WHEREAS the parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto were, by an order of the Native Land Court made on the eighth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, duly laid off as road-lines, in pursuance of sections forty-nine, fifty, and fifty-two of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913:

And whereas the said Court is of the opinion that the said road-lines should be proclaimed as public roads, and a notification to that effect has been forwarded to the Minister of Lands, in terms of section fifty-one of the said Act:

And whereas one month's notice in writing of the intention to proclaim the said road-lines as public roads has been given by the Surveyor-General to the local authority of the district concerned, in terms of section fifteen of the Native Land

Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas it is now expedient that the said road-lines should be proclaimed as public roads:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by sections forty-nine, fifty, and fifty-two of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, and in so far as each of these sections is applicable, do hereby proclaim as public roads the road-lines described in the Schedule

W HEREAS by section one hundred and thirty-three of the Land Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor-General, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any

General, by Proclamation, may from time to time declare any Crown lands within any mining district not held under lease or license, or for which a lease or license has been cancelled, to be open for disposal, as provided in section one hundred and thirty-five of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section one hundred and thirty-three of the said Act, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the sections of land described in the Schedules hereto shall be open on Monday, the fifth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, for disposal on renewable lease, as provided in section one hundred and thirty-five of the said Act; and I do also declare that, for the purposes of section one hundred and twenty-seven of the said Act, the sections of land described in the First Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be heavy-bush land, the lands in the Second Schedule to be heavy-bush land, the lands in the Second Schedule shall be light-bush land, and the lands in the Third Schedule

shall be light-bush land, and the lands in the Third Schedule shall be scrub lands.

And I do hereby provide that, after the first half-year's rent has been paid by the selector, the further instalments of rent payable by him for periods of four years in the case of the heavy-bush land in the First Schedule, three months in the case of the light-bush land in the Second Schedule, or two years in the case of the scrub land described in the 'l hird Schedule shall not be demanded; provided that if at any time during the first five years of his occupancy the selector disposes of his interest in the land the rent so conceded shall be paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit paid by him in full, and thereupon the Land Board may remit such instalments of rent payable by the incoming tenant, not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of rent previously con-ceded to the selector, as the Board thinks fit.

Save in pursuance of a permit issued by the Wheat Controller appointed under the Wheat Trade Regulations, 1921, made on the 14th day of March, 1921, it shall not be lawful for any person in New Zealand, at any time while this Order of Court of the in Council remains in force, to purchase or agree or offer to purchase, whether as principal, agent, or otherwise, any wheat of the harvest of the season 1921–22 in New Zealand, wheat of the harvest of the season 1921–22 in New Zealand, or to be concerned in New Zealand in the making of any such purchase, agreement, or offer by any other person, whether in New Zealand or elsewhere, or to be concerned in New Zealand in the fulfilment or performance of any agreement for the purchase of any such wheat, whether such agreement has been made in New Zealand or elsewhere, and whether it has been made before or after the making of these regulations.

4. In these regulations the term "purchase" includes any mode of acquisition by agreement, save that acquisition by way of security only shall not be deemed to be a purchase.

5. For the purpose of these regulations an option or right of purchase shall be deemed to be an agreement to purchase.

6. For the purpose of these regulations every agreement for

6. For the purpose of these regulations every agreement for the purchase of wheat shall be deemed to be an agreement for the purchase of wheat of the harvest of the season 1921-22 in New Zealand if in accordance with the terms thereof any wheat of that description could be delivered in due fulfilment of the agreement. The provisions of these regulations as to offers, options, or right of purchase shall be construed in like

7. In granting a permit under these regulations the Wheat Controller may impose such terms and conditions as to the purchase and as to the disposition or use of the wheat so purchased as the Controller thinks advisable for the due regulation and maintenance of industries essential for the public welfare.

8. Any such permit may be granted or refused in the absolute discretion of the Wheat Controller, and shall be revocable at the will of the Controller.

9. When any wheat has been purchased under any such permit, it shall not be lawful for the purchaser or any subsequent purchaser to deal with it otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions on which the permit was

granted.

10. The Wheat Controller, or his duly authorized representative, may require any person to give to him any information in such person's possession, and to produce any books or documents in his possession or under his control, relating to the sale or purchase of any wheat, whether grown in New Zealand or not, and of whatever season's crop, and whether such person is a party to such sale or purchase or not. Any person withholding any such information or failing to produce such books or documents shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable accordingly.

11. Any person who makes any false representations with intent thereby to obtain any permit under these regulations either for himself or for any other person, or who in any manner deceives or attempts to deceive the Wheat Controller in the exercise of the powers conferred by these regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable accordingly.

ALL hooks used in hoisting and/or lowering coal shall be manufactured from selected wrought iron of the best smithing quality, of the grades known as "Best Yorkshire" or of Grade "A," and shall have a tensile strength of from 21 to 25 tons per square inch, and an elongation of not less than 25 per cent. in a gauge length of eight times the diameter of the test piece; or from bars of selected mild steel of a tensile strength of from 26 to 30 tons per square inch, with an elongation of 25 per cent. in a gauge length of eight times the diameter of the test piece, and that have been subjected to occasional bend tests to ensure that the material is of sufficient ductility.

to occasional bend tests to ensure that the material is of sufficient ductility.

2. All hooks shall be drawn out of the solid, and must be carefully annealed after forging.

3. Drawings, in duplicate, showing fully the dimensions of the hook, and specifications, in duplicate, showing the quality of the material, the name of the maker of the material, the

tensile strength, the elongation, and particulars of any other tests, shall be forwarded to the Chief Surveyor of Ships for

approval.

4. No hook shall be used in hoisting and/or lowering coal unless it is of a pattern approved by the Minister of Marine, and until it has been passed by a Surveyor appointed by the Marine and Inspection of Machinery Department.

5. Before a hook shall be passed by a Surveyor of Ships it shall be tested in the presence of the Surveyor to double the required working load, and must show no sign of permanent deflection or injury under such load. The Surveyor may require not more than one of each size of hook to be tested to destruction.

6. If the test of a hook has been satisfactory the safe load shall be approved by the Chief Surveyor of Ships, and the Surveyor who witnessed the test shall stamp the approved working load and his initials on the projection over the point of the hook

Note.—A mild winter month, with barometric pressure, temperatures, and sunshine above the mean, and precipitation 27 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 177 hours 55 minutes, 55 per cent. of the possible, and three sunless days. The maximum atmospheric pressure for the month was 30-511 in. on the 25th, and the minimum 28-902 in. on the 5th. A heavy thunderstorm occurred on the 4th, fog on the 22nd, and hail fell on the 2nd, 4th, and 7th. Frost was recorded on the grass on eleven mornings. Mean earth temperature at 1 ft. was 47.7°, and 50-6° at 3 ft. Mean dew-point, 42-2°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0-269 in.; and mean relative humidity, 78 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1921.

During the first week of August an intense and extensive Antarctic storm was responsible for high westerly winds and unsettled boisterous conditions. On the 4th and 5th atmospheric pressure as low as 28.60 in. occurred in southern parts

of the South Island.

Thunderstorms were frequent while the storm lasted, and on the night of the 4th a severe one was experienced at

Wellington.

With the change of wind to southerly, about the 6th, snow fell in many parts of the South Island and on high

with the change of wind to southerly, about the oil, show left in many parts of the botter Island and of light levels in the North.

The middle and end of the month proved somewhat unsettled on account of small depressions to the southward of New Zealand, but, except during the first week, the weather generally was under anticyclonic control, and proved very favourable for a winter month. Rainfall, however, was deficient over most of the Dominion, above-average totals only being recorded in the West Coast and southern districts of the South Island, and at a few westerly stations in the North.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

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By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a

School for the Deal (count)
 Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
 Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
 Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
