A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fifth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in *Gazette* of the eighth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, certain Crown lands in the Auckland Land District were with other Crown lands set apart as and for provisional State forests, in terms of section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918:

And whereas an error was made by the inclusion of a primary education reserve in the Schedule to the Proclamation hereinbefore referred to, and it is desirable that the said Schedule should be amended:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pur-

suance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by subsection three of section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby rescind the said Proclamation dated the fifth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, hereinbefore referred to, in so far as it relates to the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners, and duly confirmed by the Ikaroa District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and its amendments, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made by Orders in Council dated the twenty-third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and the twenty-sixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, for the grading of teachers, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth below ; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

THE GRADING OF TEACHERS.

1. THE Director of Education (hereinafter referred to as the Director) shall, by and through the Inspectors of the Department, proceed annually to grade in accordance with the regulations herein contained the certificated teachers employed in public schools, together with certificated training-college students who have completed their training-college course.

2. The Inspectors of each education district acting together shall in accordance with these regulations assign grading-marks to all the certificated teachers employed in the public schools by the Education Board of the district on the 31st day of December preceding, and shall, through the Senior Inspector of the district, forward such grading-marks to the Director :

Provided that training-college students who hold teachers' certificates shall be assigned grading-marks by the Inspectors of the district in which the training college attended is situated, after consultation with the Principal of the training college concerned.

3. (i.) Certificated teachers who are not in the employment of an Education Board on the 31st day of December in any year but who were included in the grading-list then current may be graded in the following year, but if not so employed during that year they may be graded in any subsequent year only on application to the Senior Inspector of the district in which they were last employed. Any such application must reach the Senior Inspector not later than the 1st day of February. Certificated teachers who have not been graded and who are not in the employment of an Education Board may be graded on application to the Director not later than the 1st day of February in any year.

(ii.) Any teacher in the service of an Education Board or any training-college student who for the first time becomes certificated after the grading-list is completed shall be entitled to be graded forthwith as from the date on which his certificate is issued.

(iii.) Certificated teachers who are for the time being employed in Native schools and special schools under the Education Department may be awarded grading-marks by the Inspector or Inspectors instructed thereto by the Director, but the grading of any such teacher shall have effect only in respect of any subsequent employment or application for employment of the teacher in the service of an Education Board.

4. Teachers entitled to be graded shall be graded in six groups as follows, according to the salary paid under Schedule IV in clause 1 of the Regulations for the Salaries of Public-school Teachers on the last day of employment in the preceding year or on the last day of December in that year, as the case may be :—

5. (1.) A teacher who holds or who has held a permanent position shall be placed in the group warranted by the grade of salary of his permanent position or his last permanent position, as the case may be :

Provided that—

- (a.) The head teacher of a district high school, unless he is already in Group 6, shall be placed in the group next above that in which he would otherwise be placed under this clause :
- (b.) Teachers in charge of part-time schools shall in all cases be grouped as if their grade of salary were determined by clause 30 of the Regulations for the Salaries of Public-school Teachers gazetted on the 13th November, 1919, which for this purpose shall not be modified by the proviso to clause 9 of the same regulations :
- (c.) A teacher who previously had occupied a position that would under these regulations have placed him in a higher group than the one determined by his present position may, with the permission of the Director, be graded in such higher group if the Inspectors report that the teacher's efficiency has been maintained in all respects :
- (d.) Native-school teachers and teachers of special schools shall be grouped as if they received the grade of salary for positions in schools of corresponding grades under Schedule I in clause 1 of the Regulations for the Salaries of Public-school Teachers :
- (e.) Organizing teachers shall be graded in Group 5 :
- (f.) Relieving teachers who do not hold permanent positions, and who are classified under clause 53 (1) of the Regulations for the Salaries of Public-school Teachers as amended by Order in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1920, shall for the purposes of grading be placed in groups as follows :—

(2.) A training-college student entitled to be graded and any teacher who has not previously held a position under an Education Board shall be placed in Group 1 :

Provided that in special circumstances the Director may, on the recommendation of the Inspectors, direct that any such student or teacher shall be placed in a group higher than Group 1.

6. For the purpose of grading, marks shall be assigned by the Inspectors on the following basis, namely :—

7. *Professional Skill.*—(i.) Marks for skill in teaching, for personality, discipline, and environment, and for organization and management, shall in the first case be assigned with special relation to the teacher's efficiency in the class of positions occupied by him up to the time of grading, and shall be assessed in all essential respects on a basis of comparison with teachers in the same group.

(ii.) Marks for personality, discipline, and attention to environment shall be assessed in accordance with a teacher's value in these respects in relation to his school activities only.

(iii.) Marks for organization and management shall be assigned with due regard to the relative degrees of skill in organization and management demanded by different classes of positions in the same group.

8. After the marks provided for in clause 6 and referred to in clause 7 hereof have been provisionally determined, the Inspectors, having regard to the grading of the teachers of the district as a whole, may make such adjustment as they consider necessary to bring into due relation the marking in the various groups.

9. When any teacher is to be graded in a higher group than that in which he was last graded, the marks to be awarded under clauses 6 and 7 on the judgment of the Inspectors shall be reassessed according to the higher standard of marking in such higher group, so that the total of these marks, added to the quota mark, shall in all cases be increased only by such number of marks as represents the increased efficiency of the teacher since the previous grading.

10. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, every teacher eligible to be graded who was on military service for at least one year during the years 1914-20, inclusive, shall in general receive the same increase of marks for the period of his military service as was received on the average by teachers whose status was similar to his own at the time of his enrolment for military service.

11. In assigning marks under the several headings stated in clause 7 hereof Inspectors shall be guided by the following table of comparative values :—

12. *Academic Attainments.*—Marks for academic attainments shall be based on the class of teacher's certificate held, and shall be given as follows: For certificate of Class E, 6 marks; Class D, 12; Class C, 21; Class B, 27; Class A, 30:

Provided that a teacher who is awarded a higher class of certificate after the grading-list has been completed shall be entitled to receive the additional grading-marks for the higher certificate as prescribed in this clause, and the consequent alteration in his grading shall be notified to each Education Board and in any supplement to the grading-list that may be issued.

13. *Service.*—Marks for teaching service shall include service up to the 31st day of December preceding, one mark being given for each complete year of the total period of service up to twenty-five years. Provided that—

- (a.) Service as a probationer appointed on or after 1st February, 1921, or service as a pupil-teacher shall be counted as service of half its length.
- (b.) Each year of an approved course in a teachers' training college shall count as a full year of service.
- (c.) Any period of military service with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force within the period 4th August, 1914, to 12th November, 1918, shall count as double service.
- (d.) Any period of leave of absence in excess of three months shall not be counted as service, except that leave of absence granted under the Exchange of Teachers Regulations shall be counted as full service.

14. *Quota.*—(i.) The quota of marks provided for in clause 6 hereof shall, for each teacher graded in the respective groups, be as follows :—

(ii.) Such quota marks shall be regarded as efficiency marks awarded in recognition of the relatively higher degree of efficiency required to secure in each successively higher group the same number of marks awarded under clauses 6 and 7 hereof.

15. Any teacher who by reason of a correction in the marks allotted him for service or certificate becomes entitled to additional marks shall not in consequence thereof suffer a reduction in the marks awarded him under any other heading.

16. Any teacher who has held the maximum marks for teaching, personality, discipline, environment, organization, and management for a period of at least two years and has been unable to obtain promotion to a position in a higher group may, with the approval of the Director, be graded in the next higher group.

17. (i.) It shall be the duty of the Director to secure and maintain a reasonable degree of uniformity in the standard of marking in the various districts, and to this end he may, as he thinks fit, confer with all the Senior Inspectors conjointly.

(ii.) If by the decision of such conference it is held that the standard of grading in any district departs to an unreasonable extent from that of the remainder of the Dominion the Director shall instruct the Inspectors of the district or districts concerned to adjust their standard of marking accordingly.

18. From the grading-marks forwarded to the Director by the Senior Inspectors of the various districts shall be compiled annually a general graded list of teachers, which shall be duly published in accordance with the Act before the 30th day of June. Every such general list shall contain—

- (a.) The names of all teachers graded as herein provided, arranged in order, and consecutively numbered in accordance with the total of the grading-marks assigned ;
- (b.) The name in each case of the district in which the teacher was graded, the nature of the position occupied, and such other information as the Director may determine ;
- (c.) The names of all certificated teachers in the Dominion, whether graded or not, and the class of certificate held by each teacher.

19. Each teacher who is graded under these regulations shall be supplied by the Director of Education with the separate marks on which his grading was determined, the information thus supplied to be treated as confidential.

20. Any teacher who considers that he has good grounds for objection to the position assigned to him on the graded list may, not later than thirty-one clear days after the publication of the list in the *New Zealand Gazette*, lodge an appeal by letter with the Director of Education, Wellington, giving the complete and definite grounds on which the appeal is based, and every such appeal shall be dealt with as hereinafter provided.

21. All the appeals from each district shall be sent to an Appeal Board in the district concerned. Such Appeal Board shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Minister, who shall be Chairman of all Appeal Boards, a representative of the Department not being an Inspector of the district, and a representative selected by the certificated teachers of the district in such manner as the Director may determine. An officer of the Department may be present during the hearing of appeals, for the purpose of giving or of eliciting information bearing on points raised in appeals.

22. The Appeal Board in each district shall consider the appeals sent in from teachers in the district only with respect to the definite grounds stated in each appeal. In any case where the Board decides that an appellant's

grading is too low or too high, a report to that effect shall be made to the Director, who shall refer the case to the Inspector or Inspectors concerned, with an instruction to regrade the teacher in accordance with the decision of the Board. The result of the appeals dealt with in all the districts shall be published in a supplementary *Gazette* as soon as possible after the hearing of the appeals is concluded.

23. Teachers who may be entitled to benefit by the special provisions of clauses 5 (c) and 13 (c) hereof are required to notify the Director accordingly not later than the 1st day of February in each year, stating the name of the school, the position held, period of tenure with dates, rate of salary, and any other necessary particulars in connection with their claim to come under either of the regulations referred to. Likewise, teachers who by reason of broken service or of service in more than one district are in any danger of having a portion of their claim for service overlooked are required to forward to the Senior Inspector of their district by the same date all relative particulars of such service as herein mentioned.

Extension of Copyright Act, 1913, to certain Works first published in the United States of America.

WHEREAS by reason of conditions arising out of the war difficulties have been experienced by citizens of the United States of America in complying with the requirements of the Copyright Act, 1913, as to the first publication within New Zealand of their works first published in the United States of America during the war :

And whereas the Governor-General is advised that the Government of the United States of America has undertaken upon issue of this Order to extend the protection afforded by the United States Law of the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, entitled "An Act to amend Sections eight and twenty-one of the Copyright Act, approved March 4, 1909," to British subjects in New Zealand :

And whereas by reason of the said undertaking of the Government of the United States of America the Governor-General is satisfied that the said Government has made, or has undertaken to make, such provision as it is expedient to require for the protection of works first made or published in New Zealand, between the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and the termination of the war and entitled to copyright under Part I of the Copyright Act, 1913 :

And whereas by the Copyright Act, 1913, authority is conferred upon the Governor-General to extend by Order in Council the protection of the said Act to certain classes of foreign works within New Zealand :

And whereas by reason of these premises it is desirable to provide protection within New Zealand for literary or artistic works first published in the United States of America between the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and the termination of the war which have failed to accomplish the formalities prescribed by the Copyright Act, 1913, by reason of conditions arising out of the war :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Copyright Act, 1913, doth hereby direct as follows :—

1. The Copyright Act, 1913, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and this Order, apply to works first published in the United States of America between the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and the termination of the war, which have not been republished in New Zealand prior to the commencement of this Order in like manner as if they had been first published in New Zealand; provided that the enjoyment by any work of the rights conferred by the Copyright Act, 1913, shall be conditional upon publication of the work in New Zealand not later than six months after the commencement of this Order, and shall commence from and after such publication, which shall not be colourable only, but shall be intended to satisfy the reasonable requirements of the public.

2. The provision of section fifty-two of the Copyright Act, 1913, as to the delivery of books to the General Assembly

Library shall apply to works to which this Order relates upon their publication in New Zealand.

3. In the case of musical works to which this Order relates, and provided that no contrivances by means of which the work may be mechanically performed have before the commencement of this Order been lawfully made or placed on sale within New Zealand, copyright in the work shall include all rights conferred by the said Act with respect to the making of records, perforated rolls, and other contrivances by means of which the work may be mechanically performed.

4. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as depriving any work of any rights which have been lawfully acquired under the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1913, or any Order in Council thereunder.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, which date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the fees imposed for private letter-boxes by the above-mentioned Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby impose the fees set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby direct that this Order in Council shall be read together with and form part of the Order in Council first herein mentioned, and shall take effect on and from the date of its publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, the Kauri Timber Company (Limited), of Auckland (hereinafter called "the company"), did, in the year one thousand nine hundred and one, apply to the Governor in Council for a license under the Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto of Whitianga Harbour, Mercury Bay, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of the Harbours Act, 1878, deposited plans (two sheets) in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 2493), showing the place where it was intended to construct such wharf, the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it was proposed to carry out the work :

And whereas, it having been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work would not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans having been, prior to the making of the Order in Council granting the license, approved by the Governor in Council, a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, was, on the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and one, granted and issued to the company, on the terms and conditions therein expressed, for a period terminating on the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the fourth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 2, of the thirteenth day of the same month, the company was licensed to occupy the said part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto for a further period of five years from the date of the expiry of the license first hereinbefore mentioned :

And whereas the company has made application for a license under the Harbours Act, 1908, to occupy the said foreshore and land below low-water mark for the purpose aforesaid for a further period of two years from the date of expiry of the hereinbefore-mentioned license of the fourth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and it is expedient to grant the same subject to the terms and conditions herein-after expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the Harbours Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the wharf is erected, as shown on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and further, with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, and in pursuance and exercise of the power conferred by the Harbours Act, 1908, doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, occupied by the said wharf, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2493.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s.,

and thereafter an annual sum of £10, dating from the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty, or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein specified, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for two years from the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

13. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereinafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize Theodore Jephcoate, of Waiwera, hotel proprietor (hereinafter referred to as “the licensee”), to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes along the routes described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. ROUTES OF ELECTRIC LINES.

ALL that route in the North Auckland Land District, Waitemata County, commencing at the power-house situated in Section 224, Block III, Waiwera Survey District, and proceeding thence through the said Section 224 and across the Waiwera Wharf Road to a cottage situated in Section 300, Block III aforesaid.

Also all that route, in the said land district and county, commencing in the said Section 224 at a point on the route hereinbefore described, and proceeding thence through part of the said Section 224 and across the Waiwera Wharf Road to a cottage situated in Section 300, Block III aforesaid.

As the same are more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 49558, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington, and thereon shown by black lines.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (a) (1) of clause 3 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 110 volts between the terminals.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 22 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine: but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. EXTENSIONS.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations incorporated herein, no extensions or lines other than those along the route hereinbefore described shall be deemed to be authorized by this license.

6. REQUIREMENTS OF WAITEMATA COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the County of Waitemata except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Waitemata County Council.

7. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

SCHEDULE.

NIGHT LETTER TELEGRAMS.

SUBJECT to the conditions set out hereunder, night letter telegrams shall be accepted at any telegraph or telephone office for transmission within the Dominion:—

(1) They must be written in plain English language. No code or cipher words are permitted. The use of a code address or a code signature is prohibited. Trade terms in general use, such as f.o.b., c.i.f., are permitted. Figures are permitted only in the address and signature. When required to be used in the text figures must be written in words.

(2) They may not be sent as "Urgent," "Collect," or as "Multiple" telegrams, and such instructions as "Reply paid," "Repetition paid," are not permitted. They will not be accepted by telephone, nor will they be accepted from Government Departments.

(3) They may be accepted throughout the day up to one hour of the time of closing of either the office of origin or destination, whichever is the earlier.

(4) They may not be accepted on Departmental holidays.

(5) The charge for a night letter telegram shall be one shilling and sixpence for the first thirty-six words or fraction thereof, and one halfpenny per word for each word in excess thereof.

(6) A night letter telegram shall not be delivered until the morning following the lodgment of the telegram.

IN cases where the establishment of full-time or of part-time schools is impracticable, itinerant teachers may, with the approval of the Minister, be appointed by an Education Board to give house-to-house instruction to pupils of school age in isolated districts; but no such teacher shall be appointed until suitable accommodation in the locality has been guaranteed for him.

2. Itinerant teachers shall give instruction for not less than twenty hours on not less than five days in each week.

3. Every itinerant teacher shall, when required, furnish the Senior Inspector with such evidence of the progress of his pupils as may be required.

4. An itinerant teacher shall receive a salary of £200 per annum, together with a travelling-allowance of £50 per annum, and such addition to salary payable in accordance with clause 2 of the regulations for the salaries of public-school teachers as for a teacher graded in Group I under the regulations for the grading of teachers. In the case of a married teacher house allowance at the rate of £30 per annum shall also be paid.

- (1.) This Order may be cited as the Western Samoa (Amendment) Order in Council, 1920, and shall be read and construed as one with the "Principal Order."
- (2.) Article (2) of the Principal Order shall be read as if the words "between the thirteenth and fifteenth degrees of south latitude" were substituted for the words "between the thirteenth and fourteenth degrees of south latitude."

The total births registered for the four metropolitan areas amounted to 775, as against 825 in November—a decrease of 50. The deaths in December were 364—a decrease of 67 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 199, females 165. Arrivals and Departures in 1920.

Census and Statistics Office, Wellington, 18th January, 1921.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1920, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1920 was 44,062, and the departures during the year numbered 32,924, the excess of arrivals over departures for the year being 11,138.

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 12,340 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 3,995 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 26,125 persons, and the departures thereto as 23,768 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 5,597 and 5,761 persons respectively.

Of the 44,062 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 6,216, or 14.11 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 32,924 departures the children numbered 3,479, or 10.56 per cent.

The arrivals and departures shown for the period 1914 to 1920 do not include members of the Expeditionary Forces.

Amendments and Additions to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the regulations made under the said Act on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the amendments thereof made from time to time under the provisions of the said Act, make the amendments shown in the Schedule hereto.

Such amendments shall have effect from and after the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATION 8B is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

"8B. Only work which the Commissioner considers special in its character, and which cannot be performed during the regular hours of duty, shall be regarded as overtime work for which extra payment may be made. Officers not working under close supervision or whose hours of duty cannot be definitely determined shall not be entitled to claim payment for overtime, nor shall any officer in receipt of salary exceeding £500 per annum be so entitled: Provided that the maximum amount payable in respect of overtime worked by an officer during any calendar month shall not exceed the difference between one-twelfth of his classified salary and one-twelfth of £500: Provided further that no payment for overtime shall be made to any officer in respect of any period during which he is in receipt of an allowance for performing higher duties, if the effect of such payment is to increase the total amount received by him for that period by way of classified salary, allowance, and payment for overtime in excess of a rate of £500 per annum. If an officer becomes entitled to payment of an allowance for performing higher duties in respect of any period for which he has received payment for overtime, any surplus received by him shall be deducted from the amount payable by way of allowance."

Regulation 8E is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

"RATE OF PAYMENT.

"8E. The following shall be the rate of payment for overtime, where such payment is sanctioned, and shall apply only to officers of the Professional and Clerical Divisions:—

"Overtime shall be calculated to the nearest quarter of an hour.

"Officers of the General Division whose cases are not met by special regulation in that behalf may be paid for overtime at such rate as may be fixed by the Commissioner from time to time."

The following new regulation is hereby made:—

"RELIEVING-ALLOWANCES.

"111B. Officers called upon to perform relieving duty which necessitates their absence at night from home shall be paid allowances at the following rates:—

To officers drawing salaries not exceeding £160: Actual and reasonable expenses.	Per Diem.
To officers drawing salaries exceeding £160 and not exceeding £320	s. d. 10 0
To officers drawing salaries exceeding £320 and not exceeding £500	12 6
To officers drawing salaries exceeding £500	15 0

"Officers entitled to lodging-allowance, when appointed to relieving duty involving separate payment for such duty, will not be entitled to

claim lodging-allowance for a longer time than one week after the relieving duty commences.

“Officers are not entitled to draw travelling-allowance for any time during which they perform relieving duty, except as follows: When in performing relieving duty an officer is not required to stay more than three nights in the place where such duty is performed, he may be paid travelling-allowance instead of relieving-allowance. But travelling-allowance may be paid for the day occupied in travelling to or from headquarters, provided that the time occupied exceeds six hours on each occasion.

“In any special case the Commissioner may authorize payment of an allowance at a higher rate.”

Regulation 117 is hereby amended by deleting the words “Officers receiving £400 a year and over, 2s. 6d.; under £400 a year, 1s. 6d.,” and substituting therefor the words “Officers receiving £450 a year and over, 2s. 6d.; under £450 a year, 2s.”

Regulation 209 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

“209. (1.) Every officer who performs the duties of a position of a higher class or grade than that in which he is classified for a period of not less than three consecutive months shall be granted, on the approval of the Commissioner, payment in addition to salary for the period during which he has continuously performed such duties at a rate equal to the difference between his salary and the minimum salary of the class immediately above that in which he is classified, or at such higher rate as the Commissioner shall think fit, but in no case at a rate less than £10 per annum.

“(2.) Where the performance of such higher duties by an officer has been intermittent, and amounts to four months in a period of twelve consecutive months, an allowance as provided in subclause (1) may be paid for the time during which such higher duties have been performed: Provided that each period of twelve consecutive months shall stand by itself, and shall not include any time for which an allowance has been paid under this regulation for the consecutive or intermittent performance of such higher duties in any preceding period of twelve consecutive months.

“(3.) An officer of the Seventh Class of the Clerical Division who is in receipt of a salary of not more than £160 per annum shall be deemed to be performing the duties of a position of a higher class or grade than that in which he is classified if he performs the duties ordinarily performed by an officer of the same class who is in receipt of a salary of not less than £250 per annum, and may be granted, on the approval of the Commissioner, and subject to the provisions of this regulation, payment in addition to salary at a rate of not more than £25 per annum: Provided that no such payment shall be authorized unless the Commissioner is satisfied that the duties so performed have been actually taken over by the officer claiming from an officer in receipt of a salary of not less than £250 per annum, and are such as are ordinarily allotted only to officers of the Seventh Class in receipt of salaries of not less than £250 per annum, and that such duties have been performed in a proper and efficient manner by the officer claiming payment of an allowance in respect thereof.

“(4.) In the case of an officer occupying a position of a higher class or grade than that in which he is classified, but not in fact performing all the duties of such position, he shall be entitled only to such allowance in addition to salary as the Commissioner shall determine.

“(5.) No officer shall, without the previous consent of the Commissioner, be assigned the duties of a higher class or grade, within the meaning of this regulation, for a longer period or periods, consecutively or intermittently, than two months in any period of twelve consecutive months as defined in subclause (2).

“(6.) If an officer who is performing the duties of a higher class or grade as aforesaid goes on ordinary leave, such leave shall not be deemed to interrupt the performance of such duties if the officer goes back to the same or similar higher duties on his return from leave. No payment in addition to his ordinary salary shall, however, be made to the officer in respect of the period during which he is on leave.

“(7.) Any officer who is performing the duties of a higher class or grade on the day on which this regulation first has effect may be paid an allowance, subject to the foregoing provisions, in respect of any then current period of not less than three consecutive months during which he has performed such higher duties; provided that

no payment shall, unless already payable under the regulation hereby revoked, be made for any part of such period which is more than three months prior to such first mentioned day. Any officer who performs such higher duties intermittently may, subject to the provisions of the preceding subclauses and to the foregoing proviso, include in his first period of twelve consecutive months any time during which he has performed such higher duties from and including the 1st day of April, 1920.

“(8.) In cases where an officer acts for a shorter period than those mentioned in the preceding subclauses of this regulation, and where the circumstances are shown to be of a special nature, the Commissioner may authorize payment of such amount as he considers proper.”

The tax should be paid on or before the prescribed date, otherwise the additional percentage accrues; any overpayment will be adjusted by refund.

The demands will be posted from the office of the Commissioner of Taxes on or about 31st January, 1921.
