*Apportioning the Cost of Maintenance, &c., of Gordonton-Motumaoho Road Drain in the County of Waikato.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Land Drainage Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), a Commission was appointed and an inquiry was duly held with a view to determining what local authority could most conveniently and efficiently control the Gordonton-Motumaoho Road drain situated on the northern portion of the Gordonton-Motumaoho Road, in the County of Waikato (and hereinafter referred to as "the said drain"), and what proportion of the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said drain should be paid by any, and, if so, which, local authority or authorities: And whereas such Commission did report to the Governor-General, after due inquiry, its opinion as to the matters respecting which it was appointed to report: And whereas it is expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the said drain shall from and after the date of this Proclamation be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Waikato County Council.

2. I fix and determine that the future cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said drain shall be provided and paid from time to time by the under-mentioned local authorities, in the proportion set opposite the name of each local authority, that is to say,—

The Woodlands Drainage Board, in the proportion of nineteen-twentieths of such cost.

The Waikato County Council, in the proportion of one-twentieth of such cost.

3. I direct that any payment hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Woodlands Drainage Board shall be paid from time to time, in the proportions hereinbefore fixed and determined, out of the funds under the control of the said Drainage Board, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Waikato County Council; and all such payments shall be made from time to time to the County Clerk of the said County Council, for and on account of such County Council.

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4. And I further direct that the costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the inquiry by the Commission aforesaid touching and concerning the premises shall be paid and borne by the said Woodlands Drainage Board.

WHEREAS section thirteen of the Finance Act, 1921, provides that where any local authority, as defined by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, has heretofore been or shall hereafter be authorized to raise a loan, whether pursuant to a poll of ratepayers or otherwise, and whether such loan has been raised in part or not, such local authority may, with the consent of the Governor-General in Council, raise any part of such loan upon terms of making the same, together with interest thereon, repayable by instalments extending over such period of years whether in excess of the period mentioned in the poll taken on the proposal for such loan or not, and payable at such times as may be fixed by such local authority, and may permanently appropriate and pledge for the purpose of securing such instalments any special rate already made or hereafter to be made, or any part of such special rate:

And whereas the Patangata County Council has been authorized to borrow the sum of two hundred and nine thousand pounds for the purpose of re-erecting and reconstructing all the bridges and culverts in the county, and has been unable to raise the amount on the terms specified:

And whereas application has been made by the County Council for the consent of His Excellency the Governor-General in Council to the raising of ten thousand pounds, being part of the above-mentioned two hundred and nine

thousand pounds, on the instalment system extending over a period of thirty-six and a half years:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the Patangata County Council raising the sum of ten thousand pounds upon the terms of making the same, together with interest thereon, repayable by instalments extending over a period of thirty-six and a half years, and the said Patangata County Council is hereby authorized to borrow the said sum of ten thousand pounds on these terms.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by section fifty-one of the Judicature Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and with the concurrence of the Honourable the Acting Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of New Zealand and five of the Judges of the said Supreme Court, doth hereby make the following alteration in rule five hundred and sixty-eight of the Code of Civil Procedure. The said rule shall be and the same is hereby amended by substituting for the scale of costs in Table C in the Third Schedule to the said code the scale of costs set forth in Table C hereunder; and doth declare that such amendment shall take effect on and from the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

3. The maximum amount which may be paid to any member on any one day shall not exceed £1 ls., notwithstanding that such member may have attended one or more meetings of the Board or of any committee of the Board on such day.

4. (a.) The remuneration which the Board may pay to any member of the Board for transacting any business of the Board pursuant to a resolution of the Board shall not exceed £1 ls. per day for each day during which such member is wholly engaged in transacting such business.

(b.) No claim of any member of the Board for such remuneration shall be recognized by the Board unless such claim is accompanied by the certificate of such member stating the days on which he was wholly engaged in transacting such business.

(c.) Such certificate shall be in the following form:—

On wool, flax, tow, sheep-skins, and rabbit-skins, per bale, per day or fraction thereof: 3d.  
On tallow, per cask, per day or fraction thereof: 3d.  
On timber remaining over sixty-four working-hours, per 100 superficial feet, per week: 2d.  
The working-hours are from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on week-days.  
The above storage charges do not include handling.

Flax and tow delivered at Oakleigh Station to await shipment will be charged 6d. per bale, which will include receiving into shed, loading up, and delivery to ships in trucks alongside wharf.

*By-laws.—Whangarei Branch Railway, Portland to Waitotira (5 M. 23 Chs. to 19 M. 75 Chs.); and North Auckland Railway, Mareretu to Waitotira (96 M. 30 Chs. to 107 M. 28 Chs.).*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 11 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, I, Joseph Gordon Coates, the Minister of Public Works, do hereby order and declare that the by-laws to be enforced on the Whangarei Branch Railway, Portland to Waitotira (5 miles 23 chains to 19 miles 75 chains), and on the North Auckland Railway, Mareretu to Waitotira (96 miles 30 chains to 107 miles 28 chains), prior to being opened for traffic under the Government Railways Act, 1908, shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto, such by-laws to come into force on the 21st day of July, 1921.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE by-laws to be enforced on the Whangarei Branch Railway, Portland to Waitotira (5 miles 23 chains to 19 miles 75 chains), and on the North Auckland Railway, Mareretu to Waitotira (96 miles 30 chains to 107 miles 28 chains), prior to being opened for traffic under the Government Railways Act, 1908, shall, *mutatis mutandis*, be the same as those made by the Minister of Railways on the 29th day of May, 1909, for the management of the railways open for traffic in the Dominion of New Zealand and for the regulation and control of all traffic on or upon the same (hereinafter called "the Railway Department's By-laws"), a copy of which by-laws has been published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 47, of the 10th day of June, 1909, and as altered and extended from time to time by publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* as hereinafter mentioned.

2. Where the words mentioned in the first column below appear in the Railway Department's By-laws, the words mentioned in the second column below shall be read in lieu thereof:—

3. Paragraph (2) of clause 40 and Part VI of the Railway Department's By-laws shall be omitted from the by-laws to be enforced on the Whangarei Branch Railway, Portland to Waitotira (5 miles 23 chains to 19 miles 75 chains), and on the North Auckland Railway, Mareretu to Waitotira (96 miles 30 chains to 107 miles 28 chains).

4. The alterations and extensions hereinbefore referred to are those published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 21st September, 1911, the 15th February, 1912, the 11th December, 1913, and the 1st August, 1918.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1921.

Dull and misty weather was much in evidence during May, but except in the West Coast districts of the South Island the total rainfall was everywhere considerably less than the average.

Westerly disturbances ruling between the 7th and 13th and from the 24th to the end of the month accounted for unsettled and squally conditions during these two periods, with rain in many parts, particularly in districts with a westerly aspect.

Although anticyclonic pressure prevailed from the 12th to the 24th, the weather proved cold and dull, owing to the proximity of depressions eastward and southward of the Dominion.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.
