A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the following day, the Town District of Kaikora North was duly constituted and proclaimed under the Town Districts Act, 1881, with the boundaries described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation:

And whereas by Proclamation under the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, the name of the Town District of Kaikora North was altered to Otane, to take effect on and after the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and ten:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said town district in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, do hereby alter the boundaries of the said Town District of Otane by excluding therefrom the area described in the First Schedule hereto, and do declare that as on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, the boundaries of the said town district shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM OTANE TOWN DISTRICT.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District, being the Otane Town District as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1886, page 1584, under the name of Kaikora North Town

District: excluding therefrom that area bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the north-western side of Hickey Street with the south-western boundary of part of Block XXXVII, Patangata Crown-grant District, and proceeding thence south-easterly along the said south-western boundary to the south-eastern side of Lawrence Street; thence south-westerly along the said south-eastern side of Lawrence Street and the south-eastern side of Weber Street to Higginson Street, across that street, to the south-eastern side of the Waipawa Road to a point in line with the northern boundary of Lot 20, part of aforesaid Block XXXVII; thence to and along that boundary, across railway reserve, and along the northern boundary of Lot 19 to the eastern boundary of part of Block XLIX; thence northerly along the eastern boundaries of Blocks XLIX and L to a school reserve, along the southern boundary of that school reserve to main road, along the eastern side of that street to the northern side of Higginson Street, and along the northern side of that street and of Ross Street to Hickey Street; thence along the north-western side of Hickey Street to the point of commencement.

#### A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921-22, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby set apart the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto as provisional State forests.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the amendments set forth in the Schedule hereto in the regulations in force at the making of this Order relating to public schools—salaries, grading, staffing—pupil teachers and probationers, training colleges, and Native schools (hereinafter referred to as "the regulations"); and with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, except where otherwise specified.

SCHEDULE.

I. REGULATIONS REGARDING PUBLIC-SCHOOL TEACHERS' SALARIES, ETC.

1. CLAUSE 3 of the regulations is hereby amended—

(a.) By inserting in subclause (1) thereof, before the words " teachers in public schools," the word " certificated."

(b) By revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following :—

"(2.) (a.) A deduction of £10 per annum from the salary payable to a certificated teacher under subclause (1) of this clause shall be made in the case of every uncertificated head or sole teacher who is not the holder of a license to teach.

(b.) Uncertificated assistant teachers other than relieving teachers shall be classified by the Senior Inspector and paid according to the following scale :—

Provided that holders of licenses to teach may be paid £10 more than these rates, and that teachers recommended by the Senior Inspector on account of special proficiency may be paid at such higher rate as the Minister shall determine."

NOTES.—The first female assistants of schools of Grades V<sub>B</sub>, V<sub>C</sub>, and VI<sub>A</sub>, the second female assistants of schools of Grade VII, the assistant (if a female) in the secondary department of a district high school of Grade A, and the second assistant (if a female) in Grades C and D, will receive £30 per annum in addition to the salary prescribed above.

The first assistant, if a female, in all schools of Grade III<sub>B</sub> shall receive an additional £25 per annum; and the female assistants in such schools of Grade III<sub>A</sub> as the Minister shall determine shall receive an additional £25 or such smaller sum as he shall decide.



2. Male assistant teachers of Grades 1, 2, and 3, as defined by clause 3 and Schedules I, II, III, and IV of the regulations, if they continue in the same positions, shall be placed on 1st February, 1924, in the corresponding new Grade 1 as defined by these regulations; male assistant teachers of Grades 4 and 5 shall be placed in the new Grade 2; male assistant teachers of Grades 6 and 7 in new Grade 3; and those of Grade 8 in new Grade 4.

Similarly, female assistant teachers of Grades 1, 2, and 2A, as defined by clause 3 and Schedules I, II, III, and IV of the regulations shall be placed in the corresponding new Grade 1; female assistant teachers of Grades 3, 4, and 5 shall be placed in the new Grade 2; and female assistant teachers of Grades 6 and 7 in the new Grade 3:

Provided that the third assistant (male or female) in each school of Grades IVc and VA, the fourth assistant in each school of Grade Vc and Vd, and the fifth assistant in each school of Grade VIB shall be placed in new Grade 1.

3. The salaries under these regulations, payable from the 1st February, 1924, to teachers who entered upon their duties prior to that date, and continue to hold the same positions, shall be determined as follows:—

(1.) In any case where the previous maximum salary is equal to or higher than the new maximum salary the teacher shall continue to receive the same salary and annual increments as if these regulations had not come into force.

(2.) In any case where the previous maximum salary is less than the new maximum salary—

(a.) If the teacher has not reached the previous maximum,—

(i.) He shall continue to receive, on the 1st February of each year, the annual increments until he reaches the previous maximum to which he was entitled before these regulations came into force:

(ii.) On the 1st February next after reaching that maximum he shall receive the increment required to bring his salary up to the next higher salary in the new grade; and

(iii.) He shall, on each subsequent 1st February, receive the annual increment provided by these regulations until he reaches his new maximum.

(b.) If he has reached his previous maximum—

(i.) On 1st February, 1924, he shall receive the increment required to bring his salary up to the next higher salary in the new grade;

(ii.) On each subsequent 1st February he shall receive the annual increment provided by these regulations until he reaches his new maximum.

(3.) In any case where the salary to which a teacher would have been entitled on 1st February, 1924, under the regulations is less than the minimum of the new grade of salary, the teacher's commencing salary under these regulations shall be such minimum:

Provided that in the case of those teachers who, as a result of these amendments, are placed in a lower-grading group and in consequence receive an increase in their grading addition under clause 4 and Schedule V of the regulations as amended (*e.g.*, male assistants of Grade 3 and female assistants of Grades 4, 5, and 6) the commencing salary payable on 1st February, 1924, under this clause shall be correspondingly reduced by the amount of such increase, and also the maximum salary payable under clause 3 of the regulations, provided that such maximum is not made less than the new maximum.

4. The salaries of teachers who enter upon their duties on or after the 1st February, 1924, shall be payable in accordance with the regulations as amended by this Order unless the Minister shall, in order to avoid hardship, approve of a higher salary.

5. In no case shall a teacher whose salary is increased by the operation of these regulations be regarded as entitled to the continuance of the increased amount of salary if it is found expedient to make further amendments to these regulations during the year commencing 1st February, 1924.

6. In any case where the new grade of salary provided for any position in Schedules I, II, or III of this Order is higher than the new grade of salary named in clause 2 hereof as corresponding to the previous grade of salary for the position, the provisions of section 9 of the Education Amendment Act, 1919, as amended by section 39 of the Education Amendment Act, 1920, shall apply, provided that, with the approval of the Minister, the Board may for such period as it thinks fit retain the teacher in the position at the new grade of salary corresponding to the previous salary.

7. Clause 4 of the regulations is hereby amended

(a.) By revoking subclause four thereof, and substituting—

“(4.) An uncertificated teacher, who is the holder of a license to teach and is employed otherwise than as a relieving teacher,

may, if he is shown to the satisfaction of the Director of Education to possess special merit, be paid by way of addition to the salary payable under clause 3 of the regulations as amended such amount not exceeding £15 per annum as the Minister of Education shall determine."

(b.) By revoking Schedule V, and substituting—

8. The following new clause is added:—

"6. The salary of a teacher shall be paid from the date he enters upon his duties until the date on which his duties cease, including payment for holidays during his period of engagement, and for the period necessarily occupied in transferring from one school to another: Provided that a teacher commencing duties during the first week in February in any year may be paid from the 1st February; and provided further that a teacher who has been employed throughout a school year commencing 1st February, and whose engagement terminates at the beginning of or during the long midsummer school vacation, shall be entitled to receive salary until the end of such vacation or until 31st January, whichever is the earlier."

9. Clause 7 of the regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

"7. (1.) The Headmaster of a district high school shall receive by way of further addition to the salary provided by clauses 3 and 4 of the regulations as amended the sum shown in column (4) of Schedule III hereof.

"(2.) The salaries of the certificated assistant teachers in the secondary department of a district high school shall be the salaries of the grades (as defined by Schedule IV to clause 3) prescribed for the teachers in Schedule III.

"(3.) The salaries of the assistant teachers in the primary department of a district high school shall be the same as in a public school of the same grade as the primary department."

10. Clause 8 of the regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "Chatham Islands," the words "or other remote place."

11. Clause 9 of the regulations is hereby amended by substituting "£150" or "£170" in the proviso to subclause (1).

12. Clause 13 of the regulations is hereby amended—

(a.) By adding to paragraph (c) of subclause one thereof the words "Such increment being the amount necessary to bring the salary up to the next higher salary for the new position."

(b.) By adding the following subclause:—

"(4.) For the purpose of this clause salary means the salary payable in accordance with clause 3 of the regulations as amended by this Order, but does not include the additional sums provided by the notes to Schedule IV."

13. Clause 14 of the regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

"14. Every teacher employed in any position in a public school shall, so long as he remains in that position and until he receives the maximum of his grade of salary, receive on the 1st February in each year the annual

increment provided in clause 3 of the regulations as amended, provided that his total salary, as computed under clauses 3 and 4 of the regulations as amended, has not been increased during the six months immediately preceeding."

14. Clause 15 of the regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:—

"(3.) The provisions of this clause shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to a teacher in the primary department of a district high school who holds a position the new grade of salary attached to which is lower than the new grade of salary named in clause 2 hereof as corresponding to the salary received prior to 1st February, 1924, provided that with the approval of the Minister the transfer of such teacher to another position may be postponed *sine die*.

15. Clause 23 of the regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

"23. The grade of the primary department of a district high school shall be determined in accordance with the average attendance in such primary department in the same way as is prescribed in clauses 19 and 20 hereof for an ordinary public school."

16. Clause 24 of the regulations is hereby amended by adding "and the provisions of clause 20 shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to these departments."

17. Clause 47 of the regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

"47. The salary of a relieving teacher shall be payable for the period during which he is actually engaged in teaching together with the period reasonably necessary to travel from and to his usual place of residence: Provided that the Board may pay such teacher during any year ending 31st January for school holidays not exceeding one-fourth of the time of actual teaching."

## II. PUPIL-TEACHERS AND PROBATIONERS REGULATIONS.

1. Clause 8 of the regulations is hereby amended by substituting in subclause (1) "£75" for "£90," and "£80" for "£95." Provided that until 1st February, 1925, these reductions shall not operate in the case of a pupil teacher or probationer who commenced duties prior to the 31st December, 1923.

(c.) In paragraph (c) "£435" and "£485" for "£450" and "£500" respectively:

(d.) In paragraph (d) "£365" for "£380."

(2.) By substituting in subclause (2) thereof:—

(a.) In paragraph (i) "£520" and "£570" for "£540" and "£590" respectively:

(b.) For paragraph (ii) "First assistant master with a salary of "£335-375":

(c.) In paragraph (iii) "£335-£375" for "£350-390.":

(d.) For paragraph (iv) "One assistant male or female with a salary of Grade 3, four assistants, two females with salaries of Grade 2, with an additional £30 per annum, and two males, with salaries of Grade 2.

(e.) For paragraph (v) "Such additional female assistants of Grade 2 as are required to make up the total number of assistants to the number provided by the Regulations respecting Salaries of Teachers and Staffing of Public Schools or to such greater number as the Minister may approve."

(3.) By substituting in subclause (3) thereof:—

(a.) In paragraph (i) "£325-365" for "£340-380":

(b.) In paragraph (ii) "Grade 2, with an additional £30," for "£240-270":

(c.) For paragraph (iii) "In the secondary department, if the number of pupils in yearly average attendance is not more than thirty, an assistant of Grade 3, and if the number of pupils in yearly average attendance is more than thirty a male assistant of Grade 4 and a female assistant of Grade 2, with an additional £30 per annum."

(d.) In paragraph (iv) "Grade 2, with an additional £30 in the case of a woman," for "£260-280":

(e.) In paragraph (v) "Grade 2" for "£220-£250."

(4.) (a.) By deleting from paragraph (a) of subclause (7) thereof the words "clause 2," and substituting "clause 4."

(b.) By revoking the proviso to paragraph (a) of subclause (7), and substituting—

“ Provided that the teachers whose salaries are £335 to £375 shall be placed in Grading Group 5 and the sole teachers of Model Schools in Grading Group 4.”

- (5.) By revoking all the words after “entitled” in subclause (8), and inserting in lieu thereof: “to the same annual increment as a public-school teacher receiving the same grade of salary. Those not receiving the same grades of salary as public-school teachers shall receive an annual increment of £10.”
- (6.) By revoking subclause (9), and substituting—

“The provisions of the regulations as amended by this Order relating to salaries of public-school teachers respecting commencing salaries, salaries on transfer and annual increments, and of clauses 3, 4, 5, and 6 of Part I of these regulations shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to teachers on the staffs of normal schools, and should any dispute or difficulty arise respecting the meaning or effect of the regulations as amended by this Order, the question shall be submitted to the Minister, whose decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

“The grades of salaries referred to in this clause are the grades of salaries prescribed for assistant teachers of public schools.”

2. Clause 11 of the regulations is hereby amended by substituting, in subclause (2), “£85” for “£105” and “£80” for “£100.”

3. Clause 12 of the regulations is hereby amended by substituting, in subclause (2), “£65” for “£85” and “£60” for “£80.”

4. Clauses 2 and 4, so far as they affect students of Division A and those students of Divisions B, C, and D who were admitted to a training college prior to 1st February, 1924, shall not come into operation till 1st February, 1925.

#### IV. REGULATIONS REGARDING NATIVE-SCHOOL TEACHERS' SALARIES.

1. The regulations relating to Native schools made by Order in Council dated 12th April, 1915, and amended by Orders in Council dated 17th December, 1918, 17th November, 1919, and 17th October, 1920, are hereby further amended with respect to Part XIII as follows:—

- (a.) By revoking Schedule I, and substituting—

NOTES.—(1.) A deduction of £10 per annum shall be made from the salary provided above in the case of every uncertificated teacher who is not the holder of a licence to teach, except in the case of salaries of £60-£80 and £80-£100.

(2.) Unmarried head teachers of Grades II (i) upwards receive £2 per annum less than amounts shown above.

(3.) In addition to the salary shown above there shall be paid by way of salary the sum of £35 per annum in the case of every assistant teacher who is obliged to live away from home.

2. Clauses 3, 4, 5, and 7 of Part I of this Order, relating to public-school teachers' salaries, shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to the salaries of assistant teachers in Native schools.

THE HONOURABLE SIR FRANCIS BELL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"),

Robert Clark, of Portobello (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark in Hooper's Inlet, in order to erect and maintain a fence thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 5579), showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said fence.

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said fence is to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 5579 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said fence; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of the said fence, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 5579, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, have free and full liberty to use, for the purpose of watering animals, the area of land so enclosed by the said fence, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all persons in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the area of land so enclosed by the said fence without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned fence in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said fence and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such fence, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the fence, the licensee shall with all reasonable speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or of any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or

revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the fence at the licensee's own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

11. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said fence may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

12. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said fence for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said fence to be removed, and may recover the cost incurred by any such removal from the licensee.

13. The erection of the said fence shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

**B**Y Order in Council, made and issued by His Excellency the Governor-General in Council on the 17th day of September, 1923, under the authority of the above Act, it was determined that the duty by way of Income-tax, leviable under section 3 of the said Act, should be paid in one sum on Friday, the 8th day of February, 1924, at the office of the Commissioner of Taxes, Government Buildings, Wellington; and, in accordance with such Order in Council, I hereby give notice that the said duty will be payable accordingly. Additional tax will accrue if the tax is not paid on or before 29th February, 1924. The liability to pay is not suspended by any objection. The tax should be paid on or before the prescribed date, otherwise the additional percentage accrues; any overpayment will be adjusted by refund.

The demands will be posted from the office of the Commissioner of Taxes on or about 1st February, 1924. Demands must be presented with all payments, and if a demand has not been received the Commissioner should be communicated with.

*Amendment and Addition to the Special Regulations affecting H.M. Prisons and the Officers employed therein, together with Exemptions from the Regulations made by the Public Service Commissioner.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the special regulations affecting H.M. prisons and the officers employed therein, together with exemptions from the regulations made by the Public Service Commissioner on the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and the amendments made from time to time under the provisions of the said Act, make the amendment shown in the Schedule hereto.

Such amendment shall have effect from and after the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three.
