In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that

behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations and fix the charges set forth in the Schedule hereto with respect to telephone toll com-munications, and doth order and declare that any regulations and charges of similar purport heretofore made are hereby revoked; and doth further order and declare that the regula-tions and charges hereby made and fixed shall come into force on and after the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three.

SCHEDULE.

TOLL COMMUNICATIONS.

A TOLL line is any departmental line (as distinct from a subscriber's line) connecting two places or exchanges, for the use of which a charge is made. A toll communication is a

communication over a toll line.

2. A "telephone bureau" means any ordinary telegraph or telephone office which is mentioned as a bureau in the list of telegraph-offices published in the Post and Telegraph Guide for the time being, as well as any such bureau specifically

3. Any one person may use the wire for six minutes only at a time—that is to say, if another person requires the wire, at the end of six minutes it shall be given up. Should the wire not be asked for, then the person using it may continue

to do so at tariff rate.

4. Urgent toll communications at any time shall be charged double the fees shown under the heading 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. They take precedence of all others. The special rates applicable to ordinary communications between 9 p.m. and 8 a.m. shall not apply to urgent communications, and shall apply only at telephone exchanges which are open at any time between those hours.

5. On Sundays and holidays ordinary rates shall be charged.6. The charges for the use of toll lines shall be as

follows:-

From 8 a.m. to 9 p.m.,-Up to three minutes—
For distances up to 20 miles
For every additional 5 miles or fraction thereof
up to 100 miles s. d. up to 100 miles 0 1

For every additional 10 miles or fraction thereof
exceeding 100 miles 0 2

From 9 p.m. to midnight and from 6 a.m. to 8 a.m. at exchanges which are open at any time between those hours,—
Up to three minutes— s. d.
For distances up to 40 miles . . . 0 4

For every additional 5 miles or fraction thereof
up to 100 miles 0 0½

For every additional 10 miles or fraction thereof
exceeding 100 miles 0 1

From midnight to 6 a.m.,—
Up to six minutes— 0 0 4

For every additional 10 miles or fraction thereof exceeding 100 miles 0 1

For every additional minute exceeding 3 between 6 a.m.

For every additional minute exceeding 3 between 6 a.m. and midnight, and for every additional minute exceeding 6 between midnight and 6 a.m., the charge shall be one-third of the initial rate. All fractions of a penny shall be counted when calculating the charge for a communication, but fractions smaller than a halfpenny shall be disregarded in the total.

7. When a request to the effect that any person is required to attend at a telephone bureau is sent to such bureau for delivery beyond the premises in which the bureau is situated, 3d. shall be charged for delivery. This charge shall be paid by the sender. Similar requests delivered outside the ordinary delivery limits shall be subject to a special charge according to the extra expense thereby incurred. The delivery of any message either written or spoken other than a request for attendance at a bureau is prohibited. Such a message shall be accepted only as a telegram.

8. A charge of one-third of the initial rate for the length of line engaged, with a minimum of 4d. for every ordinary

of line engaged, with a minimum of 4d. for every ordinary communication, and 8d. for every urgent communication,

communication, and 8d. for every urgent communication, shall be made for the following unsuccessful toll calls:—

(a.) Those that are not completed owing to absence, inattention, or other failure to reply on the part of the subscriber with whom it is desired to communicate.

(b.) Those that are not completed owing to the person with whom it is desired to communicate not being a subscriber, provided the line has been used to obtain that information.

(c.) When a request for a toll line has been made, and the subscriber making such request fails to make use of the line or to cancel his request before the line becomes available.

(d.) When a subscriber has been informed that a telephone

(d.) When a subscriber has been informed that a telephone bureau or a telephone exchange is closed, and he makes a request, either before or after the hours fixed for business at that office, that an attempt be made to secure its attention, and such attempt proves abortive.

In computing the charge fractions of a halfpenny shall be disregarded in the total.

9. Any subscriber may have inserted in his toll account the name of the person making each outward toll communica-tion, or the number of the called subscriber, provided that he makes written application and agrees to pay an extra charge of 3d. on each communication.

10. The Department will not undertake to refuse toll communications from any subscriber's telephone, or to restrict in any way the hours, while the exchange is open, during which applications for communications will be received.

11. A statement of account certified by a responsible officer of the Department as being correct shall be accepted as prima facie evidence of the toll calls made from any subscriber's telephone.

12. If payment of the charge for a toll communication is not made within seven days after demand the Minister of Telegraphs may refuse an exchange subscriber any further toll communication until the outstanding charge has been paid, communication until the outstanding charge has been paid, and if the account is not paid within one month after demand, the connection with the exchange may be discontinued, without prejudice to any proceedings for the recovery of any moneys then due, or otherwise.

13. Any person making a request for a toll communication from a public bureau shall be required to deposit an amount equal to the charge for a three-minute connection over the

equal to the charge for a three-minute connection over the line on which it is desired to communicate.

14. Owners of private telephone lines led into a bureau may use the departmental lines when available for speaking purposes through such bureau. The charges for this service shall be the same as those payable for toll communications, the distance being calculated from the telephone bureau.

15. Any communication from a telephone bureau or post-office over a private telephone line connected with such office shall be charged for as a toll communication.

16. All toll communications on official business from officers

16. All toll communications on official business from officers

- 16. All toll communications on official business from officers of other Government Departments, or from postal officers on behalf of other Departments, shall be paid for.

 17. Provided the attention of the offices concerned can be gained, toll communications may be arranged after the ordinary hours of attendance on week-days or Sundays on payment of a reopening fee of 1s. if the Postmaster is resident on the premises, or 2s. 6d. if not resident on the premises. In addition, if the attendance of any officer is required beyond a period of half an hour, such attendance shall be paid for at the rate of overtime fixed by the Department's regulations.
- 18. The applicant for a toll communication over a telegraph 18. The applicant for a toll communication over a telegraph circuit shall in all cases make his own arrangements for the attendance of the person with whom he desires to communicate, and any permission required by telegraph for the joining-through of any circuit which may be required to effect the connection shall be obtained by a reply-paid telegram. The service shall be available on Sundays and at other times approved by the Minister, usually between midnight and 8 a.m., when the telegraph circuits are not in use for ordinary purposes. The charges for such communications shall be those prescribed for the use of toll lines, together with any additional charges for reopening offices or overtime incurred, as prescribed in regulation 17 hereof for any special attendance required at the office of origin or destination, or at any interrequired at the office of origin or destination, or at any intermediate office.

3. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof; profor a period of forty-two years from the date hereof; provided that should an electric-power district be constituted under the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, including the said City of Nelson, the Electric-power Board shall have the right to purchase and take over the licensee's installation in the said city at a valuation to be agreed upon between the said Board and the licensee, and failing such agreement, at a valuation to be fixed by a single arbitrator to be appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1908, and thereupon the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license. A minimum charge not exceeding 5s. per month, including meter rent (if any) may be collected, if required, by the licensee, and such minimum charge shall be printed on the licensee's conditions of supply to consumers.

The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the maintenance of such wharf, which are shown on the plan marked M.D. 3273, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit there-from, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary

lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

4. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, the Council shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such

repairs to be made, as the case may be.
5. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

6. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in

6. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the twentieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by comand privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council.

9. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

10. In case the Council shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them: or
(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for the purposes

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the said Act that before any Order in Council is issued authorizing the said Minister to construct any water-race or water-supply works the owners or occupiers of all the lands likely to be benefited thereby shall be given an opportunity to enter into contracts with His Majesty to take water from such works when completed; and such contracts shall specify the quantity of water to be so taken, and the price or rent to be paid for the same:

And whereas it is also provided by section five of the said Act that if at least one-half of the total number of those owners or occupiers enter into contracts to take such quantity of water as the Governor-General thinks reasonable, at such

of water as the Governor-General thinks reasonable, at such a price or rate as the Governor-General may approve, an Order in Council authorizing the construction of the works

And whereas the water-supply works mentioned in the First Schedule hereto are proposed to be constructed out of the funds provided by Parliament:
And whereas at least one-half of the total number of the owners or occupiers of the lands which are likely to be bene-

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council grant to any person or body corporate a license to use water from any fall, river, stream, or other source for the purpose of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, or other uses, and to exercise in respect of that license any of the powers and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section: And whereas it is further provided by the said section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a right at any time or times during the continuance of the license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as are expressed in the license) to enter upon any road, railway, or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the fall, river, stream, or other source aforesaid and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of the license:

And whereas the Hydro-electric Engineering Company (Limited) (hereinafter, with its successors and assigns, referred to as "the licensee"), has applied for a license under the said section to take and use water from the Waikohu River, in the Land District of Hawke's Bay (hereinafter referred to as "the said river"), for the purpose of generating electricity as aforesaid, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of the powers conferred by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee (subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto) a license to take and use from the Waikohu River aforesaid, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding one hundred and sixty cubic feet per second at any one time; and also to erect and maintain electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses within the area of supply hereinafter described; and subject also to the regulations dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette dated the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or substitution therefor (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations"), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein; but nothing herein shall be held to guarantee that the Waikohu River contains sufficient water to supply one hundred and sixty cubic feet per second herein-before mentioned.

SCHEDULE.

1. Plans.

The licensee shall, before the works hereby authorized are commenced, forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

- (a.) Full detailed drawings and specifications of the diverting weir and dam.
- (b.) Drawings showing how and in what manner the water diverted is to be returned to the said river.
- (c.) Contour-plan showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks.

2. Utilization of the Water,

The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be returned to the said river at or near the power-house.

3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the said river at the headworks, situated in Sections I and 3, Block XV, Motu Survey District; as shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 46338, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 46338 hereinbefore referred to.

(a.) Headworks consisting of a dam and necessary intake.
(b.) Tunnel and pipe-line leading from such dam to the power-house hereinafter referred to.
(c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including

(c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.

appliances for generating electricity.

(d.) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown by means of green and blue lines on the said plan.

(e.) Such further transmission and other lines within the area of supply as may from time to time be required within such area of supply, and after compliance with the provisions of clause 48 of the regulations.

5. Inspection of Works.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

6. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

7. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the generating-stations and any of the substations to which this license applies.

8. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

9. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, but subject to clause 16 hereof all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

10. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental at the rate of 4s. per annum per kilowatt of maximum output, as recorded by the wattmeter to be installed by the licensee at the power-house mentioned in clause 4 (c) hereof, payment to be made yearly for the period ending on the 31st day of March in each year, commencing from the day electrical power is first supplied. "Maximum output" means twice the number of units generated in the half-hour during which the number of units generated is a maximum for the year. For this purpose the units generated shall be recorded at the end of each half-hour commencing from noon of each day.

11. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 6d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 3d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes. In the case of wholesale supply the

charge shall not exceed £12 per horse-power per annum. "Wholesale supply" for this purpose shall be held to be a supply in respect to which the consumer shall guarantee to pay not less than £75 per annum.

Provided further that, in the event of a number not less

Provided further that, in the event of a number not less than twenty-five per centum of the consumers at any time representing to the Minister that the licensee is charging for the supply of electrical energy a rate which is returning an excessive profit, after allowing for the creation of a reasonable reserve fund, the Minister shall have power to cause such inquiry and investigation of the licensee's books and accounts as he may deem necessary; and if, after such inquiry and investigation, he is of opinion that unreasonably high profits are being made, having regard to all subly high profits are being made, having regard to all surrounding circumstances and conditions and to the nature of the undertaking, the Governor-General may, on the recommendation of the Minister, from time to time reduce or otherwise amend the rates permitted to be charged to consumers under this license.

12. Area of Supply.

The area of supply comprises the counties of Waikohu, Uawa, and Cook, except the area comprised in the Manga-papa Town District and the Borough of Gisborne, but including all other town districts in such counties; the said area of supply being indicated by a distinctive border coloured yellow on the plan marked P.W.D. 46338, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

13. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (e)

of clause 3 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 11,000 volts between the terminals.

14. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 15 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 22 degrees Fahrenheit.

15. EXPIRY OF LICENSE.—CROWN MAY TAKE OVER WORKS OR ALLOW LICENSEE TO REMOVE BUILDINGS, ETC.

Upon the expiration of the term of the license hereby

Upon the expiration of the term of the license hereby granted, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a.) His Majesty the King may take over and use the whole of the works hereby authorized, including all structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, plant, and land, hereinafter in this clause called the "works," on payment by him to the licensee of the then value of the works. The price to be paid under this clause shall be fixed in the same manner as the price in clause 16 of this license; or

(b.) The Governor-General may, at his option, by Order in Council, grant to the licensee a new license for a further period of forty-two years, subject to such terms, conditions.

in Council, grant to the licensee a new license for a further period of forty-two years, subject to such terms, conditions, and payment of rental as may then be imposed by him; or (c.) If His Majesty the King does not elect to take over the works under subclause (a), or the Governor-General declines to issue a further Order in Council under subclause (b) hereof, the licensee may, within such time and subject to such conditions as the Minister may then impose, remove all structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, and plant erected or installed by the licensee under the powers conferred by this license. If the licensee fails or neglects to effect such removal within the time or subject to the conditions imposed by the Minister, such structures, buildings, equipment, machinery, and plant shall, without payment of any compensation, vest in and become the property of His Majesty the King.

16. CROWN'S PRIOR RIGHT TO PURCHASE WORKS.

Notwithstanding anything hereinafter contained, the right is hereby reserved to His Majesty the King to purchase, at his option, at such price and on such conditions as may be mutually agreed upon (or, failing such mutual agreement, then by arbitration in the manner prescribed by the Arbitration Act, 1908), this license, together with the whole or any part of the business and undertaking of the licensee, so far as the same relates to or is connected with the exercise of this the same relates to or is connected with the exercise of this license, and together with all real and personal property and all rights acquired by the licensee under this license and used or enjoyed in connection therewith. The said right may be exercised by His Majesty the King at any time during the currency of this license, but the said price shall not exceed the original cost of the works (including reasonable preliminary and engineering expenses), less a deduction for depreciation at the rate of 2 per cent. per annum on the original cost on all assets other than land calculated for the period that such assets have been in service, and also a deduction.

tion in consequence of any burdensome provisions respecting the use of the electric works or any easements, rights, or privileges in connection therewith, and shall not include any sum in respect of the value of the goodwill of the licensee's business or undertaking, or in respect of the value of the license for the unexpired period thereof, or in respect of the value of any Crown land held or occupied by the licensee in value of any Crown land held or occupied by the licensee in connection with the undertaking. In addition to the sum to be paid to the licensee under this clause, there shall also be paid by His Majesty the King interest at the rate of £5 per cent. per annum on the actual cost of construction during each of the first four years respectively, commencing from the date when the deposit of £500 referred to in clause 22 hereof has been returned to the licensee. On the completion of the purchase His Majesty the King shall be deemed to be the assignee of this license, and all the rights vested in the licensee by the license shall thereupon vest in His Majesty the King. the King.

17. COMPENSATION PAYABLE FOR LAND INJURIOUSLY AFFECTED, ETC.

In respect of all land injuriously affected, and in respect of all damages done by the exercise of any of the powers or all damages done by the exercise of any of the powers conferred upon the licensee by this license, the licensee shall from time to time, as and when any such injury or damage accrues or happens, pay compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, in the same manner (subject to all necessary modifications) as if such licensee were a local authority and the claim was one for injury or damage arising out of the construction of a public work work.

18. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to cast upon or imply any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

19. Consumers entitled to Supply.

The licensee shall supply and sell to any person, company, or corporate body within the area of supply requiring the same, for any purpose within that area, electricity to the extent to which it may be available; provided that such person, company, or corporate body pays the cost of connecting his or its premises with the transmission-line control by the licensee in preparate of this license. erected by the licensee in pursuance of this license.

20. Interchange of Supply of Electrical Energy.

(a.) In the event of the Minister establishing a hydroelectric power scheme outside the area of supply of a frequency of 50 cycles per second on the three-phase alternating-current system, he may require the licensee to connect that system with the licensee's electrical system in such a manner that an interchange of electrical energy between the two systems may be made from time to time and when required by either the

be made from time to time and when required by either the licensee or the Minister, up to at least one-half of the total capacity of the plant installed at the licensee's power-house.

(b.) The licensee shall erect and maintain in good order, at the expense of the licensee, the necessary transmission-lines between the licensee's power-house and a point on the boundary of the area of supply to be determined by the Minister.

(c.) The Minister shall erect and maintain in good order, at the expense of the Minister, the necessary transmission-lines outside the area of supply for the purpose of connecting the two systems at the point last mentioned in subclause (b) hereof.

(d.) The licensee and the Minister respectively shall, on demand, and from time to time as and when required, supply to each other so much of the surplus electrical energy as is then required and is available, but not in excess of one-half of the capacity of the plant installed in the licensee's power-

(c.) The price to be paid by the licensee or the Minister shall not exceed the following rates:—

(f.) For the purpose of this clause either the licensee or the Minister may have the unit measured in kilovolt-ampere hours instead of kilowatt hours.

21. Deposit.

The deposit of £500 which the licensee has lodged with the Public Trustee as a guarantee of good faith shall be retained as security for the due fulfilment by the licensee of the terms and conditions contained in this license to be performed by him: Provided, however, that when and so soon as the licensee shall have submitted the drawings and specifications required by clause 1 hereof, and those drawings specifications required by clause 1 hereof, and those drawings and specifications have been duly approved, and the licensee shall have constructed permanent works in connection with headworks, dam, pipe-lines, and generating-station mentioned in the said clause to the satisfaction of the Minister, to the value of £1,000 at the least, then the Minister shall require the Public Trustee to return the said deposit to the licensee; but if this license is determined, cancelled, or revoked under the powers herein contained before such works to such value have been constructed, then and in any such case the said sum of £500 shall be forfeited to the Crown as ascertained and liquidated damages.

22. BED OF RIVER NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Crown of the bed of the said river, nor shall the pro-visions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to

23. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced as a contract by and against His said Majesty or the licensee accordingly.

24. Time for Substantial Completion of Works.

The licensee shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of three years from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lock-outs, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the licensee.

25. Granting of other Water-rights.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said river, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said river from the said river.

26. DEFAULT.

If the licensee fails or neglects to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 50 and 51 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

27. Variation in Conditions of License.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, if found necessary and if duly agreed upon between the licensee and the Governor-General in Council, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council, in which case particulars of such alteration or modification shall be endorsed upon this license and signed by the licensee and the Governor-General, whereupon all the terms and conditions in this license contained (save and except as they may have been so altered or modified by such alterations) shall, mutalis mutandis, apply to such alterations as if the latter had formed part of this license as originally issued.

28. Surrender of License.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment of any compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

29. REQUIREMENTS OF THE COOK, UAWA, AND WAIKOHU COUNTY COUNCILS.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any

electric lines within the counties of Cook, Uawa, or Waikohu except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the local authority of the district affected.
