A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS settlers in the locality known as "Gumtown," in the County of Coromandel, desire that the name of such locality should be changed to "Coroglen," and it is considered expedient to alter the same:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality known as "Gumtown," in the County of Coromandel, shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Coroglen," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the Cook Islands Act, 1915, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, do hereby revoke regulations eight, ten, eleven, eighteen, twenty-two, and twenty-five of the regulations made by Order in Council on the ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and gazetted on the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and do declare that the regulations hereby made shall form part of and be read with the said regulations of the ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and that the said revocation and the regulations hereby made shall take effect on the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

SCHEDULE.

8. (a.) THE Inspector may require any fruit that in his opinion is unfit for export, by reason of the same being infected, immature, overmature, under grade, or otherwise not suitable for export, to be withheld from shipment, repacked, or destroyed, as he may deem necessary.

(b.) Any fruit required to be withheld from shipment may, if the Inspector so authorizes, be used by the owner thereof for local consumption.

(c.) Any fruit required to be repacked shall be repacked to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

(d.) Any fruit required to be destroyed may be destroyed by the Inspector or by any other person under his authority, and the cost of such destruction shall be paid by the owner or shipper of such fruit, or by the person or company having the custody or control thereof, and in case of non-payment on demand may be recovered by the Inspector from any such owner or other person by civil action; but this provision shall in no way relieve such owner or other person from any other liability under these regulations.

10. The importation into any island of the Cook Group of second-hand fruit-cases, copra-sacks, or other receptacles for carrying fruit is prohibited, and any cases, copra-sacks, or other receptacles imported or attempted to be imported in breach of this regulation, together with the contents thereof, may be seized by the Inspector and destroyed or reshipped to the consignor, as the Inspector may

think proper, and the cost of such destruction or reshipment shall be paid to the Inspector on demand by the owner, shipper, or consignee of such cases, sacks, or other receptacles, or by the person or company having the custody or control thereof, and in case of non-payment, on demand may be recovered by the Inspector by civil action; but this provision shall not relieve any such person or company from any other liability under this regulation.

11. The importation of plants, fruit, produce, and other things likely to introduce insect-pests or disease into the Cook Islands or from one island to another is prohibited, except under a written permit first obtained from the Inspector to import the same, and any such plants, fruit, produce, or thing imported under such permit shall be accompanied by a certificate of inspection, signed by an horticultural officer or some other responsible officer, satisfactory to the Inspector, certifying that such plants, fruit, produce, or other things were clean and free from disease at the time of shipment; and any plant, fruit, produce, or thing imported in contravention of this regulation may be seized and destroyed or reshipped by the Inspector at the cost of the owner, shipper, or consignor thereof in the manner and with the consequences provided in the last foregoing regulation.

22. All fruit intended for export from Rarotonga shall be presented to the Inspector for inspection at such places, on such days, and within such hours as the Inspector may from time to time prescribe, and the Inspector may refuse to inspect any fruit that may be presented for inspection otherwise than in accordance with such prescription.

25. (1.) All fruit intended for export from any of the Cook Islands shall be packed in such kinds of cases, sacks, or other receptacles as may be prescribed by these regulations, or may from time to time be approved of by the Inspector as suitable for the carriage of the particular class of fruit intended to be exported, and the Inspector may refuse to allow to be exported any fruit not so packed.

(2.) All cases, sacks, and other receptacles containing fruit intended for export shall be marked in accordance with these regulations, and the Inspector may refuse to allow to be exported any case, sack, or other receptacle not so marked.

(3.) All cases shall be marked on both ends, and all sacks and other receptacles on the sides thereof, in the following manner:—

(a.) With a main mark, consisting of the initials of the consignee to whom the fruit is intended to be shipped, or with such other distinguishing letters as may be required by the Inspector, marked in block letters of not less than 5 in. in height, except in the case of tomato-cases, when such letters shall be 3½ in. in height.

(b.) With a submark, to be chosen by the shipper and duly registered in accordance with these regulations, consisting of letters 2½ in. in height, except in the case of tomato-cases, when such letters shall be 2 in. in height. In the case of fruit-cases such submark shall be placed on the left-hand top corner of the ends of the cases.

(4.) All main marks shall be subject to the approval of the Inspector, and all submarks shall, if approved by the Inspector, be registered by him in accordance with these regulations before being used, and the Inspector may, before approving any main mark or approving and registering any submark, require the same to be varied or altered in such manner as he may think proper.

(5.) All applications to approve any main mark shall be made in writing to the Inspector, and when approved by him such main mark may be issued by any shipper desiring to ship fruit to the consignees represented by such main mark.

(6.) All applications to approve and register any submark shall be made in writing to the Inspector, accompanied by a fee of 1s., and when approved and registered such submark shall be used by the person applying to register the same, who shall be entitled to ship any fruit under such submark until the 31st day of March next ensuing.

(7.) Registration of such submarks shall be renewed from year to year on application in writing to the Inspector and on payment of a fee of 1s.

(8.) No person other than the person in whose name such submark is registered shall use the same; and no person shall ship any fruit otherwise than under a main mark duly approved, and a submark duly approved and registered, or in respect of which registration has been duly renewed in accordance with these regulations; nor shall the Inspector pass any fruit as being fit for export unless the same shall be properly marked.

The parties to an appeal shall be the owner or occupier of the premises affected as appellant, and the local authority (in the case of a closing-order issued under section 40 of the said Act) or the Medical Officer of Health (in the case of a closing-order issued under section 45 of the said Act) by which or by whom a closing-order has been issued as respondent.

3. Every appeal shall be instituted in the Magistrate's Court nearest to the public office of the local authority in whose district the premises in respect of which the closing-order has been issued are situated, or in such other Magistrate's Court as may be agreed on by the parties.

4. Every appeal shall be instituted by the appellant by filing in the appropriate Magistrate's Court a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto.

5. (1.) A copy of the notice of appeal shall be delivered by the appellant to the respondent, either personally or by means of registered post.

(2.) Notice of the appeal shall also be given by the appellant to such other persons (if any) as the Court may order.

6. On the filing of the notice of appeal the Court shall set the same down for hearing, and, save with the consent of the parties, shall give to them not less than fourteen days' notice either personally or by registered post of the time and place of the hearing.

7. The parties to the appeal, and such other persons as the Court may decide to hear, shall be entitled to be represented at the hearing by counsel.

8. If either party fails to appear at the hearing, the Court shall, in its discretion, adjourn the hearing or determine the appeal in the same manner as if both parties were present.

9. The determination of the Court shall be certified in writing by the Magistrate to the parties to the appeal, and to such other persons as the Court may direct.

Shooting Season for Imported Game and Native Game, License Fee, &c., Rotorua Acclimatization District.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, William Downie Stewart, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify that the following imported game and native game—viz., cock pheasants, Californian quail, Australian quail, grey duck, black teal, spoonbill duck, black swan, eastern golden plover, and turnstone—may be taken or killed within the Rotorua Acclimatization District, comprising all that area in the Auckland, Hawke's Bay, and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at the Puwhenua Trig. Station (situated in Block VIII, Tapapa Survey District), and proceeding north-west along a right line in the direction of Weraiti Trig. Station (situated in Block VII, Tapapa East Survey District) to a point due west from Otanewainuku Trig. Station in Block XVI, Otanewainuku; thence due east along a right line to that trig. station and again due east along that line produced to a point due south of Trig. Station II in Block IV, Waihi South Survey District; thence along a right line running due north through Trig. II aforesaid to high-water mark, Bay of Plenty; thence along high-water mark, Bay of Plenty, in a south-easterly direction to the western side of Maraetotara Road (Block III, Whakatane Survey District); thence along the western side of that road to its junction with the Nukuhou-Maraetotara Road (Whakatane-Opotiki main road); thence along the western side of the last-named road to its junction with the Nukuhou (Waimana-Ohiwi) Road; thence along the western side of that road to the "confiscation line"; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary-line of Waimana 1E Block; thence along the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 21, Block IV, Waimana Survey District, and the south-eastern side of Waimana 1C and 1D to Paitana; thence along the south-western boundary of Waimana 1D Block to the Waimana or Tauranga River; thence up that river to its source; thence south-westerly along summit of range to Maungapohatu Trig. Stations 68A and 65A; thence along that line to said Trig. Station 65A; thence westerly along a right line to Trig. Station 26, Tawaki Tohunga, in Block XII, Mangamaire Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station 27; thence westerly along a right line to Trig. Station 28, Manukaia; thence north-westerly along a right line to Ruapehu Trig. Station; thence north-easterly along a right line to Paretetaitonga Trig. Station; thence towards the north-east along a right line to Ngaruhoe Trig. Station; thence northerly along a right line to Tongariro Trig. Station; thence north-easterly along a right line in the direction of the mouth of the Waihi Stream, Lake Taupo, to the Wanganui River; thence down the middle of that river to the western boundary of the Waione Block, and northerly along that boundary to Maungaku Trig. Station; thence northerly along a mountain-range passing through Hauhangaroa, Motere, Tuhingamata, and Weraroa Trig. Stations to the source of the Ongarue River; thence north-westerly along a right line to Rangitoto Mountain; and thence north-easterly along a right line to Puwhenua Trig. Station, the place of commencement; (except in the areas mentioned in the Schedule hereto) from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two (both days inclusive). And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such imported game and native game within the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each; and the General Manager of the Tourist and Health Resorts Department, Wellington, or any person authorized by the said General Manager in that behalf, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further notify that licenses to kill grey duck, black teal, spoonbill duck, black swan, eastern golden plover, and turnstone within the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of ten shillings each; and the General Manager of the Tourist and Health Resorts Department, Wellington, or any person authorized by the said General Manager, is hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do hereby restrict the number of such imported game and native game that may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day to not more than ten cock pheasants and twenty-five head in all of grey duck, black teal, spoonbill duck, black swan, eastern golden plover, and turnstone; and that no live birds of any species shall be used as decoys, nor shall more than twenty artificial decoys be used at any one time, whether by one or several persons, on any particular water, within an area of less than one hundred square yards.

A boat may be used to shoot from or for the purpose of recovering game previously shot, provided such boat is not dressed or covered in any way.

Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game and native game shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game and native game on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain, or any land mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

ADDITIONAL AREAS WHEREIN IMPORTED GAME AND NATIVE GAME MAY NOT BE TAKEN OR KILLED.

1. LAKES Ngahewa, Okataina, Rotokawa or Bitter Lake near Taupo, and Rotoaira, and the land within one mile of the shores of these lakes.
2. All land within one mile of the Okere Wharf.
3. Lagoons on F. Seccombe's property, Whakatane County.
