Change of Name of Locality "Buckley" to "Tolaga."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS settlers in the locality known as "Buckley," in the County of Uawa, desire that the name of such locality should be changed to "Tolaga," and it is considered expedient to alter the same:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality known as "Buckley" in the County of Uawa shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Tolaga," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

Good road access from either Clyde (three miles) or Alexandra (three miles). School and post-office at Clyde or Alexandra.

Sections 131 to 138 level; good soil.

Sections 139 to 143 level land, but more or less subject to drifting sand during heavy windstorms.

Sections 124 to 130 have each a narrow level frontage to the Clyde-Alexandra Road, but rise quickly to a fairly high terrace, on which the greater parts of areas lie; soil very light, on coarse gravel subsoil.

All sections commanded by Chatto Creek Irrigation Race.

3. Water for irrigation when available will be supplied by the Crown, and it will be a condition of each lease that the selector shall take the full quantity of water supplied at the price charged by the Crown.

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1920, as amended by section five of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1922, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation approved in Executive Council, declare that any national-endowment land within the Hauraki Mining District held under a renewable lease issued under the Land Act, 1908, or held under a license issued under regulations made under the Land Act, 1892, or the corresponding regulations made under the Land Act, 1908, for the occupation of pastoral lands within the said mining district, shall cease to be national-endowment land:

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section twenty-five of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare stoats and weasels to be natural enemies of the rabbit, and prohibit the killing or capturing of such animals without a special permit signed by an Inspector under the said Act.

Protection of Natural Enemy of the Rabbit.—Notice No. Ag. 2290.

Wellington, 24th August, 1923.

WITH respect to the Order in Council dated 20th August, 1923, declaring stoats and weasels to be natural enemies of the rabbit throughout the Dominion, it is hereby notified, for public information, that—

(1.) In districts which are free from rabbits consideration will be given to the granting of an exemption from the general protection upon receipt of a petition in that behalf made by any local authority or acclimatization society in accordance with the provisions of section 25 of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1908; and

(2.) Inspectors of Stock have been authorized to issue permits for the destruction of stoats and weasels on—

- (a.) Island sanctuaries;
- (b.) Acclimatization societies' game-rearing farms; and
- (c.) Poultry-farms where it is established that damage is being done on such farms by these animals.

Notice of Change of the Purpose of Portion of a Reserve in the Borough of Ashburton, Canterbury Land District.

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto forms portion of a reserve duly set apart for railway-conservation purposes, being a purpose within Class II of the Second Schedule to the said Act, and it is expedient to change, as hereinafter provided, the purpose of such portion :

NOTE.—The weather during the month has been dull and showery, with moderate to strong southerly winds prevailing. Precipitation was 34 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine 96 hours 32 minutes, 33 per cent. of the possible, and six sunless days. Hail fell on the 5th, 23rd, and 28th, fog occurred on the 17th, while frost was recorded on the grass on eleven mornings. Mean earth-temperature at 1 ft. was 45.5°, and 49.1° at 3 ft. Mean dew-point, 40.9°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0.256 in.; and mean relative humidity, 79 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1923.

July was characterized by cold, dull, and damp weather, although the total rainfall was below the average over the greater part of the Dominion. An excess was experienced only at a few places in the northern and east coast districts of the North Island, and in North Canterbury in the South.

A westerly depression between the 1st and 6th accounted for heavy and widespread falls of snow in the highlands of the South Island.

From the 7th to the 9th anticyclonic conditions and fair weather prevailed, and this was the only period during which such conditions were general. The remainder of the month was very dull, misty, and showery, but heavy rain fell on the 14th and 15th in the northern and east coast districts of the North Island, owing to the passage of a cyclone centred northward of New Zealand.

The barometer rose very high towards the close of the month, but the weather, though fine over most of the country continued cold and showery with strong south-easterly winds in the east coast districts. This was accounted for by a disturbance which persisted in the neighbourhood of the Chatham Islands on the edge of the anticyclone.

*Proclamation by Commonwealth of Australia regarding Importation of Animals.—Notice No. Ag. 2286.*Department of Agriculture,
Wellington, 23rd August, 1923.

THE following copy of an extract from the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* of 26th July, 1923, regarding the modification of the Proclamation prohibiting, subject to certain limitations and conditions or restrictions, the importation of animals into the Commonwealth is published for general information.

PROCLAMATION.

Australia to wit.
FORSTER,
Governor-General.

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Quarantine Act 1908-1920*, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia of any animals or plants or any parts of animals or plants and that the

power of prohibition shall extend to authorize prohibition generally or with limitations as to place and subject-matter and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

And whereas by Proclamation published in the *Gazette of* 23rd December, 1915 (*Quarantine Proclamation No. 1*); 24th April, 1919 (*Quarantine Proclamation No. 45*); 8th June, 1922 (*Quarantine Proclamation No. 96*); 8th March, 1923 (*Quarantine Proclamation No. 107*); 22nd March, 1923 (*Quarantine Proclamation No. 108*), the importation of animals into Australia was prohibited subject to certain limitations and conditions or restrictions:

And whereas it is desirable to modify and consolidate the said Proclamations:

Now therefore I, *Henry William, Baron Forster*, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby repeal all portions of the said Proclamation of 23rd December, 1915 (*Quarantine Proclamation No. 1*) not previously repealed, and the remainder of the said Proclamations, and I do hereby prohibit the importation into Australia from any part of the world of all animals except—

- (1.) Horses and mules from—
New Zealand ;
The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (ports of shipment to be only London, Liverpool, Hull, Newport, Glasgow, Dublin, and Cork) ;
The United States of America (ports of shipment to be only New York and San Francisco) ;
The Dominion of Canada (ports of shipment to be only Vancouver and Montreal).
- (2.) Asses from—
New Zealand ;
The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (ports of shipment to be only London, Liverpool, Hull, Newport, Glasgow, Dublin, and Cork) ;
The United States of America (ports of shipment to be only New York and San Francisco) ;
The Dominion of Canada (ports of shipment to be only Vancouver and Montreal) ;
France (port of shipment to be only Marseilles) ;
Spain (ports of shipment to be only Algeciras and Barcelona) ;
Portugal (port of shipment to be only Lisbon).
NOTE.—In the case of importations from Spain and Portugal the permission of the Minister for Health must first be obtained.
- (3.) Cattle from—
New Zealand ;
The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (ports of shipment to be only London, Liverpool, Hull, Newport, Glasgow, Dublin, and Cork) ;
The Dominion of Canada (ports of shipment to be only Vancouver and Montreal) ;
The United States of America (ports of shipment to be only New York and San Francisco).
- (4.) Sheep, swine, and goats from—
New Zealand ;
The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (ports of shipment to be only London, Liverpool, Hull, Newport, Glasgow, Dublin, and Cork).
- (5.) Dogs from—
New Zealand ;
Great Britain and Ireland.
- (6.) Cats from
New Zealand ;
The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.
- (7.) Wild or undomesticated animals for exhibition in public zoological gardens or in approved circuses, or for scientific purposes only.
- (8.) Birds : Provided—
(a.) That the admission of animals permitted by Proclamation to be imported into Australia shall be subject to certificates and declarations being furnished in accordance with the Quarantine Regulations ;
(b.) That no cattle, sheep, swine, or goats from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland shall be admitted into Australia if they have, within six months of the date of shipment, been kept pastured or housed upon, or passed on foot through, any area within 15 miles of any place where foot and mouth disease has occurred during the preceding six months ;
(c.) That no cattle from the United States of America shall be imported into Australia unless, in addition to the declarations and certifications required by the Quarantine Regulations, they are accompanied by a certificate from a responsible Government veterinary officer to the effect that the animals have not, within six months of the date of shipment, been kept pastured or housed upon, or passed on foot through, any area within 15 miles of any place where foot and mouth disease has occurred during the preceding six months ;
(d.) That, in order to prevent the introduction into Australia of *Hypoderma Bovis*, no cattle shall be imported into Australia from Great Britain, Ireland, the United States of America, or the Dominion of Canada, except those shipped during the months of December, January, February, March, April, and May : Provided further, that cattle shipped in May shall be subject to quarantine surveillance after the expiry of the quarantine period for such time as the Chief Quarantine Officer of the State into which they are imported may direct ;
(e.) That no fowls shall be imported into the Northern Territory of Australia from Asia or the East Indies ;
(f.) That venomous reptiles may be imported only by the managing authorities of zoological societies for exhibition in public zoological gardens only ;
(g.) That the Minister may permit the importation of dogs for scientific or public exhibition purposes subject to any conditions which he may think fit to impose ;

- (h.) That the Minister may permit the importation into Australia of domesticated animals by the Chief Quarantine Officer of the State into which it is desired to import them, subject to permission being given by him prior to the departure of the animals from the port of shipment, and to any further conditions which he may think fit to impose.

This Proclamation may be cited as Quarantine Proclamation No. 114.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Okuru Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse situated in the district of Westland, and known as the Mussel Point Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Masterton Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 1st day of February, 1919, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Opaki Racecourse situated in the district of Masterton, and known as the Opaki Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

Provided always that the Stipendiary Stewards' Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

MILITARY PHYSICAL ORTHOPÆDICS. PART I. GUNSHOT WOUND OF NERVE. ARTHUR STANLEY HERBERT, M.D., B.S., Lieut.-Col., N.Z.M.C. Pp. 136, with 62 figures. Price, 6s.; postage, 6d. extra.

This volume deals exclusively with the consideration of the later results of gunshot wound of nerve trunks and their treatment. It is practically a record of personal experience, as the work was done remote from other orthopaedic hospitals. The grouping is in terms of convenience of treatment rather than of anatomy, and deals with the physical as distinguished from the surgical side of orthopaedics. Emphasis is laid on the importance of promoting the voluntary action of partly paralysed muscles by the provision of artificial muscles, and thus rendering the results obtained by massage, electricity, baths, douches, &c., accessory rather than indispensable. It is claimed this method is simpler, less expensive, and more humane, as it removes the patient from the category of invalids to that of fairly useful workers. Great ingenuity has been exercised in devising the different mechanical supports of special splints and rubber muscles for the paralysed muscle, the use of rubber as an active elastic force being particularly utilized, and indeed is the basic idea underlying the whole system of treatment here advocated. The book is copiously illustrated by good figures, which add considerably to its value; the apparatus itself is characterized by its simplicity, and has stood the test of actual use in a large number of cases.
