Boundaries of Borough of Whangarei altered.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of section one hundred and thirty-three of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, a petition was presented to the Governor-General praying that certain areas be excluded from the County of Whangarei and included in the Borough of Whangarei :

And whereas a Commission appointed under the said section held inquiries, and recommended certain alterations of the said areas :

And whereas it is expedient to make the alterations of the boundaries of the said borough recommended by the said Commission :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1920, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare that as on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, the areas described in the Schedule hereto shall be excluded from the County of Whangarei and included in the Borough of Whangarei.

SCHEDULE.

AREAS INCLUDED IN THE BOROUGH OF WHANGAREI.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District bounded on the north-east and south by the Borough of Whangarei to the Waiarohia River ; thence up the Waiarohia River to an allotment containing 4 acres as delineated on plan No. 22 at the Deeds Registry, Auckland ; thence northerly along the western boundary of that allotment to Whauwhau Road ; thence easterly along the southern side of the said Whauwhau Road to a point in line with the western boundary of an allotment containing 13 acres 1 rood 10 perches as delineated on plan 3719A deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland ; thence by a right line across that

road, and along the western boundary aforesaid to the southern side of the Whauwhau Railway line ; thence easterly along the aforesaid railway to the south-western corner of Allotment 8 ; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundaries of Allotments 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 to the north-western corner of Allotment 12 ; thence north-easterly along the northern boundary of Allotment 12 to the north-eastern corner of the aforementioned Allotment 12 ; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of Allotments 12 and 11 to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned allotment ; thence by a right line across the road to the borough boundary.

Also all that area in the North Auckland Land District commencing at the northernmost corner of that part of Horahora No. 2 shown on plan 468A, proceeding thence south-westerly to the north-eastern corner of Horahora No. 1 ; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary to the north-western corner of the said Horahora No. 1 ; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that part of Horahora No. 2 shown on L.T. plan 3719A to its north-western corner ; thence southerly along its western boundary to a public road ; thence by a right line across that road to the north-eastern corner of Subdivision 1, D.P. 3158 ; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the said Subdivision 1 to a public road, across that road, and thence westerly along the southern side of that road to the north-western corner of Lot 1, D.P. 4476 ; thence southerly along the western boundary of the said Lot 1 to the Raumanga River ; thence south-easterly along the Raumanga River to the Whangarei-Raumanga Road ; thence by a right line across that road to the north-western corner of Section East 8, deposited plan 975 ; thence by the western boundary of the said Section East 8 to its south-western corner ; thence easterly along the southern boundary of Section East 8 to the south-western boundary of an allotment containing 4 acres 3 roods 31 perches, deposited plan 1032 ; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of that allotment to the north-western corner of Lot 16, deposited plan 374 ; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of the said Lot 16 to the Otaike-Whangarei Road ; thence by a right line to the centre of the aforesaid road ; thence easterly along the centre of the Otaike-Whangarei Road to the intersection of a public road forming the south-western boundaries of Lots 28 and 44 ; thence south-easterly along the centre of that public road to its intersection with High Street ; thence north-easterly along the centre of High Street and a public

road forming the south-eastern boundary of Section 23 to a public road; thence south-easterly along the centre of that road to a point in line with the eastern side of a public road forming the western boundary of part Okara Block shown on D.P. 5198; thence to and along that side of road to the Whangarei-Onerahi Railway, and along the south-eastern side of that railway to the Whangarei Harbour; thence along the high-water mark of the said harbour to the south-eastern corner of the Borough of Whangarei; thence along the southern boundary of that borough to the place of commencement.

Also all that area in the North Auckland Land District commencing at a point on the Whangarei Borough boundary in line with the southern boundary of an allotment containing 49 acres 3 roods in the name of R. Mair; thence by a right line across the Whangarei River to the south-western boundary of the northern portion of Parahaki No. 1 Block containing 7 acres 1 rood 24 perches, by that block and the Parahaki Reserve to the north-western corner of Section 47, Deeds plan No. 60; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Sections 47 and 55A to a public road, across that road, and thence by a right line intersecting Parahaki No. 3 Block to the northernmost corner of Allotment 2, Parahaki Parish; thence by the north-western and south-western boundaries of that allotment to the western boundary of an allotment containing 7 acres 1 rood 35-6 perches, being part of Allotment 1, Parahaki Parish; thence by that western boundary and the eastern boundary of Lot 23 to a public road, across that road to the Whangarei Harbour; thence north-westerly by the Whangarei Harbour to the borough boundary; and thence by the borough boundary to the point of commencement.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor-General may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor-General by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the said petition and in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

And whereas it is desirable that the said area be constituted a town district:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that as on and from the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, the area described in the Schedule hereto, being the locality defined in the said petition, shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Kaitaia Town District. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five members.

Teachers' Certificate Examinations, 1922.

THE following lists contain the principal results of the examinations held in August and September for the purposes of teachers' certificates. In the preparation of the lists consideration has been given to candidates' successes at previous examinations held by the Department and at University examinations of which notice has been received.

The first list (I) contains the names of successful candidates for Classes A, B, C, and D. Teachers' certificates will be issued to such of these as have produced satisfactory evidence of age and good character, and have passed the special medical examination required, and have fulfilled the necessary conditions as to length of service and efficiency in teaching.

The second list (II) gives the names of those who have passed in two or more subjects of Parts II and III of Class C, but have yet to complete the examination.

The third list (III) contains the names of those who have obtained "partial passes" in the Class D Examination, and the fourth list (IV) those who have gained passes or partial passes in one or more "groups" of Class D.

In the fifth list (V) are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of "special mention."

The next examination will take place in August, 1923. Notice must be sent to the Director of Education so as to reach him not later than the 31st May, 1923. Candidates who have yet to complete the examination must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to receive any further information of the date at which the notices become due.

Certificated teachers who have gained promotion at this examination may send their certificates to the Department for endorsement.

The total births registered for the fifteen urban areas amounted to 1,074, as against 1,071 in September—an increase of 3. The deaths in October were 493, a decrease of 50 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 262, females 231. Sixty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 13·79 per cent. of the whole number. Fifty of these were under one year of age.

NOTE.—A good spring month with barometric pressure, temperatures, and sunshine above the average, while precipitation was 39 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine 186 hours 54 minutes, 53 per cent. of the possible, and three sunless days. Frost was recorded on the grass on eight mornings, and hail fell on five days. Mean earth-temperature at 1 ft. was 51.3°, and 52.3° at 3 ft. Mean dew-point, 43.4°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0.281 in.; and mean relative humidity, 73 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1922.

Rainfall was below the average except at isolated places, particularly in the north-east portion of the South Island and the extreme north of the North Island.

Unsettled weather was generally confined to two periods—viz., between the 9th and 14th and the 22nd and 28th. In the former period an extensive though rather shallow cyclonic depression ruled, bringing welcome rain in most parts on the 10th and 11th. Some snow was reported on the 11th on the high country in the South, and also on the 13th on the higher levels in the North Island as far north as the Gisborne district.

The heavy rains that occurred in parts towards the end of the month were accounted for by a succession of disturbances on the edge of an anticyclone which at that time overspread the Dominion.

Except during the periods mentioned fair weather predominated, with several sharp frosts in various parts. The month was a good one for agricultural work, and, although growth was not abundant, it was sufficient for grazing purposes.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

FOXTON RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Foxton Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 20th day of December, 1918, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Foxton Racecourse situated in the district of Foxton, and known as the Foxton Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Stratford Racing Club at a meeting held on the 11th day of October, 1922, at 8 p.m., at Stratford, with a recommendation by the Chairman of such club, Mr. Sidney Pitt, of Stratford, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. Sidney Pitt, of Stratford, the Chairman of such club and the meeting, moved, and Mr. John Bangham Richards, of Stratford, seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

STRATFORD RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Stratford Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 30th day of September, 1918, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Stratford Racing Club's property situated in the district of Stratford, Taranaki, and known as the Stratford Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Stratford Racing Club were made and passed by such club on the 11th day of October, 1922, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.
