WHEREAS by the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, it is, among other things, provided that an account shall be taken in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and in every fifth year thereafter, of the number and conditions of persons, and of the live-stock, and of the land in cultivation within New Zealand, and of other particulars relating thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is enacted that such account shall be taken by Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that such account shall be taken in the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, on Monday, the eighteenth day of the said month, and for the night of Sunday, the seventeenth day of the said month.

*License authorizing the Murchison County Council to use Water from the Six-mile Creek for the Purpose of generating Electricity, and to erect Electric Lines within Portion of the Murchison County.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of January, 1921.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the Murchison County Council (hereinafter, with its successors and assigns, referred to as "the licensee"), subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, a license to take and use from the Six-mile Creek in the Nelson Land District (hereinafter referred to as "the said creek"), for the purposes

hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding thirty cubic feet per second at any one time; and also to erect and maintain electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses within the area of supply hereinafter described; and subject to the regulations dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations"), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein; but nothing herein shall be held to guarantee that the said creek contains sufficient water to supply the thirty cubic feet per second hereinbefore mentioned.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### 1. PLANS.

The licensee shall, before the works hereby authorized are commenced, forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

- (a.) Full detailed drawings and specifications of the diverting weir and dam.
- (b.) Drawings showing how and in what manner the water diverted is to be returned to the said creek.
- (c.) Contour-plan showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks.

##### 2. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be returned to the said creek at or near the power-house.

##### 3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the said creek, at the headworks situated in Section 7, Block IX, Tutaki Survey District, at a point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 49684, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington.

##### 4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license; the position of the said works being indicated on the plans marked P.W.D. 49140, 49683, and 49684, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington:—

- (a.) Headworks consisting of a weir and necessary intake.
- (b.) A race and pipe-line leading from such weir to the power-house hereinafter referred to.
- (c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switch-boards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.
- (d.) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown by means of yellow and green lines on the said plans marked P.W.D. 49683 and 49140.
- (e.) Such further transmission and other lines within the area of supply as may from time to time be required within such area of supply, and after compliance with the provisions of clause 48 of the regulations.

##### 5. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

##### 6. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

##### 7. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in, or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the generating-stations and any of the substations to which this license applies.

##### 8. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

##### 9. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine;

but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

##### 10. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental at the rate of 1s. per annum per kilowatt of maximum output, as recorded by the wattmeter to be installed by the licensee at the power-house mentioned in clause 4 (c) hereof, payment to be made yearly for the period ending on the 31st day of March in each year, commencing from the day electrical power is first supplied. "Maximum output" means twice the number of units generated in the half-hour during which the number of units generated is a maximum for the year. For this purpose the units generated shall be recorded at the end of each half-hour commencing from noon of each day. The minimum rental shall be not less than £10 per annum.

##### 11. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said creek, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said creek.

##### 12. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

##### 13. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment or compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

##### 14. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. 3d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes; provided also that if accounts are paid within fourteen days after due date the charges shall not exceed 1s. and 4½d. respectively.

##### 15. AREA OF SUPPLY.

The area of supply comprises portion of the Murchison County, comprising Blocks XV and XVI, Lyell Survey District, Blocks XIII and XIV, Matiri Survey District, Blocks III and IV, Maruia Survey District, and Blocks I, II, V, VI, IX, and X, Tutaki Survey District, as indicated by a distinctive border coloured red on the said plan marked P.W.D. 49140.

##### 16. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (e) of clause 3 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 3,300 volts between the terminals.

##### 17. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

##### 18. COMPENSATION PAYABLE FOR LAND INJURIOUSLY AFFECTED, ETC.

In respect of all land injuriously affected, and in respect of all damage done by the exercise of any of the powers conferred upon the licensee by this license, the licensee shall from time to time, as and when any such injury or damage accrues or happens, pay compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, in the same manner (subject to all necessary modifications) as if such licensee were a local authority and the claim was one for injury or damage arising out of the construction of a public work.

##### 19. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to cast upon or imply any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any

person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

#### 20. CONSUMERS ENTITLED TO SUPPLY.

The licensee shall supply and sell to any person, company, or corporate body within the area of supply requiring the same, for any purpose within that area, electricity to the extent to which it may be available; provided that such person, company, or corporate body pays the cost of connecting his or its premises with the transmission-line erected by the licensee in pursuance of this license, or alternatively pays a line rental at a rate not exceeding 6 per cent. on the cost of such connecting line together with any additional transmission-line required to supply such person, company, or corporate body.

#### 21. BED OF CREEK NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the said creek, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

#### 22. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced as a contract by and against His said Majesty or the licensee accordingly.

#### 23. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORKS.

The licensee shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of three years from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lock-outs, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the licensee.

#### 24. DEFAULT.

If the licensee fails or neglects to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 50 and 51 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

*Prescribing Dues for the Use of Messrs. Elliot and Waller's Wharf, Tamaki River, Auckland Harbour.*

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of January, 1921.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 135, of the twenty-fifth day of the same month, Edward Glenlivet Elliot and Frederick Waller, of Auckland (hereinafter called "the licensees"), were licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark in Tamaki River, Auckland Harbour, as shown on plan marked M.D. 4495, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect thereon a wharf, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for a term of fourteen years computed from the twenty-second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen: And whereas it is considered expedient to prescribe dues and rates to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the Harbours Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*, be charged and taken by the licensees for the use of the said wharf.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

EVERY person who shall use the said wharf with any vessel shall pay for the use thereof as follows, that is to say:—

For every vessel a sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day for each day or part of a day a vessel shall occupy a berth alongside any vessel lying at the said wharf, or shall lie at the said wharf undergoing repairs or fitting out only, or shall lie off the said wharf with a line attached thereto.

##### GOODS WHARFAGE.

Every person who shall use the said wharf for landing or shipping any goods shall, before using same, pay dues as follows, that is to say:—

1. For all goods landed on the said wharf, a rate of 2s. 6d. per ton weight or measurement, at the option of the licensees.

2. For every head of cattle or horses landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, 2s. 6d. per head.

3. For every yearling or calf so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 1s. per head.

4. For every head of sheep or small cattle so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 6d. per head.

5. If any ship shall use the said wharf for the discharge of any goods or cargo after the usual working-hours or on wharf holidays, such ship shall pay to the licensees for the use of the said wharf a charge at the rate of 1s. per ton on all goods or cargo so discharged from such ship.

This charge will only be made when, in the opinion of the Wharfinger, it is necessary to employ labour to stack or remove cargo in sheds in consequence of the discharge of such goods or cargo as aforesaid.

##### PASSENGERS.

For every passenger who shall land on or be shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 1s.

##### GOODS STORAGE.

Any person storing goods on wharf or in shed may be charged for such goods at the following rates:—

For every package or parcel—

Not exceeding 30 lb. in weight, per day or part of a day .. s. d. 0 1

Exceeding 30 lb. but not exceeding 100 lb., per day or part of a day .. 0 2

Exceeding 100 lb. but not exceeding 5 cwt., per day or part of a day .. 0 3

Exceeding 5 cwt., per day or part of a day .. 0 6

Storage to be charged on the expiration of twelve hours after goods have been landed on the wharf.

*Regulations under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, amended.*

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of January, 1921.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby further amend the regulations under the said Act dated the fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and published in the *Gazette* of the thirteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

#### SCHEDULE.

THE regulations hereinbefore referred to are hereby further amended as follows:—

1. The following new regulation is hereby inserted after regulation 18, namely:—

"18A. The Clerk or the Commissioner shall give not less than seven days public notice by advertisement in such newspaper or newspapers circulating in the locality, as he thinks fit, of the day and place appointed for the hearing of a dispute and of the nature thereof."

2. Regulation 79, as amended by Orders in Council dated the 21st day of May, 1918, and the 8th day of July, 1919, respectively, and published in the *Gazette* on the 6th day of June, 1918, and the 17th day of July, 1919, respectively, is hereby revoked, and the following regulation is substituted therefor:—

"79. (1.) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations contained, all notices and other documents required to be served in pursuance of these regulations may be effectively served by delivering the same personally or by sending the same by registered letter or through the ordinary course of the post to the last known residence or place of business of the person, or to the registered office

of the industrial union or association, as the case may be, upon which service is to be effected, or, except in the case of a first citation in any matter, by advertisement in such daily newspaper or newspapers circulating in the district affected as the Clerk of Awards in each case shall deem sufficient, and in such last-mentioned case the Clerk of Awards may make such amendments to the prescribed forms as shall be necessary for the purpose of service by advertisement.

"(2.) ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of January, 1921.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the Government Accident Insurance Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made on the twenty-second day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, prescribing the rates of premium to be charged to employers for insurance against their liabilities under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1908, and its amendments, and at common law in respect to accidents to workers employed by them, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations; and doth hereby order that this present Order in Council shall be read with the Order in Council made under the said Act on the nineteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and shall take effect on and after the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

SCHEDULE.

(b.) EMPLOYERS' POLICY.

Table S.

For all policies effected or renewed on or after the 1st day of February, 1921, the rates of premium shall be computed upon the amount spent in wages, and shall be fixed by the Commissioner, having regard to the nature of the risk; provided, nevertheless, as follows:—

(a.) In the case of each policy the minimum premium shall not exceed 10s., except in certain hazardous occupations to be from time to time determined by the Commissioner.

(b.) Subject to the aforesaid minimum, the premium shall not exceed in respect of every £100 or fraction thereof paid in wages the rate shown in the subjoined table; according to the category in which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, the risk should be classified.

*Regulations under the Opium Act, 1908, and the Treaties of Peace Act, 1919.*

JELlicoe, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of January, 1921.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Opium Act, 1908, and by the Treaties of Peace Act, 1919, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the Opium Act, 1908, on the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and gazetted on the twenty-seventh day of the same month, and doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context, the term—

“Importer and exporter” means the holder of a permit under these regulations to import and export opium, morphine, heroine, cocaine or the salts thereof, or preparations containing the same :

“Minister” means the Minister of Customs :

“The said Act” means the Opium Act, 1908, and its amendments :

“Opium” includes raw opium, prepared opium, opium in powder, solid extract of opium, solutions or liquids containing opium, moist or semi-liquid preparations containing opium, or opium in mixture with other substances, provided that no preparation containing 0·2 per cent. of morphine or less shall be regarded as opium :

“Morphine” means the principal alkaloid of opium having the chemical formula  $C_{17}H_{19}NO_3$ , and salts and preparations containing the same ; provided that no salt or preparation containing 0·2 per cent. of morphine or less shall be regarded as morphine :

“Heroin” means diacetyl-morphine having the chemical formula  $C_{21}H_{23}NO_5$ , and salts and preparations containing the same ; provided that no salt or preparation containing 0·1 per cent. of heroine or less shall be regarded as heroine :

“Cocaine” means the principal alkaloid of the leaves of *Erythroxylon coca* having the chemical formula  $C_{17}H_{21}NO_4$ , and salts and preparations containing the same ; provided that no salt or preparations containing 0·1 per cent. of cocaine or less shall be regarded as cocaine.

2. No person shall import into or export from New Zealand opium, morphine, heroine, or cocaine without a permit from the Minister of Customs.

3. Every applicant for a permit shall apply therefor in writing to the Minister, and shall forward his application to the Comptroller of Customs at Wellington.

4. On receipt of any such application the Minister shall, if satisfied as to the character of the applicant and as to his fitness to be the holder of a permit, issue to the applicant a permit in the form numbered 1 in the Schedule hereto.

5. Subject to the provisions of the said Act and its amendments and to these regulations, it shall be lawful for the holder of a permit to import or to export opium, morphine, heroine, and cocaine ; provided that in every case where exportation is to take place at least forty-eight hours' notice shall be given to the Collector of Customs before any of the before-mentioned drugs are packed for export.

6. The Collector of Customs may provisionally veto the exportation of any opium, morphine, heroine, or cocaine wherever on any grounds he is not satisfied as to the purpose of such exportation or as to the ultimate destination thereof. Wherever such veto is exercised the circumstances shall be reported to the Minister for confirmation of the veto or otherwise.

7. In judging of the propriety of exercising any veto of exportation the Minister and the Collector shall take into consideration the terms of Article thirteen of the “International Opium Convention” signed at the Hague on 23rd January, 1912, which reads as follows :—

“The Contracting Powers shall use their best endeavours to adopt, or cause to be adopted, measures to ensure that morphine, cocaine, and their respective salts shall not be exported from their countries, possessions, colonies, and leased territories to the countries, possessions, colonies, and leased territories of the other Contracting Powers except when consigned to persons furnished with the licenses or permits provided for by the laws or regulations of the importing country.

“With this object each Government may communicate from time to time to the Governments of the exporting countries lists of the persons to whom licenses or permits for the import of morphine, cocaine, and their respective salts have been granted.”

8. For the purpose of the Opium Act, 1908, and its amendments, the following articles are declared to be opium in a form which though not suitable for smoking may yet be made suitable for smoking : Opium crude, opium in powder, solid extract of opium, opium in mixture with other substances (if such mixture may be made suitable for smoking), liquid extract of opium, tincture of opium, sedative liquor of opium, wine of opium, or moist or semi-liquid preparations containing opium, which are in a form which may be made suitable for smoking. The articles hereinbefore enumerated shall be included within the definition of “opium” for all the purposes of these regulations.

9. Every importer and exporter shall keep a book in the form numbered 2 in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the O.M.H.C. Book), and shall enter or cause to be entered therein the particulars indicated in that form with respect to all opium, morphine, heroine, or cocaine imported or exported by him ; provided that where an importer and exporter sells, exports, or otherwise disposes of any article or goods imported or exported by him in pursuance of his permit for export or to a registered medical practitioner, a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, a registered chemist, a manufacturing chemist, a Hospital Board, or a dentist, the licensee or manager of a private hospital, or such other person as the Minister may approve, it shall not be necessary to obtain the signature of the purchaser or other person to whom those articles or goods are so sold or disposed of.

10. Before making any other entries in his O.M.H.C. Book, the importer and exporter shall enter therein the prescribed particulars (so far as applicable) as to all opium, morphine, heroine, or cocaine which he may have in his possession on the date of the issue of the permit.

11. On the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September in each year the importer and exporter shall take stock, and shall balance his O.M.H.C. Book ; in the event of the amount of opium, morphine, heroine, or cocaine as shown by the book failing to correspond with the amount actually in stock, the importer and exporter shall enter in his book his explanation of the cause of the discrepancy, and shall sign the same.

12. The importer and exporter shall, at all reasonable times, on request so to do, produce for inspection all books kept by him under these regulations to the Collector or other officer of Customs, or to any constable, or to any other person appointed by the Minister in that behalf ; and shall permit any such person to examine and take stock of all opium, morphine, heroine, and cocaine in his possession ; and shall truly answer any questions put to him with reference to the entries in the said books or as to any opium, morphine, heroine, and cocaine imported or exported by him or in his possession.

13. The Collector or other officer of Customs may at any time demand samples of any goods in the possession of an importer and exporter, or in possession of any other person where he believes or suspects that such goods are held in

possession in breach of the Opium Act, 1908, or its amendments, or in breach of these regulations.

14. Where the Collector or other officer of Customs demands samples as aforesaid he shall offer a reasonable price for the quantity he requires and selects, not being more than is reasonably necessary for the purpose of analysis, and if the owner or the person having custody of the goods refuses to sell the same to the Collector or other officer of Customs, or refuses to permit the said Collector or officer to examine the contents of any vessel for the purpose of selection, such owner or person shall be liable to a penalty of £50.

15. Where the Collector or other officer of Customs purchases samples as provided for in the preceding regulation he shall, after the purchase has been completed, forthwith notify the owner or person having custody of the goods of his intention to have the same analysed, and shall offer to divide the sample into three parts, each to be then and there marked and sealed, and shall, if required to do so, proceed accordingly, and shall deliver one of such parts to the owner or the person having custody of the goods.

16. If the importer and exporter, by himself or his agent, commits any breach of the preceding regulations, his permit may thereupon be cancelled by the Minister, and he shall, in addition, be liable to a penalty of £50, and shall forfeit to the Collector of Customs as a further penalty all opium, morphine, heroine, and cocaine in his possession, and the said goods shall be disposed of as in the case of goods seized and condemned under the Customs Acts.

DISPOSAL OF OPIUM PURCHASED FROM AN IMPORTER AND EXPORTER.

17. Every person who, for the purpose of sale or manufacture, purchases or receives opium from the holder of any permit under these regulations shall keep a book in the form numbered 3 in the Schedule hereto (to be called the Retailer's Opium Book), and shall enter or cause to be entered therein the particulars indicated in that form with respect to all opium so purchased or received by him.

18. Regulations numbered 10, 11, and 12 hereof shall, with the necessary modifications, apply to persons who receive opium from any importer and exporter for the purpose of sale or manufacture.

19. No person (other than an importer and exporter who disposes of opium to the persons or classes of persons enumerated in the proviso to regulation 9 hereof) shall during any period of seven days sell or purchase opium to or from any other person in larger quantities in the aggregate than—

Of opium in solution or liquid form not containing more dry extractive matter than 6 per cent. when evaporated for two hours on a steam bath: One fluid ounce.

Of opium in any other form: 20 grains.

20. Nothing in the last preceding regulation shall apply—

(a.) To the sale of any medicine containing opium compounded by or furnished to the order of a registered medical practitioner or a duly qualified veterinary surgeon in the course of his business; or

b.) To the sale of opium, during any period of seven days, to a registered medical practitioner, a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, a dentist, or a Hospital Board in quantities not greater in the aggregate than—

Of opium in solution or liquid form not containing more dry extractive matter than 6 per cent. when evaporated for two hours on a steam bath: Sixteen fluid ounces.

Of opium in any other form: One ounce avoirdupois.

Provided that in the case of such sales of opium the signature of the purchaser shall be obtained.

21. Every person who is convicted of a breach of the regulations numbered 17 to 19 shall be liable to a penalty of £50, and shall forfeit to the Collector of Customs as a further penalty all opium in his possession, and such opium shall be disposed of as in the case of goods seized and condemned under the Customs Acts.

*Regulations under the Census and Statistics Act, 1910.*

WHEREAS it is enacted by section thirty-five of the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, that the Governor-General may from time to time make all such regulations, consistent with the said Act, as are necessary or expedient for giving effect to the said Act : And whereas it is expedient to make such regulations accordingly :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me as aforesaid, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing certain additional matter which shall be entered upon the Householders Census Schedule ; and do hereby declare that these regulations shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. In addition to the matters specified in the First Schedule of the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, the Statistician shall cause to be entered upon the Householders Census Schedule questions in relation to the following matters :—

- (a.) In the case of a married man, widower, or widow, the number, sexes, and ages of all his or her living children, including step-children and children by adoption.
- (b.) Manner in which nationality acquired.
- (c.) Whether life insured, and amount of capital sum assured (if any).

- (f.) In the case of households situated outside city, borough, or town district boundaries, the name of the township or locality in which the dwelling is situated, the post-office commonly used, and the distance from such post-office.
- (g.) Particulars in regard to bees and the production of honey and beeswax.

2. (a.) The extent to which the Government should contribute towards the net maintenance requirements of Hospital Boards in the Dominion.

(b.) The basis of allocation of any such contribution amongst the individual Boards.

3. The extent to which the Government should continue to subsidize voluntary contributions.

4. The extent to which the Government should contribute towards the funds of separate institutions under the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act.

B

5. The extent to which the Government should make grants in aid of various charitable societies and institutions.

6. The fees that should be charged for maintenance and treatment in public hospitals.

7. The present method of allocation of representation of contributory local authorities and the ratepayers on Hospital Boards, having regard also to the nature of the suffrage.

8. The desirability, or otherwise, of providing for Government representation upon Hospital Boards by means of nominated members.

9. The constitution and area of the present hospital districts, and whether the present grouping of local authorities in the various districts is the best and fairest method of distributing the cost of the base hospitals throughout the Dominion amongst the various local authorities.

10. Generally as to any matters in connection with hospitals or charitable aid which may be referred to it by the Hon. the Minister of Public Health.

And, with the like advice and consent, I do further appoint you the said DOWNIE STEWART to be the Chairman of the said Commission.

And, for the better enabling you the said Commission to carry these presents into effect, you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under those presents at such times and places in the said Dominion as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath, or otherwise as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you think capable of affording you information in the premises, and you are also hereby empowered to call for and examine all such books, papers, plans, documents, or records as you deem likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject-matter of the inquiry hereby directed to be made, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all lawful means whatsoever.

And, using all diligence, you are required to report to me, under your hands and seals, not later than the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, your opinion as to the aforesaid matters.

And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry is not regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournment.

*By-laws of the Taumarunui Fire Board.*

THE following by-laws, made by the Taumarunui Fire Board, are published in accordance with the Fire Brigades Act, 1908.

TAUMARUNUI FIRE BOARD BY-LAWS.

By virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it in that behalf by section 43 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, the Taumarunui Fire Board hereby makes the following by-laws:—

INTERPRETATION CLAUSES.

In these by-laws, except where inconsistent with the context or when otherwise expressly provided,—

“Board” means the Taumarunui Fire Board elected and appointed under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908:

“Brigade” means the Taumarunui Fire Brigade established and enrolled under the provisions of these by-laws:

“District” means the Taumarunui Fire District as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 36, of the 8th day of April, 1920:

“Secretary” means the Secretary appointed by the Taumarunui Fire Board:

“Superintendent” and “Deputy Superintendent” means respectively the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent of the Taumarunui Fire Brigade appointed by the Taumarunui Fire Board:

“Street” means any public or private street, and includes public places:

“The Act” means the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, and any amendment thereof:

“Petroleum” means petroleum as defined by the Explosive and Dangerous Goods Act, 1908:

“Inspector” means the Inspector of the Taumarunui Fire Board who shall from time to time be appointed:

“Inflammable material” means and includes empty crates, cases, and other packages, shavings, hay, straw, and other inflammable substances.

ESTABLISHMENT.

1. The brigade shall consist of a Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent, with such other officers as the Board may from time to time determine; and not more than sixteen firemen, with such number of auxiliaries as the Board may from time to time determine.

ENROLMENT.

2. Candidates for enrolment as members of the brigade must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight. They must not be less than eighteen years of age nor more than forty-four years of age, unless they have previously and recently been engaged as active and efficient firemen or are otherwise thoroughly competent. They may be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They may be required to undergo a medical examination by such duly qualified medical practitioner as the Board may appoint. Members of the brigade acting in that capacity on the coming into force of this by-law shall be exempted from these requirements.

APPLICATION FOR ENROLMENT.

3. Applications for enrolment must be made on the form set out and printed by the Board, and applicants shall only be enrolled as members of the brigade on their application being approved by the Board.

PROBATION.

4. Candidates when approved will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which shall be three months. If at the end of that term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, and shall at a meeting of the brigade receive an affirmative vote of not less than three-fifths of the members there present, his acceptance as an enrolled member shall be confirmed by the Board.

5. Members of the brigade are subject to the provisions of clause 4 hereof, enrolled for service from year to year, subject to one month's notice on either side, except as herein-after provided.

APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION OF OFFICERS.

6. The appointment of Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent shall be made by the Board as provided by section 30 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, due consideration being given in each case to the claims of men already in the service of the Board. Such appointments may be terminated by one month's notice on either side.

RETIRING-AGE.

7. The age at which members of the brigade must retire from the brigade shall be as follows: Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent, sixty-five years; firemen, fifty-five years; but the Board may, if it thinks fit in any special case, extend these limits.

CARE OF UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT.

8. Uniforms and equipment of a pattern and design approved by the Board shall be issued to members of the brigade on enrolment, but shall remain the property of the Board.

9. On discharge from the Board's service either by resignation or dismissal each member must return to the Secretary, in good order and condition (fair wear-and-tear excepted) every article of clothing or equipment the property of the Board which may be on issue to him; in the event of his failing to do so the cost of any article of clothing not returned, or returned in a damaged condition, shall be charged to such member and deducted from any pay or money that may be due to such member, or recovered by process of law.

PLANT NOT TO BE REMOVED WITHOUT PERMISSION.

10. Except for the purposes of answering any alarm of fire or false alarm, or for *bona fide* brigade practices ordered by the Superintendent, no plant or appliance of any kind shall be removed from the brigade premises unless such person removing same shall have first received the permission of the Superintendent so to do. Any person removing any plant or appliance without such permission as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

THE SUPERINTENDENT.

11. The duties and powers of the Superintendent, in addition to those conferred on him by the Act, shall be as follows:—

(1.) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the brigade and all gear used in its service.

(2.) He shall have power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must at once report such suspension to the Board. The member so suspended may appeal to the Board, which may hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member may be present and have the right to speak in his defence and, if he so desires, to bring witnesses in support of such defence.

(3.) He shall keep an Order-book, in which from time to time all orders affecting the working of the brigade shall be entered. Such Order-book, or a copy of the orders therein, shall be available for inspection by members of the brigade at all times.

(4.) He shall allot such duties to the members of the brigade as he may deem necessary for ensuring the efficiency thereof, and may draw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.

(5.) He shall keep a Service-record Book containing the names, occupation, places of birth, dates of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the brigade, with awards and punishments by the Board, in a proper manner.

(6.) He shall perform any other duty in connection with his position which the Board may from time to time assign to him.

FIREMAN TO TAKE CHARGE IN OFFICERS' ABSENCE.

12. In the event of the absence of all of the Board's officers at any fire or false alarm of fire, the senior fireman there present shall take charge of the brigade.

DISCIPLINE.

13. A member of the brigade guilty of any of the following offences whilst on duty in the Board's service shall be liable to suspension from duty by the Superintendent:—

(a.) Being in an intoxicated condition.

(b.) Disobeying any lawful order of his superior officer.

(c.) Using abusive or insubordinate language to his superior officer.

(d.) Striking his superior officer.

(e.) Using obscene language.

14. A member of the brigade committing either of the following offences shall be suspended, and reported to the Board by the Superintendent:—

(a.) Wilfully damaging any portion of the brigade premises or other the property of the Board.

(b.) Absenting himself without sufficient excuse from any drill or practice ordered by the Superintendent, or from any false alarm of fire.

15. No member of the brigade shall under any circumstances write any letters or furnish any information to the Press on matters connected with the Board or brigade, save that in the event of no superior officer being present the senior firemen on duty may give particulars regarding any fire which has been attended by the brigade.

## LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

16. Leave of absence for any period not exceeding fourteen days may, on the application of a member of the brigade, be granted by the Superintendent, who shall record the same in his Occurrence-book. Any member of the brigade desiring leave of absence for a longer period than fourteen days shall apply in writing addressed to the Superintendent, who shall forward such application to the Secretary of the Board, with such recommendation as he may think fit, and leave of absence for such longer period shall only be granted by the Board.

## BRIGADE MAY MAKE RULES.

17. Subject to the approval of the Board, and provided they in no way conflict with these by-laws, the brigade may make rules and regulations for its own government.

## GRATUITIES FOR VOLUNTEER AND OTHER SERVICES.

18. For the performance of any volunteer or special services rendered by any person, whether a member of the brigade or not, in respect of any fire, there may be paid out of the funds of the Board such sum as the Board, or any committee authorized by the Board, may direct.

## ELECTRIC FIRE-ALARM CIRCUITS.

19. The Board may establish or contract with any person or Corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm circuit, and may from time to time extend such circuit and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings or premises. All connections of alarms installed in public or private buildings or premises, or any alterations to same, shall be carried out to the approval of the Board at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected, and the cost of maintenance and of the periodical examination and testing of such connections shall be borne by the owner of the property connected, and all such connections shall be efficiently maintained to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner, such cost may be commuted to the payment of such annual sum as may be agreed on between the Board and such owner.

## DONATIONS IN RECOGNITION OF THE BRIGADE'S SERVICES.

20. Donations by the public in recognition of the brigade's services shall be the property of the brigade, and shall be used in providing for the comfort and recreation of the members thereof, or otherwise for the benefit of the members of the brigade.

## MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AND GOOD CONDUCT ON THE PART OF THE OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE BRIGADE.

21. No person shall interfere with or in any way obstruct any officer or member of the brigade while such officer or member of the brigade is in the execution of his duty.

22. No person shall interfere with or obstruct any volunteer described in section 18 of these by-laws while such volunteer is in the execution of his duty.

23. No person shall aid, abet, or encourage any member of the brigade in any act of disobedience of orders, or insubordination, or in the use of abusive or obscene language while such member is on duty.

24. No person shall supply any intoxicating liquor to any officer or member of the brigade while such member or officer shall be on duty, unless he shall first have received from the officer in charge of the brigade at the time permission so to do.

25. No person other than a member of the Board or its Secretary, or members of the brigade, shall enter any fire-station controlled by the Board unless such person shall first have received permission to do so from the officer in charge of the station or a member of the brigade; and no person shall, after having been requested by the officer in charge of the station to leave any such station, remain in any such station or on or about the station premises.

26. No person other than an officer of the brigade, or a member thereof, or the wife or child of such officer or member, shall sleep in or on any station or in any of the Board's premises without first having received the written permission of the Superintendent to do so.

## PREVENTION OF FIRE.

27. No person other than a person licensed by the Taumarunui Borough Council to keep petroleum for sale shall keep in stock within the Taumarunui Fire District more than 12 gallons of petroleum except in a magazine or such other structure as may be approved by the Inspector. Such magazine or other structure shall, unless constructed in brick or other similar material, be placed not less than 20 ft. from any other building.

28. No person licensed by the Taumarunui Borough Council to store petroleum for sale shall store petroleum within the Taumarunui Fire District except in a magazine or such other structure as may be approved by the Inspector,

29. No such magazine or other structure mentioned in sections 27 and 28 hereof shall be used for the storage of petroleum until the person occupying such magazine or other structure shall have received a certificate in writing from the Inspector that such magazine or other structure is suitable for the storage of petroleum, and any person using any such magazine or other structure for the storage of petroleum without having first received a certificate as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

30. All buildings used for the storage of petroleum shall be kept securely locked, and any person having the control of any such building and failing to securely lock such building shall be guilty of an offence.

31. Any person, whether licensed by the Taumarunui Borough Council or not, who shall store petroleum within the Taumarunui Fire District, shall deposit with the Secretary of the Taumarunui Fire Board a plan of the building or buildings wherein such petroleum is stored, showing on such plan the exact position in such building or buildings where such petroleum shall be deposited.

32. Any person leaving any inflammable material on any part of such person's premises, and who shall, after having been requested by the Inspector to remove such inflammable material, fail to remove such inflammable material within forty-eight hours from the receipt of such notice, shall be guilty of an offence.

## IN RESPECT OF FIRES OUTSIDE THE TAUMARUNUI FIRE DISTRICT.

33. If any brigade or portion of a brigade established and maintained by the Board within the Taumarunui Fire District attends or performs any service at a fire on any premises outside the Fire District of Taumarunui at the request of the owner or occupier of such premises, then such owner or occupier shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service at the undermentioned rates:—

For first hour or portion thereof: £5.

For each succeeding hour: £2 10s.

For each fire appliance: £2.

## FINANCE COMMITTEE.

34. A committee shall be appointed from time to time by the Board, which shall exercise supervision in all matters relating to the finances of the Board. This committee shall be known as the Finance Committee, and shall pay all accounts included in the then current year's estimate of expenditure, and in an emergency shall be empowered to authorize payment of any amount not exceeding £20 not included in such estimate.

## PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS.

35. All payments shall be made by cheques upon the Board's bankers, signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the Board. In the absence of the Chairman such cheques may be signed by any member of the Finance Committee and the Secretary.

## COMMON SEAL.

36. The common seal of the Board shall be in the custody of the Secretary, and shall not be affixed to any document except by order of the Board as recorded in the minute-book, and shall only be affixed in the presence of at least two members of the Board, and every document bearing such seal shall be signed by two members of the Board and its Secretary.

## NOTICES OF MOTION.

37. Any member of the Board may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be numbered and dated and given in writing to the Secretary at least seven clear days previous to the meeting at which such notice of motion is to be considered.

## PENALTY CLAUSE.

38. Every person guilty of an offence against, or committing any breach of, or failing to perform any duty imposed upon any such person by any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be liable for such offence, breach, or failure to such fine not exceeding £20 as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit.

The foregoing by-laws were made by the Taumarunui Fire Board at a duly constituted meeting of the said Board held on 9th December, 1920.

WELLINGTON RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Wellington Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 29th day of September, 1916, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of Trentham, and known as the Trentham Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908
