Boundaries of Districts under the Marriage Act, 1908, altered.

[L.S.] **JELlicoe, Governor-General.**
A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Stratford and Whangamomona districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

STRATFORD DISTRICT.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded by a line from the summit of Mount Egmont to the source of the Waipuku River; thence down that river to the northern boundary of Blocks IX, Huiroa Survey District; thence easterly along the said northern boundary to the western boundary of Block X; thence southerly along that said western boundary to Croydon Road; easterly along Croydon Road to the south-eastern corner of Section 11, Block X aforesaid; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the said Section 11; and easterly along the southern boundary of Section 14 to the Mangaotea Road; southerly along that road to the southern boundary of Section 20; easterly along that boundary and the southern boundary of Section 26 to the Makara Road; along that road and the southern boundary of Section 28, Block X aforesaid, to the eastern boundary of the said Block X; thence southerly along that boundary to the Makino Stream; thence down the Makino Stream to the eastern boundary of Section 5; along that boundary to the Makara Road; along the Makara Road to the south-western corner of Section 11, Block VII; thence easterly along the southern boundaries of Sections 11 and 18, Block VII aforesaid, to the Makino Stream; thence down the Makino Stream to the Waitara River; thence up the Waitara River to the point where Junction Road crosses the Waitara River; thence south-easterly along Junction Road to its intersection with the north-western boundary of the Pohokura Block; thence north-easterly along that

boundary to the northernmost corner of the said Pohokura Block; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of the said block to the south-western corner of Section 7, Block X, Mahoe Survey District; thence southerly generally along the south-western boundaries of Sections 7, 8, and 10, Block X aforesaid, the western boundary of Section 1, Block XIV, to the Taumata Road; thence south-westerly along the Taumata Road; thence by the Taumata and Whakaihuwaka Roads to the point of intersection with a right line running from the mouth of the Tangarakau Stream to the Whakaihuwaka Trig.; thence by that line to Whakaihuwaka Trig. (Mount Humphries); thence by a right line to Taurakawa Trig. Station; thence by a line along the summit of the Matemateonga Range to a point in line with the southern boundary-line of Section 11, Block VIII, Ngaire Survey District; thence by a right line running due west to the Patea River, across that river, and along the northern boundaries of Blocks XII, XI, X, and IX, Ngaire Survey District, and Block XII, Kaipokonui Survey District, to Palmer Road; along that road to the Kapuni Stream, and up that stream to its source; thence along a right line to the summit of Mount Egmont, the place of commencement.

WHANGAMOMONA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north generally by the Mangapapa Road from the Waitara River to Mount Dampier Road; thence by the last-mentioned road to the south-western corner of Section 6, Block XIV, Waro Survey District; thence by Sections 6 and 7, Block XIV aforesaid, to the south-eastern corner of the latter section; thence by the summit of the range to Mangapapa Trig. Station; thence by the north-eastern boundary-line of Section 1, Block III, Pouatu Survey District, and the production of that boundary-line to the northern boundary-line of Whangamomona County as described in the First Schedule to the Whangamomona County Act, 1907; thence by the northern boundary-line of that county to the Wanganui River; thence towards the south-east by the Wanganui River to the northern boundary of Omara Survey District; thence towards the south generally by the northern boundaries of Omara and Taurakawa Survey Districts to the summit of Whakaihuwaka Trig. (Mount

Humphries); thence north-easterly along a right line running from Whakaihuwaka Trig. to the mouth of the Tangarakau Stream, to its intersection by the Whakaihuwaka Road; thence north-westerly along the Whakaihuwaka and Taumata Roads to the south-western corner of Section 1, Block XIV, Mahoe Survey District; thence northerly generally along the western boundaries of Section 1, Block XIV aforesaid, Section 10, Block X, Mahoe Survey District, and the south-western boundaries of Sections 8 and 7, Block X aforesaid, to the south-western corner of the said Section 7; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of the Pohokura Block, to the northernmost corner of the said Pohokura Block; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundary of the said block to its intersection with Junction Road; thence along Junction Road to the Waitara River; thence generally northerly up the Waitara River to the Mangapapa Road, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

Boundaries of Districts under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, altered.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Stratford and Whangamomona districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Stratford and Whangamomona districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be continuous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by subsection one of section ninety-eight of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1923, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the reservation as an endowment over that portion of the Nelson College Endowment in the Canterbury Land District described in the Schedule hereto, and the vesting of the said land in the Governors of the said Nelson College.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1924.

Strong southerly winds and cold, squally, and showery weather, associated with the rear of a westerly low-pressure area, characterized the first three days of June.

There were four district westerly disturbances, which culminated on the 8th, 12th, 18th, and 24th, and the weather between the 17th and 27th was very unsettled, with heavy showers in most parts of the country. An ex-tropical cyclone passed in the North on the 14th and 15th, causing easterly gales and very heavy seas on the East Coast, especially about Gisborne and Napier.

Periods when fair weather was most general were the 4th to 6th, on the 10th, 16th to 17th, and 28th to 30th.

Frosts were frequent in the east coast districts of the South Island, but on the whole conditions were milder than usual.

Rainfall was again much above the average in the North Island, except in parts of the east coast districts, about Cape Egmont, and Cook Strait; while in the South Island it was above in the high country and the southern districts and below on both the east and west coasts.

WARNING SIGNALS DISPLAYED BY BRITISH VESSELS TO DENOTE THE PRESENCE OF SUBMARINES.

Former Notice.—No. 7 of 1921; hereby cancelled.

Attention is drawn to the following warning signal which has been adopted to denote the presence of submarines:—

British vessels fly a square red flag to denote that submarines, which may be submerged, are in the vicinity. Vessels are cautioned to steer so as to give a wide berth to any vessel flying a square red flag. If from any cause it is necessary to approach her, vessels should proceed at slow speed until warning is given of the danger zone by flags, semaphore, or megaphone, &c., a good look-out being kept meanwhile for submarines, whose presence may be only indicated by their periscopes showing above water. "M" flag International Code has been discontinued for the use of British vessels escorting submarines.

CAUTION TO BE OBSERVED BY VESSELS PASSING LIGHT VESSELS.

Attention is drawn to the recent increase in the number of cases in which light-vessels have sustained serious damage from collision by passing vessels. These accidents have been mainly caused by vessels attempting to pass too close. Mariners are warned that when passing a light-vessel and particularly when attempting to cross her bows, due allowance must be made for the set and strength of the tidal streams, &c., and every precaution should be taken in the circumstances in order to avoid damage to the light-vessel.

WIRELESS DISTRESS SIGNAL.—WARNING AS TO MISUSE.

The attention of the Board of Trade and the Postmaster-General has been called to cases in which the wireless distress signal has been sent out by ships (including British ships) which were not at the time in immediate danger.

The signal SOS (- - - - -) is prescribed by the International Radiotelegraph Convention as the signal to be used by ships in distress and under the international regulations, which all ships fitted with wireless-telegraph apparatus must obey, stations hearing the distress signal must suspend all ordinary correspondence until the call has been dealt with.

Masters of ships are under international obligation to render assistance to every person in danger of being lost at sea.

The sending out of the distress signal seriously interrupts wireless-telegraph traffic and results in ships being diverted from their course and delayed. It must accordingly be used only when the ship is in immediate danger and urgently in need of help. Misuse of the signal will inevitably lead to its being ignored in a case of real necessity.

Full particulars of any well authenticated case of misuse should be reported to the Board of Trade or the General Post Office, London.
