WHEREAS by section eleven of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1921-22, it is enacted that where any national-endowment land is held under a pasturage lease or license for a term of not less than fourteen years, of which not less than seven years have expired, and the Board is of opinion that the land comprised in the lease or license is not

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more than sufficient for the maintenance of the lessee and his family, the Governor-General may, by Proclamation approved in Executive Council, declare that the said land shall cease to be national-endowment land:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the land mentioned in the Schedule hereto, which is held under pastoral license as aforesaid, should cease to be national-endowment land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities so conferred upon me by the aforesaid section eleven, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date of the gazetting hereof the land described in the Schedule hereto, which was set apart as national-endowment land under the provisions of section two hundred and fifty-eight of the Land Act, 1908, shall cease to be national-endowment land.

1. CIDER (or cyder) shall be the product of the alcoholic fermentation of the expressed juice of sound apples.

*Sweetened Cider.*

2. Sweetened cider shall be the product of the alcoholic fermentation of the expressed juice of sound apples to which sugar has been added either before or after fermentation.

*Unfermented Cider.*

3. Unfermented cider shall be the expressed juice of sound apples.

*Sweetened Unfermented Cider.*

4. Sweetened unfermented cider shall be the expressed juice of sound apples with the addition of sugar.

*Preservative.*

5. The preservative substance, sulphur dioxide or a preparation of sulphur dioxide or salicylic acid (one but not both) may be added to cider in proportion not exceeding two grains to the gallon.

*Prohibition.*

6. The word "cider" (or "cyder") alone or in conjunction with any word or any expression which includes or resembles the word "cider" shall not be written on or attached to any package unless the contents thereof comply with the standard for cider, or for sweetened cider, or for unfermented cider, or for sweetened unfermented cider, or for cider vinegar, as the case may be.

And whereas the said Treaty of Peace Order, 1920, was amended by the Treaty of Peace Amendment Order, 1922, and the Treaty of Peace Amendment Order (No. 2), 1922, and the Treaty of Peace Amendment Order, 1923:

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order and the above-recited Amendment Orders should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority conferred upon him in manner aforesaid, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. Paragraph 4 of the principal Order is hereby amended by deleting the words "and the Territory of Western Samoa."

2. Paragraph 5 of the principal Order is hereby amended by deleting from the definition of "New Zealand" contained therein the words "and the Territory of Western Samoa."

3. Paragraph 34 of the principal Order as amended by the Treaty of Peace Amendment Order, 1922, is hereby further amended by adding, after the words "or in any person claiming through an enemy" in subparagraph (a) thereof, the words "or that any enemy or other person as aforesaid was at such date beneficially entitled to any land or any estate, right, title, or interest therein"; and by adding, after the words "as the proprietor of such land, estate, or interest" in subparagraph (b) thereof, the words "as defined in such Order."

4. Paragraph 4 of the said Treaty of Peace Amendment Order, 1922, is hereby amended by deleting the words "in necessitous circumstances" therein appearing; and by adding, after the words "whether of enemy nationality or not," the following words: "whose property or money is held by the Public Trustee in pursuance of the War Regulations or of the principal Order, or any amendment thereof."

WHEREAS at Saint Germain-en-Laye on the tenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, a Treaty of Peace with Austria was signed on behalf of His Majesty, which said Treaty came into force on the sixteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty:

And whereas at Trianon on the fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, a Treaty of Peace with Hungary was signed on behalf of His Majesty, which Treaty came into force on the twenty-sixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one:

And whereas the said Treaty of Saint Germain-en-Laye and the said Treaty of Trianon are Treaties within the meaning of the Treaties of Peace Act, 1919:

And whereas by the said Treaties of Peace Act, 1919, it is enacted that the Governor-General may by Order in Council make all such provisions as appear to him to be necessary for giving full effect to any of the provisions of such Treaties:

And whereas by the said Treaties the Government of New Zealand is entitled to retain or liquidate all property, rights, and interests situated in New Zealand and belonging to Austrian or Hungarian subjects and companies respectively:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority conferred on him in manner aforesaid, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. All property, rights, and interests (including debts) within New Zealand which at the date when the Treaty of Saint Germain-en-Laye came into force belonged to nationals of the former Austrian Empire (other than Austrian nationals resident in New Zealand at such date) are hereby declared to be vested in the Public Trustee in trust for His Majesty as property to be retained and liquidated in accordance with the provisions of the said Treaty.

2. All property, rights, and interests (including debts) within New Zealand which at the date when the Treaty of Trianon came into force belonged to nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary (other than Hungarian nationals resident in New Zealand at such date) are hereby declared to be vested in the Public Trustee in trust for His Majesty as property to be retained and liquidated in accordance with the provisions of the said Treaty.

3. The Public Trustee is hereby empowered to sue for and recover in his own name in the Supreme Court of New Zealand or in any other Court of competent jurisdiction all property, rights, and interests (including debts) which are declared to be vested in the Public Trustee in pursuance of the foregoing provisions.

4. (a.) In respect of any estate, right, title, or interest, in any property as aforesaid vested in His Majesty as aforesaid the Public Trustee shall have power to sell, realize, or otherwise convert into money such property or any such estate, right, title, or interest therein, and after any sale, realization, or other conversion of such property into money as aforesaid the proceeds of such sale, realization, or conversion shall be retained and liquidated by His Majesty pursuant to the provisions of the relative Treaty, and to be dealt with and disposed of in accordance with the provisions of such Treaty.

(b.) A statement or recital in any transfer, conveyance, assignment, or other disposition of such property, or such estate, right, or interest therein shall, respecting any matter of fact in relation to such transfer, conveyance, assignment, or other disposition, be sufficient evidence of the facts therein stated or recited.

5. When the Attorney-General is satisfied that any property or money belonged at the outbreak of the late war with Germany to a person of British, Allied, or non-enemy

nationality, or who has acquired the nationality of an Allied or Associated Power under the provisions of one of the said Treaties of Peace, or that it is desirable to grant relief to any person, whether of enemy nationality or not, the Attorney-General may, by warrant under his hand, release at any time such property or money or any part thereof from all or any of the provisions of this Order, or any amendment thereof. In exercising this power the Attorney-General will be guided by, but will not necessarily be restricted by, the policy adopted by the Imperial Government in connection with similar cases in the United Kingdom.

6. The Public Trustee shall be entitled to charge for all services rendered by him in connection with his duties under this Order or any amendment thereof, and the fees to be charged for such services may be fixed and determined by him from time to time under the provisions of the Public Trust Office Regulations.

7. Every Court in New Zealand shall take judicial notice of the terms of the said Treaties of Saint Germain-en-Laye and Trianon.

8. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Austria and Hungary) Order, 1924.

## ROTORUA FIRE BOARD.—BY-LAWS.

By virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it in that behalf by section 43 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, the Rotorua Fire Board hereby makes the following by-laws:—

*Interpretation Clauses.*

In these by-laws, except where inconsistent with the context or when otherwise expressly provided,—

- “Board” means the Rotorua Fire Board elected and appointed under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908;
- “Brigade” means the Rotorua Fire Brigade established under the provisions of these by-laws;
- “District” means the Rotorua Fire District as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 36, of the 8th day of April, 1920;
- “Secretary” means the Secretary appointed by the Rotorua Fire Board;
- “Superintendent” and “Deputy Superintendent” means respectively the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent of the Rotorua Fire Brigade appointed by the Rotorua Fire Board;
- “Street” means any public or private street, and includes public places;
- “The Act” means the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, and any amendment thereof;
- “Petroleum” means petroleum as defined by the Explosive and Dangerous Goods Act, 1920;
- “Inspector” means the Inspector as appointed by the local authority;
- “Inflammable material” as described in the Act of 1920.

*Establishment.*

1. The brigade shall consist of a Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent, with such other officers as the Board may from time to time determine, and not more than twenty firemen, with such number of auxiliaries as the Board may from time to time determine.

*Enrolment.*

2. Candidates for enrolment as members of the brigade must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight. They must not be less than eighteen years of age, nor more than forty-four years of age, unless they have previously and recently been engaged as active and efficient firemen or are otherwise thoroughly competent. They may be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They may be required to undergo a medical examination by such duly qualified medical practitioner as the Board may appoint. Members of the Brigade acting in that capacity on the coming into force of this by-law shall be exempted from these requirements.

*Application for Enrolment.*

3. Application for enrolment must be made on the form set out and printed by the Board, and applicants shall only be enrolled as members of the brigade on their application being approved by the Board.

*Probation.*

4. Candidates, when approved, will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which shall be three months. If at the end of that term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, and shall at a meeting of the brigade receive an affirmative vote of not

less than three-fifths of the members there present, his acceptance as an enrolled member shall be confirmed by the Board.

5. Members of the brigade are subject to the provisions of clause 4 hereof, enrolled for service from year to year, subject to one month's notice on either side, except as hereinafter provided.

*Appointment and Promotion of Officers.*

6. The appointment of Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent shall be made by the Board as provided by section 30 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, due consideration being given in each case to the claims of men already in the service of the Board. Such appointments may be terminated by one month's notice on either side.

*Retiring-age.*

7. The age at which members of the brigade must retire from the brigade shall be as follows: Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent sixty-five years, firemen fifty-five years, but the Board may, if it thinks fit in any special case, extend these limits.

*Care of Uniform and Equipment.*

8. Uniforms and equipment of a pattern and design approved by the Board shall be issued to members of the brigade on enrolment, but shall remain the property of the Board.

9. On discharge from the Board's service either by resignation or dismissal, each member must return to the Secretary in good order and condition (fair wear-and-tear excepted) every article of clothing or equipment the property of the Board which may be on issue to him. In the event of his failing to do so the cost of any article of clothing not returned, or returned in a damaged condition, shall be charged to such member and deducted from any pay or money that may be due to such member, or recovered by process of law.

*Fire-hose.*

10. That it be the duty of the Superintendent to keep a record of the various makes of hose and the service rendered thereby, also the hose to be stamped with distinctive maker's mark and year brought into service.

*Plant not to be removed without Permission.*

11. Except for the purposes of answering any alarm of fire or false alarm, or for *bona fide* brigade practices ordered by the Superintendent, no plant or appliance of any kind shall be removed from the brigade premises, unless such person removing same shall have first received permission of the Superintendent to do so. Any person removing any plant or appliance without such permission as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

*The Superintendent.*

12. The duties and powers of the Superintendent, in addition to those conferred on him by the Act, shall be as follows:—

- (1.) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the brigade and all gear used in its service.
- (2.) He shall have power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must at once report such suspension to the Board. The member so suspended may appeal to the Board, which may hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member may be present and have the right to speak in his defence and, if he so desires, to bring witnesses in support of such defence.
- (3.) He shall keep an order-book in which from time to time all orders affecting the working of the brigade shall be entered. Such order-book or a copy of the orders therein shall be available for inspection by members of the brigade at all times.
- (4.) He shall allot such duties to the members of the brigade as he may deem necessary for ensuring the efficiency thereof, and may draw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.
- (5.) He shall keep a service-record book containing the names, occupations, places of birth, dates of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the brigade, with awards and punishments by the Board, in a proper manner.
- (6.) He shall perform any other duty in connection with his position which the Board may from time to time assign to him.

*Fireman to take Charge in Officers' Absence.*

13. In the event of the absence of all the Board's officers at any fire or false alarm of fire, the senior fireman there present shall take charge of the brigade.

*Discipline.*

14. A member of the brigade guilty of any of the following offences whilst on duty in the Board's service shall be liable to suspension from duty by the Superintendent:—

- (a.) Being in an intoxicated condition.
- (b.) Disobeying any lawful order of his superior officer.
- (c.) Using abusive or insubordinate language to his superior officer.
- (d.) Striking his superior officer.
- (e.) Using obscene language.

15. A member of the brigade committing either of the following offences shall be suspended and reported to the Board by the Superintendent:—

- (a.) Wilfully damaging any portion of the brigade's premises or other the property of the Board.
- (b.) Absenting himself without sufficient excuse from any drill or practice ordered by the Superintendent, or from any false or real alarm of fire.

16. No member of the brigade shall under any circumstances write any letter or furnish any information to the Press on matters connected with the Board or brigade, save that in the event of no superior officer being present, the senior fireman on duty may give particulars regarding any fire which has been attended by the brigade.

*Leave of Absence.*

17. Leave of absence for any period not exceeding fourteen days may, on the application of a member of the brigade, be granted by the Superintendent, who shall record the same in his occurrence-book. Any member of the brigade desiring leave of absence for a longer period than fourteen days shall apply in writing addressed to the Superintendent, who shall forward such application to the Secretary of the Board, with such recommendation as he may think fit, and leave of absence for such longer period shall only be granted by the Board.

*Brigade may make Rules.*

18. Subject to the approval of the Board, and provided they in no way conflict with these by-laws, the brigade may make rules and regulations for its own government.

*Gratuities for Volunteer and other Services.*

19. For the performance of any volunteer or special services rendered by any person, whether a member of the brigade or not, in respect of any fire, there may be paid out of the funds of Board such sum as the Board, or any committee authorized by the Board, may direct.

*Electric Fire-alarm Circuits.*

20. The Board may establish or contract with any person or corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm circuit, and may from time to time extend such circuit and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings or premises. All connections of alarms installed in public or private buildings or premises or any alterations to same shall be carried out to the approval of the Board at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected, and the cost of maintenance and of the periodical examination and testing of such connection shall be borne by the owner of the property connected, and all such connections shall be efficiently maintained to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner such cost may be commuted to the payment of such annual sum as may be agreed on between the Board and such owner.

*Donations in Recognition of Brigade's Services.*

21. Donations by the public in recognition of the brigade's services shall be the property of the brigade, and shall be used in providing for the comfort and recreation of the members thereof, or otherwise for the benefit of the members of the brigade.

*Maintenance of Discipline and Good Conduct on the part of the Officers and Men of the Brigade.*

22. No person shall interfere with or in any way obstruct any officer or member of the brigade while such officer or member of the brigade is in the execution of his duty.

23. No person shall interfere with or obstruct any volunteer described in section 18 of these by-laws while such volunteer is in execution of his duty.

24. No person shall aid, abet, or encourage any member of the brigade in any act of disobedience of orders, or insubordination, or in the use of abusive or obscene language while such member is on duty.

25. No person shall supply any intoxicating liquor to any officer or member of the brigade while such member or officer shall be on duty, unless he shall first have received permission from the officer in charge of the brigade at the time so to do.

26. No person other than a member of the brigade, its Secretary, or members of the brigade, shall enter the fire-station controlled by the Board, unless such person shall first have received permission to do so from the officer in charge of the station or a member of the brigade, and no person shall, after having been requested by the officer in charge of the station to leave any such station, remain in any such station or on or about the station premises.

27. No person, other than an officer of the brigade or a member thereof or the wife or child of such officer or member, shall sleep in or on any station or in any of the Board's premises without first having received the written permission of the Superintendent to do so.

*In Respect of Fires outside the Rotorua Fire District.*

28. If any brigade or portion of a brigade established and maintained by the Board within the Rotorua Fire District attends or performs any service at a fire on any premises, vessel, or ship, outside the Fire District of Rotorua, at the request of the owner or occupier of such premises, vessel, or ship, then such owner or occupier shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service at the undermentioned rates.

*Penalty Clause.*

29. Every person guilty of an offence against, or committing any breach of, or failing to perform any duty imposed upon any such person by any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be liable for such offence, breach, or failure, to such fine not exceeding £20 as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit. The foregoing by-laws were made by the Rotorua Fire Board, at a duly constituted meeting of the said Board held on the 20th day of March, 1923.

*Appointment of Chauffeur.*

30. The appointment of chauffeur shall be made by the Board at a wage to be agreed upon. Such appointment shall be terminated by a fortnight's notice given either by the employer or the employee. The chauffeur shall be a member of the fire brigade, and subject to all its rules and regulations.

*Duties of Chauffeur.*

31. (1.) Subject to instructions (or orders) from the Superintendent or his deputy, the chauffeur shall have sole charge of the motor-reel, and be responsible for the same being kept in good running-order and condition.

2. He shall be responsible for the keeping clean and in good order and condition the whole of the brigade's plant and equipment, also the station premises, other members' rooms excepted.

(3.) He shall teach such other members of the brigade to drive the motor-reel as the Superintendent shall appoint for the purpose.

(4.) During such hours as may be arranged by the Superintendent the chauffeur shall be responsible for watch duty.

(5.) In addition to the aforesaid duties, the chauffeur shall take part in all station drills, and attend all calls of the brigade.

(6.) Should a call be received when there are less than four members of the brigade present, the chauffeur or the driver for the time being shall drive slowly until that number are on the motor-reel.

(7.) No persons other than members of the brigade shall be permitted to ride on the motor-reel without the sanction of the Superintendent or his deputy.

(8.) Excepting for the purpose of responding to calls, the motor-reel must not leave the station without the sanction of the Superintendent or his deputy.

(9.) The chauffeur, shall, for the purpose of carrying out watch duty in conjunction with his other duties, remain on the station premises, within hearing of the telephone, from 7 a.m. till 7.30 p.m. daily; he shall be relieved at 7.30 p.m. by an auxiliary driver, but must return to station not later than 11.30 p.m.

(10.) He shall receive two weeks' holiday on full pay for every completed year of service.

32. The appointment of the auxiliary drivers shall be made by the Superintendent. The appointment shall be subject to a salary agreed upon by the Board.

*Duties.*

33. The auxiliary driver shall take sole charge of the fire-engine and must remain within hearing of the telephone between the hours of 7.30 p.m. and 7 a.m. He shall be responsible for giving the alarm and taking the engine out during the above hours. He must start the engine and see same is in good running-order prior to midnight each night,

and defects must be immediately reported to the Superintendent or his deputy. These duties shall be carried out in conjunction with his other duties as a fireman. He may be relieved from duty one night per week, but such relief must be approved of by the Superintendent or his deputy.
