A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section one hundred and thirty-one of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, a petition was presented to the Governor-General praying that the area described in the said petition be constituted a new borough:

And whereas a Commission appointed under the said section one hundred and thirty-one held inquiries, and recommended certain alterations of the said area:

And whereas the provisions of the said section one hundred and thirty-one have been complied with in respect thereto, and the result of the poll taken on the proposal contained in the said petition was in favour thereof:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be constituted a borough under the said Act on and from the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one; that the name of such borough shall be the Borough of Raetihi; that the said borough shall be an undivided borough; and that the number of Councillors to be elected thereto shall be nine, exclusive of the Mayor.

And I do further proclaim and declare that Alfred James Parkes, of Raetihi, shall be the Returning Officer to conduct the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough; and that the said Alfred James Parkes shall be the Town Clerk and the person to prepare the district electors roll for the purposes of the said first election.

And, lastly, I do proclaim and declare that the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said borough shall be held on Thursday, the twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one; and that the first meeting of the Council of the said borough shall be held on Tuesday, the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, at half past two o'clock in the afternoon, at the office of the Raetihi Town Board, Raetihi.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, situated in Blocks VI and VII, Makotuku Survey District, bounded towards the north-west generally by a line commencing at

the north-western corner of Lot 1 on D.P. 3791, and proceeding in an easterly direction along the northern boundary-line of the said Lot 1 to the south-western corner of Lot 2 on D.P. 3740; thence by the western boundary-line of the said Lot 2 and its production to the northern side of the Ameku Road; thence by a right line bearing  $76^{\circ} 18' 30''$  to its intersection with the western boundary-line of Section 26, Block VI, Makotuku Survey District; thence towards the south-east by a right line to a point on the western boundary-line of Section 8, Block VI, Makotuku Survey District, fifteen chains distant from the northern side of the aforesaid Ameku Road; thence towards the south by the western boundary-line of the said Section 8 to its south-western corner; thence towards the east by the southern boundary-line of the said Section 8 to the south-western corner of that part of Section 8 as shown on D.P. 3580; thence by the western and north-eastern boundary-lines of the said part of Section 8 to the western side of the Makotuku Valley Road; thence towards the north-east along the said road to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Subdivision X of the Ngapakihiki No. 1 Block; again towards the east by a right line across the aforesaid road to and by the said southern boundary-line of Subdivision X to the south-eastern corner thereof; thence towards the south by the western and southern boundary-lines of Subdivision N of the Ngapakihiki No. 1 Block to a point in line with the eastern boundary-line of Subdivision 2A of the Ngapakihiki Block; again towards the south by a right line across the Pipiriki-Waiouru Road to and by the said eastern boundary-line of Subdivision 2A to the northern side of the Raetihi-Ohakune Railway line; thence towards the west by a right line across the said railway-line to and by the northern boundary-line of Subdivision 2B 4 of the Ngapakihiki Block and its production to the right bank of the Makotuku Stream; again towards the south by the said stream to a point opposite the most southerly corner of Section 32, Block VI, Makotuku Survey District; again towards the west by a right line to the western side of the Raetihi-Papapara Road; thence towards the north by the said road to the north-eastern corner of Section 23, Block VI, Makotuku Survey District; again towards the west by the northern boundary-line of the said Section 23 and its production to the western side of Islington Street; thence towards the north by the said street to its intersection with the southern boundary-line of Section 19, Block VI, Makotuku Survey District; again towards the west by the southern boundary-line of the said Section 19 and its production to the western side of the Hukaroa Road; thence towards the north generally by the said road to the south-eastern corner

of Lot 20 on D.P. 4783; thence by the southern boundary-line of the said Lot 20 to its south-western corner; thence towards the north by the western boundary of the aforesaid Lot 20 to the Pipiriki-Ohakune Road; thence by a right line across that road to the western side thereof; again towards the north by the western side of the said road to the south-eastern corner of Lot 15 on D.P. 3791; and again towards the north and west generally by the southern and western boundary-lines of the said Lot 15, the western boundary-line of Lot 14, the southern boundary-lines of Lots 12, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2, and the southern and western boundary-lines of Lot 1 of the said D.P. 3791 to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned lot, the place of commencement.

*Constituting the Town District of Glen Eden in the County of Waitemata.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor-General may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor-General by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the said petition, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

And whereas a Commission appointed in pursuance of section two of the Town Boards Amendment Act, 1912, held an inquiry, and reported that the locality defined in the said petition was suitable for municipal control, and made certain alterations of the boundaries thereof:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that as on and from the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the area described in the Schedule hereto, being the locality defined in the said petition, with boundaries as altered by the said Commission, shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Glen Eden Town District. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

the north-east by the last-mentioned allotment and Allotment 162 to the Auckland-Kaipara Railway, by a right line across said railway to the boundary of the New Lynn Town District as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 62, of the 23rd June, 1910, page 1789; thence towards the north-east and south-east generally by the said New Lynn Town District boundary to the westernmost corner of Allotment 139, Parish of Waikomiti; thence towards the north-east and south-east by Allotment 138 and Allotments 137 and 136, all of the aforesaid parish, to and across a public road to its western boundary, by the said boundary of the said public road to the northernmost corner of Allotment 127; thence towards the south-east and south-west generally by the last-mentioned allotment and Allotments 40 and 50, both of the aforesaid parish, to and across a public road, and again by the said Allotment 50, Lots 70, 71, and 72 of Allotment 119, Lots 1, 2, and part of 3 of Allotment 118, part of Lot 3, and Lots 4 and 6, of Allotment 117, all of Waikomiti Parish aforesaid, and by the production of the northern boundary of the last-mentioned lot to the centre of a public road; thence towards the south-west by the centre of said public road to a point in line with the north-eastern corner of Allotment 11, Parish of Waikomiti, by a right line to the said corner of that allotment, and thence towards the south-east by the said Allotment 11 to the south-eastern boundary of Allotment 112; thence towards the north-west by that allotment and Allotment 15, both of the aforesaid parish, and by the production of the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the centre of a public road; thence towards the north-east by the centre of said public road to a point in line with the production of the south-eastern boundary of Allotment 114, by a right line to the southernmost corner of the said Allotment 114, and thence towards the north-west generally by the south-eastern boundary of the said Allotment 114; thence towards the south-west by the north-eastern boundary of the same allotment for a distance of 600 links; thence by a right line bearing 14° 27' to the centre of a public road; thence towards the south-west by the centre of said public road to a point in line with the production of the south-eastern boundary of a portion of Allotment 14 of the aforesaid parish containing 51 acres, by the said portion of Allotment 14 to a creek forming the southern boundary of Section 90, Waari Hamlet, by the said creek, and the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section to the point of commencement: be all the aforesaid bearings and linkages more or less.

WHEREAS settlers in the locality known as "Cabbage Bay," in the County of Coromandel, desire that the name of such locality, and of the bay adjacent thereto also known as "Cabbage Bay," should be changed to "Colville" and "Colville Bay" respectively, and it is considered expedient to alter the same:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality now known as "Cabbage Bay" and that the name of the bay now known as "Cabbage Bay," in the County of Coromandel, shall be and the same are hereby altered to "Colville" and "Colville Bay" respectively, and do assign the last-mentioned names to such locality and such bay accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

2. Subclause (b) of clause 3 of the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting paragraph (3) and substituting the following paragraph:—

"(3.) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of dangerous goods of Class I or of Class II kept for private use only, and not for the purpose of sale, stored on any farm or other premises not less than 10 acres in area, or 58 gallons stored on premises less than 10 acres in area, if all such dangerous goods are kept in a thoroughly ventilated depot constructed of stone, brick, or concrete, and situated not less than 10 ft. from any other building, or in a thoroughly ventilated wooden-frame building situated not less than 40 ft. from any other building, and if all such dangerous goods are kept in substantial metal vessels each containing not more than 5 gallons, and so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, or in other manner approved

by the Chief Inspector; and that all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion."

3. Clause 6 of the said regulations is hereby amended by adding to paragraph (c) the following proviso:—

"Provided that no such label shall be required for petroleum oil, turpentine or turpentine substitutes, packed in approved metal vessels each containing not more than four and one-sixth gallons, and contained in an approved tightly fitting outer package containing not more than two such vessels."

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises Banks Peninsula Electric-power District, duly constituted by Proclamation dated the 20th day of December, 1919, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 1 of 8th January, 1920.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

Electrical energy shall be received in bulk from the Lake Coleridge supply. This 11,000-volt supply shall be stepped up at Stoddart's Corner substation to 33,000 volts by transformers for transmission and distribution in accordance with clause 3 (e) of the regulations, the licensee taking delivery of same at Motukarara.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that “lighting purposes” shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within

fourteen days after due date the charges shall not exceed 10d. per unit for lighting purposes and 5d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, or heating purposes.

6. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

7. REQUIREMENTS OF AKAROA, WAIREWA, AND MOUNT HERBERT COUNTY COUNCILS.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Akaroa, Wairewa, and Mount Herbert County Councils, except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and each of the said County Councils.

8. BARE WIRES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, no bare wires shall be erected unless and until the consent of the Minister has first been obtained in accordance with the regulations.

*Amendments in Regulations under the Education Act, 1914, relating to Secondary Schools.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the amendments set out below in the regulations made by Order in Council dated the eighth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and amended subsequently, relating to secondary schools (hereinafter referred to as "the said regulations"); and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

## AMENDMENTS.

THE said regulations are hereby amended by the addition of the following clauses:—

## PART VI.—GRANTS FOR APPARATUS AND MATERIAL FOR SECONDARY-SCHOOL CLASSES IN SCIENCE AND MANUAL WORK.

49. Where special and appropriate provision for the teaching of the subjects named hereunder has been made to the satisfaction of the Director, including suitable provision for individual practical work, there may be paid towards the cost of material capititation at rates not exceeding the following:—

For each subject in Division I, a capititation of 2s. per annum for each pupil on the roll of a class for instruction in such subject given for one hour per week regularly throughout the school year, and a proportionate rate for each period over one hour per week; and, similarly, for each subject in Division II, a capititation of 1s. per annum.

Division I: Chemistry, Dairy Science, Home Science, Cookery.

Division II: Physical Measurements, Mechanics, Heat and Light, Magnetism and Electricity, Botany, Physiology and Hygiene, Agriculture, Home Nursing, Laundrywork, Needlecraft and Garment-making, Woodwork, Metalwork, Drawing in Colour, and any other approved subject.

50. To render classes eligible for the grant the governing body of the school must, before 31st March in each year, submit for the approval of the Director of Education, on forms supplied by the Department, particulars of the classes to be conducted in the school during the year; and must, before the 31st December following, make a claim for payment, furnishing at the same time such information as may be required.

51. The Minister may, if he deems fit, make grants equal to the whole or part of the cost of fittings and permanent apparatus for the use of approved secondary-school classes in the science and manual-training subjects named in clause 49 hereof, provided that the purchase of such fittings and apparatus is first approved by the Director.
