Redefining Boundaries of the Borough of Morrinsville and the County of Piako.

Department of Internal Affairs,
Wellington, 14th May, 1921.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 141 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, the boundaries of the Borough of Morrinsville are hereby defined as set out in the First Schedule hereto, the said borough being a new borough constituted by Proclamation dated the 9th day of March, 1921, made under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, and published in *Gazette* No. 25, of the 10th day of March, 1921.

And also, in pursuance of the provisions of the said section 141 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, the boundaries of the County of Piako affected by the constitution of the Borough of Morrinsville, made by the said Proclamation dated the 9th day of March, 1921, are hereby defined as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
