A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby set apart the Crown land described in the Schedule hereto as and for provisional State forests.

SCHEDULE.

WESTLAND FOREST-CONSERVATION REGION.

ALL that area of land in the Westland Land District, being Reserve No. 1708, situate in Blocks X and XI, Waitaha Survey District, containing 1,400 acres, more or less, bounded as follows: Towards the north-east by Sections 3076-14 and Duffers Creek, towards the south-east by State Forest Reserve No. 1631, towards the south-west by the Te Raho Taiapa River, and towards the north-west by the Tasman Sea.

Also all that area of land in the Westland Land District, being Reserve No. 1709, situate in Blocks VII and XI, Waitaha Survey District, containing 600 acres, more or less, bounded as follows: Towards the north-east by the Waitaha River; towards the south-east by State Forest Reserve No. 1631; towards the south-west by State Forest Reserve No. 1631 and Section 2354, Block XI, Waitaha Survey District; and towards the north-west by Sections 3077, Block XI, 2962, and Reserve No. 648 (South Waitaha Town Reserve), Block VII, Waitaha Survey District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and gazetted on the eighth day of May of that year, certain land in Arawata Survey District, in the Westland Land District, was, *inter alia*, set apart as and for a provisional State forest in terms of section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918:

Constituting the Dannevirke Electric-power District, and Outer Area of such District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, that any area or areas of land may be constituted an electric-power district or outer area of such district under the said Act, and in the manner therein provided:

And whereas a petition, praying that the area described in the First Schedule hereto may be constituted an electric-power district under the said Act, and that the area described in the Second Schedule hereto may be constituted an outer area of such electric-power district, was presented to the Governor-General on the twenty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one:

And whereas such petition was publicly notified in the *Examiner* and the *Manawatu Daily Times* of the thirteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, respectively, and the *Dannevirke Evening News* of the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, being newspapers circulating in the proposed electric-power district:

And whereas, after due inquiry, the Governor-General is of opinion that the petition should be granted, subject to the proposed boundaries of the outer area being altered as hereinafter appears:

Now, therefore I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, do hereby proclaim the district with the boundaries as described in the First Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district, and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "Dannevirke Electric-power District"; and I do hereby alter the proposed boundaries of the outer area, and

further proclaim that the outer area with the altered boundaries as described in the Third Schedule hereto shall be an outer area of such electric-power district.

DANNEVIRKE ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Wellington.

JELLICOE, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red-deer may be destroyed in the Wellington Acclimatization District.

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, the

secretary of the Wellington Acclimatization Society at Wellington, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red-deer of either sex and of any age which in the opinion of the said secretary or of the said authorized persons should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or any other reason.

2. Such deer may be destroyed [as aforesaid during a period of three months from the date hereof.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red-deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of the person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

On the same date the existing fixed light in Destruction Gully on the north side of the entrance will be replaced by an unwatched (U) Aga flashing light showing one flash every 3 seconds (0.4 second light, 2.6 seconds eclipse). Visible for a distance of ten miles. The white and green arcs of this light will remain the same as at present.

The upper and lower beacons in line bearing 70° lead over the bar, which has a width of not less than half a mile between the three-fathoms banks, and a depth of not less than 23 ft. M.L.W.S.

After crossing the bar inwards care should be taken to alter course promptly when the Destruction Gully beacon is in line with the edge of Paratutai; otherwise, a vessel may be dangerously close to the edge of the main or middle bank. Strict and constant attention should be paid to the semaphore when entering or leaving.
