Apportioning the Cost of Maintenance, &c., of Gordonton-Motumaoho Road Drain in the County of Waikato.

A PROCLAMATION.

Where I and Drainage Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), a Commission was appointed and an inquiry was duly held with a view to determining what local authority could most conveniently and efficiently control the Gordonton-Motumaoho Road drain situated on the northern portion of the Gordonton-Motumaoho Road, in the County of Waikato (and hereinafter referred to as "the said drain"), and what proportion of the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said drain should be paid by any, and, if so, which, local authority or authorities: And whereas such Commission did report to the Governor-General, after due inquiry, its opinion as to the matters respecting which it was appointed to report: And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the said drain shall from and after the date of

this Proclamation be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Waikato County Council.

management of the Waikato County Council.

2. I fix and determine that the future cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said drain shall be provided and paid from time to time by the undermentioned local authorities, in the proportion set opposite the name of each local authority, that is to say,—

The Woodlands Drainage Board, in the proportion of nineteen-twentieths of such cost.

The Waikato County Council, in the proportion of one-twentieth of such cost.

3. I direct that any payment hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Woodlands Drainage Board shall be paid from time to time, in the proportions hereinbefore fixed and determined, out of the funds under the control of the said Drainage Board, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Waikato County Council; and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the County Clerk of the said County Council, for and on account of such County Council.

4. And I further direct that the costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the inquiry by the Commission aforesaid touching and concerning the premises shall be paid and borne by the said Woodlands Drainage Board.

Where relief other than a sum of money is claimed, either alone or in addition to a sum of money, the Court on giving judgment shall fix under what head costs shall be allowed. If judgment is entered before trial, without application to the Court, the Registrar shall fix the head.
38. The total cost of an action exclusive of disbursements shall not exceed £300, unless the Court certifies for the whole costs of the action. This shall not limit the power of the Court under Rule 568 to fix the costs at any amount.

Allowances to Witnesses

Expert and scientific witnesses giving evidence, as such, per diem: £2 2s. to £5 5s.

Professional men, bankers, engineers, surveyors, merchants, auctioneers, accountants (certificated), commission agents, and other gentlemen not specially mentioned, per diem: £1 10s. to £2 2s.

Masters of ships, farmers, clerks, shopkeepers, hotelkeepers, accountants (uncertificated), master tradesmen, contractors, commissioned officers of police, per diem: 15s. to £1 1s.

Officers of police of inferior grade, shop-assistants, petty officers of ships, journeymen mechanics, per diem: 12s. Police constables, labourers, seamen, per diem: 10s. 6d.

Interpreters.

If engaged for any time not exceeding one hour: 12s. 6d. For every additional hour or fraction of an hour he may be actually employed beyond that time: 7s. 6d. But not exceeding one day: £2 12s. 6d.

Female witnesses, if earning salary or wages, according to foregoing scale; but if not earning salary or wages, they shall be paid according to their rank at rates not exceeding two-thirds of the said scale for male witnesses of similar degree. Witnesses to be allowed a refund of travelling-expenses if able to travel by railway, steamer, or other public conveyance. Where there is no public conveyance, witnesses will be allowed 1s. per mile, calculated one way only. (b.) No claim of any member of the Board for such remuneration shall be recognized by the Board unless such claim is accompanied by the certificate of such member stating the days on which he was wholly engaged in transacting such business.

(c.) Such certificate shall be in the following form :-

By-laws.—Whangarei Branch Railway, Portland to Waiotira (5 M. 23 Chs. to 19 M. 75 Chs.); and North Auckland Railway, Mareretu to Waiotira (96 M. 30 Chs. to 107 M. 28 Chs.).

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 11 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, I, Joseph Gordon Coates, the Minister of Public Works, do hereby order and declare that the by-laws to be enforced on the Whangarei Branch Railway, Portland to Waiotira (5 miles 23 chains to 19 miles 75 chains), and on the North Auckland Railway, Mareretu to Waiotira (96 miles 30 chains to 107 miles 28 chains), prior to being opened for traffic under the Government Railways Act, 1908, shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto, such by-laws to come into force on the 21st day of July, 1921. on the 21st day of July, 1921.

SCHEDULE.

1. Paragraph (2) of clause 40 and Part VI of the Railway Department's By-laws shall be omitted from the by-laws to be enforced on the Whangarei Branch Railway, Portland to Waiotira (5 miles 23 chains to 19 miles 75 chains), and on the North Auckland Railway, Mareretu to Waiotira (96 miles 20 chains to 107 miles 28 chains) 30 chains to 107 miles 28 chains).

4. The alterations and extensions hereinbefore referred to are those published in the New Zealand Gazette of the 21st September, 1911, the 15th February, 1912, the 11th December, 1913, and the 1st August, 1918.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1921.

Dull and misty weather was much in evidence during May, but except in the West Coast districts of the South Island the total rainfall was everywhere considerably less than the average.

Westerly disturbances ruling between the 7th and 13th and from the 24th to the end of the month accounted for unsettled and squally conditions during these two periods, with rain in many parts, particularly in districts with a

westerly aspect.

Although anticyclonic pressure prevailed from the 12th to the 24th, the weather proved cold and dull, owing to the proximity of depressions eastward and southward of the Dominion.
