WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the fourteenth WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and gazetted on the sixteenth day of the same month, the boundaries of the County of Waitemata were altered by the exclusion therefrom of the area comprising the Glen Eden Town District, being part of the Titirangi and Waikumete Ridings of that county:

And whereas it is desirable that the remaining portions of the said Titirangi and Waikumete Ridings be abolished, and that the areas comprised therein be included in and form part of two ridings to be known as the Titirangi and Waikumete Ridings of the said county:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe,
Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in
pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred
upon me by section twenty-one of the Counties Act, 1920, do hereby abolish the remaining portions of the said Titirangi and Waikumete Ridings, parts of which were excluded as aforesaid from the said County of Waitemata, and do hereby declare that the remaining portions of the said ridings shall be included in and form part of ridings to be known as the Titirangi and Waikumete Ridings of the said county, and that the boundaries of those ridings shall be those set forth respectively in the First and Second Schedules hereto.

north-eastern boundary of the western portion of Allotment north-eastern boundary of the western portion of Allotment 15, Parish of Karangahape, the south-eastern and part of the north-eastern boundary of Allotment 16, Parish of Karangahape, and the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of Allotment 109, Parish of Karangahape, to the Huia River; thence by the Huia River to the northern boundary of Allotment 8a, Parish of Karangahape; thence by the northern boundary of said Allotment 8a to its north-eastern corner; thence by a direct line to the south-eastern corner of Allotment 30, Parish of Karangahape; thence by the south-eastern boundary of said Allotment 30 to the Nihotapu River; thence by the Nihotapu River to the western boundary of Allotment 38, Parish of Waikomiti; thence by the western, northern, and part of the eastern the western boundary of Allotment 38, Parish of Waikomiti; thence by the western, northern, and part of the eastern boundaries of Allotment 38 aforesaid to the south-western corner of Allotment 58; thence by south-west and southern boundaries of Allotment 58, Parish of Waikomiti; thence by the southern and part of the eastern boundary of Allotment 57, Parish of Waikomiti, to the south-western corner of Allotment 59, Parish of Waikomiti; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of Allotment 59 aforesaid to a public road crossing the road by part of the western boundary and road, crossing the road by part of the western boundary and the northern boundary of Allotment 30, Parish of Waikomiti, to the stream forming the western boundary of Allotment 29, Parish of Waikomiti; thence by the said stream to the south-western corner of Allotment 12, Parish of Waikomiti; thence by the southern boundary of said Allotment 12, part of the western boundary, the southern boundary, and part of the eastern boundary of Allotment 27, Parish of Waikomiti; thence by part of the eastern boundary of Allotment 50, Parish of Waikomiti, to the county boundary, and by that boundary to the place of commencement.

The Education Act, 1914.—Regulations regarding Free Places in Secondary Schools, District High Schools, Technical High Schools, and Technical Schools and Classes.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations at present in force regarding Free Places in Secondary Schools and District High Schools, and doth also hereby revoke clauses seventy-seven to one hundred and nine inclusive of the regulations for Manual and Technical Instruction at present in force, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

SCHEDULE.

FREE PLACES.

1. A free place under clauses 3 to 21 inclusive of these regulations tenable at a secondary school, district high school, or technical high school, hereinafter referred to as "a high school," shall be regarded as alternative with (not in addition to) a free place held on a corresponding qualification under clauses 22 to 28 inclusive of these regulations.

2. A high school shall be held to provide free places within the meaning of section 97 of the Education Act, 1914, if, in accordance with the Act and these regulations, it admits to such free places all qualified pupils who wish

to attend such school.

JUNIOR FREE PLACES IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS, DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS, AND TECHNICAL HIGH SCHOOLS.

3. Subject to these regulations a pupil shall be qualified to be a junior

free pupil or the holder of a junior free place under the Act if-

(a.) He is the holder of a Junior National Scholarship, or any other scholarship that the Minister shall approve for this purpose: Provided that the value of any such scholarship is not greater than £50 per annum in the case of any pupil who is obliged to live away from home in order to attend the high school, or than £15 per annum in any other case; or if

(b.) He has qualified for a free place in the Junior National Scholarship Examination on such pass conditions as the Minister may from

time to time determine; or if

(c.) Being not over fifteen years of age on the 1st December preceding the date of his admission to a free place, he has obtained a certificate of proficiency as defined by regulations under the Act, or

an equivalent or higher qualification:

Provided that any pupil who has obtained a certificate of proficiency but by reason of age is not qualified for a free place under paragraph (c) hereof may, within six months after obtaining such certificate, be admitted to a free place in a high school if he has been recommended therefor by a Senior Inspector of Schools, and takes a course of instruction that meets with the approval of the Director:

Provided further that if any pupil is in attendance at a secondary school or district high school at the date of coming into force of this proviso, and has been debarred from holding a free place solely by reason of age, he may, on the receipt of a favourable report from the Principal, be admitted by the

Director to a junior free place during the year 1923.

In the case of a pupil applying for admission to a technical high school or district high school, a certificate of competency in the subjects of the Sixth Standard, with special merit in handwork or elementary science, shall be deemed to be equivalent to a certificate of proficiency.

4. With regard to pupils qualified under clause 3 hereof-

(i.) The secondary school shall admit to a junior free place any pupil qualified under (a) or (b), unless such pupil can attend a secondary school nearer his home.

(ii.) The secondary school shall also admit any pupil qualified under (c), unless such pupil can attend a secondary school nearer his home, or unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that such pupil can obtain suitable instruction at a district high school or a technical high school.

(iii.) The technical high school and the district high school shall admit as a junior free pupil any pupil qualified under any of the paragraphs of clause 3 hereof, unless such pupil can obtain suitable instruction at a high school nearer his home, and no such school shall admit to a junior free place

any pupil not so qualified.

5. (i.) A junior free place at a secondary school or technical high school is tenable for two years from the 1st January preceding the actual date of admission as a free pupil, but in the case of a holder who was under thirteen years of age on the 1st December preceding such date of admission the tenure of the free place may, on the recommendation of the Principal of the school, be extended to a third year.

(ii.) A junior free place at a district high school is tenable for three

years from the 1st January preceding the actual date of admission.

(iii.) In no case, however, shall a junior free place be tenable after the holder has passed his seventeenth birthday; provided that if the seventeenth birthday occurs during a school term or quarter the free place shall

be tenable till the end of that term or quarter.

6. (A.) The secondary school or district high school shall give to each holder of a junior free place under these regulations suitable instruction in subjects (1) English and (2) history and civics (Group I of the following schedule), in one of the subjects (3) or (4) of Group II, in one subject at least chosen from Group IV, and in not less than two other subjects chosen from Groups III, IV, and V, in such a way that the total number of units of work in a year is in general not less than 20: Provided that during the tenure of a junior free place subject (12), home science, shall be taken by every girl, whether attending a secondary or a district high school, and that subject (11), practical agriculture and dairy science, shall be taken by every boy attending a district high school with an average attendance of not more than seventy in the secondary department, unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that adequate provision for instruction in these subjects cannot be made, or that equivalent instruction of a vocational character is otherwise provided for.

Further, the school shall give to each free pupil suitable physical training, including where possible instruction in swimming and life-saving, equivalent

to at least one unit annually.

Note.—This clause is not intended to be construed in such a way as to limit unduly the discretion of the Principal of a school in determining the programme of a pupil, but any material departure from the course prescribed must be approved beforehand by the Director of Education.

(ii.) A "unit" denotes one hour a week for not less than thirty-nine weeks regularly throughout the school year; provided that in the case of subjects (15) and (16) two hours a week for half the year may be counted as a unit.

(iii.) No credit will be given in any subject, for the purpose of clause 7 (c) hereof, for work in any year of less amount than the minimum number of units shown in the schedule above; but, subject to that condition, two lessons of forty minutes each may be counted as 1.3 units, three lessons of forty-five minutes each as 2.3 units, five lessons of fifty minutes each as 4.2 units, and so on, in each such case the nearest tenth of a unit being taken, provided that the minimum number of units prescribed for the subject is reached.

(B.) The technical high school shall give to each holder of a junior free place instruction in-

(i.) English as for the Intermediate Examination, or commercial English, including in either case the general study of selected standard works in both prose and verse, reading and recitation, handwriting, composition (both oral and written), and history and civies. The cultivation of correct habits of speech and of facility of expression, both oral and written, must receive special attention. The history and civies herein included should have special reference to the British Empire and to the rights and duties of citizens, so treated as to develop a sense of responsibility with regard to social service, and should embrace generally instruction based on the course in civics recommended in the Syllabus of Instruction for Public Schools.

- (ii.) Arithmetic (including household accounts in the case of girls), or elementary mathematics as prescribed for the Intermediate Examination, or practical mathematics, or commercial or actuarial arithmetic.
- (iii.) Any appropriate branch of free or instrumental drawing.

(iv.) Physical training, including where possible instruction in swimming and life-saving.

The instruction referred to in (i), (ii), and (iii) must be given regularly throughout the year for not less than 4 units in the case of (i), 3 units in the case of (ii), 2 units in the case of (iii), and in the case of (iv) for not less than 1 unit in the course of the year. In addition the pupil must also take at the technical high school a vocational course approved by the Minister having a direct bearing on industrial, agricultural, domestic, or commercial pursuits, or, with the approval of the Minister previously obtained, a vocational course of a general character in preparation for one or other of the public examinations. The total time given to the instruction in a year must not, with the time given to the subjects enumerated in (i), (ii), (iii), and (iv) hereof, be less than 20 units: Provided that during the tenure of her junior free place every girl shall take not less than 3 units each year of an approved course in home science-namely, an elementary course in general science bearing on the home, and in household economics and hygiene, together with one or more of the following subjects: Plain cookery, laundry-work, needlecraft and garment-making, home nursing.

SENIOR FREE PLACES IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS, DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS, AND TECHNICAL HIGH SCHOOLS.

7. Subject to these regulations—(a.) A senior free place is tenable by any pupil who is the holder of a Senior National Scholarship, or of any other scholarship that the Minister shall approve for this purpose: Provided that the value of any such scholarship is not greater than £55 per annum in the case of any pupil who is obliged to live away from home in order to attend the high school, or more than £20 per annum in any other case.

(b.) A senior free place is tenable by any pupil who has passed the Matriculation Examination, or the Public Service Entrance Examination, or the Intermediate Examination; or has qualified for a pass in the examination for a Senior National Scholarship or any other scholarship that the

Minister shall approve for this purpose.

(c.) On the recommendation of the Principal of the secondary school or technical high school, based on the school records and examination results for the year, or of an Inspector of Schools, or, in the case of a district high school, on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector of the district, or in part on such a recommendation and in part on the results of a special examination, a senior free place may be awarded by the Director of Education to any pupil who, after obtaining the educational qualification for a junior free place, has satisfactorily completed a course of instruction during the two years immediately preceding. In the case of a pupil of a secondary school or district high school, such course shall include not less than 36 units of work as defined in the schedule to clause 6 hereof, such 36 units to include at least 8 units in English (Group I), 6 units in Group II, 4 units of a continuous course in Group IV, and, if a subject is chosen from Group III, not less than 6 units therein. In reckoning units for this purpose, credit cannot be given for any subject in which less than 2 units have been completed during the two years, nor for any subject in which the conditions of the schedule to clause 6 have not been satisfied. In the case of a pupil of a technical high school, such course shall include not less than 36 units of work of a course approved by the Director of Education.

Note.—Applications to be admitted to the Intermediate Examination under paragraph (b), and applications for admission to senior free places under paragraph (c), must be sent on forms provided by the Education Department to the Director of Education before the 8th September.

8. The school shall admit to a senior free place any pupil qualified under clause 7 hereof, unless, in the opinion of the Director, such pupil can obtain suitable instruction at a school nearer his home, and no school shall admit to a senior free place any pupil not so qualified.

9. A senior free place is tenable until the holder has reached his nineteenth birthday: Provided that if the nineteenth birthday occurs during a school term or quarter the free place shall be tenable until the end of that term or quarter.

10. (i.) The secondary school or district high school shall give to each holder of a senior free place more advanced instruction in the secondary

subjects named in clause 6 hereof, and under the conditions set out in that clause, except that the proviso contained in the first paragraph of the clause shall not be held to apply, and that when the pupil reaches the standard required for a Lower Leaving Certificate the requirements of the course prescribed may be deemed to be satisfied if the pupil receives at least 4 units of instruction of a higher standard in English, at least 4 units of like standard in each of two other subjects named in clause 3 of the regulations for secondary-school certificates, together with instruction in other subjects so selected in accordance with the provisions of clause 6 hereof that the total number of units completed each year is not in general less than 20.

(ii.) The technical high school shall give to each senior free pupil vocational and technical instruction in continuation and advance of the courses prescribed for junior free pupils. Not less than 20 units of work must be completed each year.

GENERAL.

11. As a condition of admission to a free place, any candidate may be required to furnish to the principal of the school to which admission is sought reasonable evidence of good character.

12. Notwithstanding the foregoing regulations, the school shall not be required to admit pupils to free places at any other time than the beginning of the school year, unless it shall seem expedient to the governing body

of the school to admit such pupils at any other time.

13. In case there shall not be sufficient accommodation at the school for all pupils seeking admission to the school, those qualified as holders of scholarships under paragraph (a) of clause 3, and under paragraph (a) of clause 7 hereof, shall first be admitted, next applicants qualified by attainment for senior free places, and then the remaining applicants in such order as the Minister, after consultation with the Board, shall determine.

14. (i.) A free place, whether held at a secondary school, district high school, or technical high school, or held partly at one and partly at another, shall be reckoned continuously from the date of the original admission of

the pupil to a free place in the school first attended.

(ii.) Except as hereinafter provided or as the Director of Education may decide, any intermission of attendance exceeding a period of three months in duration shall be deemed to determine the free place; further, the free place held by a pupil whose attendance during any term or quarter falls below 50 per cent. of the possible total of attendance at the school shall, with a like exception, be deemed to have lapsed as at the close of the period specified.

(iii.) If, on a report from the governing body of the school or from an Inspector of Schools, it shall appear to the Director of Education that the attendance, conduct, diligence, or progress of any free pupil is not satisfactory, he may forthwith, or after due warning, determine the free place. In any case under review a special report may be required.

(iv.) Any junior or senior free pupil who has forfeited his free place shall not be eligible for a free place of the same kind, junior or senior

respectively, at any other school.

15. (i.) Except as provided for in clause 16 hereof, the holder of a free place at one school shall not be allowed to transfer his free place to another school.

Provided that, in special cases where it is shown to the Director's satisfaction that the free pupil is unable to obtain at the school he is attending instruction in the subjects required for the course of study he desires to follow, such free pupil may, with the consent of the Director previously obtained, continue his free place for the unexpired period thereof at another school.

Provided further that a junior or senior free pupil who leaves a secondary school, or a district high school, or a technical high school to take up employment at any time before the completion of the tenure of his free place shall be eligible to continue his free place at a technical school for the unexpired period thereof.

(ii.) A pupil who has completed his tenure of a junior or senior free place at one school shall not be eligible to hold a similar free place—junior

or senior, as the case may be—at another school.

(iii.) Nothing in this clause shall be taken to prevent a pupil who has qualified for but has not entered upon a senior free place while attending one school from entering upon a senior free place at another school.

16. (i.) Any free pupil whose parents, after his admission to one school, shall remove more than five miles from the school at which his free place is held may continue to hold his free place at another school nearer his home, and such other school shall admit him accordingly on the same terms as if he had remained at the first-named school, provided that a secondary school

shall not be required to admit under these circumstances a holder of a free place at a district high school who can attend another district high school

or a technical high school.

(ii.) If any free pupil fails on account of illness to fulfil the conditions of his free place, or if any junior free pupil fails on account of illness to pass the examination or otherwise qualify for a senior free place, his free place may, with the approval of the Minister, be continued for another year, provided that the limits of age stated in clauses 5 and 9 hereof are not thereby exceeded. The fact of illness must be proved by evidence satisfactory to the Director of Education.

17. Any pupil who has held a free place at a school that has been disestablished by the Minister, or that for any other reason has ceased to exist, may continue to hold his free place at another school; and such school shall admit him accordingly on the same terms as if he had remained at the first-named school; nevertheless, a school may decline to admit such pupil

if he can attend another school nearer his home.

18. The programme of work of each free pupil under these regulations shall be determined by the Principal of the school after consultation, where practicable, with the parent or guardian of the pupil: Provided that no such pupil shall be compelled to take Latin or to take more than one language besides English.

The programme of each free pupil shall consist not of a number of disconnected subjects, but of a group of subjects duly arranged in accordance with the pupil's capacities, surroundings, and probable future calling, as far as such a programme can be provided for with regard to the general

circumstances of the school.

19. Free places under these regulations are not tenable with any other scholarship or free place, except as provided in clause 3 (a) or in clause 7 (a) hereof.

20. (a.) The annual returns of free pupils under these regulations shall be made on forms provided or approved by the Education Department, and sent to the Director of Education not later than the 1st April in each year. Supplementary returns showing the new entrants and removals, and the Principal's report on the attendance, conduct, diligence, and pro-

- gress of pupils, shall be sent at the end of each term or quarter.

 (b.) The Principal of every secondary school or district high school and the Director of every technical high school shall keep record-cards, on the forms provided or approved by the Education Department, showing such information with respect to the course pursued and progress made by each free pupil as may be required; and in the case of transfer from one school to another the free pupil who is entitled to a transfer under these regulations shall be given his record-card duly filled up and signed, and no secondary school, district high school, or technical school shall admit such pupil to a free place until he produces his record-card. A record-card duly completed so as to form a certificate should be given to every pupil who has satisfactorily completed his course as the holder of a junior or senior free place. The pupil's record-card must accompany every application for the transfer of a free place under the first proviso to clause 15 (i), or for the extension of a junior free place under clauses 5 (i) or 16 (ii), or for the granting of a senior free place under clause 7 (c), or for the granting of a leaving certificate under the regulations relating to certificates of secondary
- 21. Free railway tickets will be granted, in terms of the Railway Regulations relating to Free School Season Tickets, to holders of junior or senior free places.

FREE PLACES AT TECHNICAL CLASSES OTHER THAN CLASSES AT TECHNICAL HIGH SCHOOLS.

22. A free place under the conditions specified in the following clauses is tenable at technical classes other than classes at technical high schools.

Junior Free Places.

23. Subject to these regulations a pupil shall be qualified to hold a junior free place at such classes if-

(a.) He has qualified for a Junior National Scholarship on such pass conditions as the Minister may from time to time determine;

(b.) He has obtained a certificate of proficiency or an equivalent or higher qualification; or if

(c.) Being over fourteen years of age, and having been in regular attendance at a public school up to a date not more than six months prior to the date of admission to a free place, he is recommended therefor by an Inspector of Schools: Provided

that the elapse of a longer period than six months shall not be held to be a bar in cases where the Director of Education is satisfied that the pupil was unable sooner to attend a technical school or class: Provided further that such free place shall be tenable only subject to the conditions hereinafter

For the purposes of this clause a certificate of competency in the subjects of the Sixth Standard, with special merit in handwork or elementary science shall be deemed to be equivalent to a certificate of proficiency.

24. (a.) A junior free place held under paragraphs (a) or (b) of the previous clause is tenable if the conditions relating thereto are complied with for two continuous years from the 1st January preceding the actual

date of admission as a free pupil.

(b.) A junior free place held under paragraph (c) of the previous clause is tenable if the conditions relating thereto are complied with for one year from the 1st January preceding the date of admission as a free pupil; but the period may be extended for a second year, and again for a third year, by the Director of Education on the recommendation of the school authorities, based on the school records and on the results of an examination in the subjects included in the pupil's course.

25. Every pupil admitted to a junior free place shall receive in each

year and at approved classes regular and appropriate instruction in-

(a.) English, or, as an alternative in the case of pupils qualified under paragraphs (a) or (b) of clause 23 hereof, commercial English, including in either case the study of one or more selected standard works; reading; composition; and handwriting.

(b.) Arithmetic, or elementary mathematics, or practical mathematics, or, as an alternative in the case of pupils qualified under (a)

or (b), commercial arithmetic.

(c.) In the case of pupils qualified under (a) or (b) one or more of the subjects of technical instruction; in the case of pupils qualified under (c), one or more subjects bearing directly on a trade or industry, including agriculture and kindred subjects, or on domestic occupations, provided that pupils qualified under (c) shall not be admitted to classes for commercial subjects.

The pupil must receive the instruction referred to in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of this clause for not less than sixty hours a year, provided that not less than twenty hours a year must be given to any subject taken up.

Senior Free Places.

26. Subject to these regulations-

(a.) A pupil shall be qualified to hold a senior free place at such classes if he has passed the Matriculation Examination, or the Public Service Entrance Examination, or the Intermediate Examination, or has qualified for a pass in the examination for Senior National Scholarships or for any other scholarship that the Minister may approve for this purpose.

(b.) A senior free place may also be awarded by the Director of Education, on the recommendation of the Director of the technical school or classes attended, based on the school records and on the results of the examination held by the school at the end of the school year in the subjects included in the pupil's course, to any pupil who has satisfactorily completed during the two years immediately preceding not less than 120 hours'

instruction.

27. A senior free place is tenable, if the conditions relating thereto are complied with, for three continuous years from the 1st January preceding the actual date of admission as a free pupil, but if special merit is shown the tenure of the free place may be extended for a fourth year on the recommendation of the Director of the technical school or classes. Every pupil admitted to a senior free place must attend in each year approved classes in two or more related subjects of technical instruction for not less than sixty hours a year, provided that not less than twenty hours a year must be given to any subject taken up. The instruction must be of a more advanced character than that given to junior free pupils.

General.

28. The provisions of clauses 11 to 21 inclusive of these regulations shall, mutatis mutandis, apply to the tenure of free places held under clauses 23 and 26 hereof.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS FOR TRAINING COLLEGES.

CLAUSE 11 of the said regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting therefor the following:—

- "(2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division A shall be at the rate of £105 a year for a male and £100 for a female student, together with the fees of the university college classes attended by the student with the approval of the Principal. The allowances under this subclause are subject to a reduction of £12 under the Public Expenditure Adjustment Act, and may be further reduced after 1st January, 1923.
- "(3.) In the case of a student who is obliged to live away from home or his usual place of residence in order to attend the training college there shall be paid to the Board controlling the college an allowance of £30 per annum, and the Board may at its discretion, either
 - "(a.) Provide board and residence in a hostel under its control at a charge to the student of not more than £25 per annum in addition to the £30 boarding-allowance; or
 - "(b.) Pay to the student the boarding-allowance of £30 per annum, provided that the place of board and residence is approved by the Board on the recommendation of the Principal.
- "(4.) In the case of a student who lives at home but is obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way in order to attend the training college there may be paid the actual cost of travelling (not exceeding £10 per annum)."

Clause 12 of the said regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting therefor the following:—

"(2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division B shall be those set out in subclauses (2), (3), and (4) of subclause (11) hereof for a student in Division A, except that the allowance provided in subclause (2) shall be £85 for a male and £80 for a female student.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

Nobel Peace Prize.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1923, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the 1st of February, 1923.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) members of Parliament and members of Government of the different States, as well as members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) members and associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) university professors of political science and of law, of history, and of philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, par. 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to par. 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket - picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

The following are the regulations referred to:-

SOUTHLAND RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Southland Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 24th day of January, 1919, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of Invercargill, and known as the Southland Researches, while the said reco and known as the Southland Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of

the same being published in the New Zealand Gazette.
2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) Bookmakers' exents.

makers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful wisible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation

The foregoing regulations of the Southland Racing Club were made and passed by such club on the 24th day of November, 1922, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.

RESOLUTION.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

(a) Bookmakers.
(b) Bookmakers derks, bookmakers assistants, and book-

makers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful wisible means of support.

visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of housebreak-(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of housebreaking or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that

appointed by the New Zealand Racing Comercite, upon temps satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such presention.
