Upon the receipt of such valuation the Commissioner shall notify every lessee in such township or subdivision of the amount of the valuation of the land comprised in his lease.

(1.) Every such agreement shall be accompanied by a deposit equal to not less than 5 per centum of the value of the estate or interest of the Native owners of the land comthe estate or interest of the Native owners of the land com-prised in the lease, which deposit shall be held by the Com-missioner pending the result of the negotiations for the pur-chase of the fee-simple of the lands. In the event of the lessee completing the purchase as aforesaid, the said deposit shall be applied in the manner hereinafter prescribed, but shall be forfeited to His Majesty if the lessee does not carry out his agreement to purchase within the time prescribed

Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society at Dunedin, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such Secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the 1st day of January, 1921, to the 31st day of December, 1921.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. The said Secretary may, with the authority of the said society, authorize the sale, either by auction or otherwise, during the currency of these regulations, of deer destroyed pursuant to these regulations, and of the meat and skins of such deer; provided that the proceeds derived from such sale shall be devoted to patriotic purposes.

5. The said Secretary shall, on or before the 31st day of January, 1922, furnish a statement of the moneys received from such sale and of the patriotic purposes or purpose to which they were devoted.

6. Any person who commits a breach of any of the pro-visions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Amendment of the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

In pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the special regulations affecting H.M. prisons and the officers employed therein, together with exemptions from the regulations made by the Public Service Commissioner on the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette on the twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and as amended by notice published in the New Zealand Gazette of the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, make the further amendment shown in the Schedule hereto. Such amendment shall have effect from and after publication in the New Zealand Gazette.

In exceptional cases special circumstances may be taken into consideration—e.g., where an officer in discharge of his duties sustains injuries of such a nature as to incapacitate him for all duty, this scale may be varied

If any officer is absent from duty on account of illness, and such absence has extended beyond three months, he shall not be permitted to return to duty until some medical practitioner approved by the Commissioner has certified that he is fit to resume.

When extended leave is granted other than on full pay the rate paid for Sundays and holidays shall be the same as that allowed for

the period of leave.

Siek-leave allowed, whether by the Permanent Head or by the Commissioner, under this regulation may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave above stated is intended to cover a period of three years, dating from the first absence on sick-leave.

The second or any subsequent triennial period will commence on the date of the first absence on sick-leave following the date upon which the previous triennial period expired; and for the three years thus commencing the full amount of leave as herein provided according to length of service may again be allowed.

In exceptional cases special circumstances may be taken into consideration—e.g., where an officer in discharge of his duties sustains injuries of such a nature as to incapacitate him for all duty, this scale may be varied.

If any officer is absent from duty on account of illness, and such absence has extended beyond three months, he shall not be permitted to return to duty until some medical practitioner approved by the Commissioner has certified that he is fit to resume.

When extended leave is granted other than on full pay the rate paid for Sundays and holidays shall be the same as that allowed for the period of leave.

Sick-leave allowed, whether by the Permanent Head or by the Commissioner, under this regulation may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave above stated is intended to cover a period of three years, dating from the first absence on sick-leave.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1920.

During November pressure was almost continuously below normal in the south owing to frequent disturbances passing in higher latitudes, while anticyclone centres invariably moved north of the Dominion. As a consequence, strong winds between north-west and south-west prevailed, and the weather proved very changeable, and often boisterous, with heavy rains in districts with a westerly aspect.

The total rainfall was considerably above the average in the West Coast and southern half of the South Island, and slightly above in the Taranaki and Auckland districts of the North. Elsewhere it was generally below, the greatest deficiency being experienced in the Gisborne and Napier districts.

Thunderstorms occurred on several occasions in various parts of the Dominion, and some stations recorded damage to fruit crops through the accompanying hail squalls.

This Order may be cited as the Western Samoa (Fugitive Offenders) Order in Council, 1920.

2. The Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply to the said Territory of Western Samoa as if that Territory were a British possession, subject to the provisions following.

3. In the application of the said Act to the Governor of a British possession shall be read as a reference to the Administrator or other chief executive officer of the said Territory.

WHEREAS by section 36 of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the said Act shall apply as if, subject to the conditions, exceptions, and qualifications (if any) contained in the Order, any place out of His Majesty's dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction and which is named in the Order, were a British possession, and to provide for carrying into effect such application.

And whereas the Territory of Western Samoa is a place out of His Majesty's dominions in which His Majesty has

jurisdiction:

And whereas it is expedient to extend to that Territory the provisions of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in the exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Act,

(b.) Every reference in the Act to a Magistrate shall be read as a reference to a Judge or other judicial officer possessing criminal jurisdiction within the said Territory, and every such Judge or other officer may exercise accordingly the jurisdiction conferred by the Act upon a Magistrate. by the Act upon a Magistrate.
4. So much of the fifth section of the said Act as relates

4. So much of the fifth section of the said Act as relates to the information to be given by the Magistrate to a fugitive shall have no application within the said Territory, and in lieu of such information the person acting as the Magistrate shall inform the fugitive that in any British possession to which he may be conveyed he has the right to apply for a writ of habeas corpus or other like process.

5. So much of the sixth section of the said Act as requires the expiration of fifteen days before the issue of a warrant shall have no application within the said Territory.

6. For the purpose of Part II of the said Act the said Territory of Western Samoa and the Dominion of New Zealand shall be deemed to be one group of British possessions.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

Under the Control and Supervision of the Education Department.

OR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are

taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.

2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.

3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
