A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been found desirable for the use, convenience, and enjoyment of the Greymouth-Otira Section of the Springfield to Brunnerton Railway to take further land at Stillwater Junction, in addition to land previously acquired for the purposes of the said railway:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections twenty-nine and one hundred and eighty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes above mentioned.

SCHEDULE.

APPROXIMATE area of the piece of land: 1 acre 1 rood 23·8 perches.

Portion of Native Reserve No. 34, Block XI, Arnold Survey District, Grey County. (S.O. 2259.)

In the Westland Land District; as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked W.R. 31284, deposited in the office of the Minister of Railways at Wellington, and thereon coloured blue.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section twenty of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Lands, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion of a provisional State forest set apart by Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and gazetted on the eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, is required for settlement purposes; and, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, such land shall, from and after the day of the gazetted hereof, cease to be a provisional State forest, and shall become subject to the provisions of the Land Act, 1908.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Westland Land District, containing by admeasurement 86 acres, more or less, situated in Block VII, Turiwhate Survey District, and being part of Provisional State Forest Reserve No. 1676. Commencing at the south-eastern corner of Section 2981, and proceeding due north along the eastern boundary of the said section to the south-western corner of Section 2056; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of the said section to Harrington's Creek; thence southerly along the left bank of the said creek to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 3056; and thence south-westerly by a right line to point of commencement. Constituting the South Canterbury Electric-power District and Outer Area.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, that any area or areas of land may be constituted an electric-power district or outer area of such district under the said Act, and in the manner therein provided:

And whereas a petition praying that the area described in Part I of the First Schedule hereto may be constituted an electric-power district under the said Act, and that the areas described in the Third Schedule hereto may be constituted an outer area of such electric-power district, and also a further petition praying that the boundaries of the proposed electric-power district be altered so as to include the area described in Part II of the First Schedule hereto, were presented to the Governor-General on the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two:

And whereas such petitions were publicly notified in the *Timaru Herald* dated the twenty-third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, the *Waimate Daily Advertiser* dated the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and the *Temuka Leader* dated the twenty-sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, respectively, being newspapers circulating in the proposed electric-power district:

And whereas after due inquiry the Governor-General is of opinion that the petitions should be granted subject to the proposed boundaries of the district and outer area being altered as hereinafter appears:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, do hereby alter the proposed boundaries, and proclaim the district with the altered boundaries as described in the Second Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district, and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "South Canterbury Electric-power District"; and I do further proclaim that the area with the altered boundaries as described in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be an outer area of such electric-power district.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

PART I.

ALL that area in the South Canterbury District commencing at a point on the sea-coast of the Ninety-mile Beach at its junction with the north-eastern boundary of Geraldine County; thence north-westerly and south-westerly along the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Geraldine County to its junction with Mackenzie County; thence northerly, westerly, and southerly along the north-east, north-west, and west boundaries of the Mackenzie County to its junction with the western boundary of Waimate County; thence south-easterly along the southern boundary of Waimate County to the sea-coast; thence northerly along the eastern boundaries of Waimate, Levels, and Geraldine Counties and the Borough of Timaru to the commencing-point, and which area comprises the counties of Geraldine, Mackenzie, Waimate, and Levels, the boroughs of Timaru, Geraldine, and Temuka, and the Pleasant Point Town District, but excludes the Borough of Waimate.

PART II.

All that area comprised within the boundaries of the Borough of Waimate.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

SOUTH CANTERBURY ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District being the County of Levels, and parts of the counties of Geraldine, Mackenzie, and Waimate, the boroughs of Geraldine, Temuka, Timaru, and Waimate, and the Town District of Pleasant Point, bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Rangitata River, and proceeding southerly along the high-water mark of the Canterbury Bight to the mouth of the Waitaki River; thence up that river to the western boundary of Lot 16, Reserve 191, along that boundary and the southern and western boundaries of Lot 11 to a public road, easterly along that road to the eastern boundary of Section 2, said Block XI, Waikakahi Settlement, along that boundary to a public road, thence northerly along that road to Rural Section 17126, along the western boundary of that section to its north-western corner, thence along a right line through Rural Section 16797 to the junction of roads at its north-eastern corner; thence north-easterly along a public road intersection or fronting Rural Sections 14585, 20508, 18960, to the south branch of the Waihao River, down that river to its junction with the north branch, thence up the said north branch to its source on Mount Nimrod; thence down

the Pareora River to the north-eastern boundary of Rural Section 29453, along that boundary to a public road, and north-westerly along that road fronting or intersecting Rural Sections 29453, 24960, 24959, 24196, 24195, 24831, 25425, 24248, 25044, and 20134 to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 4, Block V, Opawa Survey District; thence north-westerly, south-westerly, and again north-westerly to the north-western corner of the said Section 4; thence along a right line to a point on Fraser Road being the easternmost corner of Rural Section 36059, along the north-eastern boundary of that section to the Exe Creek, up that creek to the north-eastern boundary of Rural Section 29564, along that boundary to a public road, thence southerly along that road to the south-western boundary of said Section 29564; thence north-westerly along that boundary to Rural Section 34435, along the south-western boundaries of Sections 34435, 34434, 34433, to Lockhart Stream; thence down that stream, the Mackenzie Stream, and the Tengawai River to Rural Section 32070, along the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of that rural section, the eastern boundaries of Rural Sections 28033, 28064, 28034, and 32072 to the Tengawai River; thence down that river to Rural Section 30864, along the western boundaries generally of said Sections 30864, 25768, and 30863, the southern and western boundaries of Rural Section 31248, the southern boundary of 25146, the western boundaries generally of Rural Sections 30644, 31649, 30704, 21792, 27471, 30352, 35090, 30213, 2008, of Section 2, Block V, and of Section 1, Block II, Tengawai Survey District, to its westernmost corner; thence northerly generally along a public road and the north-eastern boundaries of Rural Sections 36086 and 36085 to its northernmost corner; thence to and along the eastern boundaries generally of Sections 2 and 1A, Ashwick Settlement, to the South Opuha River; thence crossing that river to and along the eastern boundaries of Sections 15B, 20A, 17A, and 13A, and the southern boundary of Section 4A, Sherwood Downs Settlement, to the North Opuha River; thence down that river to the northern boundary of the Raukapuka Riding, Geraldine County; thence by the northern boundary of that riding as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1883, page 878, to the Rangitata River, and down that river to its mouth, the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 55648, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon coloured red and orange as to the electric-power district, and in blue as to the outer area.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

(a.) ALL that portion of the Geraldine County bounded as follows: Commencing from the south-eastern corner of Small Grazing-run 210, Block 2, Auckland Survey District; thence by a line following the centre of the Rangitata River northwards to its junction with Forest Creek; thence by a line following the centre of Forest Creek to the one-chain road reserve to the summit of the main range; thence following the main range by Butler's Saddle, Trig. Station C, to the source of the Phantom River; thence by the Phantom River to its junction with the Orari River, Block XIII, Four Peaks Survey District; thence up the Orari River to its junction with the Mowbray River; thence up-stream by the centre of the Mowbray River to the western boundary of Tripp Settlement; thence by the western boundary of this settlement, the western boundary of Four Peaks Settlement to the Opuha River at the north-eastern corner of Rural Section 27301, Block I, Ophi Survey District; thence by the centre of the Opuha River to the boundary-line between the Mount Peel and Geraldine Ridings of the county at the south-eastern corner of Rural Section 24315, Block I, Ophi Survey District; thence north-east by the boundary of the said ridings to the south-eastern corner of Small Grazing-run 24, Block XVI, Four Peaks Survey District; thence by the eastern boundary of Small Grazing-runs 24 and 23, Block XII, Four Peaks Survey District, to a road on the western boundary of Rural Section 34445, Block XII, Four Peaks Survey District, and by that road to its junction with a road at the south-eastern corner of Rural Section 9548, Block V, Orari Survey District, to the Orari River; thence up the Orari River to the south-eastern corner of Run 4B, Block 3, Orari Survey District; thence by the eastern boundary of Run 4B 4C to the north-eastern corner of Rural Section 32893, Block 3, Orari Survey District, and the Blandswood Road; thence by the Blandswood Road to the south-eastern corner of Rural Section 1415, Block 2, Orari Survey District, to a road running parallel with the Rangitata River; thence by that road to the south-eastern corner of Rural Section 4276, and by the southern boundary of Section 4276 and the western boundaries of Sections 4276, 4556, 4457, 4036, 30936, 29281, 30937, Block IV, Auckland Survey District, to the Lynn Creek; thence by the Lynn Creek and the western boundary of Rural Section 36720 and the northern boundaries of Rural Sections 25262, 24509, 21843, to the south-eastern corner of Small Grazing-run 102, Block 2, Auckland Survey District, to the point of the commencement.

(b.) All that portion of the Mackenzie County bounded as follows: Commencing at a point in the North Opuha River at the north-eastern corner of Section 1A, Sherwood Downs Settlement, and bounded by part of the south-western boundary of Section 4A, the south-eastern boundary of Section 13A, the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 17A, and the south-eastern boundary of Section 20A, Sherwood Downs Settlement, to the South Opuha River; thence by the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 1A and 2, Ashwick Settlement, to the Opihi River; thence by the eastern boundaries of Sections 36085 and 36086, Block I, Tengawai Survey District, Small Grazing-run 86, Section 36088, Block 5, Tengawai Survey District, Small Grazing-runs 49, 50, 51, to the Tengawai River; thence along the Tengawai River and the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Small Grazing-run 54, again to the Tengawai River; thence by the Mackenzie Stream and Lockhart's Creek to the north-eastern corner of Rural Section 36466, Block 16, Burke's Survey District; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of said Section 36466, Section 36467, Block 4, Mackenzie Survey District, by part of the western and the north-eastern boundaries of Section 36059, Block I, Opawa Survey District, and by the north-eastern boundaries of Small Grazing-runs 5, 1, 2, 6, 4, Chamberlain Settlement, to the Opawa River; thence along the Opawa River to the north-eastern corner of Section 1, Mount Nissing Settlement; then by the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 1, 2, 8, 10, 11, Mount Nissing Settlement, to the Pareora River; thence towards the south-west, north, and east by the Waimate, Waitaki, Westland, Ashburton, and Geraldine Counties respectively to the Opuha River; thence by the Opuha and North Opuha Rivers to the commencing-point at the north-eastern corner of Section 1A, Sherwood Downs.

(c.) All that portion of the Waimate County bounded as follows: Commencing at a point where the traffic-bridge crosses the Waihao River at Waihao Forks; thence up-stream by the Waihao River to the Waihao Downs Road at the north-eastern corner of Rural Section 20185; thence by the Waihao Downs Road and the northern boundaries of Rural Sections 20185, 18960, 20508, 14585, to the junction of the Shearers' Hill Deviation Road; thence by the Shearers' Hill Deviation Road and Shearers' Hill Road to the Middle Road; thence by the road on the western boundary of Lot 3, Waikakahi Settlement, Rural Section 20141, to the Redcliffs Road; thence westerly along Redcliffs Road to the north-western boundary of Lot 11, Reserve 191; thence by the western and southern boundaries of Lot 11, Reserve 191, to the western boundary of Lot 16, Reserve 191; thence by the western boundary of Lot 16, Reserve 191, in a direct line to the county boundary in the Waitaki River; thence by the county boundary in the Waitaki River in a north-westerly direction to the boundary-line between the Waimate and Mackenzie Counties; thence generally along the north-western and northern boundaries of the Waimate County to the Waihao River; thence in a southerly direction by the Waihao River and the western boundaries of the Upper Pareora, Otaio, Makikihi, and Deep Creek Ridings of the Waimate County to the point of commencement.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

ALL that area comprising those portions of the counties of Waimate, Mackenzie, and Geraldine not included in the South Canterbury Electric-power District as described in the Second Schedule.

Constituting the Grey Electric-power District and Outer Area.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the district described in the First Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district, and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "Grey Electric-power District"; and I do further proclaim that the area described in the Second Schedule hereto shall be an outer area of such electric-power district.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

GREY ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Westland Land District commencing on the sea-coast at the mouth of the Ten-mile Creek, Block II, Te Miko Survey District, and continues along said creek to its source at the summit of the Paparoa Range to Trig. L; thence along the summit of the said range to a Trig. G at the source of the Moonlight Creek, continuing down the said creek to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 11, Block XII, Waihero Survey District; thence to the south-western corner of the said section; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Sections 11 and 12, eastward along the northern boundary of Section 12, thence along the western boundary of Sections 15 and 16; thence along the northern boundary of Section 16 to the Big River; thence down the said river to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 3021, Block XII, Waihero Survey District, continuing along the said boundary to the north-east corner of the said section; thence by a right line to the north-western corner of Section 2762, Block IX, Mawheraiti Survey District; thence along the north-western boundary of the said section to the Craigieburn River; thence down the said river to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 3, Block IX, Mawheraiti Survey District; thence in a north-easterly direction along the north-western boundaries of Sections 3 and 257, Block IX, Mawheraiti Survey District, and Sections 180, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, and 29, Block X, of the said survey district, continuing on same bearing to a point on the western bank of the Rough River; thence following the said river to its confluence with the Grey River, thence across the said river to the south bank, continuing up the river-bank till a point is reached due north of the said north-east corner of Section 5, Block IV, Ahaura Survey District; thence along the eastern and southern boundaries of Section 5 to the intersection with Section 6; thence following the southern boundaries of Sections 6 and 7 to the southern corner of Section 7; thence along the south-western boundaries of Sections 7, 8, 9, and 10, continuing on till a point on the Waipuna Creek is reached, thence down the said creek to the confluence with Nobles Creek, thence up the said creek to its source on Napoleon Hill, thence following track and road in a westerly direction through Orwell Creek Township till the north-western corner of Section 107, Block II, Ahaura Survey District, is reached; thence in a southerly direction following the road along the eastern boundary of Sections 106 and 11 till the Ahaura River is reached; thence up the said river to a point due north of Trig. I, Block VI, Ahaura Survey District; thence to Trig. I; thence by a right line to Trig. A, Block X, of the said survey district; thence by a right line to the south-eastern corner of Section 1, Block 13, of the said survey district; thence by a right line to the intersection of Kotuku - Bell Hill Road and Grey Valley - Taramakau Road, continuing in a southerly direction along the said road to the intersection with the north-eastern boundary of part of Subdivision I, Block XI, Te Kinga Survey District; thence along the said boundary to the eastern corner thereof; thence in a south-westerly direction generally following the south-eastern boundary of said subdivision, Subdivision 6 in the said block and survey district, and Section 21, Block X, of the said survey district; thence along the north-eastern, south-eastern, and south-western boundaries of Section 2852, Blocks XI and XV, Te Kinga Survey District; thence in a south-westerly direction along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 18 and 17, Block X, of the said survey district, part Subdivision I, Blocks XIV and XIII, of the said survey district, and part Section 868, Block I, Otaira Survey District; along the western boundary of Sections 2208 and 2311, Block I, of the said survey district till a point on the northern bank of the Taramakau River is reached, thence following the said bank to the sea-coast, thence northward along the sea-coast to the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan marked P.W.D. 55566, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon bordered green.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

OUTER AREA.

ALL that area in the Westland Land District commencing at the mouth of the Ten-mile Creek on the sea-coast, Block II, Te Miko Survey District, continuing along the sea-coast in a northerly direction to the mouth of the Punakaiki River, thence following the boundary between the Buller and Grey counties to the intersecting point of the boundaries of the said counties and the Inangahua County; thence following the boundary between the Grey and Inangahua counties till a point of intersection with the area described in the First Schedule is reached on the western bank of the Rough River, Block X, Mawheraiti Survey District; thence following in a westerly direction generally the northern boundary of the

area described in the First Schedule till the point of commencement is reached; then commencing at a point where the boundary-line of the area described in the First Schedule leaves the south bank of the Grey River, Block IV, Ahaura Survey District, continuing in an easterly direction, and following the boundary of the Grey County till a point of intersection is reached with the eastern boundary of the area described in the First Schedule on the north bank of the Taramakau River, Block I, Oira Survey District; thence following in a northerly direction generally the eastern boundary of the area described in the First Schedule till the point of commencement is reached. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked and deposited as aforesaid, and thereon bordered yellow.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the area described in the First Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district, and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "Otago Central Electric-power District"; and I do further proclaim that the area described in the Second Schedule hereto shall be an outer area of such electric-power district.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

OTAGO CENTRAL ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

ALL that area situated in the Otago Land District, comprising the Borough of Alexandra as at present constituted and the portion of the County of Vincent bounded as follows: Commencing at a point being the north-west corner of Block X, Leaning Rock District; thence running due south along the block-line between Blocks X and XIII, Leaning Rock District, to the south-west corner of Block X, Leaning Rock District; thence running due east along the block-line between Block X, Leaning Rock District, and Block III, Fraser District, to the south-east side of the road-line lying towards the north-west of Lot 1 on L.T.P. 2722; thence running in a south direction generally along the west boundary of Lot 1 on L.T.P. 2722 to the south-west corner of the said Lot 1; thence running in an east direction along the south boundaries of Lots 1, 2, and 3 on L.T.P. 2722 to the block-line between Blocks 1 and 3, Fraser District; thence running in a south direction generally along the block-line between Blocks 1 and 3, Fraser District, to the south-west corner of Block 1, Fraser District; thence running due east along the block-line between Blocks 1 and 2, Fraser District, to the north-west bank of the Clutha River; thence running in a north-east direction along the north-west bank of the Clutha River to the Town of Alexandra; thence running in a north-east direction along the north-west bank of the Manuherikia River to the block-line between Blocks VIII and IX, Leaning Rock District, thence running due west along the block-line between Blocks VIII and IX and Blocks VII and VIII, Leaning Rock District, to the south-west corner of Block VIII, Leaning Rock District; thence running due north along the block-line between Blocks I and VIII, Leaning Rock District, to the main Clyde-Chatto Creek Road; thence running in a north-west direction generally along the main Clyde-Chatto Creek Road to the most east corner of the Town of Clyde; thence running in a north-west direction along the north-east boundary of the Town of Clyde to the most north corner of the Town of Clyde; thence running in a south-west direction along the north-west boundary of the Town of Clyde to the east bank of the Clutha River; thence running in a south direction generally along the east bank of the Clutha River, across Clyde Bridge, and along the main Clyde-Earnsclough Road to the block-line between Blocks X and XI, Leaning Rock District; thence running finally in a west direction generally along the block-line between Blocks X and XI, Leaning Rock District, to the north-west corner of Block X, Leaning Rock District, the point of commencement: containing by admeasurement an area of 17,500 acres (more or less). As the said area is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 55211, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon bordered yellow.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

OUTER AREA.

ALL that area in the Otago Land District comprising the Borough of Cromwell as at present constituted and the balance of the County of Vincent not included in the said electric-power district. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked and deposited as aforesaid and thereon bordered sienna.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand; and issued under the Seal of that Dominion, at the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of October, 1922.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE maximum price of bread in respect to the South Island shall be 5½d. per 2 lb. loaf when sold over the counter for cash, with an additional ¼d. for cash on delivery and a further ¼d. for booking; and in respect to the North Island shall be 6d. per 2 lb. loaf when sold over the counter for cash, with an additional ¼d. for cash on delivery and a further ¼d. for booking.

2. Notwithstanding anything in this Order in Council, the Board of Trade may, by order made and published by it in such manner as it thinks fit, authorize the sale of bread in any specified locality at a price exceeding the prices fixed as aforesaid by such amount as the Board thinks fit; and nothing in this Order in Council shall apply to the sale of bread in that locality in accordance with the authority so granted by the Board of Trade.

3. Any such authority may be at any time withdrawn by the Board of Trade by order made and published by it in such manner as it thinks fit.

4. This Order in Council shall come into operation with respect to the South Island on the 30th October, 1922, and with respect to the North Island on the 6th November, 1922.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers particularly conferred on him by sections eight and twelve of the Customs Amendment Act, 1921, by section two of the Tariff Agreement (New Zealand and Australia) Ratification Act, 1922, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby modify the Schedule to the agreement for Customs reciprocity between New Zealand and Australia, as the same is set out in

the said Tariff Agreement (New Zealand and Australia) Ratification Act, 1922, to the extent and in the manner following :—

1. Consecutive No. 26 : "Meats, Potted or Preserved" to be altered to 2d. per lb. instead of 20 per cent. ad valorem in the column headed "Proposed Duties against Australia."

2. Consecutive No. 30 : "Meats, viz., (c.) Preserved in tins or other airtight vessels, including the weight of the liquid contents," to be altered to 2d. per lb. instead of 20 per cent. ad valorem in the column headed "Proposed Duties against New Zealand."

3. Consecutive No. 67 : To be altered by deleting the words "Sheets and Roofing Slates composed of cement and asbestos or of similar materials."

4. A fresh consecutive number to be inserted as follows : Consecutive No. 67A, Tariff Item No. 240A, "Sheets and Roofing Slates composed of cement and asbestos or of similar materials"; 10 per cent. ad valorem in the column headed "Proposed Duties against New Zealand," and 10 per cent. ad valorem in the column headed "Proposed Duties against Australia."

5. Consecutive No. 69 : To be altered by deleting the words "sheets, plain or corrugated, roofing slates and."

6. Consecutive No. 85 : To be altered by inserting after the word "Curdmills" the words "Curd-agitators, Curd-mixers."

7. A fresh consecutive number to be inserted after consecutive number 120 as follows : Consecutive No. 120A, "Corn Millet Brooms"; 30 per cent. ad valorem in the column headed "Proposed Duties against New Zealand," and 30 per cent. ad valorem in the column headed "Proposed Duties against Australia."

License authorizing the Wanganui-Rangitikei Electric-power Board to use Electric Lines in the Wanganui-Rangitikei Electric-power District.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the above-mentioned Act, and dated the ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and hereafter collectively referred to as “the regulations”), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize the Wanganui-Rangitikei Electric-power Board (hereinafter referred to as “the licensee”) to use electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described, such electric lines at present proposed to be erected being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 55287, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District.

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises the Wanganui-Rangitikei Electric-power District, and outer areas of such district, as constituted by Proclamation dated the 29th day of November, 1921, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 100, of 1st December, 1921.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

Electrical energy shall be received in bulk at Public Works Department substation located at Marton, on the three-phase system, in accordance with paragraph (e) of clause 2 of the regulations.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 32 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charges for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that “lighting purposes” shall include the operation of motor-generators for lighting purposes; and provided further that if accounts are paid within fourteen days after due date the charges shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes and 4½d. per unit for motor-power, cooking, or heating purposes.

In the case of wholesale supply the charges shall not exceed £12 per kilovolt-ampere per annum, plus ½d. per unit; provided that if the licensee's load reaches the amount of power supplied in bulk by the Minister of Public Works, the licensee shall have the right to refuse further supply at the wholesale rate until such time as the Minister is in a position to supply to the licensee the whole of the licensee's load.

“Wholesale supply” for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect of which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £180 per annum.

A minimum charge of 7s. per month, including meter-rent (if any), may be collected if required by the licensee, and shall be printed on the licensee's conditions of supply.

6. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

7. ROUTES RESERVED FOR GOVERNMENT LINES.

The Board shall not, without the consent in writing of the Minister of Public Works, erect any electric lines along the routes of the Government Main Trunk transmission-lines.

8. BARE WIRES.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, no bare electric lines shall be erected unless and until the regulations have been strictly complied with.

9. CONVERSION OF LINES FROM EARTH-WORKING TO METALLIC.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Post and Telegraph Department's lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic if required by the Minister of Telegraphs.

10. TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT'S LINES.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs any interference or disturbance that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph lines which are the property of the Telegraph Department.

And whereas the Invercargill Borough Council has been authorized to borrow the sum of eleven thousand pounds for repaying a mortgage debt on the lands vested in the Corporation of the Borough of Invercargill by the Invercargill Athenæum Act, 1916 :

And whereas the Minister of Finance has given his precedent consent as required by the above-recited section eleven, and it is desired that the rate of interest at which the money may be borrowed be not exceeding six per centum per annum :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him as aforesaid, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe that the rate of interest that may be paid by the Invercargill Borough Council in respect of the said loan of eleven thousand pounds shall be a rate not exceeding six per centum per annum, and the said Invercargill Borough Council is hereby authorized to borrow the said sum of eleven thousand pounds accordingly.

Scheme for the Control of Wairarapa High School.

Education Department,
Wellington, 24th October, 1922.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Education Act, 1914 (hereinafter called "the Education Act"), and with the powers thereunder, I, Christopher James Parr, Minister of Education, do hereby, on the advice of the General Council of Education, approve of the following scheme for the Wairarapa High School (hereinafter called "the school"), which is to be established under section 88 of the Education Act, 1914.

1. The school shall be controlled by a Board of Governors under the name of "The Board of Governors of the Wairarapa High School" (hereinafter called "the Board"). The Board shall under that name be a body corporate, as provided in section 91 of the Education Act.

2. (1.) There shall be nine members of the Board, who shall be appointed or elected in the manner following, namely:—

- (a.) A group of two members appointed by the Governor-General;
- (b.) A group of three members appointed by the Education Board of the district;
- (c.) A group of three members elected by the parents of the pupils;
- (d.) One member appointed by the Masterton Borough Council.

(2.) The ordinary term of office of members appointed under paragraphs (a) and (d) of subclause (1) hereof shall be two years, and the ordinary term of office of members appointed or elected under paragraphs (b) and (c) of subclause (1) hereof shall be three years; but every member shall hold office until the appointment or election of his successor.

3. (1.) The members appointed by the Board of Education shall be appointed by a resolution of such Board.

(2.) The member appointed by the Masterton Borough Council shall be appointed by a resolution of the Council.

4. In regard to the election of members of the Board by the parents of the pupils, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (1.) Every such election shall be held on a date to be fixed by the Board in accordance with this scheme.
- (2.) The Secretary of the Board shall be the Returning Officer.
- (3.) For the purposes of each election the Returning Officer shall prepare a roll, and shall enter therein the name, occupation, and address of every person qualified to be enrolled as a parent of a pupil of the school. The roll shall be closed at 5 o'clock on the fourteenth day next before the day on which any election is to be held, and shall continue to be closed until the election is completed.

"Parent" means the parent or guardian having the actual custody or control of a pupil of the school. It means the father if so qualified; if not, then the mother being so qualified; or if neither be so qualified then the actual guardian of the pupil; but does not in any case include both the father and the mother of a pupil, nor include either of the parents and the guardian.

A "pupil of the school" means a pupil whose name is on the school roll, but does not include a pupil in any lower department.

(4.) The Returning Officer shall, by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district, publicly notify, not less than fourteen days before each election—

- (a.) The day and hour for the closing of nominations.
- (b.) The total number of candidates to be elected;
- (c.) The day and hour for the closing of the election.

(5.) Every candidate shall be nominated in writing by one or more parents entitled to vote for his election.

Each such parent may nominate any number of candidates not exceeding the number to be elected.

(6.) Every nomination-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following:—

I, [Name and address], being a parent duly entered on the roll, do hereby nominate [Name and address] as a candidate for election to the Board of Governors of the Wairarapa High School at the election to be held on the _____ day of _____, 19____.
Dated this _____ day of _____, 19____.
[Signature of nominator.]

CANDIDATE'S CONSENT [to be subscribed at foot of Nomination-paper].

(7.) If the nomination-paper does not bear the written consent of the candidate nominated, such consent

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may be given by him to the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed, and every nomination-paper shall be void in so far as concerns any candidate whose written consent is not duly given as aforesaid.

(8.) Nominations shall close at noon on the tenth day before the day of the election.

(9.) If the number of nominations received does not exceed the number of vacancies to be filled, the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare the candidate or candidates so nominated to be duly elected. In all other cases he shall, as soon as the nominations are closed, prepare and post to each elector at his address as appearing on the roll a printed voting-paper containing in alphabetical order of surnames a list of all the duly nominated candidates for whom such parent is entitled to vote; and such voting-paper shall bear the number of the voter on the roll and be in the form or to the effect following:—

(10.) The poll shall close at 5 o'clock on the afternoon of the day of election; but all voting-papers shall be included and counted which are not informal and are received by the Returning Officer in due course of post before the close of the sixth day after the day of the election.

(11.) A voting-paper shall be informal in any of the following cases, that is to say,—

(a.) If the elector votes more than once at the same election;

(b.) If the candidates whose names are left uncancelled exceed in number the total number of candidates for whom the person is entitled to vote, or if in any other way the paper fails to indicate clearly for whom the vote is intended to be given; or

(c.) If, being delivered to the Returning Officer, the sealed envelope containing the voting-paper is not delivered at his office before the close of the poll; or

(d.) If, having been forwarded by post, the sealed envelope containing the voting-paper is not received at the office of the Returning Officer before the close of the sixth day after the day of election, or if, from the post-mark on the envelope or otherwise, the Returning Officer is satisfied that it was not posted until after the day of the election.

(12.) On the seventh day after the day of election the Returning Officer shall open and examine all voting-papers duly delivered to him or received by him through the post as aforesaid, and, after rejecting all informal voting-papers, shall ascertain the candidates (not exceeding the total number to be elected) who have received the greatest number of votes, and shall declare such candidates to be elected.

(13.) If, by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more candidates, the election is not complete, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot, in the presence of two members of the Board, which candidate or candidates shall be elected, and thereby complete the election.

(14.) (a.) Each candidate may, by writing under his hand, appoint one scrutineer, who may be present at the examination of the voting-papers and the counting of the votes by the Returning Officer.

(b.) The Returning Officer shall, immediately after counting the votes, seal up all voting-papers, and transmit the whole to the Clerk of the nearest Magistrate's Court, who shall keep the same for six months thereafter, and shall not open or permit to be opened such packet except on the order of some Court of competent jurisdiction, and shall at the end of six months effectually destroy the same.

(c.) Forthwith after the completion of the election the Returning Officer shall, by notice exhibited on the outside of the office of the Board and by advertisement in a newspaper published in the district, notify the names of the persons elected, the number of valid votes recorded for each candidate, and the total number of votes rejected as informal, and shall notify to the Board and to the Minister the names of the persons elected.

(d.) The Returning Officer and every scrutineer shall be required faithfully and impartially to perform the duties of their offices, and shall not directly or indirectly make known the state of the poll or give or pretend to give any information by which the state of the poll may be known before the final declaration thereof by the Returning Officer, or make known for which candidate any voter has voted, or communicate to any person any information likely to defeat the secrecy of the ballot.

(15.) If any dispute or question arises touching the regularity of any election, such dispute or question shall be determined by a Stipendiary Magistrate in manner provided by sections 45 to 54 of the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, all the provisions of which shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply.

5. (1.) One member out of each of the groups (a), (b), and (c) of subclause (1) of clause 2 hereof shall retire on the 31st December in each year, and the member so to retire shall be the one who has been longest in office since his last appointment or election: Provided that where any question arises as to which member shall retire the same shall be decided by lot among those members who have served longest without re-election in such manner as the Board shall determine.

(2.) On the 31st December in the year 1923, and in every second year thereafter, the member appointed under paragraph (d) of the said clause shall retire.

6. Retiring members shall be eligible for reappointment or re-election.

7. (1.) A casual vacancy shall be created in the same way and for the same causes as are set out in section 20 of the Education Act in the case of members of an Education Board.

(2.) Every casual vacancy shall be filled in the same manner and by the same appointing or electing authority as in the case of the vacating member; provided that the member appointed or elected shall hold office only for the residue of the term of the vacating member.

(3.) Whenever a casual vacancy occurs it shall be the duty of the Board forthwith to report the fact to the Minister if the vacancy is to be filled by the Governor, or to the Secretary to the Education Board if the vacancy is to be filled by that Board, or to the Town Clerk in the case of a member to be appointed by the Masterton Borough Council.

8. (1.) The appointment or election of a member to fill a vacancy caused by the expiry of the ordinary term of office shall be made in the first week of the month of December at the end whereof such expiry takes place, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, but shall not take effect until such expiry.

(2.) The appointment or election of a member to fill a casual vacancy shall be made not later than fifty days after the vacancy occurs.

9. The Board shall hold an annual meeting in the month of February or March in each year, at such time and place as the Board shall direct.

10. From time to time as may be necessary the Board shall appoint a Secretary, and shall appoint him or some other person with authority to receive and to pay moneys on its account. The Board shall in each case forthwith inform the Minister of such appointment.

11. (1.) At the annual meeting and at such other times as may be necessary the Board shall elect a Chairman.

(2.) During the election of Chairman the Secretary to the Board shall preside. The person presiding shall have no vote; ties shall be decided by lot.

(3.) The Chairman's ordinary term of office shall be one year, and he shall be eligible for re-election.

(4.) If the Chairman shall from any cause cease to be a member of the Board or resign the office of Chairman, the Board shall as soon thereafter as conveniently may be elect another member of the Board to be Chairman in his stead, who shall hold office only until the next annual meeting.

12. At all meetings of the Board the Chairman, or in his absence such member of the Board as the majority of the

members assembled shall choose, shall preside, and such Chairman or presiding member shall have a deliberative vote, and in all cases of equality of votes shall also have a casting-vote.

At all meetings of the Board a majority of all the members then in office shall constitute a quorum.

13. Subject to the provisions of this scheme, the Board shall make, and may from time to time revoke, vary, or amend, regulations for the conduct of business at its meetings, for determining how meetings shall be convened, and for such other like matters as may be requisite for the conduct of the business of the Board.

14. Minutes of the proceedings of the Board shall be regularly entered in a proper book to be kept for that purpose, and at every meeting of the Board the minutes of the previous meeting shall be read over and signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which the same are read, and the minutes when so signed shall be held to be a true statement and record of the proceedings of the Board for all purposes whatever.

15. (1.) The Board shall keep full and true accounts, in which shall be entered every sum received into and paid out of the Board fund in the order of date of each such receipt and payment, including all moneys received from rents or profits derived from lands or other property, vested in the Board or under its control or management.

(2.) The Board shall cause its accounts for the preceding calendar year to be balanced, and a true statement and account to be prepared, in the prescribed form, of the receipts and expenditure of the Board and of its assets and liabilities.

(3.) All such accounts shall be audited by the Audit Office, which for that purpose shall have and may exercise all such powers as it has under the Public Revenues Act, 1910, in respect of public moneys.

16. All things required by the Education Act or this scheme to be done by the Board shall be done in accordance with and in pursuance of a resolution passed at a meeting of the Board, and no act of the Board shall be invalid or liable to be questioned on the ground that one or more than one of the members thereof was or were incapacitated, or had ceased to hold office, or on the ground that the seat of any member was vacant.

17. Subject to the provisions of this scheme, and of the Education Act and regulations thereunder, there shall be vested in the Board the whole control and management of the Wairarapa High School, and also the entire superintendence over all the affairs, concerns, and property thereof, with full power to appoint and suspend or dismiss all masters, teachers, lecturers, examiners, and other necessary officers and servants; and in all cases unprovided for by the Education Act and the regulations thereunder, or by this scheme, it shall be lawful for the Board to act in such manner as shall appear to it best calculated to further the purposes intended to be served by the establishment of such school; and the Board shall, subject to the Education Act and the regulations thereunder, and to this scheme, have full power from time to time to make, alter, and rescind by-laws and regulations for defining the courses of study and education in the school, and also for regulating the discipline and examination of the same, the conditions upon which the scholars shall be admitted, and, in general, touching all other matters, purposes, and things regarding the school.

18. (1.) The school shall provide a general course of secondary education and one or more vocational courses.

(2.) The program of each pupil shall be determined by the headmaster of the school after consultation with the parents or guardian of the pupil; but in all cases the program of each girl shall include adequate instruction in elementary domestic science and hygiene, and in one or more of the domestic arts extending in general over not less than two years of the secondary course provided. No pupils shall be compelled to take Latin or to take more than one language besides English.

(3.) The school year shall consist of three terms of about thirteen weeks each.

(4.) The headmaster shall cause the school to be examined during each term; provided that it shall not be necessary for the school to be so examined in any term in which it is examined by some other person appointed by the Minister or the Board; and provided further that it shall not be necessary to include in such examination pupils sitting for public examinations during the term.

19. Subject to the general direction of the Board, the headmaster shall have the following powers:—

(1.) He shall have control of the school buildings and premises, and of the apparatus and furniture thereof.

(2.) He shall have the power to recommend the appointment or dismissal of assistant teachers or of other officers of the school, and to allot their several duties; and no assistant teacher or other officer of the school shall be appointed until the headmaster has been consulted.

- (3.) He shall have the power in case of grave neglect of duty or of gross misbehaviour to suspend any assistant teacher or other officer, but shall forthwith report his action to the Chairman, who shall thereupon confirm or overrule his action until the next meeting of the Board, when the matter may be determined: but the action of the headmaster shall hold good until the Chairman or the Board has determined the matter.
- (4.) He shall be supreme over the discipline, and may suspend any pupil, reporting his action to the Board at their next meeting, and the action of the headmaster shall hold good until the Board has come to some determination in regard to the matter. He shall not expel any pupil without the sanction of the Board.
- (5.) He shall regulate all text-books, methods, and organization in accordance with clause 18 hereof, and, subject to the same clause and to the regulations under the Education Act, shall determine the course of study for each pupil.

20. The Board may establish or license hostels or boardinghouses for the accommodation of pupils, and may place such hostels or boardinghouses under the charge of teachers of the school or other suitable persons, and shall provide for the inspection of such hostels or boardinghouses.

21. The rents, profits, and income of all real and personal estate which may be vested in the Board, or granted or acquired as a site or sites or otherwise for the benefit of the school, or given, devised, or bequeathed to the Board for the benefit of the school without any trusts or powers of a different nature being expressed in the instrument so giving, devising, or bequeathing to the Board, and all reserves of land which may be hereafter made for the benefit of the school, shall be held and dealt with by the Board under and subject to all such powers, provisions, and conditions as are contained in the Education Reserves Act, 1908, and its amendments, as if the school were a high school within the meaning of that Act.

22. Subject to the subsequent clauses of this scheme, the rents, profits, and annual income of all real and personal

estate that may be vested in the Board, together with all funds which may from time to time be derived from fees or payments made in respect of pupils attending the school, together with any annual or other allowance that may be made by the General Assembly or the Government of New Zealand, shall be applied by the Board for the maintenance of the school, and the payment of the salaries and expenses connected therewith, and for prizes, exhibitions, and scholarships for the pupils therein: Provided that the Board shall have power to set apart, if it sees fit, out of the said rents, profits, and annual income such part as it considers advisable, either as an addition to the capital fund, which shall then be invested in the manner hereinafter mentioned and dealt with as part of such capital fund, or as reserve fund to meet extraordinary expenses, which shall be invested and dealt with in such manner as the Board directs.

23. With respect to any moneys bequeathed or given to the Board for the school, and with respect also to all rent, profit, and annual income set apart under the preceding clause, the Board shall have power to invest the same in the purchase or upon first mortgages of freehold land in New Zealand, or upon the stocks, bonds, bills, or debentures of the Government of New Zealand, or issued by any local authority therein under any Act of the General Assembly, and may from time to time vary such investments.

24. The Board may, out of such moneys as may come into its hands by virtue of any Act or otherwise for the benefit of the school, expend any sum or sums in purchasing land and erecting and maintaining suitable buildings and premises thereon for use as school buildings, and may, subject to the approval of the Minister, expend any sum or sums in purchasing land and erecting and maintaining suitable buildings thereon for use as boardinghouses for the pupils, or as residences for the masters, teachers, or other officers employed in connection with the school.

25. The school shall be open to inspection as provided by section 96 of the Education Act.

THAMES JOCKEY CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Thames Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 28th day of February, 1919, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the club's property situated in the district of Parawai, Thames, and known as the Thames Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

 - (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Woodville District Jockey Club at a meeting held on the 12th day of October, 1922, at Woodville, with a recommendation by the President of such club, Mr. Samuel Bolton, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. George Peebles moved, and Mr. Robert Bly seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

WOODVILLE DISTRICT JOCKEY CLUB (INCORPORATED).

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Woodville District Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 3rd day of February, 1919, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of Lots 1 and 2, D.P. 1716, part Sections 8 and 9, and also part Section 9, Woodville Special Settlement, situated in the district of Woodville, and known as the Woodville Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

- (a.) Bookmakers.
- (b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Woodville District Jockey Club were made and passed by such club on the 12th day of October, 1922, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
