Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality known as "Buckley" in the County of Uawa shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Tolaga Bay," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 31 of the seventh day of the following month, Alexander McKay, of Mangonui (hereinafter called "the licensee"), was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark in Mangonui Harbour, as shown on plan marked M.D. 3027 (three sheets) and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect and maintain thereon a store, warehouse, and offices as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid for a term of fourteen years computed from the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten. And whereas the said license having expired, the licensee has made application for a fresh license



under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a term of fourteen years computed from the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four: And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the store, warehouse, and offices are erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said store, warehouse, and offices thereon; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the erection of the store, warehouse, and offices as shown on plan marked M.D. 3027.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £8 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said store, warehouse, and offices without payment.

5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned store, warehouse, and offices in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said store, warehouse, and offices and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such store, warehouse, and offices, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensee shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the 24th day of March, 1924, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the store, warehouse, and offices at the licensee's cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

10. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said store, warehouse, and offices for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or

(4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

And whereas the Minister of Finance has given his precedent consent as required by the above-recited section eleven, and it is desired that the rate of interest at which the money may be borrowed be not exceeding six per centum per annum:

#### REGULATIONS.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take salmon in any year during the period from the 15th day of May to the 30th day of September, both days inclusive, which period is hereby declared to be a close season for such fish.
2. During the period from the date of this Order in Council until the 15th day of May, 1924, anglers licensed by any Acclimatization Society within the Dominion to fish for trout may fish for salmon and dispose by sale of any salmon so taken.
3. During the period from the date of this Order in Council until the 15th day of May, 1924, sea fishermen duly licensed by the Marine Department under the provisions of section 6 of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and the regulations made thereunder, may fish for and take salmon from the sea outside a radius of 500 yards from the mouth or entrance of any river, and dispose of the same by sale, provided that the above restriction as to radius shall not apply to tidal rivers or estuaries where netting is by regulation allowed, within limits therein defined, for indigenous market fishes.
4. Such anglers and fishermen shall, on or before the 31st day of May, 1924, forward to the Secretary, Marine Department, Wellington, a return, in such form as may be prescribed, of all salmon taken under the authority of these regulations.
5. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £50.
