Boundaries of Borough of Whangarei altered.

[L.S.] JELLICOE, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS, in pursuance of section one hundred and thirty-three of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, a petition was presented to the Governor-General praying that certain areas be excluded from the County of Whangarei and included in the Borough of Whangarei :

and included in the Borough of Whangarei : And whereas a Commission appointed under the said section held inquiries, and recommended certain alterations of the said areas :

And whereas it is expedient to make the alterations of the boundaries of the said borough recommended by the said Commission :

Commission: Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare that as on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, the areas described in the Schedule hereto shall be excluded from the County of Whangarei and included in the Borough of Whangarei.

AREAS INCLUDED IN THE BOROUGH OF WHANGAREL

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor-General may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1922.

Rainfall was below the average except at isolated places, particularly in the north-east portion of the South Island

Rainfall was below the average except at isolated places, particularly in the north-east portion of the South Island and the extreme north of the North Island. Unsettled weather was generally confined to two periods—viz., between the 9th and 14th and the 22nd and 28th. In the former period an extensive though rather shallow cyclonic depression ruled, bringing welcome rain in most parts on the 10th and 11th. Some snow was reported on the 11th on the high country in the South, and also on the 13th on the higher levels in the North Island as far north as the Gisborne district. The heavy rains that occurred in parts towards the end of the month were accounted for by a succession of disturb-ances on the edge of an anticyclone which at that time overspread the Dominion. Except during the periods mentioned fair weather predominated, with several sharp frosts in various parts. The month was a good one for agricultural work, and, although growth was not abundant, it was sufficient for grazing purposes.
