5. Any local authority may at any time during the currency of any registration transfer the registration so as to apply to any other person or premises.

6. (1.) Every local authority shall keep a record of every registration of premises made in accordance with the said Act, and such record shall include the date of registration, the dates of renewals or of transfers of registration, and a statement of any conditions under which any registration or

statement of any conditions under which any registration or

renewal of registration was authorized.
(2.) The Medical Officer of Health may at any time inspect such record during office hours and may take extracts there-

from.

(3.) A copy of any entry in such record, certified as correct under the hand of the Clerk of the local authority, shall be prima facie evidence of the facts stated therein.

7. (1.) When any premises are registered or the registration thereof is renewed under these regulations the Clerk of the local authority shall cause to be issued to the occupier of such premises a certificate of registration or of renewal

of such premises a certificate of registration or of renewal of registration.

DURSUANT to the provisions of section 141 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1999 the land cipal Corporations Act, 1920, the boundaries of the Borough of Morrinsville are hereby defined as set out in the First Schedule hereto, the said borough being a new borough constituted by Proclamation dated the 9th day of March, 1921, made under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, and published in Gazette No. 25, of the 10th day of March, 1921.

And also, in pursuance of the provisions of the said section 141 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, the boundaries of the County of Piako affected by the constitution of the Borough of Morrinsville, made by the said Proclamation

the Borough of Morrinsville, made by the said Proclamation dated the 9th day of March, 1921, are hereby defined as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

OR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

necessity):

Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
 Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
 Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
