A PROCLAMATION.

**I**N pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration district known as the Lumsden District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

**LUMSDEN DISTRICT.**

ALL that area in the Southland Land District bounded towards the north and east by the Mataura River from its source at Eyre Peak to the northern boundary of the Hokonui Survey District; thence towards the south generally by that boundary, the eastern boundaries of Blocks II, III, and IX to the south-western corner of Section 356, Hokonui Survey District; thence along a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section 339, along the northern boundary of that section and Section 367 to the eastern boundary of Block VIII; thence southwards along said boundary and along the southern boundary of said Block VIII to the Oreti River, thence by that river and the Southland County to Section 186, Taringatura Survey District; thence towards the west generally by Sections 186, 158, and 157 to the confluence of Hamilton Burn with the Aparima River; thence by the Hamilton Burn, the Mossburn, and Sections 6 and 16 and the production of the eastern boundary of said Section 16 to the left bank of the Oreti River; thence up that river to its confluence with the Windley River; and towards the north-west by a right line to Eyre Peak, the point of commencement.

**BALFOUR DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Southland Land District bounded towards the north by the Lumsden Marriage District hereinbefore described from Section 258, Hokonui Survey District, to the Mataura River; towards the east by said Mataura River to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 511, Hokonui Survey District; thence towards the south generally by a right line to the easternmost corner of that section and by Sections 201, 563, and 202 to the westernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the road at the easternmost corner of Section 148, by that road and its continuation to the junction of roads at the northernmost corner of Section 198 by the road forming the north-western boundaries of Sections 198, 629, 628, 627, 626, and 625 to Section 50, and by that section to the Longridge Stream; thence by that stream, the Waimea Stream, and Cowan's Creek, and along the south-eastern boundary of Section 354 to its southernmost corner; thence towards

the south-west by Sections 797 and 796 and the road intersecting Sections 354, 405, and 670 and its continuation along the north-eastern boundary of Section 19, through Section 445, and along the north-eastern boundary of Section 258, Hokonui Survey District, to the Oreti River to the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the eleventh day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Lumsden District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

LUMSDEN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Southland Land District bounded towards the north by the Manapouri, Mararoa, and Burwood Survey Districts from Lake Manapouri to the Oreti River, and across that river to Windley Stream; thence towards the north-west by a right line to Eyre Peak; thence towards the east generally by a right line to the source of the Mataura River, and by that river to the northern boundary of the Hokonui Survey District; thence towards the south generally by that boundary, the eastern boundaries of Blocks II, III, and IX to the south-western corner of Section 356, Hokonui Survey District; thence along a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section 339, along the northern boundaries of that Section and Section 367 to the eastern boundary of Block VIII; thence southwards along said boundary and along the southern boundary of said Block VIII to the Oreti River, by that river and the Southland County to the north-western corner of Section 162A, Taringatura Survey District; thence by a line running due west to and across the Aparima River, and by that river to Etal Stream; thence by that stream to its source; thence by a right line to Spence Peak; thence by a right line to the source of Redcliff Creek, and by that creek to the Waiau River; and thence towards the west by the Waiau River and Lake Manapouri to Manapouri Survey District, the place of commencement.

BALFOUR DISTRICT.

All that area in the Southland Land District bounded towards the north by the Lumsden Marriage District hereinbefore described from Section 258, Hokonui Survey District, to the Mataura River; towards the east by said Mataura River to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 511, Hokonui Survey District; thence towards the south generally by a right line to the easternmost corner of that section and by Sections 201, 563, and 202 to the westernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the road at the easternmost corner of Section 148, by that road and its continuation to the junction of roads at the northernmost corner of Section 198, by the road forming the north-western boundaries of Sections 198, 629, 628, 627, 626, and 625 to Section 50, and by that section to the Longridge Stream; thence by that stream, the Waimea Stream, and Cowan's Creek, and along the south-eastern boundary of Section 354 to its southernmost corner; thence towards the south-west by Sections 797 and 796 and the road intersecting Sections 354, 405, and 670 and its continuation along the north-eastern boundary of Section 19, through Section 445, and along the north-eastern boundary of Section 258, Hokonui Survey District, to the Oreti River to the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the eleventh day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intitled the Prisons Act, 1908, it is provided that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a prison, and from and after the gazetting of any such Proclamation, or from any time later specified in the Proclamation, such house, building, enclosure, or place shall be deemed a prison:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby declare that the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, and all buildings and enclosures used or occupied thereon, shall from and after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Gazette*, be a prison, known as the Waikune Prison, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Prisons Act, 1908.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Crown may purchase any Native land in pursuance of a resolution of the assembled owners passed and confirmed in accordance with Part XVIII of the said Act, and on the resolution being adopted by the Native Land Purchase Board it shall become a contract of purchase as between the Crown and all persons who are the owners of the land; and the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, at any time after the contract of purchase has been so made, declare that the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly and shall become Crown land:

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners, and duly confirmed by the Aotea District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

And whereas the Native Land Purchase Board has adopted such resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the said Act, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land set out in the Schedule hereto is vested in His Majesty the King.

WHEREAS by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, the City of Wellington and the Borough of Karori were constituted one united borough, and the boundaries of the said city were so constituted as to include the said borough:

And whereas by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-second day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, the City of Wellington and the Borough of Miramar were constituted one united borough, and the boundaries of the said city were so constituted as to include the said borough:

And whereas by section nine, subsection two, of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1909, it is enacted that the number of representatives of each contributory district on a Hospital Board shall be such as is determined from time to time in each case by the Governor-General by Order in Council:

And whereas it is desirable to determine the representatives for the said city:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1909, doth hereby determine that the number of representatives of the City of Wellington within the Wellington Hospital District shall be fourteen; and that the first election of such representatives shall be held on Wednesday, the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one; and that the representatives of the formerly combined district of Wellington City and Miramar and Karori Boroughs shall continue to hold office as representing the City of Wellington until such date. And doth hereby direct that the regulations made by Order in Council dated the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, shall apply as if incorporated in this Order in Council, with the following exception:—

The Order in Council of the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "Miramar Borough," "Karori Borough," "Combined District," in the second column of the Schedule thereto.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by section forty-nine of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, as amended by section seventeen of the Electric-power Boards Amendment Act, 1920, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Banks Peninsula Electric-power Board to construct suitable and necessary works in the Canterbury Land District to enable such Board to erect electric lines, transformers, and substations for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy in the Banks Peninsula Electric-power District as defined by Proclamation dated the twentieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 1, of the eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, to make by-laws in respect of any electric works for the purposes set out in the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, and its amendments, and for the purposes set out in section 19 of the Electric-power Boards Amendment Act, 1920; to purchase any electric works the property

of the Akaroa Borough Council, the local authority of the Borough of Akaroa, one of the constituent districts within the Banks Peninsula Electric-power District; to acquire land by purchase or lease and thereon to plant or sow such trees as the Board may consider advisable; to expend moneys on the tending and rearing of such trees, and the same trees from time to time to cut down and utilize for the purpose of electric works within the district, subject to the provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, and its amendments; to reclaim land by the erection of retaining-walls or otherwise, and to fill in and level such land or otherwise adjust or adapt the same to use for the purposes of the Board; and generally to perform the functions of an Electric-power Board constituted in accordance with the provisions of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, and its amendments, subject to the following conditions.

**CONDITIONS.**

1. No electric lines shall be used for the distribution of electrical energy until the Banks Peninsula Electric-power Board has obtained a license for such purpose in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911.

2. Any conditions inserted in such license shall be strictly complied with by such Board.

3. Such Board shall, before the works authorized are commenced, forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works,—

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, William Anderson Stout, of Invercargill (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore of Thule Bay, Paterson's Inlet, Stewart Island, in order to erect and maintain a boat-shed thereon, and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington marked M.D. 5294, showing the area of foreshore intended to be occupied and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said boat-shed :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid ; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said boat-shed is to be erected, as shown on plan marked M.D. 5294 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said structure thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore occupied by the said boat-shed as shown on the plan marked M.D. 5294.
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, dating from the date of this Order in Council, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said boat-shed without payment.
5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned boat-shed in good order and repair.
6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said boat-shed and view the state of repair thereof ; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such boat-shed, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provision

of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said boat-shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

11. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said boat-shed for a period of thirty days ;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy ; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever ; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. The erection of the said boat-shed shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1921.

During February the weather was generally warm and very dry. The middle of the month was bright and sunny, except in the far North, where some heavy rains were reported from the 12th to the 14th. From the 7th to the 9th considerable rain fell in the North and in some parts of the north-western coast of the South Island. At Hokitika, on the morning of the 7th, 3-12 inches of rain fell between 1.30 a.m. and 7.30 a.m.

A strong south-westerly sprang up on the 22nd and brought rain to many parts of the country, especially to the East Coast districts; it was accompanied by a cold snap, and the hills were lightly covered with snow on both Islands at this time.

The rainfalls in Poverty Bay were greater than in Hawke's Bay, and drought conditions set in in the latter district. Most parts of Marlborough also suffered from drought during February.

WEST COAST.—SCILLY ISLES.—PENINNIS HEAD LIGHT.—INTENDED ALTERATION IN DURATION OF FLASH.

Date of Alteration.—On or about 15th January, 1921.

Position.—Lat. 49° 54' N., long. 6° 18' W. (approx.).

Alteration.—The duration of the flash of this unwatched flashing white light will be reduced from 1½ seconds to half a second. The light will then show thus: Flash 0·5 sec., eclipse 19·5 secs.

Note.—At the same time the power of the light will be increased to 100,000 candles.
