And whereas it is provided by section nine of the said Act that in any harbour where there is no Board, or where any Board is dissolved under the powers contained in the said Act, the Governor-General in Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by this Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may exercise the same in accordance with the said Act, and that any power or authority conferred upon the Governor-General in Council which, in the case of a Harbour Board, would be exercised by or under by-laws to be made by such Board shall and may be exercised under regulations to be made by Order in Council gazetted:

And whereas the Westport Harbour Board will, under the provisions of the Westport Harbour Board Act, 1920, be abolished on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and it is desirable to make regulations in respect of the Harbour of Westport:

Amended Regulations under the Education Act, 1914, relating to Secondary Schools.

JELLICOE, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the amendments set out in the Schedule hereto in the regulations relating to secondary schools made by Order in Council dated the eighth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty (herein-after referred to as "the said regulations"); and doth prescribe that, except where otherwise stated, this Order shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

SCHEDULE.

1. Subclause (1) of clause 1 of the said regulations is hereby amended by deleting the words "a secondary school established under the Act," and by substituting therefor the words "secondary schools."

2. Clause 17 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the addition

of the following subclause:-

(4.) If at the beginning of the second or third term the roll number of a school has increased so that it is fifteen more than the maximum for the grade in which the school is placed, an additional assistant of Grade D may, with the approval of the Minister, be added to the staff.

3. Clause 18 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the addition

of the following subclauses:-

(2.) If at the beginning of any term the roll number of any school has decreased so that it is less by more than eight per cent. than the minimum roll of the grade in which the school is placed, the staff shall be reduced to that prescribed for a school having a roll number of the next lower grade, and it shall be the duty of the Board to give notice to every teacher whom it may be necessary to discharge in order to carry out such reduction; provided that, if the Minister is satisfied that the number of the staff should be maintained, payment of the salary of each assistant concerned may be continued for such period as the Minister shall decide.

(3.) When in accordance with these regulations a reduction in the staff of a school is necessary, such amount shall be paid to the governing body towards the salaries of the teachers whose services are dispensed with as will enable the Board to give the teachers due notice of the termination of the engagement, but in no circumstances shall the payment be made towards the salary of any teacher for a longer period than four months after the beginning of the term when the school ceases to be entitled to the

services of such teacher.

(4.) If at any time the grade of a school is reduced, any teacher who remains in the same position therein shall, for a period of three years, continue to receive the same salary and allowances as if no such reduction

had taken place.

- 4. Clause 21 of the said regulations is hereby amended (a) by inserting in subclause (1), after the words "£25 per annum," the words "in the case of men or £20 per annum in the case of women"; (b) by deleting from subclause (1) the words "January in each year," and substituting therefor the words "February next following after the lapse of a period of six calendar months reckoned from the date of commencing duty"; and (c) by deleting from subclause (3) the words "adjusted accordingly by the Minister after consultation with the Board of Governors of the school," and substituting therefor the words "reduced by such amount as the Minister of Education after consultation with the governing body of the school shall determine."
- 5. Clause 22 of the said regulations is hereby amended (a) by inserting in subclause (1), after the words "the various grades," the words "as set out in Schedule I hereof"; (b) by deleting from subclause (4) the words "on the 1st day of January, 1922," and substituting therefor the words from the 1st day of February next following after the lapse of a period of six calendar months reckoned from the date of commencing duty, or from the 1st February, 1922, whichever is later."

6. Clause 26 of the said regulations is hereby amended by deleting the words "a married allowance" in subclause (1), and substituting therefor the words "an amount."

7. Clause 30 of the said regulations is hereby amended (a) by deleting from subclause (1) the words "commencing with the year 1920," also by deleting the words "paid to" and substituting therefor the words "receivable by"; and (b) by revoking subclause (2) thereof. This clause shall be deemed to have been in force on and after 1st April, 1920.

8. Clause 40 of the said regulations is hereby amended by deleting the words "clause 35," and substituting the words "clause 37."

9. Clause 41 of the said regulations is hereby amended by deleting the words "clause 36," and substituting therefor the words "clause 38."

10. Clause 47 of the said regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "scholarship-holders," the words "or pupils of any lower department."

Class III.—On capital moneys belonging to estates held or administered under the Lunatics Act, 1908, the Mental Defectives Act, 1911, the Aged and Infirm Persons Protection Act, 1912, or Parts II or III of the Public Trust Office Act, 1908 (Unclaimed Lands and Unclaimed Property)—4½ per cent.; but if held at call, 3 per cent.

Class IV.—On capital moneys received as superannuation contributions or salary deductions or National Provident.

contributions, or salary deductions, or National Provident contributions under the Civil Service Act, 1908, the Government Railways Act, 1908, the Police Force Act, 1908, the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Act, 1908, the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, the Education Act, 1908, the Local Authorities Superannuation Act, 1908, or the National Provident Eved Act, 1910, the same rates as under National Provident Fund Act, 1910—the same rates as under Class I (a).

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth Whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-touring day of February, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, the Town District of Manurewa was duly constituted and proclaimed under the Town Boards Act, 1908, with the boundaries described in the Schedule to the said Proclamatics.

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Admiral of the Fleet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Town Boards Act, 1908, and by the said section eighty-seven of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1920, do hereby enlarge the said town district of Manurewa, as on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, by including therein the areas described in the First Schedule hereto; and do hereby declare that on and after the aforesaid date the boundaries of the said town district, with such additions as hereinbefore provided, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREAS INCLUDED IN MANUREWA TOWN DISTRICT.

POR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):

Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
 Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
 Children who have lost their hearing after having

learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
