 During the period from the date of this Order in Council until the 30th day of April, 1923, sea fishermen duly licensed by the Marine Department under the provisions of section 6 of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and the regulations made there-under, may fish for and take salmon from the sea outside a radius of 500 yards from the mouth or entrance of any river, and dispose of the same by sale.
 Such anglers and fishermen shall, on or before the 21st day of May, 1923, forward to the Secretary, Marine Department, Wellington, a return, in such form as may be prescribed, of all salmon taken under the authority of these regulations.

 (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (a) Common products, and provide the persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
 (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
 Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at
