of Section 9, Kaiwarra; thence by the north-western and south-western boundaries of Section 9, Kaiwarra, to the northernmost corner of Section 7, Kaiwarra; thence by the north-western and south-western boundaries of the said Section 7 to the northernmost corner of Subdivision I of the Otari Native Reserve; thence by the north-western boundaries of Subdivisions Nos. I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, and VIII, Otari Reserve, and the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned subdivision and its prolongation to the right bank of the Kaiwarra Stream, and along the right bank of that stream to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of the Otari Native Reserve; thence to and along that boundary and the southern boundary of the said Native Reserve to the eastern side of the Parkvale Road; thence southerly along that side of the said road to the south-western boundary of Section 57, Karori Registration District; thence south-easterly along that boundary and south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of Sections 37, 39, 40, 41, and 42 of the said district; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned section to and along the north-western boundary of Section 49, Makara District; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundaries of said Section 49, the abutment of Karori Road, and the south-western boundary of Section 43, Karori Registration District; thence along the north-western, south-western, and south-eastern boundaries of Section 54, Karori Registration District, to and along the south-western boundary of Section 45 of the said district; thence along the southern boundaries of that section and Section 47 of the said district and along the north-eastern boundaries of the said Section 47 and Section 46, along the south-eastern boundary of Section 55 of the said Karori Registration District to Section 9, Upper Kaiwarra Registration District; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of the said Section 9 to the western boundary of the Waterworks Reserve; thence along the western boundary of that reserve to the northern boundary of Section No. 69, Block X, Port Nicholson Survey District; thence along the northern boundaries of Sections Nos. 69 and 70, the eastern boundaries of Sections Nos. 70 and 38,

Block X aforesaid, the eastern boundary of Section No. 37, Block XIII, and its production to high-water mark of the sea; thence along high-water mark of Cook Strait, Port Nicholson, and Evans Bay to the eastern boundary of the area described in the Third Schedule to the Wellington City Reclamation and Empowering Act, 1906; thence along the said eastern boundary and high-water mark of Evans Bay to a point on the southern boundary of land reclaimed by the Wellington Patent Slip Company, distant 2434 links south and 10952 links east from Mount Cook Initial Station; thence along lines bearing 117° 24' distance 206.06 links, bearing 80° 28' distance 157.58 links, bearing 2° 30' distance 206.06 links, and bearing 27° 43' distance 348.5 links (scaled), to high-water mark, and again along high-water mark of Evans Bay to a point on the eastern boundary of another portion of land reclaimed by the said company, distant 1860.7 links south and 11775.16 links east from Mount Cook Initial Station; thence along lines bearing due north distance 460 links, bearing 290° 58' distance 91.17 links, to high-water mark, and along high-water mark of Evans Bay and Lambton Harbour to the north-eastern boundary of Te Aro Baths; thence along the seaward boundary of the said Te Aro Baths to the north-eastern corner of the land shown on plan marked M.D. 3188, deposited in the office of the Minister of Marine at Wellington; thence along the northern boundary of the said land to its westernmost corner; thence along the seaward boundary of the land shown on plan marked 1373, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington, by lines bearing 314° 57' distance 123.72 links, bearing 15° 54' distance 414.64 links, bearing 277° 45' distance 739.8 links, and bearing 262° 45' distance 430.8 links, to the boundary of the land granted to the Corporation of the City of Wellington by deed of grant dated the 24th day of June, 1874, and along the seaward boundary of the land so granted to the eastern boundary of the land shown on plan marked M.D. 1332, deposited in the office of the Minister of Marine at Wellington; thence along the seaward boundary of the said land by lines bearing 12° 39' distance 298.95 links, bearing 349° 41' distance 329 links, bearing 347° 2' distance 83.76 links, to a point on the southern boundary of the land on plan marked 103/61, deposited in the District Survey Office at Wellington; thence along the seaward boundary of the said land by lines bearing 81° 31' distance 20.97 links, bearing 349° 34' 37" to the eastern boundary of the land granted to the Superintendent of Wellington by grant dated the 20th day of June, 1862; thence along the seaward boundary of the last-mentioned grant to a point on the line marked "Proposed Limit of Reclamation" on plan marked M.D. 2192 (sheet No. 1), deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington; thence along the said line to a point marked O on the aforesaid plan, being a point on the eastern side of the Railway Wharf as it existed in May, 1898; thence along the said eastern side of the Railway Wharf to the southernmost point of the land vested in the Wellington Harbour Board by Order in Council, 25th April, 1887, and shown on plan marked B/30, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington and thereon edged green; thence along the seaward boundary of that land to the southernmost point marked F of the land described in the First Schedule to the Wellington Harbour Board Reclamation and Empowering Act, 1903, and shown on plan marked M.D. 2636, deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington; and thence along the seaward boundary of the last-mentioned land to the southernmost point marked C on the land described in the First Schedule to the Wellington Harbour Board Reclamation and Empowering Act 1903 Amendment Act, 1906, and shown on plan marked M.D. 2988, deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington; thence along the south-eastern, north-eastern, and north-western boundaries of that land to the point marked B on the said plan M.D. 2988; thence along a right line to the easternmost corner of the land taken for railway purposes by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th May, 1891, and shown on plan marked P.W.D. 16469, deposited in the office of the Public Works Department at Wellington; thence along the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of that land, the seaward boundaries of the Thorndon Baths, and again along the south-western boundary of the aforesaid land shown on the said plan marked P.W.D. 16469, to the seaward boundary of the Wellington-Hutt Railway land; and thence along the seaward boundary of the said Wellington-Hutt Railway land to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on the plan marked 49/59, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

*Alteration of Boundaries of Kahutara River District, County of Featherston.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section three of the River Boards Amendment Act, 1913, a majority of the ratepayers in the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Featherston, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the lands comprised in the said areas be included in the Kahutara River District as constituted under the provisions of the River Boards Act, 1908: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of such river district in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section fourteen of the River Boards Act, 1908, as amended by section three of the River Boards Amendment Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that, as on and from the date hereof, the boundaries of the Kahutara River District shall be altered so as to include in the said district the areas of lands described in the said petition and in the First Schedule hereto; and do hereby proclaim and declare that as on and from the aforesaid date the boundaries of the said river district, with such addition as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA PROPOSED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE KAHUTARA RIVER DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at the northernmost point of Section 19, Block XIV, Wairarapa Survey District, and proceeding thence along the Opoura Stream to and along the south-western boundary of the Kahutara River District as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1907, page 3543, to the Whakawerawera Stream; thence along the right bank of that stream and the Ruamahanga River to a road intersecting Mapuna-Atea Native Reserve; thence along the eastern side of that road to the south-eastern corner of Otaupuaroro No. 1 Block, and along the south-eastern boundary of that block for a distance of 40 chains; thence along a right line bearing 313°, distance 62 chains, to the western boundary of Otaupuaroro No. B 4 Block, and along the north-western boundary of that block to and along the southern boundaries of Sections 38 and 17 for a distance of 42 chains; thence north-easterly along a right line bearing 35°, distance 88 chains, to the north-eastern corner of Section 44, Block XIII; thence due east along a right line for a distance of 33 chains, and north-easterly along a right line bearing 57°, distance 40 chains, to a point on the eastern side of a road intersecting Section 17, Block XIV, Wairarapa Survey District; thence north-easterly along the eastern side of that road to the north-eastern boundary of the said Section 17, and along that boundary, the northern boundary of Section 38, and the western boundaries of Sections 39 and 19 to the point of commencement: be all the aforesaid bearings and distances more or less.

Also all that area, being part of Kahutara No. 1 Block, bounded towards the north-west by the Kahutara Main Road, 850 links; towards the north-east by lines bearing 142°, 1200 links, and 159°, 1900 links; towards the south-east by a right line bearing 218°, 2100 links; and towards the south-west by Section 3, Block XIV, Wairarapa Survey District: be all the aforesaid bearings and distances more or less.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at the northernmost corner of Section 32, Block XI, Wairarapa Survey District, and proceeding thence south-easterly along the Mangatete Stream and the eastern boundary of Section 2, Block XI aforesaid, to and across the Kahutara Road to the north-eastern corner of Section 3, Block XV; thence north-easterly along the southern side of the said road, 850 links; thence by lines bearing 142°, 1200 links, 159°, 1900 links, and 218°, 2100 links, to the eastern boundary of said Section 3; thence along that boundary and the eastern boundaries of Section 4 to the Whakawerawera Stream; thence along the right bank of that stream and the Ruamahanga River to a road intersecting Mapuna-Atea Native Reserve; thence along the eastern side of that road to the south-eastern corner of Otaupuaroro No. 1 Block, and along the south-eastern boundary of that block for a distance of 40 chains; thence along a right line bearing 313°, distance 62 chains, to the western boundary of Otaupuaroro No. B 4 Block, and along the north-western boundary of that block

to and along the southern boundaries of Sections 38 and 17 for a distance of 42 chains; thence north-easterly along a right line bearing 35°, distance 88 chains, to the north-eastern corner of Section 44, Block XIII; thence due east along a right line for a distance of 33 chains, and north-easterly along a right line bearing 57°, distance 40 chains, to a point on the eastern side of a road intersecting Section 17, Block XIV, Wairarapa Survey District; thence north-easterly along the eastern side of that road to the north-eastern boundary of the said Section 17, and along that boundary, the northern boundary of Section 38 and the western boundaries of Sections 39 and 19 to the Opoura Stream; thence along that stream to the western boundary of Section 7, Block XV; thence northerly along that boundary and the western boundary of Section 8, Block XI, to the Makahi Stream, and along that stream to the north-western boundary of Section 33, Block XI; thence along that boundary and the north-western boundary of Section 32, Block XI, to the place of commencement: be all the aforesaid bearings and linkages more or less.

*Education Act, 1914.—Regulations for the Establishment and Management of Supplementary Model Country Schools.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments to that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations set out hereafter for the establishment and management of supplementary model country schools; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND MANAGEMENT OF  
SUPPLEMENTARY MODEL COUNTRY SCHOOLS.

1. A SUPPLEMENTARY model country school may, with the consent of the Minister, be established by an Education Board for the purpose of giving training in the management of a country school to (a) young persons who intend to become teachers, but who are ineligible for admission into a teachers' training college; (b) teachers who are already in the service of the Board, but who require further training.
2. Attendance for training at a supplementary model country school, hereinafter termed "a model school," shall not be regarded as in any sense equivalent to or in substitution for attendance at a training college, and such training shall not in itself be held to raise the educational status of any teacher.
3. A model school may be established as part of a larger school or may be a separate school, provided boarding-accommodation for visiting teachers can be readily secured in the neighbourhood.
4. No model school shall have more than thirty-five pupils in daily average attendance.
5. Only teachers who have shown special skill in the management of a country school shall be eligible for appointment to a model school, and no such appointment shall be made without the concurrence of the Director.
6. The salary, additions to salary, and the house allowance payable to a teacher in charge of a model school shall be equal to those paid a head teacher of a school of Grade IIIA.
7. Any teacher in the service of the Board may, on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector, be required to attend a model school for any period of training not exceeding three months, and shall receive full salary during such period.
8. The Board may also from time to time send for training to a model school young persons who desire to enter the teaching profession and appear suitable for appointment on probation to junior positions in the service; but no such person shall be selected so long as there is available for employment any teacher who has received training in a teachers' training college, or who has served as a pupil-teacher or probationer.
9. Young persons selected for training under clause 8 hereof shall, during their period of training, receive an allowance at the rate of £70 per annum, together with a lodging allowance of £30 per annum in the case of those who require to live away from home.
10. Before being accepted for training each candidate must satisfy the Senior Inspector that he has reached a standard of education in advance of

Standard VI, and shall, when accepted, enter into a bond with the Education Board to teach, if so required, for a period of two years, or alternatively to refund the amount paid him by way of allowance during his period of training.

11. Teachers and others attending a model school shall while so doing be under the control of the teacher in charge of such school. They will be expected to keep full notes of their observations, and shall undertake whatever preparation of lessons and whatever practice in teaching are required of them. A report on the work and general ability of each teacher or candidate shall be submitted to the Senior Inspector by the teacher in charge.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the amendment to the Regulations for Average Attendance made by Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in lieu thereof doth make the following amendments; and doth prescribe that these amendments shall come into force on the date of the first publication of this Order in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

AMENDMENTS IN REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations relating to average attendance of public schools, the Minister of Education, being satisfied that infectious diseases of an epidemic character have been prevalent during the year 1920 to the extent of affecting 10 per cent. of the roll number of a large number of schools, the average of the quarter which is the highest of the four quarters of the year 1920 for any school or department shall be deemed to be the yearly average attendance for such school or department for the year 1920.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 1 hereof, or contained in the regulations relating to the staffing and salaries in public schools, in any case in which the average as computed in clause 1 hereof would entitle a school or department to an assistant or assistants in addition to the staff as at the 31st day of December, 1920, the appointment of such assistant or assistants shall be provisional, and shall be terminated by the Board as from the 30th day of April, 1921, should the average of the first quarter of that year not be equal to the average yearly attendance that would entitle the school to such addition to the staff.

Further, no increase in grade of salary shall be paid to any teacher on account of the operation of the provisions of clause 1 hereof until the 1st day of April, 1921, and then only under the conditions contained herein regarding an increase of staff. If such conditions are fulfilled, the increase in grade of salary shall in each case be paid as from the 1st day of February preceding.
