Boundaries of Manunui Town District altered.

[L.S.] JELLICOE, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-first day

HEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the sixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the Town District of Manunui was duly constituted and proclaimed under the Town Boards Act, 1908, with the boundaries described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said town district in the manner hereinafter set forth:
Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Town Boards Act, 1908, do hereby alter the boundaries of the said Town District of Manunui by excluding therefrom the area described in the First Schedule hereto; and do hereby declare that on and after the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the boundaries of thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the boundaries of the said town district shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto: and do hereby further declare that on and from the aforesaid date the boundaries of the County of Kaitieke, affected by the said alteration, shall be those described in the Third Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM MANUNUI TOWN DISTRICT AND IN-CLUDED IN KAITIEKE COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 4 acres 0 roods 38 perches, more or less, being Section 139, Block II, Hunua Survey District, bounded on the north-east and south by public road and on the southwest by railway reserve.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

MANUNUI TOWN DISTRICT.

the North Island Main Trunk Railway line, and by the said railway-line to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 83, Suburbs of Manunui (quarry reserve); thence again towards the south-east by a right line to the easternmost corner of that section, and by the south-eastern boundary of that section to Section 29, Block II, Hunua Survey District; there is the next by the section to Section 29. thence towards the east by the eastern boundaries of sections numbered 29, 22, 24, and 26, Block II aforesaid, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence again towards the south-west by the south-western boundary of that section to the public road forming its western boundary; thence across that road to the south-eastern corner of Section 17, Block II aforesaid; thence by the southern boundary of 17, Block II aforesaid; thence by the southern boundary of that section to its south-western corner; thence towards the west generally by the western boundaries of sections numbered 17, 16, 15, and 14 to the westernmost corner of Section 79, Suburbs of Manunui, in Block II aforesaid; thence again towards the south generally by a right line through sections numbered 1, 2, and 3, Block II aforesaid, to the corner of the road opposite the easternmost corner of Section 4; thence across the said road and by the southern boundary of the said Section 4 to its westernmost corner; thence towards the north-west by the north-western boundary of the last-mentioned section, and by the road forming part of the south-eastern boundary of Section 5, Block II aforesaid, to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of that section; thence again towards the south-west by a right line across the said road to the north-eastern corner of the said Section 5; and thence by that section and the production of its north-eastern boundary to the Wanganui River, the place of commencement.

Station; thence by a right line to the source of the Ngahuinga Stream; thence by that stream to the eastern boundary-line of Section 13, Block VIII, Manganui Survey District; thence by a right line running due south to the middle of the Manganuia-te-Ao River, and along the middle of that river to a point opposite the southernmost corner of Section 24, Block XI, Manganui Survey District; thence to and along the south-ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded towestern boundary of that section and its production to the middle of the Raetihi-Waimarino Road, along the middle of that road to a point opposite the southernmost corner of Section 24, Block VII, Manganui Survey District; thence to and along the south-western boundary of that section, part of the south-eastern boundary of Section 4, Block VI, to its southernmost corner, and along its south-western boundary to and along the middle of the Makino Road, to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 2, said Block VI; thence to and along that boundary and the south-western boundaries of Section 1, Block VI, and Section 4, Block II, part of the north-western boundary of the last-mentioned section, and the south-western boundary of Section 3, Block I, Manganui Survey District, and that boundary produced to the middle of the Ruatiti-Erua Road, and along the middle of that road to a point near the south-western corner of Section 3, Block II, Manganui Survey District; thence to and along the western boundary of that section and part of the southern boundary of Section 8, Block XIII, Kaitieke Survey District, to the Kokako Road, to and along the middle of that road to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 5, said Block XIII; thence to and along the south-western boundaries of Sections 5 and 3 and the north-western boundaries of Sections 5 and 3 and the north-western boundaries of Section 4, Block XIII aforesaid, and its production to the middle of the Maungaroa Road, along the middle of that road to the northernmost corner of Section 3, Block IV, Whirinaki Survey District; thence by the northern boundaries of Blocks IV, III, II, and I, Whirinaki Survey District, to the Wanganui River, the place of commencement, excluding the Manunui Town District.

The area of supply comprises the Te Awamutu Electric-power District, and the outer area of such district, as constituted by Proclamation dated the 18th day of December, 1919, and published in Gazette No. 1, of 8th January, 1920, pages 13

2. System of Supply.

Electrical energy shall be received in bulk from the Horahora supply at Public Works Department substations located at such point or points as may be mutually agreed upon by the Minister of Public Works and the licensee. This 11,000-volt supply shall be stepped down by transformers for distribution in accordance with clause 3 (e) of the regulations.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. Duration of License.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days of due date the charges shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, or heating purposes. In the case of wholesale supply the charge shall not exceed £12 per horse-power per annum. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £120 per annum.

6. Variation in Conditions of License.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

7. GOVERNMENT ROUTES RESERVED.

8. BARE WIRE CONSENTS.
