A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Oxford, Malvern, Inglewood, Waitara, Morrinsville, Cambridge, Matata, and Whakatane districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into eight registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Oxford, Malvern, Inglewood, Waitara, Morrinsville, Cambridge, Matata, and Whakatane districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be conterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names, as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Oxford, Malvern, Inglewood, Waitara, Morrinsville, Cambridge, Matata, and Whakatane districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore

comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into eight marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

OXFORD DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded by a line commencing at Ashley Head, and proceeding along a right line to Block Hill; thence along a right line to the source of the Ashley River and down the right bank of that river to its intersection with a right line between Trig. Station 16, Mairaki Survey District, and the north-western corner of Section 9791; thence along that line to the said corner, along a right line to the north-western corner of Section 13684, and along the north-western boundaries of Sections 13684, 15467, 5896, 1025, 14620, 13974, across a road-line, and along the north-western boundary of Section 1154 to its south-western corner; thence along a right line to the northern corner of Section 20235, and along its north-western boundary to the Eyre River; thence along a right line to the north-western corner of Section 13682, and along the north-western boundaries of Sections 13682, 13681, and 15260; thence along a right line to the northern corner of Section 34754, and along its north-western boundary, across a road, and the north-western boundaries of Sections 30310, 33342, 33451, and the production of the last boundary-line to a road; thence north-westerly along that road to Trig. Station 48, and along a right line from that trig. to the north-eastern corner of Section 32083; thence along the north-western side of the road forming the south-eastern boundary of that section, and its production to the right bank of the Waimakariri River; thence up the said right bank to a point due west of Trig. Station S on the summit of the Puketiraki Range; thence along a right line to said trig. station, and along the Puketiraki Range to Ashley Head, the point of commencement.

MALVERN DISTRICT.

All that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded by a line commencing at the Teremakau Saddle, and proceeding thence along the watershed through Snowy Peak and Esk Head to Ashley Head; thence along the Puketiraki Range to Trig. Station S; thence due west to the right bank of the Waimakariri River, and down that bank to a point in line with the Selwyn and Waimakariri Road; thence to and along that road, the Greendale and Station Road, and the Great South Road to the Selwyn River; thence up that river and the Waianiwaniwa branch to the Homebush Road; thence by straight lines passing through Porter's Pass and Browning's Pass; thence northerly along the dividing-range to the point of commencement.

## INGLEWOOD DISTRICT.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north by Sections Nos. 48, 44, and 45, Hua and Waiwakaiho Hundred, Paritutu Survey District, by Sections Nos. 32, 41, 80, and 55, Tarurutangi District, Paritutu Survey District, by Sections Nos. 203 and 127, Huirangi District, Paritutu Survey District, and by Sections Nos. 115, 116, 206, and part of 207, Huirangi District, Waitara Survey District; towards the north-east by the Rimutauteka Native Block to the Kurapete Stream; thence towards the north-east by that stream to its confluence with the Manganui River; thence towards the east by that river, the Bristol Road, and the Kaimata Road to the south-western corner of Block II, Huiroa Survey District; thence again towards the north by Blocks II and III, Huiroa Survey District; again towards the east by Blocks VIII, XII, and part of XVI, Huiroa Survey District, to the summit of the watershed between the Waitara River and the Patea River; thence towards the south and south-west by that summit and the western watershed of the Ahuroa Stream, and by Croydon and Salisbury Roads to Tariki Road; thence again towards the south by the last-mentioned road to the Waipuku Stream; thence towards the south-east by that stream to its source; and thence by a right line to Mount Egmont; and thence again towards the north-west and towards the west by a right line from Mount Egmont to the source of the Waiwakaiho Stream, and by that stream to Section 48, the point of commencement.

## WAITARA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north and north-west by the ocean from the mouth of the Waiongona River to a point due west of Mount Tiger in Block III, Tainui Survey District; thence again towards the north by a right line to the said Mount Tiger; thence towards the north-east generally by the southern watershed of the Mohakatino River and the summit of the range over Mount Dampier to Section 17, Block II, Pouatu Survey District; thence towards the south-east generally by Sections 17 and 18, Block II aforesaid, to Mount Dampier Road; thence by that road to its junction with the Mangapapa Road; thence by the last-mentioned road to the Waitara River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Makino Stream; thence by the Makino Stream to Block VII, Huiroa Survey District; thence towards the south-west generally by Blocks VII and VI, Huiroa Survey District, to the Kaimata Road; thence towards the west by the said Kaimata Road, the Bristol Road, and the Manganui River to the Kurapete Stream; thence by that stream to Section No. 238, Huirangi District, Huiroa Survey District; thence by that section and Sections Nos. 233, 230, 221, 215, 214, 205, and 212, Huirangi District aforesaid, to the Waiongona River; and thence by that river to its mouth, the point of commencement.

## MORRINSVILLE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing on the confiscation-line in Block XII, Hapukohe Survey District, due west of Te Aroha Mountain; thence proceeding due east along a right line to the western boundary of Block XII, Waitoa Survey District; thence southerly along that boundary to the north-eastern boundary of Lot 12A of Section 24, Block XI, Waitoa Survey District; thence along the north-eastern, north-western, south-western, and south-eastern boundaries of the said Lot 12A to the western boundary of Block XII; thence southerly along that boundary and the western boundaries of Block XVI, Waitoa Survey District, and Block IV, Maungakawa Survey District, to the northern boundary of Pourewa Block, and easterly along that boundary to the Waitoa River; thence up that river to the eastern boundary of the Kerihoni Block, along the eastern boundaries of the Kerihoni Block and the Pakarau Settlement to the southernmost corner of Section 20s, Pakarau Settlement, along a right line to the easternmost corner of Section 18s, and along the south-eastern boundary of that section to its southernmost corner, and along the north-western boundary of Section 32 on deposited plan No. 4333A to and along the eastern boundary of Te Waikaukau Block; thence along the eastern boundaries of Kiwitahi Nos. 1A, 1B, 1C, and 1D to the northern boundary of Kiwitahi No. 1E; thence westerly along that boundary, and northerly and westerly along the eastern and northern boundaries of Kiwitahi No. 2 to the north-eastern corner of Section 24s, Te Miro Settlement; thence along the northern and western boundaries of that section, the north-western boundary of Section 23s, the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Section 25s, the north-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 19s and 71s, the northern and western boundaries of Section 28s, the north-western boundaries of Sections 33s and 34s, and the northern boundary of Section 35s, Te Miro Settlement, to Pukemoremore; thence north-westerly along the confiscation-line to the point of commencement.

## CAMBRIDGE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing on the Waikato River at the westernmost corner of Hautapu Parish, and proceeding thence along the

north-western boundary of that parish to Pukemoremore; thence along the southern boundary of the Morrinsville Registration District hereinbefore described to the north-eastern corner of Kiwitahi 1E Block; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of that block, Te Konehu, Tawawhakapuoro, and Hinuwera No. 2 Blocks to the Waikato River, and up the right bank of that river to the Little Waipa River; thence westerly along a right line to Maungatautari Trig. Station, and along a right line to the southernmost corner of the Pukekura Parish; thence along the western boundary of that parish to the Waikato River, and down that river to the point of commencement.

## MATATA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, commencing at the north-western corner of the Matata Parish, and proceeding thence along the sea-coast to the new outlet of the Rangitaiki River in Block V, Awa-o-te-Atua Survey District; thence up the middle of the said Rangitaiki River to the southern boundary of the Matata Parish, and proceeding westerly and northerly along the southern and western boundaries of the said parish to the point of commencement.

## WHAKATANE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, commencing at the mouth of the new outlet of the Rangitaiki River in Block V, Awa-o-te-Atua Survey District; thence easterly along the sea-coast to the mouth of the Waiotahi River, up the middle of that river to its source, and thence along a right line to the Maungapohatu Trig. Station; thence along a right line to Ngapakira Trig. Station, a right line to the mouth of the Huiarau Stream in Waikaremoana, and up that stream to its source; thence along a right line to the source of the Whakatane River; and down that river to the southern boundary of the Rangitaiki Parish; thence westerly along the said parish boundary to the Rangitaiki River, and down the middle of that river to the point of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Piopio, Awakino, and Waiharakeke Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Piopio, Awakino, Waiharakeke, and Marokopa Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be continuous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

## Districts constituted under the Marriage Act, 1908.

## A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Piopio, Awakino,

and Waiharakeke Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

**PIOPIO DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the westernmost corner of Section 4, Block V, Whareorino Survey District, and proceeding north-easterly along the Mangatōa Road, the Kiritehere Road, the Mangakōkopu Road, and the Pomarangi Road to the Tawarau Stream; thence down that stream to the southernmost corner of Section 7A, Block X, Kawhia South Survey District; thence along the southern boundaries of Blocks X and XI to Section 6, Block XVI, Kawhia South Survey District (Small Grazing-run 26), and along the south-western boundary of that section to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 3, Block IV, Maungamangero Survey District; thence along a right line to the northernmost corner of that section, and along the southern boundaries of Kawhia South and Orahirī Survey Districts to the Haururu Road; along that road to Section 8, Block IV, Maungamangero Survey District; along the north-eastern and eastern boundaries of that section, and the southern boundary of Section 3, Block I, Otake Survey District, to the north-eastern corner of Kinohaku East 2 No. 5B Block; along the eastern boundary of that block and of Section 1, Block V, Otake Survey District, the south-western and southern boundaries of Kinohaku East 2 No. 28 Block, southern part of 16B, the southern and eastern boundaries of Subdivision 15 of that block, and the northern boundary of Kinohaku East 2 No. 24A Block, the western and northern boundaries of Section 1, Block VI, Otake Survey District, across a road, and along the northern boundary of Section 16, Block VI aforesaid, to the western boundary of that block, and along the boundary between Blocks VI and VII to the Awakino - Te Kuiti Road; thence along a right line to the northernmost corner of Maraetaua AA Block, along the north-eastern and eastern boundaries of that block to the Tuhua Road, along that road to the western boundary of Block II, Totoro Survey District, along the western boundary of that block and the western boundaries of Blocks V, VIII, and XII, Totoro Survey District, to the Mokaiti Stream, and along that stream to the boundary between Blocks X and XI, Totoro Survey District; thence along a right line to Taumatatini Trig. Station, and a right line to the Waitahi Road at the saddle; thence along that road to the Mokau River, and along its right bank to Mangapapa B 2 Block, and along the eastern and northern boundaries of that block, the eastern and northern boundaries of Mangaawakino No. 4 eastern portion, the northern boundaries of Mangaawakino Nos. 1c and 1a, and the eastern boundary of Mahoenui No. 6 to the Awakino River; thence down that river to the eastern boundary of Section 1, Block IX, Awakino North Survey District, and northerly along that boundary, the eastern and northern boundaries of Section 3, Block IV, the eastern boundaries of Sections 2 and 4, Block II, Awakino North Survey District, the eastern boundaries of Sections 9, 7, 5, Block XI, and 7, 8, 9, Block VIII, Whareorino Survey District; thence along the road forming the southern boundaries of Sections 4 and 1A, Block VIII, Whareorino Survey District; thence along the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned section, and the south-western boundary of Section 4, Block V, Whareorino Survey District, to its westernmost corner, the point of commencement.

**AWAKINO DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Waikawau River in Block IX, Whareorino Survey District, and proceeding up that river to the Mangatōa Road; thence northerly along that road to the western boundary of Section 4, Block V, Whareorino Survey District; thence south-easterly along that boundary and south-easterly along the boundary of Section 1A, Block VIII, and along the road forming the southern boundaries of that section and Section 4 to the western boundary of Section 11, Block IX, Maungamangero Survey District; thence southerly along the western and south-western boundaries of said Section 11 and the western boundaries of Section 12, Block IX, Section 2, Block XIII, Maungamangero Survey District, forest reserve, Block II, Awakino North Survey District, Section 2, Block I, Awakino East Survey District, and Section 1, Block II, Awakino North Survey District, to the northern boundary of Section 3, Block IV, Awakino North Survey District; thence easterly along the northern boundary of that section, and southerly along the eastern boundaries of the same section and of Section 1, Block IX, to the Awakino River; thence up that river to and along the eastern boundary of Mahoenui No. 6 Block, and along the northern boundaries of Mangaawakino Nos. 1A and 1c and eastern portion No. 4 to the north-western boundary of Mangapapa B 2 Block; thence along that boundary and the north-eastern boundary of the same block

to the right bank of the Mokau River; thence down that bank to the sea, and northerly along the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

**WAIHARAKEKE DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Rakaunui Creek in Kawhia Harbour; thence proceeding up that creek and Te Toi Stream to and along the western boundary of Section 1A, Block XV, Kawhia North Survey District; thence along the western boundaries of Sections 3, 2, and 1, Block III, and 4A, 3, and 1, Block VII, Kawhia South Survey District, to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the easternmost corner of Section 2, Block XI, Kawhia South Survey District, along the southern boundary of that section, and along the eastern boundary of Section 7A to the Tawarau Stream; thence down that stream and the Marokopa River to the northern boundary of Kinohaku West No. 5 Block, and along that boundary and the northern boundary of Kinohaku West No. 2 to the sea, and northerly along the sea-coast and easterly along the shore of Kawhia Harbour to the point of commencement.

**MAROKOPA DISTRICT.**

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing on the sea-coast at the north-western corner of Kinohaku West No. 2 Block, and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundaries of Kinohaku West Nos. 2 and 5 Blocks to the Marokopa River; thence up that river and the Tawarau Stream to the Pomarangi Road; thence along that road, along the Mangakōkopu Road, along the Kiritehere Road, and along the Mangatōa Road to the Waikawau River; thence down that river to its mouth, and northerly along the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District, containing by admeasurement 36 acres 0 roods 28 perches, more or less, being Lot 2 of Section 10, Block III, Upper Waitara Survey District. Bounded towards the north by Moki Road, 914-5, 215-2, 328-4, 168, 255, 612-7, 1190-9, 317-6, 297-4, and 128-6 links; towards the south by Lot 1 of the aforesaid Section 10, 181-3, 162-7, 342-8, 341-4, 134-8, 405-4, 552-8, 191-2, 242-7, 172-4, 345-5, and 167-8 links; and towards the west by Section 1, Block III, Upper Waitara Survey District, 327-1, 346, 329-1, 602-1, 356-4, and 383-7 links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby set apart the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto as and for a provisional State forest.

SCHEDULE.

PROVISIONAL STATE FOREST PART 28.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District, containing by admeasurement 2,306 acres 3 roods, more or less, being Section 1, Block I, Mangaoporo Survey District. Bounded towards the north-east by Tapatu Block, 6620.3 links; towards the east by Section 1, Block II, Mangaoporo Survey District, 16813.2 links; towards the south by Ahomatariki

No. 3B Block, 14752.1 links; and towards the west generally by Waikura Block, 11332 links, and Mangaparoa Block, 17244 links.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the license dated the ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, authorizing the Tamaki West Road Board to erect electric lines within the Tamaki West Road District; and doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act and dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of the same month, or any regulations hereinafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations"), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein, hereby authorize the Tamaki West Road Board (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described.

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises the Tamaki West Road District as at present constituted. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 51810, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (c) and (e) of clause 3 of the regulations. The generating voltage shall be approximately 440 volts between the terminals.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days after due date a discount of 1d. per unit shall be allowed; and provided further that the minimum charge to any consumer shall be not less than £1 per quarter.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

6. VARIATIONS IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

7. BARE WIRES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, no bare wires shall be erected unless and until the consent of the Minister has first been obtained in accordance with the regulations.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereinafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize the Roxburgh Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as “the licensee”) to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes along the routes hereinafter described.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE ROUTES OF THE ELECTRIC LINES.

THAT route along the street in the Borough of Roxburgh between Blocks III, V, VII, and XI on the western side, and Blocks IV, VI, VIII, IX, and XII on the eastern side. Also that route along the street in the said borough between Blocks XII and XIII on the south-western side, and Blocks IX and X on the north-eastern side. As the said routes are more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 51757, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph a (1) of clause 3 of the regulations. The generating voltage shall be approximately 110 volts between terminals.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The maximum charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that “lighting purposes” shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

6. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

7. EXTENSION OF LINES.

Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorize any extension of the electric lines shown on the plan referred to in clause 1 hereof.

8. BARE WIRES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, no bare wires shall be erected unless and until the consent of the Minister has first been obtained in accordance with the regulations.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 30th day of August, 1921.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act, and doth hereby revoke the regulations made under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, on the 15th day of November, 1915, and published in the *Gazette* of the 18th November, 1915.

## REGULATIONS.

## DISTRICT ELECTORS LIST AND ROLL.

1. THE district electors list, to be compiled on or before the 31st day of January in every year in which a general election of the Council is to be held, as provided by section 6 of the said Act, shall be in the form and shall contain the particulars specified in the First Schedule hereto.

2. In preparing the district electors list the Town Clerk shall place thereon the name—

(a.) Of every person of whose qualification as an elector he is satisfied; and also

(b.) Of every person who makes, and delivers or transmits to him at his office, a claim for enrolment as hereinafter provided.

3. Every such claim for enrolment shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, and the claimant's signature shall be attested by a Justice of the Peace, or a Postmaster, or a minister of religion, or an elector of the borough, or the Town Clerk.

4. It shall be the duty of the Council to keep at the Town Clerk's office a supply of blank printed forms of claims for enrolment as aforesaid for the free use of claimants under paragraph (b) of Regulation 2 hereof.

5. Names appearing on the district electors roll for any year shall be continued on the next succeeding district electors list, except in the case of persons who are known to the Town Clerk to have died or to have lost their qualification; and it shall be his duty to report in writing to the Council all names thus omitted and the reasons of the omission. The Town Clerk shall send a written notice to every person whose name is omitted as having lost his qualification, informing him of the fact of such omission.

6. The Town Clerk shall keep the district electors list in his office, and allow it to be inspected without fee by all persons interested therein during office hours from the 1st until the 7th day of February of the year in which the list is compiled; and he shall, on or before the said 1st day of February, publicly notify that the said list is or will be ready for inspection as aforesaid.

7. All objections under section 9 of the said Act shall be in writing under the hand of the objector, in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, and must be addressed to the Town Clerk, and delivered at his office on or before the 15th day of February in the year in which the list is compiled.

8. The Town Clerk shall make and sign a list of all such objections in the form in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and shall keep that list in his office, and allow it to be inspected without fee by any person interested therein during office hours from the 16th to the 20th day of February.

9. The Council shall, at the sitting of the Council held for that purpose in the month of March (being not later than the 15th day thereof), amend the district electors list by correcting every error set forth in any such objection and proved to the satisfaction of the Council to exist therein, and any other error found in such list; and the Mayor shall initial every alteration so made in the district electors list, which shall thereupon be authenticated in the manner prescribed by Regulation 25 hereof.

10. Additions to the district electors list after the 31st day of January aforesaid shall be made by means of a supplementary district electors list or supplementary lists, and with respect to every such supplementary list the following shall apply:—

(a.) The names of electors shall be entered therein in alphabetical order of surnames, and shall be numbered consecutively, commencing with the number next following the last number in the district electors list, or in the last previous supplementary list.

(b.) Each supplementary district electors list shall be corrected where necessary, and shall be authenticated in the manner prescribed by Regulation 25 hereof, and shall thereupon be a supplementary district electors list, and be deemed to be incorporated with the original district electors list; or, if the said district electors list has then become the district electors roll, it shall be deemed to be a supplementary district electors roll, and to be incorporated with such district electors roll.

11. Appeals to a Magistrate under section 11 of the said Act against the district electors list may be made as follows:—

(a.) An objection in writing under the hand of the objector shall be lodged by him with the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court nearest to the public office of the Council not later than the 19th day of March, and a copy of that objection shall also be lodged by the objector with the Town Clerk not later than the said 19th day of March.

(b.) The objection may be in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as may be.

(c.) The Magistrate shall hear and determine the appeal at such convenient place and time, not being later than the 27th day of March, as he appoints, and not less than three days' notice shall be given by the Clerk of the said Court to the Council and to the appellant of the date so appointed.

12. Appeals to a Magistrate under section 11 of the said Act against the district electors roll or a supplementary district electors list or roll may be made as follows:—

- (a.) An objection in writing under the hand of the objector shall be lodged by him with the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court nearest to the public office of the Council not later than the day on which the district electors roll is, by section 13 of the said Act, closed for the purpose of any election or poll, and not later than that day a copy of that objection shall be lodged by the objector with the Town Clerk.
- (b.) The objection may be in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as may be.
- (c.) The Magistrate shall appoint a day being not later than three days after the objection is lodged for the hearing and determining thereof, and notice of the day so appointed shall be given by the Clerk of the said Court to the Council and to the appellant.

13. Supplementary district electors rolls for the purposes of an election to fill any extraordinary vacancy in the office of Mayor or Councillor or for any poll shall be prepared in manner prescribed by Regulation 10 hereof.

14. A copy of the district electors roll, and of all its supplements, and also the original roll with all its amendments and corrections, shall be kept open for public inspection at the office of the Town Clerk during office hours without fee.

15. The roll required under section 14 of the said Act shall be prepared by striking out from the district electors roll, and from every supplementary district electors roll in force within the borough, on the fourteenth day previous to the taking of the poll for which such roll is required, the name of every person whose name appears on such rolls and is not entitled to vote at such poll, and the name of every other person whose name appears on such rolls more than once (except in the case where that name first appears); and no other alterations shall be made in any such roll after that day until after the taking of the poll.

16. In case the district electors roll for any borough or ward is not, from any cause whatever, made out and completed so as to come into force on the 1st day of April, or within any extension of time allowed under section 379 of the said Act, the district electors roll for that borough or ward in force on the 31st day of March shall remain in force until another district electors roll comes into force for the same borough or ward.

17. (1.) As soon as practicable after the original district electors roll or any supplementary district electors roll, or roll under section 14 of the said Act, comes into force, copies thereof shall (except as hereinafter provided) be printed by the Council.

(2.) Where the total number of electors on any roll or supplementary roll does not exceed two hundred, the Council may by resolution declare that such roll or supplementary roll shall be typewritten and not printed, and the same shall be typewritten accordingly.

(3.) The Town Clerk shall supply any person with a copy of the printed or typewritten district electors roll, together with all its printed or typewritten supplements, on payment of 1s.

18. The Town Clerk is liable to a fine not exceeding £5 in every case where he refuses, or wilfully neglects, or unreasonably delays—

(a.) To place on the district electors list the name of any person who makes a claim for enrolment in the manner provided by paragraph (b) of Regulation 2 hereof; or

(b.) To faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on him by these regulations.

19. If the Council fails or unreasonably delays to keep at the Town Clerk's office a supply of blank printed forms of claims for enrolment for the free use of claimants, as provided by Regulation 4 hereof, or to faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on it by these regulations, every person (whether the Town Clerk or any member of the Council) who is party to or responsible for such failure or delay is severally liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

20. When a borough is first divided, or is redivided, into wards, the Town Clerk shall prepare a separate district electors roll for each ward, or for each ward affected by the redivision; and the Town Clerk shall forthwith make up from the district electors roll or rolls in force a new district electors roll for each such ward, and shall place on the roll of each such ward the name of each elector who appears from the existing district electors roll to be entitled to vote therein.

21. The Town Clerk shall also in like manner make new district electors rolls for any ward or wards affected by any creation, abolition, or division of wards, or alteration in their boundaries.

22. Whenever any adjoining area is included in a borough or any ward the Town Clerk shall forthwith make up from the district electors roll or rolls in force in such borough or ward, and from the ratepayers or electors roll in force in any such area, a new district electors roll for the borough or ward, as the case may be; and shall place on the roll for such borough or ward the name of each elector or ratepayer who appears from such rolls respectively to be entitled to vote therein.

23. Whenever any area is excluded from a borough the Town Clerk shall forthwith remove from the district electors roll or rolls in force in such borough or any ward thereof respectively the name of every person whose name appears on such roll or rolls only as possessing a qualification entitling him to be entered thereon in respect of the area so excluded.

24. The rolls made or altered under any of the four last preceding regulations shall, when authenticated in the manner prescribed by Regulation 25 hereof, be the district electors rolls for such borough or ward or wards, as the case may be, until new rolls are made up in accordance with the said Act and the regulations thereunder.

25. (1.) The district electors list, and every supplementary district electors list, and every roll or supplementary roll made pursuant to the said Act or these regulations shall be authenticated by being certified to be correct by the Mayor and two Councillors.

(2.) Where from any cause the foregoing provisions of this regulation cannot be complied with such lists or rolls may be authenticated by the Town Clerk, who shall append the following certificate thereto:—

“Certified pursuant to Regulation 25 (2) of Regulations under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, to be correct.

....., Town Clerk.”

## COLLECTORS AND ACCOUNTANTS.

26. Before any officer entrusted by the Council with the custody or control of moneys enters on the duties of his office, the Council shall take such sufficient security from him for the faithful execution of his duties as it thinks fit.

27. Every person receiving any moneys belonging to or on account of the Corporation of the borough (hereinafter referred to as "a Collector") shall, at such times as the Council directs, pay all moneys so received by him into the bank to the proper account of the District Fund; and shall in any case on the Saturday in each week pay into the bank all such moneys then in his hands.

28. The bank shall give receipts for all moneys so paid in, and such receipts shall be a sufficient discharge to the Collector for the amount named therein.

29. Every Collector shall, once at least in each week, give to the Treasurer a list of all moneys collected by him, showing by whom they were paid and the number of the receipt given by the Collector, as provided in the next succeeding regulation. Every such list shall be accompanied by the receipt of the bank for those moneys.

30. (1.) Every Collector shall give to every person paying rates, rents, tolls, or any other moneys belonging to the Council, a receipt for the same, in such form as the Council provides.

(2.) Forms of receipts shall be supplied to the Collector, numbered with consecutive numbers; and the Collector shall account for the use of all such forms, and shall append to the list mentioned in the last preceding regulation the number of the receipt which he has given to each person from whom he has received money.

(3.) Such receipts are exempt from stamp duty.

31. Every Collector shall from time to time, as directed, make a return to the Council of the names of all persons who have neglected or refused to pay any rates or other moneys due by them.

32. Every person in whose hands any money is placed for expenditure on behalf of the Council shall render full and faithful accounts of the expenditure of all such moneys, at such times and in such manner, and supported by such vouchers, as the Council directs, and shall pay over the balance of any such moneys in his hands to any person appointed by the Council to receive the same on demand.

33. If any moneys belonging to the Corporation appear at any time to be lying in the hands of any person, and not to be duly accounted for, such moneys shall be deemed to be a debt due by that person to the Corporation, and may be recovered by any person authorized by the Council in that behalf, together with full costs of suit, in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

## ACCOUNTS AND BALANCE-SHEET.

34. The Treasurer shall, within fifteen days after the 31st day of March in every year, prepare a balance-sheet of the District Fund, showing, under such heads as the Audit Office requires, an abstract of the receipts and expenditure of the General Account, and of each of the separate accounts kept in accordance with section 111 of the said Act, during the year ending on the said 31st day of March, together with the statements following:—

(a.) A statement of the whole assets and liabilities of the Corporation upon the said 31st day of March, exclusive of the public debt and sinking funds:

(b.) A statement of the public debt of the Corporation, showing the total debt outstanding under the head of each loan raised, and the sinking fund in the hands of the Commissioners to provide for the repayment of each such loan:

(c.) A statement of the reserves and other real estate belonging to the Corporation, showing the terms and rent for which any parts thereof are let on lease or otherwise, and the amounts of the rents in arrear in each case:

(d.) A statement—

(i.) Of the amount of each rate struck or recurring for the year ending on the said 31st day of March, the amount thereof collected, and the amount outstanding at the end of the year, as shown by the rate-book;

(ii.) Of the amount outstanding at the beginning of that year of each rate struck or recurring for previous years, the amount thereof collected during the year, the amount written off during the year by order of the Council, and the amount outstanding at the end of the year.

35. An officer authorized by the Controller and Auditor-General may attend at the office of the Council at any time for the purpose of examining the books and documents up to the date of his visit.

36. As soon as possible after the annual audit the Audit Office shall certify to the correctness of such balance-sheet and statements, either wholly or with such exceptions as are thought fit, and shall send the same so certified to the Council on or before the 30th day of April, or as soon thereafter as possible; and the Council shall forthwith publish the same in the borough, together with the report of the Audit Office thereon.

37. Publication of the balance-sheet and statements, and the report of the Audit Office thereon, may be made in the manner following:—

(a.) The said balance-sheet and statements, together with the report of the Audit Office thereon, shall be printed, and a copy shall be posted free of charge to any rate-payer making application for the same.

(b.) Copies thereof shall be deposited for public inspection during office hours at the office of the Council for a specified period, not being less than thirty days.

(c.) A notice to the above effect shall be published at least four times in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough.

(d.) A copy of the balance-sheet shall, as soon as printed, be forwarded to the Controller and Auditor-General.

38. (1.) Within fourteen days after the certificate is received from the Audit Office the Council shall hold a special meeting for considering such balance-sheet and statements, and the report of the Audit Office; and, if it thinks that the balance-sheet fails to show fully and truly all the dealings with the borough funds, may make such alterations therein, not being contrary to the report of the Audit Office or to the provisions of the said Act, as it thinks fit, and shall finally settle the same.

(2.) The Mayor shall sign the balance-sheet so settled, which, when so signed, shall be deemed to be the true accounts of the borough for all purposes.

39. (1.) The Commissioners of Sinking Funds shall, within fifteen days after the 31st day of March in every year, prepare a balance-sheet showing in respect of each loan the transactions during that year, and also a statement in respect of each loan of the sinking funds in the hands of the Commissioners, and the securities in which those funds are invested at the end of the year. Such balance-sheet and statement shall be certified by the Controller and Auditor-General.

(2.) Such balance-sheet and statement shall be signed by the Commissioners, and clauses 35, 36, and 37 of these regulations shall, with the necessary modifications, apply thereto.

40. (1.) The Council shall, on or before the 30th day of June in each year, cause to be prepared and sent to the Minister of Finance a copy of the balance-sheet as signed by the Mayor for the year ending on the 31st day of March previous, together with such other accounts and particulars as the Minister of Finance directs.

(2.) The Minister of Finance shall lay such accounts and particulars before Parliament within ten days after he has received the same, if Parliament is in session, and, if not, then within ten days after its first meeting at the next session thereof.

#### TRAVELLING-EXPENSES.

41. (1.) The Council may out of its District Fund reimburse to the Mayor and to every Councillor the actual travelling-expenses incurred by him in travelling a distance exceeding three miles (counting one way only) to attend to any business of the Council to which he has been authorized by the Council to attend.

(2.) No expenses incurred in travelling for the purpose of attending any meeting of the Council or any committee thereof shall be reimbursed to any Councillor.

#### PETITIONS.

42. The following provisions shall apply to all petitions made under the said Act, whether to the Governor-General or to the Council:—

(a.) Except in cases where it is otherwise expressly provided, every petition shall be signed by at least three-fifths of the electors of the borough if the subject-matter thereof relates to the entire borough, or by at least three-fifths of the electors of such ward or wards of the borough as may be affected by the subject-matter of the petition.

(b.) The signatures to every petition shall be verified by declaration in the form following, made and signed by some person or persons residing in the district or area to which the petition refers:—

“ I, A. B., of \_\_\_\_\_, do hereby declare that the signatures affixed to the above petition, initialled by me [or which I have marked (*describing the mark*)] are the genuine signatures of the persons whose signatures they purport to be, and that those persons are electors of the [*Name the district*].

“ A. B.”

#### BRIDGES AND FERRIES.

43. Tolls payable at any bridge or ferry under sections 207 to 212 of the said Act may be leased in manner and subject to the terms and conditions following:—

(a.) The letting shall be for a period not exceeding one year.

(b.) The letting shall be by public auction or sealed tenders, after due public notice given.

(c.) Security to the satisfaction of the Council shall be given for the rent to be paid.

(d.) The scale of tolls shall not be altered during the lease without the consent of the lessee, except on payment of compensation.

(e.) The lessee, or any person appointed by him in writing, shall be deemed to be a Collector appointed by the Council.

44. If any person refuses to pay a toll for which he is liable the Collector may seize and distrain any cattle or vehicle in respect of which such toll is payable, or any goods carried in such vehicle or on such cattle.

45. If such toll, with reasonable charges for the seizure and distress and for the maintenance of such cattle, is not paid within four days, the Collector may sell such cattle, vehicle, or goods by public auction, and apply the proceeds of the sale in payment of such toll and charges, and shall pay the residue, if any, to the owner on demand.

46. Instead of making such seizure and distress, the Collector may recover from any person refusing to pay a toll for which he is liable the amount of such toll, with such compensation for loss of time in recovering the same as the Court thinks fit.

47. Every person is liable to a fine not exceeding £5 who—

(a.) Leaves a road and returns thereto within 300 yards on either side of the toll-gate with intent to evade paying toll;

(b.) Hires or plies for hire in any boat or punt across a river, stream, or creek within half a mile in a straight line from any public ferry in working-order, or bridge open for traffic across the same, at which tolls are payable.

48. Every person is liable to a fine not exceeding £5 who attempts by force to evade the payment of any toll, or resists or obstructs the Collector in the execution of his duty.
49. Every Collector is liable to a fine not exceeding £5 who—
- (a.) Demands a larger toll than is payable by law ;
  - (b.) Does not maintain in a legible condition the board required to be maintained by section 208 of the said Act ;
  - (c.) Refuses, when required so to do, to give his name, or gives a false name, to any person from whom he has demanded toll ;
  - (d.) Is drunk when in discharge of his duty ;
  - (e.) Obstructs any person in passing when the lawful toll has been tendered ;
  - (f.) Uses any abusive or offensive language to any person passing.

FINANCIAL ADJUSTMENTS.

50. Whenever, upon the constitution of a new borough or the alteration of the boundaries of an existing borough, agreements for financial and other adjustments are required to be made as specified in section 145 of the said Act, such agreements shall respectively be made and executed within three calendar months from the date of the constitution of the new borough or from the date of alteration of boundaries respectively, as the case may be.

51. All such agreements shall provide, *inter alia*, for the following matters :—

- (a.) What part of the real and personal property of the local authority or local authorities directly affected by such constitution or alteration shall respectively become the property of the new borough or other authority acquiring the severed area, as the case may be.
- (b.) What part of the rates payable to the existing local authority or local authorities from which such new borough or added area has been taken shall be deemed payable to such new borough or other authority acquiring such severed area respectively.
- (c.) What part of the debts, liabilities, or engagements of such existing local authority or local authorities, whether absolute and outstanding at the date of such severance or then contingent or prospective (if the same be capable of estimation), shall be liabilities or engagements of such new borough or other local authority acquiring such severed area respectively.
- (d.) What part of the interest and sinking fund of any loan raised by such existing local authority or local authorities shall be payable by the new borough or other local authority acquiring such severed area respectively.

52. If no such agreements as aforesaid are made within the said period of three calendar months from the date of the constitution or alteration of boundaries as aforesaid, then, upon the written application of any of the local authorities directly affected by such constitution or alteration, the Governor-General may appoint one or more persons to be Commissioners to inquire and report to him upon any matters which he shall deem necessary to enable him to make an adjustment of property, liabilities, contracts, and engagements between such local authorities. The Commissioners shall report to the Governor-General, after such inquiry as they think necessary, their opinion as to the matters inquired into, but it shall not be obligatory on the Governor-General to act in accordance with any opinion or recommendation expressed or made by the Commissioners. Such Commissioners shall have all the powers of a Commission appointed by the Governor-General in Council under the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908. After consideration of the report of the Commissioners the Governor-General shall, by Warrant under his hand, make such adjustment or award as he deems just. Such adjustment or award shall be notified to the parties by the Minister of Internal Affairs. All applications under this regulation shall be addressed to the Minister of Internal Affairs.

53. Any such adjustment or award may provide for all or any of the matters mentioned in Regulation 51 hereof, and may declare in whom any property shall be vested, and for what estate, and by whom any moneys shall be paid, or other acts and things done (including the payment by either party of the whole or any part of the costs and expenses of such inquiry), and generally may give such directions as may be necessary for giving full effect to these regulations relating to financial adjustments.

54. Every such adjustment or award shall be final and conclusive as between the parties.

OFFENCES.

55. Every person commits an offence who fails to observe any of the provisions of these regulations and is liable for each such offence to a fine of £5.

IN exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred upon him by the Christchurch Tramway District Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council made under the Christchurch Tramway District Act, 1902, and its amendments, on the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and six, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and six (page 839), and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

ELECTORS LISTS AND ROLLS.

1. THE Secretary of the Christchurch Tramway Board shall, on or before the 1st day of September in each year in which a general election of members of the Board is to be held, make out a list, in card form or otherwise, of tramway electors as defined in section 9 of the said Act.

2. Every such list of electors shall contain the particulars specified in the First Schedule hereto.

3. In preparing the said list the Secretary shall enter thereon the name of every person who to his knowledge possesses any qualification entitling him to be entered thereon, or who, being so entitled, makes a claim to be entered thereon in the manner hereinafter provided.

4. Every such claim for enrolment shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect,

and the claimant's signature shall be attested by a Justice of the Peace, or a Postmaster, or a minister of religion, or an elector of the Christchurch Tramway District, or the Secretary of the Board, or the Clerk of any local authority.

5. It shall be the duty of the Board to keep at its general office a supply of blank printed forms of claims for enrolment as aforesaid for the free use of claimants for the purposes aforesaid.

6. Names appearing on the roll of the electors of the Christchurch Tramway District in respect of a freehold or rating qualification for any year shall be continued on the next succeeding electors list, except in the case of persons who are known to the Secretary to have died or to have lost their qualification, and it shall be his duty to report in writing to the Board all names thus omitted.

7. (1.) The Secretary shall transfer to the list of tramway electors the names of persons appearing on the rolls of all boroughs and counties in the Christchurch Tramway District, providing that he is satisfied that such persons still retain the qualification in respect of which they are so enrolled, and providing that the property or residence in respect of which they are so enrolled is within the Christchurch Tramway District. If in his opinion it is desirable to ascertain whether or not persons so enrolled on a borough roll in respect of a residential qualification continue to reside at the address in respect of which they are so enrolled, he shall send to such persons through the post a communication to that effect. If such communication is returned by the Postal authorities to the Secretary undelivered, such persons shall be deemed to have left the address entered on the borough rolls, and their names shall not be transferred to the tramway election list.

(2.) Names of persons on the tramway electors roll in respect of a residential qualification, and who are entered thereon as resident in any portion of a county in the Christchurch Tramway District, shall be continued on the next succeeding tramway electors list. If in the opinion of the Secretary it is desirable to ascertain whether or not such persons continue to reside at the address in respect of which they are entered, he shall adopt the same procedure as is set forth in the preceding paragraph hereof.

8. The Secretary shall keep the electors list in his office and allow it to be inspected (without fee) by all persons interested therein during office hours from the 2nd day of September until the 8th day of September in the year aforesaid, and he shall, on or before the said 2nd day of September, publicly notify that such list is or will be ready for inspection at his office.

9. All objections under section 12 of the said Act shall be made in writing in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, and must be addressed to the Secretary and delivered at his office on or before the 15th day of September in the year aforesaid.

10. The Secretary shall make and sign a list of all such objections in the form in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and shall keep such list in his office, and allow it to be inspected (without fee) by any person interested therein during office hours from the 16th day of September to the 20th day of September in the year aforesaid.

11. The Board shall amend the electors list by correcting every error set forth in any such objection and proved to the satisfaction of the Board to exist therein; and the Chairman shall initial every alteration so made in the electors list.

12. At a sitting of the Board to be held for that purpose in the month of October (being not later than the 12th day thereof) the Chairman and two members of the Board shall sign the electors list as amended, and shall certify thereon to its being correct; and the electors list so certified and corrected shall thereupon become the electors roll for the district, and shall remain in force until a new electors roll comes into force in like manner.

13. All corrections and additions required to be made after the completion of the electors roll shall be made on a supplementary electors list, which shall be corrected, completed, and authenticated in the same manner as in the case of the electors roll, and thereupon shall become a supplementary electors roll, and shall form part of the electors roll.

14. Amendments to the electors roll shall be made as provided in section 13 of the said Act.

15. Appeals to a Stipendiary Magistrate under section 14 of the said Act may be made as follows:—

- An objection in writing under the hand of the objector shall be lodged with the Clerk of the Magistrate's Court not later than the 22nd day of October in the year aforesaid, and a copy of such objection shall also, on or before the same day, be lodged with the Secretary.
- The objection shall be in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as may be.
- The Magistrate shall hear and determine the appeal at such convenient place and time, not being later than ten days after the last day appointed for lodging such objections, as he appoints, and not

less than seven days' notice shall be given to the Board and to the appellant of the date so appointed.

16. A copy of the electors roll and all its supplements, and also the original manuscript roll, whether in card form or otherwise, shall be kept open for public inspection at the office of the Secretary during office hours without fee. As soon as practicable copies thereof shall be printed by the Board and supplied with its supplement to any person applying for same on payment of 1s.

17. In case the electors roll is not, from any cause whatever, made out and completed so as to come into force at the prescribed time, the roll then in force shall (unless the time for making out and completing a new roll is extended) be in force until another electors roll comes into force for the said district.

18. The Secretary is liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 in every case where he refuses, without good cause, or wilfully neglects, or unreasonably delays to place on the electors list the name of any person who makes written claim for enrolment as provided for by clause 3 of these regulations, or refuses, wilfully neglects, or unreasonably delays to faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on him by the said Act or these regulations.

19. If the Board fails or unreasonably delays to keep at the Secretary's office a supply of blank printed claim forms for the free use of claimants as provided by clause 5 of these regulations, or to faithfully and promptly perform any other duty imposed on it by the said Act or these regulations, every person, whether the Secretary or any member of the Board, who is party to or responsible for such failure or delay is severally liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

*Regulations for a System of Ballot under the Land Act, 1908, and the Land for Settlements Act, 1908.*

JELLICOE, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 30th day of August, 1921.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by sections three and one hundred and six of the Land Act, 1908, and section eighty-four of the Land for Settlements Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Acts"), it is enacted that the Governor-General may make regulations as to the mode in which ballots are to be conducted and for preference being given to certain applicants at such ballots:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Acts, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations for a system of ballot made under the Land Act, 1908, and the Land for Settlements Act, 1908, and gazetted on the fifteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof; and doth also declare that such revocation shall take effect and these regulations shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. On the day appointed for receiving applications for land, each application as it is received shall be numbered in consecutive order.

PREFERENCE AT BALLOT.

*Examination of Applicants.*

2. Before taking a ballot or otherwise disposing of applications for land the Land Board may, in such manner as it thinks fit, inquire into all matters affecting an applicant's suitability or his right of preference under the said Acts, or the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, and may reject any applicant who refuses or fails to answer any inquiries as to such matters to the satisfaction of the Board, or who fails to satisfy the Board on any material point.

*Preference to Applicants.*

3. In cases where a ballot is required the preference of applicants shall be determined by the Board in the manner prescribed by the Land Act, 1908, and its amendments.

*Board's Decision to be Final.*

4. The decision of the Board as to the rejection or preference of any applicant shall be final and conclusive.

METHOD OF CONDUCTING BALLOT.

*Ballot-list to be prepared.*

5. A list shall be prepared for each ballot in the following form, on which shall be entered the name of each applicant, followed by the entry of the figure 1 in the column under each section for which he has applied. After the scrutiny of applications by the Land Board, and prior to the drawing of the ballot, rotation numbers shall be affixed in numerical order in the columns set apart therefor, against the names of those whom it has been decided to include in the ballot. The said form may be extended so as to make provisions for as many sections thereon as may be found convenient.

6. The Commissioner shall provide sufficient balls, all of one size and colour, equal to the total number of applications for the section applied for, and on each of such balls there shall be legibly printed or written one of the rotation numbers aforesaid, but so that no two balls shall bear the same rotation number. The figures on the balls shall have a line drawn horizontally under them to show which is the right side up.

*Ballot-box.*

7. At the time fixed for the ballot the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or officer appointed by him, shall in respect of each section read over each name on the list aforesaid with its rotation number, and, as each name and number is read over, the ball bearing the corresponding rotation number shall be deposited in the ballot-box.

*Scrutineer.*

8. The applicants or their authorized representatives present at the ballot shall be entitled to select one person in the room to act as scrutineer on their behalf.

*Ball to be drawn.*

9. The ballot-box shall then be securely closed and thoroughly shaken up and turned, and the drawing shall then take place in the presence of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or the officer appointed by him to superintend such drawing, and the person whose rotation number appears on the ball first drawn from the ballot-box for the section then being balloted for shall be declared by the Commissioner or other officer to be the successful applicant for that particular section, and thereupon his applications (if any) for remaining sections to be balloted shall be cancelled by drawing a horizontal line through entries representing them on the ballot-list.

*Second Number may be drawn.*

10. If the Commissioner thinks fit he may draw a second ball from the ballot-box, and the applicant whose rotation number appears thereon shall be declared the successful applicant in all cases where the applicant whose rotation number is first drawn is ineligible or disqualified from selecting or holding the section balloted for, and such disqualification is announced by the Commissioner or Land Board within a space of thirty days from the date of ballot.

*Successful Applicant to pay Deposit.*

11. Immediately upon the successful applicant being declared he shall pay to the Receiver of Land Revenue the deposit, purchase-money, rent, or other moneys required by law in respect of the section, should such moneys not have already been deposited.

*Procedure if Deposit not paid.*

12. Should such applicant or his representative not make the said payments as required by law, then a fresh ballot in the manner before provided shall be taken between the other applicants for that section without delay, unless a second number has already been drawn as provided in regulation 10, in which case the applicant whose rotation number it is shall be declared the successful applicant and called upon

to pay the necessary deposit, &c. Or, should there be only one remaining applicant, he shall be declared successful, subject to the said payments being made as aforesaid.

*Certificate on Ballot-list.*

13. Immediately after the ballot the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or officer superintending the ballot, and the scrutineer (if any) shall certify on the ballot-list that the ballot has been conducted in accordance with these regulations.

*Vesting the Control of Scenic Reserves in the Summit Road Scenic Reserves Board, under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserves described in the Schedule below (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of three years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely—

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Summit Road Scenic Reserves Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say,—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at the District Lands and Survey Office, Christchurch, at such times as may be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Tuesday, the thirtieth of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

2. The Commissioner of Crown Lands or his Deputy shall be the Chairman of the Board. He may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting be given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on

the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister charged with the administration of the said Act as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

*Amending Regulations relating to the Examination of Engineers  
in the Mercantile Marine.*

WHEREAS by Warrant dated the 13th day of June, 1914, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 58, of the 18th day of the same month, regulations were made for the conduct of examinations of engineers:

And whereas by Warrants dated the 5th day of December, 1918, and 10th day of August, 1921, and published in *New Zealand Gazette* No. 163, of the 12th day of December, 1918, and No. 77, of the 18th day of August, 1921, respectively, the regulations for the conduct of examinations of engineers were amended:

And whereas it is desired to further amend regulation No. 4 in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I do hereby revoke the said regulation No. 4 of the hereinbefore-recited regulations, and do make the following regulation in lieu thereof; and I do hereby order that the said amended regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1921.

REGULATION.

4. CERTIFICATES of competency will be granted to those persons who are British subjects and who pass the requisite examinations, and otherwise comply with the requisite conditions. For this purpose Examiners have been appointed, and arrangements have been made for holding the examinations at the following places, viz.:-

At Auckland, during the first three working-days after the 14th day in the months of January, March, May, July, September, and November.

At Hamilton, during the first three working-days in January, May, and September.

At Napier, during the first three working-days in February, June, and October.

At Wanganui, during the first three working-days in February, June, and October.

At Palmerston North, during the first three working-days in February, June, and October.

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At Wellington, during the first three working-days in February, April, June, August, October, and December.

At Nelson, during the first three working-days in February, June, and October.

At Greymouth, during the first three working-days in February, June, and October.

At Christchurch, during the first three working-days in January, March, May, July, September, and November.

At Timaru, during the first three working-days in March, July, and November.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1921.

July was an unsettled month, though the weather was milder than usual, and in consequence vegetation made an appreciable growth. The total rain was above the average in the West Coast districts of the South Island, and between New Plymouth and Wanganui in the North Island; elsewhere the amounts were below, the greatest deficiencies occurring in the Hawke's Bay and Canterbury districts. Some heavy rain fell on the 2nd and 3rd, with high westerly to southerly winds, when a disturbance in the South ruled in conjunction with one which passed in the vicinity of Cook Strait during the night of the 3rd. A very intense Antarctic storm prevailed between the 12th and 18th, and on the night of the 16th a north-west gale of exceptional severity was experienced, particularly in and southward of Cook Strait. From the 26th to the close of the month a cyclone centre persisted off the western coast, but, though the weather proved dull and misty during this period, the disturbance was responsible for very little rainfall.

WRECKS.—UNIFORM SYSTEM FOR CORRECTION OF CHARTS.

With a view to establishing a uniform system for the correction of charts in regard to sunken wrecks, the under-mentioned procedure will in future be adopted and gradually introduced on the charts:—

I. Wrecks known to, or liable to, constitute a danger to surface navigation will continue to be shown on all Admiralty charts affected; such wrecks may be described as follows:—

(a.) Wrecks of which any part is visible above water.

(b.) Wrecks over which there is a depth of only 10 fathoms (18.3 m.), or less, at low water.

(c.) Wrecks, the existence of which is authentic but of which no definite details are known, liable in consequence of the depth of water to constitute a danger to surface navigation.

II. Wrecks, other than those described in I above, will only be inserted on the largest scale Admiralty chart embracing the position, provided that the depth of water does not exceed 100 fathoms (182.9 m.).

III. Wrecks which lie in positions where the depths exceed 100 fathoms (182.9 m.) will not be shown on the Admiralty charts.

*Note.*—A cautionary note will be inserted on small-scale charts to the effect that certain wrecks are not shown.

IV. Doubtful wrecks will be marked on large-scale charts with the note "E.D." or "P.D.," signifying "existence doubtful" or "position doubtful," as necessary, in order to differentiate them from wrecks the particulars of which are authentically known.

V. In conjunction with the foregoing system, wreck symbols in accordance with the decision of the International Hydrographic Conference, 1919, will be gradually introduced.

*Note.*—In correcting published Admiralty charts for information of wrecks promulgated by Admiralty Notices to Mariners, the old symbols should be used unless the new symbols have been already engraved on these charts.
