Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section twenty-two of the Counties Act, 1908, do hereby declare that the area included as aforesaid in the Waitotara County shall, as on and from the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, be included in the Tokomaru Riding of the said county, and that the boundaries of such riding shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Union of Borough of Ashburton and Town District of Hampstead.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of Ashburton and the Board of the Town District of Hampstead, by petitions under the respective common seals of the Corporation of such borough and the Board of such town district, as provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1915, have prayed the Governor-General that such borough and town district (forming one continuous area) be constituted one united borough:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1915, do hereby proclaim that the said Borough of Ashburton and the said Town District of Hampstead are hereby constituted one united borough by the name of the Borough of Ashburton, and also that the boundaries of the said borough so constituted and named shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

And I do also proclaim that the said borough shall be an undivided borough, and that the number of Councillors to be elected to the Council thereof shall be eleven, exclusive of Mayor.

And I do hereby appoint Alfred McClure (the Town Clerk to the existing Borough of Ashburton) to be the Town Clerk temporarily of the said united borough; and I do hereby appoint Alfred McClure (the Returning Officer to the said existing borough) to be the Returning Officer temporarily to the said united borough.

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

Constituting the Borough of Morrinsville, County of Piako.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section thirteen of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, a petition was presented to the Governor-General, praying that the area described in the Schedule hereto be constituted a new borough: And whereas the provisions of the said section thirteen have been complied with in respect thereto, and the result of the poll taken on the proposal contained in the said petition was in favour thereof:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be constituted a borough under the said Acts on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one; that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Morrinsville; that the said borough shall be an undivided borough; and that the number of Councillors to be elected thereto shall be six, exclusive of the Mayor.

And I do further proclaim and declare that John Stevens Reid, of Morrinsville, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough; and that the said John Stevens Reid shall be the Town Clerk and the person to prepare the district electors roll for the purposes of the said first election.

And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough shall be held on Wednesday, the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one; and that the first meeting of the Council of the said borough shall be held on Monday, the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, at half past seven o'clock in the afternoon, at the Town Board Office, Morrinsville.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 141, of the ninth day of the same month, Messrs. R. P. Gibbons (Limited) was licensed under the Harbours Act, 1908, to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Tangowahine, in Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect thereon a wharf and log-slip, as shown on the plans marked M.D. 2495 and 2915 deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington :

And whereas the said license was, with the consent of the Minister of Marine, transferred to Thomas Charles Hawkins (hereinafter called "the licensee") :

And whereas the licensee has made application for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of ten years, computed from the twenty-third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the aforesaid wharf and log-slip thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen

Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by the Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the wharf and log-slip, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2495 and 2915.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £3, and thereafter an annual sum of £4 in advance, dating from the 23rd day of September, 1920, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and log-slip, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf and log-slip without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf and log-slip in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and log-slip and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or log-slip, requiring him within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf and log-slip shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for ten years from the 23rd day of September, 1920, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf or log-slip may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein before set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

And whereas it is expedient to extend the scope of the said inquiry in manner hereinafter appearing :

And whereas it is also expedient to extend the time within which you were required to report as aforesaid in manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby direct that your powers and functions under the said Warrant are hereby extended, and shall be deemed to include the power to inquire into the following matter, namely :—

Whether it is desirable and expedient and warranted in and by the public interest that any deviation of the Wellington—New Plymouth Railway should be made between Paekakariki and Marton; and, if so, between what points such deviation should be made.

NOTE.—The rainfall for the month of January was 4 per cent, below the mean of previous years, and fell between the 13th and 31st, the earlier part of the month being given over to fine warm weather. Total bright sunshine 239 hours 26 minutes, and one sunless day, giving an average of 7 hours 43 minutes per diem. Mean earth-temperature at 1 ft. was 68.2°, and 65.6° at 3 ft. Mean dew-point, 52.2°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0.391 in.; and mean relative humidity, 70 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1921.

Anticyclonic influences were predominant during the first portion of the month, and fine and warm weather was experienced generally. The warmest day was the 3rd, when maximum shade temperatures of over 90° Fahr. were recorded in Canterbury. At Ashburton as high as 100° Fahr. was reported.

A westerly low-pressure passed in the South on the 13th, and was followed by an ex-tropical cyclone. The centre of the latter reached Cape Maria van Diemen on the morning of the 15th, and apparently passed in the neighbourhood of Cook Strait the same night. Good general rains occurred at this time.

The last half of the month proved changeable, with frequent showers.

On the night of the 29th a secondary "low" developed considerable intensity between the East Coast of the South Island and Chatham Island, and accounted for south-west gales and heavy seas along the east coast south of East Cape.

The total rainfall was much above the average in Canterbury and in parts of the Auckland peninsula, but elsewhere it was below.

edition of Admiralty Notices to Mariners will be in accordance with the new system outlined above. This system will also be adopted shortly for supplements to those volumes of Sailing Directions in which the bearings are given true.

(2.) With the adoption of the above system, the following change in expression will also be made in compiling or revising Sailing Directions:—

In such an expression as "In approaching the entrance of the harbour the lighthouse should be kept *northward*" of a certain bearing, the terms "*more than*" or "*less than*" will be used in conjunction with a bearing instead of "*northward*," "*southward*," "*eastward*," or "*westward*."

The term "*more than*" will refer to a bearing in a clockwise direction from the stated bearing, and the term "*less than*" to a bearing in an anti-clockwise direction from the stated bearing—

Thus, More than 045° means a bearing of 046° or more ;
 Less than 045° " 044° or less ;
 More than 001° " 002° or more ;
 Less than 001° " 000° or 359° or less ;
 More than 000° " 001° or more ;

and finally, in the special case of "less than 000°," the expression "less than 360°" will be adopted, meaning a bearing of 359° or less.

CARIBBEAN COAST.—PANAMA.—POINT MANZANILLO.—CAUTION WITH REGARD TO UNEXAMINED DANGEROUS AREA NORTHWARD OF.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION
 DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
