And whereas a resolution was passed by the Woodville County Council on the fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and sealed with the seal of the Council of the said county on the nineteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one:

And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Pohangina County Council on the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and sealed with the seal of the said county on the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of such counties in the manner described in the said resolutions and in the First manner described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto:

Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sconer determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license. this license.

# 6. Extensions.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations in-corporated herein, no extensions or lines other than those along the route hereinbefore described shall be deemed to be authorized by this license.

### 7. REQUIREMENTS OF GREYMOUTH BOROUGH COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Borough of Greymouth except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Greymouth Borough Council.

## 8. Variation in Conditions of License.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.
