IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, and of every other power in anywise enabling me in that behalf, I, Robert Stout, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Otago Central Electric-power District, being an electric-power district duly constituted under the said Act by a Proclamation dated the twentieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and published in *Gazette* No. 76, of the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, so as to include the area described in the Schedule hereto.

REGULATIONS.

REGISTRATION OF ELECTORS.

1. APPLICATIONS for registration under section 2 of the Legislature Amendment Act, 1924, shall be in the form numbered (1), or the form numbered (2) in the Schedule hereto, as the case may require.

2. (1.) Every Registrar of Electors who enters the name of any person on the roll of his district shall forthwith transmit notice thereof, by telegraph if necessary, to the Registrar of the District (if any) for which the applicant was previously registered, and that Registrar shall forthwith remove the name of that person from the roll of such last-mentioned district, and, having endorsed the notice with a note of such removal, shall file it in his office. If the Registrar to whom the notice is transmitted finds that the name of the elector is not upon the roll of his district, he shall, by telegraph if necessary, inform the Registrar who transmitted the notice of that fact.

(2.) Every notice of transfer pursuant to this regulation shall be in the form numbered (3) in the Schedule hereto.

3. (1.) Notice of the death of an adult person, to be given pursuant to section 7 of the Legislature Amendment Act, 1924, shall be in the form numbered (4) in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) On receipt of any such notice the Registrar of Electors shall remove from the roll the name of the person to whom the notice relates, and shall, opposite his name, write the word "Dead" and the date of death.

4. (1.) Notice of the intended marriage of an adult woman, to be given pursuant to section 8 of the Legislature Amendment Act, 1924, shall be in the form numbered (5) in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) On receipt of any such notice the Registrar of Electors shall forthwith by registered letter request the elector to state whether the marriage has been solemnized and (if so) whether she is still residing within the electoral district; and on receipt of a statement by the elector that the marriage has been solemnized the Registrar shall remove the former name of the elector from the roll, and, if she is still possessed of the necessary residential qualification, shall insert her married name in its alphabetical order, together with the correct address and description.

ABSENT VOTERS.

5. For the purposes of section 13 of the Legislature Amendment Act, 1924, any registered elector may at any time within the hours of polling, vote as an absent voter at any polling-place outside the district for which he is registered.

6. Every such elector shall, on applying to vote, state to the Deputy Returning Officer his full name, his place of residence, and occupation as appearing on the electoral roll of the district for which he is registered.

7. The Deputy Returning Officer may, and if so required by a scrutineer shall, before allowing an elector to vote as an absent voter, put to him the questions specified in section 128 of the Legislature Act, 1908.

8. If the Deputy Returning Officer is satisfied that the claimant is entitled to vote as an absent voter, he shall require him to make an application in the form numbered (6) in the Schedule hereto.

9. On application being so made the Deputy Returning Officer shall fill up a blank ballot-paper with the names of the candidates for the district for which the elector is entitled to vote, and shall enter on both the counterfoil and the top right-hand corner of the back of the ballot-paper the proper consecutive number; he shall then fold over the corner of the ballot-paper so as to conceal the consecutive number, and shall secure the corner by gum or other effective means; on the counterfoil of the ballot-paper he shall also write his initials, and the name of the electoral district in respect of which the ballot-paper is given; and shall then, on both the counterfoil and the back of the ballot-paper, place his official mark, and shall give the ballot-paper to the voter. The voter shall mark the ballot-paper in the manner prescribed by the Legislature Act, 1908, and shall return the same to the Deputy Returning Officer, who shall, in the presence of the voter, enclose it in an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer of the district for which the vote is exercised and, having fastened up the envelope, shall enclose it, together with the application for a ballot-paper in a second envelope similarly addressed, and shall forthwith post it to that Returning Officer.

10. Forthwith after a vote is recorded as mentioned in the last preceding regulation the Deputy Returning Officer shall transmit by telegraph or other expeditious means to the Returning Officer of the district for which the vote is exercised a statement of the name, address, and occupation or description of the elector who recorded the vote.

11. On receipt of any such statement the Returning Officer shall place on the roll against the name of the elector a note indicating that such elector has exercised his vote as an absent voter.

12. The Returning Officer, on receiving a ballot-paper transmitted to him as aforesaid, shall open the outer envelope only and extract therefrom the application for a ballot-paper which he shall forthwith refer to the Registrar of Electors, who shall, on receipt of the same, compare the signature of the voter on his application for a ballot-paper with that of the voter on his application for registration as an elector.

13. If the Registrar of Electors is satisfied as to the identity of the voter, he shall certify to that effect, and return the application forthwith to the Returning Officer, who shall allow the vote if it is otherwise in order.

14. If the Registrar of Electors is not satisfied as to the identity of the voter, he shall certify to that effect and shall give his reasons for so doing; or if the voter's name is not on the roll a certificate to that effect shall be given; and the Registrar shall return the application forthwith to the Returning Officer, who shall disallow the vote and set aside, unopened, the envelope containing the ballot-paper, after having written across it the words "Disallowed, identity not proved," or "Disallowed, name not on roll," as the case may require.

15. The envelopes containing the ballot-papers of absent voters shall be placed in a ballot-box specially set aside for the purpose, and shall not be opened until the official count, and then only in the presence of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present. The envelopes marked "Disallowed" shall not be opened at all.

16. In the case of a vote disallowed for the reason that identity has not been proved the scrutineers shall, if they so desire, be given an opportunity to compare the signatures of the voter as appearing on the application for a ballot-paper and on the application for registration as an elector.

17. For the purpose of exercising his vote as an absent voter for a district in which a by-election is being held the elector shall apply in person to any Postmaster to have a ballot-paper issued to him, and shall make application in the form numbered (6) in the Schedule hereto, and thereupon the foregoing provisions of these regulations relating to voting by absent voters at general elections shall, with the necessary modifications, apply.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1925, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the 1st of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) members of Parliament and members of Government of the different States, as well as members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) members and associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) university professors of political science and of law, of history, and of philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, par. 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to par. 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, *qualified persons* are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1924.

October was characterized mainly by dull and warm weather. It was remarkable for the end of the protracted dry period which had been experienced, particularly in the east coast districts of the South Island. Warm, beneficial rains occurred several times during the month, but snow fell on several occasions on the higher levels, particularly in the rear of a cyclonic storm about the 20th.

On the last two days general heavy rains were again experienced, resulting from a disturbance which moved up the West Coast. Floods occurred about this time in various parts of the North Island.

During the month there were six areas of westerly low-pressure and four ex-tropical disturbances. As a consequence, atmospheric conditions were very unsettled, and there were very few days on which the weather was fine over the whole Dominion.

The aggregate rainfall was above the average in nearly all parts, only a few places in Otago and the Bay of Plenty reporting a deficiency. Most of Canterbury experienced over double its mean.
