During the period from the date of this Order in Council until the 15th day of May, 1924, sea fishermen duly licensed by the Marine Department under the provisions of sec-tion 6 of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and the regulations made thereunder, may fish for and take salmon from the sea outside a radius of 500 yards from the mouth or entrance of any river, and dispose of the same by sale, provided that the above restriction as to radius shall not apply to tidal rivers or estuaries where netting is by regulation allowed, within limits therein defined, for indigenous market fishes. 4. Such anglers and fishermen shall, on or before the 31st day of May, 1924, forward to the Secretary, Marine Depart-ment, Wellington, a return, in such form as may be pre-scribed, of all salmon taken under the authority of these regulations.
