ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 1st day of May, 1922.

Present :

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the Boards of the Waihekau Drainage District and of the Hungahunga Drainage District have each presented a petition praying that the said drainage districts may be united and form one united district, as provided by section fifteen of the Land Drainage Act, 1908 :

And whereas the said Boards have agreed to the following conditions, namely :—

1. That all special rates made as security for loans existing at the date of the union of the said districts shall continue to be levied only within the area over which they were respectively originally levied :

2. The name of the united districts to be the Hungahunga Drainage District, and the number of trustees for such district to be seven :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the said Land-Drainage Act, 1908, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that the Waihekau Drainage District and the Hungahunga Drainage District shall, as on and from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, form one united district under and for the purposes of the said Act, the boundaries whereof shall be those described in the Schedule hereto ; and doth also order and declare that the name of the said united district shall be the Hungahunga Drainage District, and that the number of trustees of the said district shall be seven.

SCHEDULE.

HUNGAHUNGA DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west by a right line from the Waitoa River at its intersection with the northern boundary of Block XVI,

Waitoa Survey District, to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Ngutumanga Block at right angles to that road ; thence towards the north-east generally by the last-mentioned road and the north-eastern boundary of Ngutumanga Block to the railway-line ; thence across the railway-line and a road to Section 14, Block XVI, Waitoa Survey District ; thence by the north-western boundaries of Sections 14, 13, 12, and 11, Block XVI aforesaid ; again towards the north-east by Ngutumanga Road to its junction with Taylor's Road ; again towards the north-west by Taylor's Road to its junction with Mikkelsen's Road ; thence towards the north-east generally by that road to the westernmost corner of Section 17, Block XI, Aroha Survey District ; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of that section ; thence by a public road to the western boundary of Section 3, Block I, Wairere Survey District ; thence by the western boundary of Section 3, across Steel's Road, and by the western boundary of Section 7 to School Road ; thence towards the south by School Road to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Orongomairo and Hungahunga No. 2 Blocks ; thence by that road to the road intersecting Section 1, Block V, Wairere Survey District ; thence again towards the north-west by this road to the Waihou River at the eastern corner of Section 12, Block II, Wairere Survey District ; thence again towards the north-east by the Waihou River to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 4, Block X, Wairere Survey District ; thence by a right line to the road at the northernmost corner of Section 27A, Block X aforesaid, and by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of Section 27A, and towards the east generally by the road forming the eastern boundaries of Sections 27A, 27, and 26, Block X, Sections 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, and 19, Block XIV, Wairere Survey District, Sections 18, 17, and 16, Block III, Tapapa Survey District, and Sections 15 and 14, Block II, to the southern boundary of Section 14 ; thence towards the south by the southern boundary of Section 14 and its production to the Morrinsville-Rotorua Railway line ; again towards the east by the said railway-line to the south-eastern corner of Section 1, Block II, Tapapa Survey District, by the south-eastern boundary of Section 1, across a road, the eastern boundary of Section 81, and the north-eastern boundary of Section 80 to and across a road to the aforesaid railway-line, and again along the railway-line to the north-eastern corner of Section 104, Block VI ; thence again towards the south by

the northern boundary of that section to the Waitoa River; thence towards the west generally by the Waitoa River to Section 7, Block II; thence by the south-eastern boundary of Section 7 and its production to the Morrinsville-Rotorua Railway line; thence by that railway-line to its crossing by the Waitoa-Matamata Road; thence by this road to Section 40, Block XVI, Waitoa Survey District (school reserve); thence by that section and across the road at its northernmost corner to the Morrinsville-Te Aroha Railway line; thence by the railway-line to the Waitoa River, and by that river to Section 33, Block XVI aforesaid; thence by the southern boundary of Section 33 to the watershed crossing Sections 33 and 32, and by this watershed to the Waitoa River; thence by the Waitoa River to the place of commencement.

Altering Boundaries of Otekaike Drainage District, County of Waitaki.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area described in the First Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Waitaki, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the land comprised in the said area, be excluded from the Otekaike Drainage District as constituted under the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of such drainage district in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the said Otekaike Drainage District by excluding from such district the area of land described in the said petition and in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said drainage district, with such alteration as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE EXCLUDED FROM OTEKAIKE DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Otago Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point on the left bank of the Otekaike River in line with the south-western boundary of Section 46A, Otekaike Settlement, and proceeding thence along the said left bank to the northern boundary of Section 32A; thence westerly along that boundary to Otekaike Road, and northerly along the eastern side of said road to the north-eastern boundary of Section 42A; thence south-easterly along that boundary to the left bank of the Otekaike River, and north-easterly along said left bank to railway-line; thence easterly, southerly, and north-westerly generally along the boundary of the Otekaike Drainage District as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1917, page 3177, to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

OTEKAIKE DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Otago Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point on the left bank of the Otekaike River in line with the south-western boundary of Section 46A, Otekaike Settlement, and proceeding north-westerly 45 chains and north-easterly 70 chains to the north-eastern boundary of Run 28D, distant 7 chains from the easternmost corner of Run 28C; north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of Runs 28D and 28C to Section 31A; along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 31A, 28A, 26A, the north-eastern boundary of said Section 26A, and the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 8A and 2A to the Waitaki River; down the right bank of that river and up the left bank of the Otekaike River to Section 42A; along the northern boundary of that section, and along the eastern side of the Otekaike Road to the northern boundary of Section 32A; easterly along that boundary to the Otekaike River, and up the left bank of that river to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area described in the First Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Egmont, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the land comprised in the said area be included in the Oaonui Drainage District as constituted under the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of such drainage district in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the said Oaonui Drainage District by including in such district the area of land described in the said petition and in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said drainage district, with such addition as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE INCLUDED IN OAOUI DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded by a line commencing at the junction of South Road and Opua Road, and proceeding thence north-easterly along the boundary of the Oaonui Drainage District as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1917, page 4234, to the northernmost corner of Subdivision 11, Ngatikahumate Block; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of said Subdivision 11 to the Opua Road, and south-westerly along that road to the south-eastern boundary of Subdivision 9; thence along the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of said Subdivision 9 to the Opua Road; thence along that road to the northernmost corner of Section 54, Block IX, Opunake Survey District, along the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of said Section 54, the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Section 55, to the south-eastern corner of Section 56; thence along the south-eastern boundary of said Section 56 to the South Road, and along that road to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

OAOUI DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Kotetote Stream, and proceeding thence along the sea-coast to the western boundary of Section 6, Block XV, Opunake Survey District; along the western boundary of that section to its north-western corner; along the northern boundary of that section and of Section 5 to its north-eastern corner; thence along a right line to the intersection of the eastern side of South Road with the northern side of Hitona Road; along the northern side of that road to the southernmost corner of Section 21, Subdivision 3, Ngatitara Block; along the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of that subdivision to and across the Oaonui Stream; along the right bank of that stream to Subdivision 30, Ngatitara Block; thence along the south-western, north-western, and north-eastern boundaries of that subdivision to Arawhata Road; across that road and along its south-eastern side to Subdivision 16, Ngatikahumate Block; along the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of that subdivision and the south-eastern boundaries of Subdivisions 14 and 12; along the north-eastern boundary of Subdivision 11 to Opua Road; south-westerly along that road to the south-eastern boundary of Subdivision 9; along the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of that subdivision to the Opua Road; along that road to the northernmost corner of Section 54, Block IX, Opunake Survey District; along the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of said Section 54 and the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Section 55 to the easternmost corner of Section 56; thence along the south-eastern boundary of said Section 56 to the South Road; along that road to the Kotetote Stream, and down that stream to its mouth, the place of commencement.

Declaring the Rawhitiroa Road Reserve to be a Sanctuary for Imported and Native Game.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District, in Block IX, Omona Survey District, being Rawhitiroa Road Reserve, from the Omona Road to the Patea River.

Declaring Wingatui Racecourse Grounds to be a Sanctuary for Imported and Native Game.

ALL that area in the Otago Land District, situated in Block I, Taieri Survey District, known as the Wingatui Racecourse Grounds.

Declaring a Lagoon at Kahautara to be a Sanctuary for Imported and Native Game.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be a sanctuary for the purposes of the said Animals Protection and Game Act, and that no imported or native game shall be taken or killed within the said area.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, situated in Blocks XI and XV, Wairarapa Survey District, being the lagoon lying partly in Kahautara No. 1B Block and partly in Subdivision 1c of Te Awaawaroa No. 1 Block.

Declaring Whakapapa Island to be a Sanctuary for Imported and Native Game.

JELlicoe, Governor-General.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be a sanctuary for the purposes of the said Animals Protection and Game Act, and that no imported or native game shall be taken or killed within the said area.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement one hundred and fifty-two acres (152 acres), be the same a little more or less, being Section 86, Block VI, Hunua Survey District, and known generally as Whakapapa Island. Bounded towards the north generally by the Wanganui River, towards the east and south-east generally by the right branch of the Whakapapa River, and towards the west and north-west generally by the left branch of the Whakapapa River to its eastern confluence with the Wanganui River. As the same is more particularly shown on a plan numbered 270 over 34, and deposited in the Wellington District Office of the Lands and Survey Department, and thereon bordered red.

Shooting Season for Imported Game and Native Game, License Fee, &c., Lakes Acclimatization District.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, I, William Downie Stewart, Minister of Internal Affairs of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify that the following imported game and native game—viz., Californian quail, grey duck, and black swan—may be taken or killed within the Lakes Acclimatization District, comprising the County of Lake, from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two (both days inclusive). And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill such imported game and native game within the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of twenty shillings each; and the Postmasters at Queenstown, Arrowtown, Kingston, and Pembroke are hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further notify that licenses to take or kill grey duck and black swan within the said district will be issued to any person on payment of the sum of ten shillings each; and the Postmasters at Queenstown, Arrowtown, Kingston, and Pembroke are hereby authorized to sign and issue the said licenses.

And I do further restrict the number of such grey duck and black swan that may be taken or killed by any one person in any one day to not more than twenty-five head in all.

Nothing in any license to take or kill imported game and native game shall authorize the holder thereof to take or kill imported game and native game on lands actually and exclusively used by any registered acclimatization society for acclimatization purposes, or on any sanctuary or public domain.
