A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Scenery Preservation Board, constituted pursuant to the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has recommended that the land described in the Schedule hereto should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall be a scenic reserve under the said Act, and subject to the provisions thereof.

And whereas the Wellington City Council has, in order to reduce the interest payable on its overdraft, made application for authority to transfer the sum of £25,000 from the Wellington City Water-supply Loan Account to its General Account, and it is expedient to authorize the said transfer:

WHEREAS section thirteen of the Finance Act, 1921, provides that where a local authority, as defined by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, has heretofore been or shall hereafter be authorized to raise a loan, whether pursuant to a poll of ratepayers or otherwise, and whether such loan has been raised in part or not, such local authority may, with the consent of the Governor-General in Council, raise any part of such loan upon terms of making the same, together with interest thereon, repayable by instalments extending over such period of years, whether in excess of the period mentioned in the poll taken on the proposal for such loan or not, and payable at such times as may be fixed by such local authority, and may permanently appropriate and pledge for the purpose of securing such instalments any special rate already made or hereafter to be made, or any part of such special rate:

And whereas the Brunner Borough Council has been authorized to borrow the sum of one thousand pounds for the purpose of paying the Council's proportion of the cost of rebuilding Wallsend-Taylorville Bridge:

And whereas application has been made by the Borough Council for the consent of His Excellency the Governor-General in Council to the raising of the above-mentioned loan of one thousand pounds on the instalment system extending over a period of thirty-six and a half years:

Education Act, 1914.—Regulations for Appeals of Teachers against their Classification or Grading.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the amendments set out below in the regulations made by Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (hereinafter referred to as "the said regulations"), for the appeals of teachers against their classification or grading; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

AMENDMENTS IN REGULATIONS.

APPEALS OF TEACHERS AGAINST THEIR CLASSIFICATION OR GRADING.

1. CLAUSE 1 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the insertion, after the words "lodge an appeal," of the words "in writing," and by the addition of the following proviso :—

"Provided that appeals from teachers employed in Western Samoa and in the Cook Islands may be accepted if they have been posted to the Director by the next outgoing mail-steamer following the date on which the classification or grading list was received."

2. Clauses 2 and 3 of the said regulations are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "Secondary-schools Assistant Teachers' Association," and by the substitution therefor of the words "New Zealand Secondary-school Assistants' Association."

3. Clause 4 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the deletion from subclause (i) of the words "an explicit," and by the substitution therefor of the words "a complete and definite."

4. Clause 5 of the said regulations is hereby amended—

(a.) By the deletion of subclause (i), and by the substitution therefor of the following subclause :—

"(i.) The Appeal Board may waive any informality in an appeal, but, in general, shall consider only such grounds of appeal as have been furnished in sufficient time to receive the consideration of the grading officers."

(b.) By the insertion of the following subclause :—

"(ii.) All appeals that have been received after the due date shall be submitted to the Appeal Board, which may, on the ground of exceptional circumstances, decide to hear the appeal."

(c.) By renumbering the remaining subclauses accordingly, and by adding to subclause (vii) the words "Such decision shall in every case be regarded as final."

1. CLAUSE 1 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the addition of the words "or who have previously been graded."

2. Clause 3 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the deletion in subclause (i) of all the words after "they may be graded in any subsequent year only on application to the," and by the substitution therefor of the word "Director"; and by the insertion in subclause (iii), after the word "employed," of the words "in technical schools, secondary schools, or private registered schools, or in Western Samoa or the Cook Islands, or."

3. Clause 5 of the said regulations is hereby amended by adding the following provisos to subclause (i):—

"(g.) Certificated teachers employed on the staff of a normal school shall be placed in groups as follows:—

"(h.) Certificated teachers who are for the time being employed in secondary schools, technical schools, or private registered schools, or who have not been in the employment of an Education Board for a period of three years preceding the date of their application for grading, may be placed in such groups as shall, on the recommendation of an Inspector of Schools, be approved by the Director, and such grading shall be deemed a provisional grading."

4. Clause 13 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the addition of the following proviso:—

"Provided that teaching service in other countries or in schools other than public schools shall be counted to an extent that shall be determined in each case by the Director."

Amended and Additional Regulations under the Naval Defence Act, 1913.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by section twenty-five of the Naval Defence Act, 1913 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby amend and supplement the regulations for the government and payment of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy made under the said Act by Order in Council of the twentieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, as shown in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

(1.) Add an additional regulation No. 12A as follows:—

12a. Extension of Allotment in case of Death.— In the case of death of a rating to whom marriage allowance or dependant's allowance was being paid at the time of death, the allotment based on such allowance is to be continued at the rate in force for four weeks following the date of the notification of death. This should be the fourth Thursday following the date of death, and if death occurs on a Thursday that day is not to count as one of the four. In communicating the stoppage of allotments, the date of death and inclusive date to which allotment is payable should be stated.

(2.) Add an additional regulation No. 12B as follows:—

12b. Extension of Pay, &c., to Men Invalided.— The pay and allowances of ratings lent from the Royal Navy who may be invalided are to be extended, and discharge postdated, for twenty-eight days from the date of approval of the medical survey. It is not the intention that the men should be detained for this period, but the procedure is designed to prevent men whose deferred pay has mostly gone to meet pension contributions being left unprovided for pending the consideration of their claims to pensions or gratuities, which may be payable by the Admiralty or under article 37 of these regulations.

2. The pay and allowances to be extended are such as the man may have been receiving at the date of his survey, including marriage or dependant's allowance, and leave allowance when not victualled. Any allotment based on marriage or dependant's allowance is to be continued for four weeks at the rate in force as a charge against the man's extended account.

3. As men who do not wish to take their discharge in New Zealand are required to be resurveyed at a Naval hospital on arrival in England, the extension of pay, &c., previously authorized will, in their case, take effect from date of approval of the survey as a result of which the man is finally invalided, and the depot to which the man is discharged is to be informed of the terms of this regulation.

4. In the case of all ratings invalided, immediate application should be made to the Naval Secretary for payment of deferred pay and interest accrued. The application should state the address to which it is desired that the sum due be remitted, and the amount due in respect of the current quarter up to and including the date of discharge. In the case of any deductions the reasons should be stated.

(3.) Add an additional regulation No. 30A as follows:—

30a. Playing Harmonium, &c.— In all ships an allowance of 2s. a week is payable to any properly qualified person of the ship's company, selected by the Commanding Officer, who plays the harmonium or other suitable instrument and conducts the choir during divine service. The allowance is payable whether a Chaplain officiates at the service or not.

2. This allowance is payable to the schoolmaster or other person in the training-ship, selected by the Chaplain as choirmaster, whose duty it is to train the choir and play the harmonium at divine services. He may also be granted an allowance at the rate of £4 a year from the Training Service Fund at the discretion of the Commanding Officer.

(4.) At the end of regulation No. 44 add the words "and may be extended to include Saturdays, where such extension is considered desirable."

(5.) Cancel clause 5 of regulation No. 47, and substitute:—

5. Should a man be discharged at his own request, or for other causes other than by invaliding, within two years of entry, a charge is to be made

against him in respect of free kit issued on entry of £1 10s. per month in the cases of Classes I and III, and of £1 5s. per month in the case of Class II ratings, for each full month of the unexpired period of two years. This charge is first to be met by forfeiture of the Kit-upkeep Allowance standing to his credit in respect of the current quarter, the balance of the charge being communicated for recovery against his deferred pay, unless this is forfeited under regulation 13, clause 3. In the case of ratings discharged within two years of entry, other than by invaliding, who may be in debt or have insufficient credit of deferred pay to cover the charge referred to, the kit, or portion thereof as may be necessary to discharge the debt, except such articles as are necessary to meet immediate requirements, is to be recovered and sold. Any balance received for the sale of kit after recovery of debt and charges has been effected is to be paid to the rating.

(6.) Add an additional regulation No. 47A as follows:—

47a. Uniform Gratuities: Officers.—Uniform gratuities will be paid to officers on first joining, or on promotion to officer rank, as follows:—

Commissioned officers on first joining (except Chaplains or officers appointed for temporary service)	£	60
Chaplains or officers appointed for temporary service, on first joining	..	30
Paymaster cadets on promotion to Paymaster midshipmen	..	40
Warrant officers on first joining, or on promotion to that rank	..	40

2. In the event of discharge, except by invaliding, within twelve months of the grant of clothing gratuity, a proportionate part of the gratuity for the unexpired period is to be recovered from the officer concerned, on a monthly basis (i.e., one-twelfth for each full month of the unexpired period).

3. In the case of officers who are appointed as "probationary" or "acting" for a period, half the allowance is payable on entry and the balance when the officer has completed his probationary or acting service and has been confirmed in rank.

4. Uniform gratuities are not payable to officers lent from the Imperial or a Dominion Navy.

5. Officers transferred permanently from the Imperial or a Dominion Navy, or from other branches of the New Zealand Division, will receive no uniform gratuity on transfer if transferred direct or within twelve months of such previous service.

(7.) Add an additional clause to regulation No. 53 as follows:—

3. The following officers shall be entitled to deck berths in steamers and sleeping-berths on trains at the public expense when travelling on duty:—

The Commodore Commanding.
Members of the Naval Board.
Naval Secretary.
Commanding Officers of H.M. ships of and above the rank of Commander.

Under special circumstances an extension of this privilege may be granted to an officer other than the above.

(8.) In Appendix I, cancel reference to Medical Branch, and substitute the following revised New Zealand rates of pay, which are approved with effect as from 1st July, 1921:—

Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Nelson.

JELlicoe, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red deer may be destroyed in the Nelson Acclimatization District.

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, dated 26th December, 1920, the Secretary of the Nelson Acclimatization Society at Nelson, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such Secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from 1st November, 1921, to 30th November, 1921, both days inclusive.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
