6. At the hearing of the appeal the appellant may himself appear or may be represented by some other person on his behalf, and the Masseurs Registration Board may be represented by any member thereof appointed by that Board, or by some other person appointed by that Board; but no solicitor or counsel shall appear or be heard.

7. The order made in respect of the appeal shall be in writing, signed by the Magistrate and the assessors, and a copy of such order shall be given to the appellant and to the Masseurs Registration Board; and that Board shall at once give effect to such order.

2. Not later than seven days after the service of such notice on an owner of land all trapping on his land shall cease, and thereafter for a period of three months from the date of service of the notice the owner shall not, except with the written permission of the Board and subject to the conditions specified therein, trap rabbits or allow rabbits to be trapped on his land.

3. Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £10.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1923.

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With the exception of three short periods—viz., between the 1st and 3rd, 18th and 21st, and 25th and 30th, when anticyclonic conditions ruled—the weather of October was dominated by frequent westerly depressions and at least three ex-tropical cyclones. As a result the month was very changeable. The westerly depressions were mostly of only slight intensity, but one which culminated on the 24th was very severe. A cyclone persisting about East Cape for several days about the middle of the month caused southerly gales and stormy conditions between the 15th and 17th, particularly along the

East Coast.

Wide differences in rainfall occurred over the Dominion, and, though mostly above the average in the northern and east coast districts of the North Island and in North Canterbury in the South, most other parts recorded a deficiency, many places in Nelson and Westland having less than half the usual amount.

Temperatures were generally above the average, but the cold southerly in the middle of the month was responsible for

TAMAKI WEST ROAD BOARD.

By-laws of the Body Corporate under the Name of "The Inhabitants of the Tamaki West Road District".

AND AND MADE ENACTED BY THE TAMAKI WEST ROAD BOARD.

I N pursuance of the powers vested in it by the Road Boards Act, 1908, the Public Works Act, 1908, the Motor Regulation Act, 1908, and by all or any other statutes and powers it hereunto enabling, the Tamaki West Road Board doth hereby make and enact the following by-laws,

namely:—

1. These by-laws shall be read with and as extending and amending By-law No. 56 of the by-laws of the Tamaki West Road Board, and words used herein shall have the same meaning and be interpreted in the same way as when used in the said by-laws in the said by-laws.

2. These by-laws shall come into force on the gazetting

thereof.

3. By-law No. 56 is hereby amended by repealing paragraph 12 thereof, and substituting therefor the following:—
"12. Drive or cause to be driven any motor-car, motor-

cycle, or other horseless vehicle at a greater speed than twenty-five miles per hour.

"13. Drive or cause to be driven any motor-car, motor-cycle, or other horseless vehicle round any corner at a greater

"13. Drive or cause to be driven any mountain, mountained, and cycle, or other horseless vehicle round any corner at a greater speed than six miles per hour.

"14. Drive a motor-car, motor-cycle, or other mechanically propelled vehicle recklessly or negligently, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition, and use of the road or street and the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on the road or street.

"15. Drive or cause to be driven any mechanically propelled vehicle within the definition of "Heavy traffic" at a greater speed than the following:—

"(a.) Where such vehicle is fitted on all its wheels with pneumatic tires,—

"(1.) If the vehicle and load do not exceed 5 tons total weight, the speed shall not exceed fifteen miles per hour.

"(2.) If the vehicle and load exceed 5 tons total weight, the speed shall not exceed twelve miles per hour.

"(b.) Where such vehicle is not fitted on all its wheels with pneumatic tires,—

"(1.) If the vehicle and load do not exceed
tons total weight, the speed shall not exceed

twelve miles per hour.

"(2.) If the vehicle and load exceed 5 tons total weight, the speed shall not exceed ten miles per

During the whole of the month of May, June, July, August, and September in each year no person shall drive or cause to be driven on any road or street any vehicle of any description within the definition of "Heavy traffic," except in strict conformity to the following regulations and conditions that is to say :-

(a.) Except where inconsistent with these regulations, the

general and foregoing by-laws shall apply.

(b.) On any metalled road all wheels of such vehicle shall at all times be kept upon (and at least one foot within the edge of the metalled portion of the road, except where turning or crossing or when and during such time as the general conditions of the traffic or the safety of the public or other unavoidable cause renders the same inexpedient

or unsate.

"(c.) The load on the back axle shall not exceed 6 tons in all or 600 lb. per inch width of rubber tire in contact with the street or road surface.

"18. Any person committing a breach of any of these byaws shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding five counds for each offence." ounds for each offence.
