EASTERN TIDE-DEFLECTOR.—LIGHTS ESTABLISHED.— On and after 30th July, 1923, the following fixed lights will be exhibited from the outer end of the Eastern Tide-deflector : Red, orange, red, vertically disposed 5 ft. apart, the lower light being 10 ft. above H.W. (2.) TAKAPUNA BEACH.—CABLE HUT AND BEACONS ERECTED. -A white painted concrete hut, immediately in front of which is a triangular beacon on which is painted "CABLE" in large letters, has been erected on the southern corner of "The Strand," Takapuna Beach. From the foregoing triangular beacon two other double-triangle beacons have been erected, one being situated 037° distant 300 ft., the other being situated 106° distant 378 ft. The distance separating the two double-triangle beacons is 391 ft. in a northerly and southerly direction.
