Authorizing the Minister of Public Works to construct and maintain Water-supply Works in the Teviot Irrigation District.

JELLICOE, Governor-General.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 25th day of June, 1923.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General may, if he thinks fit, by Order in Council, authorize the Minister of Public Works to construct, maintain, or control any water-race or water-supply works, either within or outside a mining district, which are proposed to be constructed or which have been constructed out of funds provided by Parliament :

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the said Act that before any Order in Council is issued authorizing the said Minister to construct any water-race or water-supply works the owners or occupiers of all the lands likely to be benefited thereby shall be given an opportunity to enter into contracts with His Majesty to take water from such works when completed; and such contracts shall specify the quantity of water to be so taken, and the price or rate to be paid for same :

And whereas it is also provided by section five of the said Act that if at least one-half of the total number of those owners or occupiers enter into contracts to take such quantity of water as the Governor-General thinks reasonable, at such a price or rate as the Governor-General may approve, an Order in Council authorizing the construction of the works may be issued :

And whereas the water-supply works mentioned in the First Schedule hereto are proposed to be constructed out of the funds provided by Parliament :

Amending and making New Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces.

JELLICOE, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and do also hereby make new regulations in accordance with the Schedule hereto; and I do hereby declare that such amendments shall take effect and new regulations come into force as from the date of the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

FINANCIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND ALLOWANCE REGULATIONS FOR THE NEW ZEALAND MILITARY FORCES.

PARAGRAPH 43 is hereby amended by deleting the words "by the G.O.C."

Paragraph 56 is hereby amended by adding at the end of the paragraph "If the circumstances warrant it the G.O.C. may approve payment at full or half the daily rate for such further periods as he may consider necessary."

Paragraph 70 is hereby amended by the addition after the word "by-laws" of "Cab or taxi hire is not admissible unless it is certified that the officer was accompanied by military or other personal gear which could not be carried."

Paragraph 75 is hereby amended to read as follows:—

"When travelling on the public service all officers shall be entitled to sleeping-berths on trains, and, in the case of those holding the following appointments, to deck-berths on steamers also,—

- General Officers.
- Chief of the Staff.
- Staff Officers in charge 'G,' 'A,' and 'Q.'
- Director of Artillery.
- Director of Ordnance Services.
- Director of Financial Services.
- Director of Medical Services.
- Officers at Command Headquarters—
- O.C. Commands.
- Chief Staff Officers."

Paragraph 90 is hereby amended by deleting "O.C. Commands will requisition for all bicycles to Headquarters, Wellington"; and by adding at the end of the paragraph "The above allowance shall be paid only to the officer, warrant or non-commissioned officer, actually in possession of the bicycle, and shall be claimed annually in arrears, or for such less time as the bicycle was in actual use."

Paragraph 95 is hereby amended by altering the rate for motor-bicycles to read "3d.," and by substituting "G.O.C." for "G.O. in charge Administration."

Paragraph 114 is hereby amended by deleting "They shall not draw camp or field allowance."

Paragraphs 55, 57, 82 (b), 93, 203, and 214 are hereby amended by substituting "G.O.C." for "G.O. i/c A."

Paragraphs 62, 106, 125, 155, and 209 are hereby amended by deleting "or G.O. i/c A."

The following new regulations are hereby made:—

51A. All members of the R.N.Z.A. and N.Z. Permanent Staff who are actually employed to instruct in physical training will each be granted an allowance of £1. 5s. per

annum in lieu of the issue from Ordnance Stores of one pair of rubber shoes and one white jersey.

This allowance will be made only to Instructors actually employed upon such duties, and the mere fact that an Instructor is qualified as such does not entitle him to the allowance unless he is actively employed in connection with physical-training duties. A certificate to this effect by the O.C. Detachment or Area Officer must accompany each claim.

The amount is payable in advance as from the 1st April in each year.

67A. For any portion of a day the rate shall be one twenty-fourth of the full daily rate for each hour's absence, provided the whole period of absence from Headquarters exceeds twenty-four hours.

In computing the time of absence, a fraction of an hour, if less than half an hour, shall not be taken into account, but half an hour or more shall be reckoned as one hour.

Whenever the G.O.C. is satisfied that any lesser travelling-allowance than the scale rate should suffice, he may act accordingly.

REGIMENTAL BANDS GRANT.

177A. An annual grant of £75 will be made towards the upkeep of all approved regimental bands other than bugle, drum and fife, or pipe bands. Where a doubt exists as to the eligibility of any particular band to draw this grant the matter must be submitted to General Headquarters for decision.

Payment will be made annually in advance on the 1st April in each year.

The provisions of regulations 161 and 164 to 177 will be adhered to in so far as they are applicable.

233. A Paymaster or any member of the A.P.C. will not take charge of any regimental or other funds not belonging to the public, nor shall he act on the committee controlling the expenditure of the same.

WHEREAS by the three-hundred-and-twenty-first section of the Land Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time, either by general or particular description, and whether the same has been surveyed or not, reserve from sale temporarily, notwithstanding that the same may be then held under pastoral license, any Crown lands which in his opinion are required for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned:

And whereas by the three-hundred-and-twenty-second section of the said Act it is provided that land temporarily reserved under the said three-hundred-and-twenty-first section may, at the expiration of one month but not later than six months after the publication in the Gazette of notice of such temporary reservation, be permanently reserved, and that notice of such permanent reservation shall be published in the Gazette:

And whereas by the sixty-ninth section of the Land for Settlements Act, 1908, it is further provided that the Governor-General may from time to time, as he thinks fit, set aside reserves for any specified public purpose out of lands acquired under the last-mentioned Act, provided that no land so acquired shall be set aside for endowments:

And whereas the lands specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto were, by the Warrants the dates of which are specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and the notifications of which were published in the Gazette specified in the fourth column, temporarily reserved under the authority of the said Acts for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the said Acts, do hereby permanently reserve the lands so temporarily reserved as aforesaid, and enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto, for the purposes specified in the second column of the said Schedule, being the same purposes for which the said lands were so temporarily reserved as aforesaid.

Notice of Exchange of Reserve for Land of Equal Value pursuant to Section 6 of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908.

JELlicoe, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by section six of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), the Governor-General is empowered, in the case of any public reserve vested in His Majesty or the Governor-General for any of the purposes comprised in Class II in the Second Schedule to the said Act, to exchange any of the land comprised in such reserve to be dedicated to one or more of the purposes comprised in the said Class II:

And whereas the land described in Part I of the Schedule hereto was duly set apart for a site for an explosives magazine, being a purpose within Class II in the Second Schedule to the said Act, and it is expedient that the said land should be exchanged for the Crown land of equal value described in Part II of the Schedule hereto, and that the land last referred to should be dedicated for a site for an explosives magazine:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section six of the said Act as aforesaid, declare that the land described in Part I of the Schedule hereto is hereby exchanged for the land of equal value described in Part II of the Schedule hereto; and, further, that the land described in Part II of the Schedule hereto is hereby dedicated for a site for an explosives magazine (being a purpose comprised in Class II of the Second Schedule of the Act). 1. EVERY application for a license to use water for power purposes, under section 5 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, shall be made in writing to the Minister of Public Works, at Wellington, and the applicant shall, when required, supply the Minister with the following particulars:—

- (1.) In the case of a company—
 - (a.) Evidence to the satisfaction of the Minister that the company is duly incorporated and registered.
 - (b.) A copy of the company's memorandum of association and rules.
- (2.) In every case—
 - (c.) A lithograph or sketch-plan, to a suitable scale, showing the position of the headworks, the proposed water-race or pipe-line, or both, the position of the generating-station and the tail-race, and the approximate boundaries of the area of land, if any, to be flooded.
 - (d.) A statement of the quantity of water to be taken, and the difference in level between the water and the headworks and in the tail-race; a description of the electrical system to be adopted—that is

to say, whether direct current or alternating current, and if the latter the number of phases and periodicity, and in either case the pressure of generation, transmission, and supply.

(e.) A statement of the extent of the electric power proposed to be developed in the initial installation, and to be provided for in future extensions, and the use intended to be made of it.

(f.) A plan in triplicate to a suitable scale, but in any case not less than 1 in. to the mile, showing the area of supply, the site of the power-house and substations, the routes proposed for the initial transmission-lines, indicating all roads, railways, rivers, post and telegraph lines, and other electric lines, and also private and Crown lands proposed to be crossed or traversed.

(g.) A statement of the time to elapse between the date of the license and the complete initial installation and construction of all the hydraulic and electrical plant and works specified in the application.

(h.) Any further or other information which the Minister may require.

2. (a.) In all cases where the applicant is not a local authority, or if a local authority desires to operate beyond its own boundaries, the consent in writing of the local authority concerned must be obtained and forwarded with the application.

(b.) In cases where an Electric-power Board has been established under the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, the written consent of the Power Board must be obtained and forwarded with the application if it is proposed to sell electricity to consumers other than the licensee.

3. The Minister may require all or any of the aforesaid particulars to be verified on oath, and the application may be refused if, in his opinion, any of the particulars are unsatisfactory, or the quantity of water applied for is excessive or the proposed use is improper.

4. If the Minister thinks the application should be further considered, he shall appoint a commission of inquiry for this purpose, whereupon the following provisions shall apply:—

(a.) The Commissioner shall require a minute of the application to be advertised, at the cost of the applicant, in such form and in such newspaper as he thinks fit, having regard to the nature and extent of the works, the route proposed for transmission, and the interests likely to be affected.

(b.) The minute shall call on all persons having any objection to the proposed works to give notice thereof to the Commissioner, and also to serve a copy thereof on the applicant, within such time before the day of hearing as the Commissioner prescribes.

CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

5. The license when issued shall be in such form and shall contain such conditions and provisions as the Governor-General in Council thinks fit, including conditions and provisions for the following purposes:—

- (a.) A limitation as to time within which the powers conferred by the license shall be exercised, and a limitation as to the time within which the complete initial plant as authorized shall be installed.
- (b.) Power for inspection by the Minister and such officers as he appoints for that purpose, both during and after construction of all works, so as to ensure the provisions of the license being given due effect to, and the law as regards safety of life and property being duly observed.
- (c.) Power to the Governor-General in Council to impose fines, or suspend or cancel the license, for breach of any of its conditions.
- (d.) A statement of the time during which the license is to be current, and whether or not any renewal of the same can be obtained, and on what terms.
- (e.) A yearly rental charge of 1s. per kilowatt of maximum output generated during each and every year in the case of local authorities or Electric-power Boards, with a minimum charge of £10 per year; and in all other cases at the rate of 4s. per kilowatt of maximum output generated during each and every year, with a minimum charge of 5s. per year. The output shall be measured by means of a wattmeter when available, otherwise it shall be determined on the maximum capacity of the generator or generators installed.
- (f.) A schedule of maximum charges that may be made by the licensee for the sale or supply of electricity.
- (g.) Power to the Governor-General in Council to forfeit, without payment of any compensation, any water delivered at the headworks or dam in excess of the quantity which the turbines installed are capable of utilizing.
- (h.) Requiring the licensee to submit for the Minister's approval, before the works are commenced, detail plans of the dam, pipe-line, and headworks.
- (i.) For all or any of the purposes prescribed by the Regulations under section 2 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, published in *Gazette* No. 73, of 12th October, 1922.

6. Before the issue of a license the licensee shall deposit with the Public Trustee a sum of £1 per kilowatt for every kilowatt authorized to be used, but not exceeding a maximum deposit of £500. Such deposit shall be retained by the Public Trustee, without payment of interest, until the licensee produces a certificate under the hand of an officer appointed by the Minister to the effect that the licensee has duly and properly constructed and installed on the premises the whole of the hydraulic and electrical installations authorized by the license.

7. In order to standardize the conditions as far as possible throughout the Dominion, it is suggested that when convenient the three-phase four-wire system be adopted for distribution at a frequency of 50 cycles per second, and a voltage of 230 between each phase and a neutral for lighting purposes and small motors, and 400 volts between phases for supply to large motors.
