Change of Name of Locality "Gumtown" to "Coroglen."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS settlers in the locality known as "Gumtown," in the County of Coromandel, desire that the name of such locality should be changed to "Coroglen," and it is considered expedient to alter the same:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality known as "Gumtown," in the County of Coromandel, shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Coroglen," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, it is enacted that if at any time after the issue or making of any Proclamation taking land under the Public Works Act, 1908, and before the payment or award of any compensation in respect of the taking thereof, it is found that the land or any part thereof is not required for the

purpose for which it was taken the Governor-General may, by a subsequent Proclamation gazetted, revoke the former Proclamation, either wholly or so far as he thinks necessary:

And whereas it is found that the land in Karangahape Parish, Waitemata County, taken for railway purposes by a Proclamation made under the Public Works Act, 1908, dated the twenty-first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (hereinafter termed "the said Proclamation"), and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 172, of the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, page 4341, is not required for the purposes for which it was taken:

And whereas compensation in respect of the taking of the said land has not been paid or awarded:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe the additional fees to be taken by Registrars, and make the additional regulation hereinafter set forth for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATION.

1. The following fees are hereby prescribed as the charges to be made for checking plans to be deposited in the Land Registry Office:—

(a.) For each £1,000 or part of £1,000 of the value of the land (including improvements) comprised in any plan of survey, 5s.

(b.) For any plan not being a plan of survey, 5s.

2. To enable assessment of the said fees, there shall be lodged with each plan of survey presented for checking and deposit a statutory declaration, made by the owner for whom the survey was made, or by some person acting on his or her behalf, stating the value of the land (including improvements) comprised in the plan.

3. This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1922, and the fees aforesaid shall be paid on all plans deposited on and after that date.

The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair ; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at their own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels ; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof ; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensees' part.

13. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein before set forth, or any of them ;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days ;

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 10, of the thirtieth day of the same month, the Opotiki County Council (hereinafter called "the Council"), was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Kutarere, Bay of Plenty, as a site for a wharf :

And whereas by section thirteen of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor-General in Council may from time to time by Order in Council prescribe what dues and rates shall be taken by the authority or person for the use of such wharf :

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 82, of the eighth day of the same month, an additional rule was made as to life-saving appliances for ships: And whereas it is desirable to revoke such rule and make a new rule in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power conferred upon him by section one hundred and ninety-seven of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council of the fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and doth hereby make the following rule as to life-saving appliances for ships.

RULE.

3. *Life-jackets previously passed.*—Until the 31st March 1923, any life-jacket which has been previously passed by a Marine Department Surveyor as part of the statutory equipment of a vessel may be accepted as part of the statutory equipment of the same vessel so long as it remains in good condition.

Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest, sinking fund, and other charges on the Kamo Town Board Electric Lighting Loan of £2,700, 1922, authorized to be raised by the said Board, under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of the installation of an electric lighting and power scheme in the special rating area within the Kamo Town District, the said Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of one and thirteen-twentieths of a penny (1d. and 13/20d.) in the pound sterling on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all the rateable property in the special rating area within the Kamo Town District, in the County of Whangarei, contained within the following boundaries: Commencing at the intersection of the Whangarei-Kamo Railway line with the southern boundary of the Kamo Town District, thence following the said boundary of the Kamo Town District in a north-westerly direction generally to the intersection of the said boundary with the Whangarei-Kamo Railway line, thence following the said Whangarei-Kamo Railway line in a south-easterly direction generally to the intersection of the said railway-line with the southern boundary of the Kamo Town District, the point of commencement. And that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of June in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of ten (10) years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
