WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the eighteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, regulations were made under the Dairy Industry Act, 1898, providing for the grading of dairy-produce: And whereas it is desirable to prescribe fees for such grading: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Dairy Industry Act, 1908, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations prescribing fees for the grading of dairy-produce; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE fee for grading butter shall be 1d. per box of butter of the standard size.
2. The fee for grading cheese shall be 1½d. per crate of cheese.
3. (1.) In the case of butter or cheese forwarded for export from a registered factory, creamery, or private dairy the fee shall be payable by the manufacturer on demand.  
(2.) In the case of butter or cheese not included in (1) the fee shall be payable by the owner on demand.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, and the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the licenses issued to the Thames Borough Council on the twentieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and doth hereby grant to the Thames Borough Council (hereinafter, with its successors and assigns, referred to as "the licensee")—subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to the regulations dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations"), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—a license to take and use from the Thames County Water-race, in the Land District of Auckland (hereinafter referred to as the "said race"), for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding twenty cubic feet per second at any one time; and also to erect and maintain electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses within the area of supply hereinafter described; and the lines already erected in pursuance of the licenses hereby revoked shall be deemed to be erected under this license, and the provisions hereof shall apply as fully and effectively as if this were the license originally issued.

## 1. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity.

## 2. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the 30 in. water-main from the Thames County Water-race near the junction of Bella Street and Reservoir Road in the Borough of Thames at the point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 38431, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

## 3. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license; the position of the said works being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 38431 hereinbefore referred to.

- (a.) Pipe-line leading from the said race to the power-house hereinafter referred to.
- (b.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.
- (c.) No bare wires shall be deemed to be authorized by this license. If the licensee desires to use bare wires, the licensee shall obtain the consent of the Minister of Public Works thereto in accordance with the provisions of the regulations.
- (d.) Electric lines over the routes shown by means of red and blue lines on the plan marked P.W.D. 48819, deposited in the office of the Minister aforesaid.

(e.) Such further electric lines within the area of supply as may from time to time be required within such area of supply, and after compliance with the provisions of clause 48 of the regulations.

## 4. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

## 5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

## 6. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the generating-stations and any of the substations to which this license applies.

## 7. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

## 8. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

## 9. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental of one peppercorn per annum if demanded.

## 10. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the Kauaeranga Stream except at the place where water is taken for the Thames County Water-race; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water in the Thames County Water-race.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment or compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

## 12. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

## 13. AREA OF SUPPLY.

The area of supply comprises the Borough of Thames as at present constituted, as indicated by a distinctive border coloured yellow on the plan marked P.W.D. 48819 hereinbefore referred to.

## 14. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (b) (1) of clause 3 of the regulations.  
The generating voltage shall be approximately 480 volts between the terminals.

## 15. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 22 degrees Fahrenheit.



16. COMPENSATION PAYABLE FOR LAND INJURIOUSLY AFFECTED, ETC.

In respect of all land injuriously affected, and in respect of all damages done by the exercise of any of the powers conferred upon the licensee by this license, the licensee shall from time to time, as and when any such injury or damage accrues or happens, pay compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, in the same manner (subject to all necessary modifications) as if such claim was one for injury or damage arising out of the construction of a public work.

17. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to cast upon or imply any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

18. CONSUMERS ENTITLED TO SUPPLY.

The licensee shall supply and sell to any person, company, or corporate body within the area of supply requiring the same, for any purpose within that area, electricity to the extent to which it may be available; provided that such person, company, or corporate body pays the cost of connecting his or its premises with the transmission-line erected by the licensee in pursuance of this license, or alternatively pays a line rental at a rate not exceeding 6 per cent. on the cost of such connecting line together with any additional transmission-line required to supply such person, company, or corporate body.

19. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced as a contract by and against His said Majesty or the licensee accordingly.

20. DEFAULT.

If the licensee fails or neglects to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 50 and 51 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

21. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Auckland, this 26th day of January, 1921.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council grant to any person or body corporate a license to use water from any fall, river, stream, or other source for the purpose of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, or other uses, and to exercise in respect of that purpose any of the powers and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section: And whereas it is further provided by the said section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a right at any time or times during the continuance of the license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as are expressed in the license) to enter upon any road, railway, or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the fall, river, stream, or other source aforesaid and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of the license:

And whereas Kanieri Electric (Limited), (hereinafter, with its successors and assigns, referred to as "the licensee") holds a water-race license under the Mining Act, 1908, to take and use water from the Kanieri Lake, in the Land District of Westland (hereinafter referred to as "the said lake"), for

the purposes therein specified, and has applied for a license under the above-recited section five to also take and use the said water for the purpose of generating electricity as aforesaid, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of the powers conferred by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee (subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto) a license to take and use from the said lake, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding fifty cubic feet per second at any one time; and also to erect and maintain electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses along the routes and within the area of supply hereinafter described, and subject also to the regulations dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations"), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein.

SCHEDULE.

1. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water shall be used under this license for the purpose of generating electricity, and, except one head supplied to Hokitika Borough Council, shall be returned to the Kanieri River at or near the power-house.

2. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the said lake at the headworks, situated at Kanieri Lake, in Block XI, Kanieri Survey District, at a point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 48198, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

3. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 48198 hereinbefore referred to and on the plans marked P.W.D. 46770 and 50108, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District.

- (a.) Headworks consisting of a weir and necessary intake.
- (b.) Race, penstock, and pipe-line leading from such weir to the power-house hereinafter referred to; also tail race from the power-house to the Kanieri River.
- (c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.
- (d.) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown by means of red and blue lines on the said plan marked P.W.D. 46770, with the exception of the blue lines shown in the Westland County area.
- (e.) Such further transmission and other lines within the area of supply as may from time to time be required within such area of supply, and after compliance with the provisions of clause 48 of the regulations.

4. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

5. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

6. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the generating-stations and any of the substations to which this license applies.

7. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable

the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

#### 8. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee or his assigns shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license. Such surrender shall be without prejudice to any rights held by the licensee under the Mining Act, 1908, or any similar statute.

#### 9. RENTAL

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental at the rate of 4s. per annum per kilowatt of maximum output, as recorded by the wattmeter to be installed by the licensee at the powerhouse mentioned in clause 3 (c) hereof, payment to be made yearly for the period ending on the 31st day of March in each year, commencing from the day electrical power is first supplied. "Maximum output" means twice the number of units generated in the half-hour during which the number of units generated is a maximum for the year. For this purpose the units generated shall be recorded at the end of each half-hour commencing from noon of each day.

No rental shall be paid for electrical energy generated under this license and supplied by the licensee to the Rimu Gold-dredging Company (Limited) for dredges operated by such company, and such electrical energy shall be separately metered and deducted from the above-mentioned maximum output.

#### 10. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said lake, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said lake.

#### 11. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, if found necessary and if duly agreed upon between the licensee and the Governor-General in Council, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council, in which case particulars of such alteration or modification shall be endorsed upon this license and signed by the licensee and the Governor-General, whereupon all the terms and conditions in this license contained (save and except as they may have been so altered or modified by such alterations) shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to such alterations as if the latter had formed part of this license as originally issued.

#### 12. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment or compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

#### 13. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. 3d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that if accounts be paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes. In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £12 per horse-power per annum. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect to which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £120 per annum:

Provided further that, in the event of a number not less than twenty-five per centum of the consumers at any time representing to the Minister that the licensee is charging for the supply of electrical energy a rate which is returning an excessive profit, after allowing for the creation of a reasonable reserve fund, the Minister shall have power to cause such inquiry and investigation of the licensee's books and accounts as he may deem necessary; and if, after such inquiry and investigation, he is of opinion that unreasonably high profits

are being made, having regard to all surrounding circumstances and conditions and to the nature of the undertaking, the Governor-General may, on the recommendation of the Minister, from time to time reduce or otherwise amend the rates permitted to be charged to consumers under this license.

#### 14. AREA OF SUPPLY.

The area of supply comprises the Borough of Hokitika as at present constituted and the Westland Hospital premises, being Reserve 144, Block XIII, Waimea Survey District, Westland Land District.

#### 15. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (c) and (e) of clause 3 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 2,300 volts between the terminals, at a frequency of 60 cycles per second.

#### 16. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 12 degrees Fahrenheit.

#### 17. REQUIREMENTS OF THE HOKITIKA BOROUGH COUNCIL AND THE WESTLAND COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Borough of Hokitika or the Westland County, except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license (or any variation of this license) and the regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Hokitika Borough Council, or between the licensee and the Westland County Council.

#### 18. EXPIRY OF LICENSE.—CROWN MAY TAKE OVER WORKS OR ALLOW LICENSEE TO REMOVE BUILDINGS, ETC.

Upon the expiration of the term of the license hereby granted, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) His Majesty the King may take over and use the whole of the works hereby authorized, including all structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, plant, and land, hereinafter in this clause called the "works," on payment by him to the licensee of the then value of the works. The price to be paid under this clause shall be fixed in the same manner as the price in clause 19 of this license; or

(b) The Governor-General may, at his option, by Order in Council, grant to the licensee a new license for a further period of forty-two years, subject to such terms, conditions, and payment of rental as may then be imposed by him; or

(c) If His Majesty the King does not elect to take over the works under subclause (a), or the Governor-General declines to issue a further Order in Council under subclause (b) hereof, the licensee may, within such time and subject to such conditions as the Minister may then impose, remove all structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, and plant erected or installed by the licensee under the powers conferred by this license. If the licensee fails or neglects to effect such removal within the time or subject to the conditions imposed by the Minister, such structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, and plant shall, without payment of any compensation, vest in and become the property of His Majesty the King.

(d) No right is hereby conferred to take over works, structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, plant, or land used for mining purposes.

#### 19. CROWN'S PRIOR RIGHT TO PURCHASE WORKS.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the right is hereby reserved to His Majesty the King to purchase, at His option, at such price and on such conditions as may be mutually agreed upon (or, failing such mutual agreement, then by arbitration in the manner prescribed by the Arbitration Act, 1908), this license, in so far as this license is legally necessary under the Public Works Act, but not including the licensee's rights under the Mining Act or any Act passed in substitution therefor, together with the whole or any part of the business and undertaking of the licensee, so far as the same relates to or is connected with the exercise of this license, and together with all real and personal property and all rights acquired by the licensee under this license and used or enjoyed in connection therewith. The said right may be exercised by His Majesty the King at any time during the currency of this license, but the said price shall not exceed the original cost to the licensee of the works (including reasonable preliminary and engineering expenses), less a deduction for depreciation at the rate of 2 per cent. per annum on the original cost on all assets other than land calculated for the period that such assets have been in service, and also a deduction in consequence of any burdensome provisions respecting the use of the electric works or any easements, rights, or privileges in connection therewith, and shall not include any sum in respect of the value of the goodwill of the licensee's

business or undertaking, or in respect of the value of the license for the unexpired period thereof, or in respect of the value of any Crown land held or occupied by the licensee in connection with the undertaking. On the completion of the purchase His Majesty the King shall be deemed to be the assignee of this license, and all the rights vested in the licensee by the license shall thereupon vest in His Majesty the King.

20. COMPENSATION PAYABLE FOR LAND INJURIOUSLY AFFECTED, ETC.

In respect of all land injuriously affected, and in respect of all damages done by the exercise of any of the powers conferred upon the licensee by this license, the licensee shall from time to time, as and when any such injury or damage accrues or happens, pay compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, in the same manner (subject to all necessary modifications) as if such licensee were a local authority and the claim was one for injury or damage arising out of the construction of a public work.

21. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to cast upon or imply any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

22. CONSUMERS ENTITLED TO SUPPLY.

The licensee shall supply and sell to any person, company, or corporate body within the area of supply requiring the same, for any purpose within that area, electricity to the extent to which it may be available; provided that such person, company, or corporate body pays the cost of connecting his or its premises with the transmission-line erected by the licensee in pursuance of this license.

23. BED OF LAKE NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the said lake, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

24. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced as a contract by and against His said Majesty or the licensee accordingly.

25. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORKS.

The licensee shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of two years from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lock-outs, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the licensee.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 15, of the fourteenth day of the same month, the Northern Steamship Company (Limited), (hereinafter called “the company”), was licensed under the Harbours Amendment Act, 1883, to occupy for a period of fourteen years from the seventh day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seven, a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark of Awaroa Bay, Waiheke Island, in the Hauraki Gulf, in order to erect thereon a wharf as shown on the plans marked M.D. 3028, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington:

And whereas the company has made application for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called “the said Act”), for a further term of fourteen years, computed from the seventh day of February, one thousand nine

hundred and twenty-one, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the aforesaid wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be taken by the company for the use of the said wharf.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the wharf, as shown on plans marked M.D. 3028.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £3, and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, dating from the 7th day of February, 1921, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit thereon and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels, provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall, with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company or do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 7th day of February, 1921, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

13. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinafter set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

##### SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

EVERY person who shall use this wharf with any vessel shall pay for the use thereof as follows, that is to say:—

For every vessel a sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day for each day or part of a day a vessel shall occupy a berth alongside any vessel lying at the said wharf, or shall lie at the said wharf undergoing repairs or fitting out only, or shall lie off the said wharf with a line attached thereto.

##### GOODS WHARFAGE.

This charge will only be made when, in the opinion of the Wharfinger, it is necessary to employ labour to stack or remove cargo in sheds in consequence of the discharge of such goods or cargo as aforesaid.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-seven of the Customs Act, 1913, and section twenty-four of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby further amend the Order in Council made on the twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-seventh day of November then instant, which prohibited to the extent specified therein the exportation from New Zealand of certain goods, by omitting from the Second Schedule thereto the words "Wheat, oats, and other cereals, also flour and oatmeal, crushed oats, rolled oats, and similar preparations"; and doth prohibit the exportation from New Zealand of wheat, wheatmeal, flour, bran, and pollard, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs.

*New Zealand Military Forces.—Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations amended.*

JELlicoe, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend or revoke certain regulations made under that Act, as described in the Schedule hereto, and do also revoke the regulations made on the second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the regulations as set out in the said Schedule; and I do hereby declare that the amendments, revocations, and additional regulations hereby made shall take effect as from the date of the gazetting hereof.

SCHEDULE.

FINANCIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND ALLOWANCE REGULATIONS FOR THE NEW ZEALAND MILITARY FORCES.

PARAGRAPH 76 is hereby amended by deleting the words "Temporary rank will carry the pay and allowances of substantive rank, and the increments thereof, excepting where the service in temporary rank is broken for periods of three months and over," and substituting therefor "Temporary rank shall qualify the holders for the minimum pay and allowances of the corresponding substantive rank."

Paragraphs 274 and 276 (A) are hereby revoked.

Paragraph 44 is hereby amended by adding after the word "Duplicate" the words "show the reason for the non-production of the original"; and by substituting "Director of Financial Services" for "Paymaster-General."

Paragraph 112 (b) is hereby amended to read as follows:—

Except as provided in paras. 153 (a) and 153 (b), officers up to and including the rank of Colonel, warrant officers, non-commissioned officers above the rank of sergeant, and members of the N.Z. Army Nursing Service, travelling by train may claim, in lieu of the ordinary travelling-allowance, an allowance of £1 for the day of departure or return, provided they have incurred the cost of a sleeping-berth on the train, a receipt for which must be produced. Such allowance shall cover a period of twenty-four hours from the time of departure or return, or the whole period occupied in travelling if such period is less than twenty-four hours.

Paragraph 117 is hereby amended by adding before the words "the maximum period" the words "unless otherwise approved by the G.O. in charge Administration."

Paragraph 237 is hereby amended by deleting the words "and Senior Cadet Companies."

Paragraph 275 is hereby amended by substituting the words "New Zealand Permanent Forces" for the letters "R.N.Z.A."

Paragraphs 277 (B) and 278 (C) are hereby amended by deleting the letters "(B)" and "(C)" respectively.

Section XII is hereby amended by altering the title to read "Section XII.—Sick-leave: N.Z. Permanent Forces."

Paragraph 281 is hereby amended by substituting the word "sick-leave" for "leave of absence."

The following new regulations are hereby made:—

153A. The following officers when travelling on the public service shall be entitled to deck berths on steamers and sleeping-berths on trains at the public expense:—

- Officers at General Headquarters—
  - General officers.
  - Director of Military Training.
  - Staff officers in charge "G," "A," and "Q" branches.
  - Director of Artillery.
  - Director of Ordnance Services.
  - Director of Financial Services.
  - Director of Medical Services.
- Officers at District Headquarters—
  - Officers commanding districts.
  - Chief staff officers.

229A. In computing the amount of maintenance grant to be paid to units, the balance in hand at the end of the training year shall be deducted from the amount which the unit is entitled to receive as hereinafter provided.

276 (1.) Warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men prevented from performing their duty through wounds, injury, or sickness directly attributable to the performance of their duty shall be termed "first-class sick," and shall receive their full pay.

(2.) Warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men prevented from performing their duty through ordinary sickness or accident while off duty shall be termed "second-class sick," and shall receive their full pay, except that in cases where medical attendance or hospital treatment is received a total stoppage of 1s. 6d. per diem shall be made for every day on which such attendance or treatment is received.

(3.) Warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men prevented from performing their duty through disability contracted by their own misconduct shall be termed "third-class sick," and a total stoppage of 4s. per diem shall be made from their pay.

NOTE.—Subparagraphs (2) and (3) above are subject to the provisions of Section XII of these regulations, and no stoppages under these subparagraphs shall be made while the soldier is in receipt of reduced pay under the said section.

*Regulations for Deer-shooting, Auckland.*

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Auckland Acclimatization District—comprising all that area in the North Auckland, Auckland, Taranaki, and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Mokau River, and proceeding thence along high-water mark, Tasman Sea, in a northerly direction generally (crossing the mouths of all harbours and rivers by the way) to the Kaipara Harbour entrance to a point midway between Kaipara Heads; thence up the centre of the channels, Kaipara Harbour, leading to the mouth of Oruawhero River; thence up the middle of that river, Topuni River, and Hakaru River to the north-west corner of Section 33, Oruawhero Parish; thence along the south-western boundaries of Sections 65, 64, 61, 60, 57, 56, 51, and 50, all in Mangawhai Parish, and along the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section to a public road; thence south-easterly along that road to a point opposite south-west corner of Section 92 in the aforesaid parish; thence across that road and proceeding along the western boundaries generally of said Section 92 and



Sections 90, 89, 88, 87, and 86 in the aforesaid parish to a public road; thence north-westerly along that road to a stream near the headwaters of the Mangawhai Harbour; thence down the middle of that stream and the middle of that harbour to the sea; thence along high-water mark of the sea, Hauraki Gulf and Firth of Thames (crossing the mouths of all harbours and rivers by the way), to the mouth of the Waikawau River in Block VI, Hastings Survey District; thence up the middle of that river to its source, and along a right line from said source to Northhead, Tairua Harbour; thence southerly along high-water mark, Bay of Plenty (crossing the mouths of all harbours and rivers by the way), to the mouth of the Waihi River in Block III, Waihi North Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Mount Te Aroha Trig. Station; thence north-easterly along a right line (in the direction of Ngakuriawhare Trig. Station, Block I, Katikati North) to the western boundary of the Tauranga Confiscation Block; thence south-easterly by right lines from hill to hill along the summit of the range forming the western boundary of the aforesaid Tauranga Confiscation Block and passing over Ngatamahinerau, Mimio-tohanga, and Waianuanu to Te Weraiti Trig. Station; thence south-easterly along a right line to Puwhenua Trig. Station (in Block VIII, Tapapa Survey District); thence south-westerly along a right line to Rangitoto Mountain; thence south-easterly along a right line to the source of the Ongarue River; thence southerly along a mountain range passing through Weraroa, Tuhingamata, Motere, and Hauhangaroa Trig. Stations to Maungaku Trig. Station; thence southerly along the western boundary of the Waione Block to the Wanganui River; thence down the middle of that river to its confluence with the Ohura River; thence up the middle of the Ohura River to the 39th parallel of south latitude; thence easterly along the said parallel of latitude to the western boundary of Block IV, Pouatu Survey District; thence due north along that boundary and the western boundary of Block XVI, Waro Survey District, to the confiscation line; thence north-easterly along that line to the Tangarakau Stream; thence up the middle of that stream and up the middle of the Waitaanga Stream to the Kotare Road at the southern boundary of Section 2, Block VII, Waro Survey District; thence westerly along the Kotare Road to the south-west corner of Section 1, Block VII; thence along the south-west boundary of the said section and along the southern, western, and northern boundaries of Section 3, Block VI, Waro Survey District, to the western boundary of Section 4, Block VI, Waro Survey District; thence along the western boundary generally of Sections 4 and 5, and along the south-western and northern boundaries of Section 6 (all in Block VI, Waro Survey District) to the Mohakatino Road; thence northerly along that road to a stream which crosses the Mohakatino-Parinihi 1st East Block and flows into the Mohakatino Stream near the westernmost corner of Section 1, Block III, Waro Survey District; thence down that stream to the said confluence and up the said Mohakatino Stream and along the northern boundary of Section 3, Block III, Waro Survey District, to Tawhitirau Trig. Station; thence along the south-western and western boundaries of Mokau-Mohakatino 1st Block to the Mokau River; thence down the middle of that river to the sea, the place of commencement: including in the hereinbefore-described area the islands of Waiheke and Ponui and Great Barrier Island—and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. FALLOW-deer bucks may be taken or killed within the Auckland Acclimatization District from the 15th day of March, 1921, to the 31st day of May, 1921, both days inclusive.
2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Auckland, and the Postmasters at Cambridge, Hamilton, Matamata, Morrinsville, Walton, Te Aroha, Thames, Paeroa, and Helensville, on payment of a license fee of £1, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations. The number of such licenses shall not exceed thirty; provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person.
3. No licensee shall take or kill more than five bucks, and no buck shall be killed carrying antlers with less than four points.
4. No doe or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
6. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

1. RED-DEER stags may be taken or killed within the above-mentioned part of the Rotorua Acclimatization District from the 26th March, 1921, to the 26th April, 1921, both days inclusive.
2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Government Tourist Agent at Rotorua, on payment of a license fee of £3, in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations. 6. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.
7. Regulations as to deer "tags," per *New Zealand Gazette* No. 40, Vol. I, of 20th May, 1909, page 1408, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Government Tourist Agent at Rotorua immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with the advice of number of deer shot.
8. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not less than £5 nor exceeding £20.

counties lying to the westward of the Wellington-Napier Railway line, and excepting also the area described in the First Schedule hereto), and further prescribing the conditions affecting such deer-shooting, the form of license, and the fee payable in respect thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags and hinds may be taken or killed within that portion of the Wellington Acclimatization District hereinbefore described from the 24th day of March, 1921, to the 31st day of May, 1921 (both days inclusive).

Births in 1920.

The number of births registered in 1920 (29,934) is easily a record, being 1,425 in excess of the previous highest figure (28,509 in 1916), and 5,451 more than the abnormally low total for 1919 (24,483). Nevertheless, the rate for 1920 (25.38 per 1,000 of mean population) is the fourth lowest on record, being higher than the rates for the years 1915, 1918, and 1919 only.

The following statement giving the figures for each quarter of the last three years discloses that the improvement shown for the first nine months of 1920 was not entirely maintained in the last quarter of the year:—

Deaths in 1920.

With the exception of the year 1918 (when the deaths were increased by 50 per cent. on account of the influenza epidemic of the last quarter), the number of deaths registered in 1920 is the highest on record. The rate per 1,000 of mean population (10.27) is also somewhat above the average of recent years, and is indeed higher than in any of the ten years 1908-1917.
