Education Act, 1914.—Regulations relating to Training Colleges.

CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of January, 1925.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR: GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations at present in force relating to Training Colleges, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that, except when expressly stated to the contrary, this Order shall come into force on first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

SCHEDULE.

CONTROL AND ORGANIZATION.

1. For the purpose of the following regulations the "University district" means the University district in which a training college is situated, and the "University college" means the University college in such University district.

2. The Board of any district in which any training college is situated shall have the entire control and management of such college,

subject to the provisions hereinafter contained.

- 3. (1.) For every training college there shall be a Committee of Advice, consisting of the Chairman or other member of the Board, the Senior Inspector of the education district, a representative of the Professorial Board of the University college, and a representative of the Boards of such other education districts as are situate wholly in the University district, to be chosen, if there be more than one other such district, in such manner as the Minister of Education shall determine.
- district, in such manner as the Minister of Education shall determine.

 (2.) The Committee of Advice shall meet at least twice in each year. The first meeting shall be called by the Chairman of the Board, and shall be held not later than the month of March. Any subsequent regular meeting shall be at a time to be fixed by the Committee, but other meetings may at any time be called on the joint request of two members of the Committee, or on the initiative of the Chairman. The Principal of the training college shall be present at all meetings of the Committee of Advice, except when questions affecting his personal or professional status are under discussion.
- 4. (1.) Every training college shall have one or more normal or practising schools connected with it. The total number of children on the roll of any such school, including the model schools attached thereto, shall not at any time exceed 750. Every such normal school shall include—

shall not at any time exceed 750. Every such normal school shall include—

(a.) A "main school," organized as a "mixed school," having

children of all classes from Class P to Class S6: and

- children of all classes from Class P to Class S6; and
 (b.) Such "model schools" as may be approved by the Minister,
 each model school being of one of the following types,
 namely,—
 - (i.) A rural public school of Grade II (hereinafter designated Model I) under one teacher, with not more than forty children on the roll;
 - (ii.) A junior school (hereinafter designated Model II) under one teacher, with not more than forty-five children of Classes P to S2 on the roll;
 - (iii.) A class or classes organized as the secondary department of a district high school, with not more than fifty-five pupils on the roll;

(iv.) A special class of children of school age, with not more than thirty children on the roll, such class being hereinafter designated Model III;

(v.) A junior kindergarten class or classes (hereinafter designated Model IV), with not more than forty children between the ages of three and five on the roll; but children so enrolled shall not be reckoned in computing the average attendance of the normal school.

(2.) For the purpose of the wider observation by students of teaching methods, the Board, after consultation with the Committee of Advice, may select, subject to the approval of the Director, any teachers of public schools, secondary schools, technical high schools, or approved kindergarten schools within convenient distance of the normal school to supervise and report upon the work of such students as are sent by the Principal of the training college to observe the classes under the charge of the said teachers. Teachers so appointed shall be recognized as associated normal teachers, and the classes as associated normal classes.

5. (1.) The organization of normal schools and the salaries of the staffs shall be approved by the Minister of Education, but in no case shall the salaries be less than those payable under the Act to teachers

employed in public schools of the same grade.

(2.) No uncertificated teacher shall be appointed on the staff of a normal school unless he possesses special qualifications approved by the Minister.

(3.) No pupil-teacher shall be employed on the staff of a normal

school, nor shall any probationer be assigned thereto.

6. (1.) After consultation with the Committee of Advice the Board shall make recommendations to the Minister regarding appointments to the staff of the training college and normal school, and on receipt of the Minister's approval thereto the Board shall make appointments accordingly. Except in regard to the appointments of the Principal and Vice-Principal of the training college and the headmaster of the normal school, the Committee of Advice may delegate its functions in this respect to the Senior Inspector of Schools.

(2.) In making appointments to the staff of a normal school the Board shall, in addition to considering applications received for any position, take into consideration the question of appointing by transfer any teacher in the district whose qualifications for the position are

superior to those of any of the applicants.
7. (1.) In addition to the staff of the normal school the following shall

be the staff of the training college:-

(a.) Principal of the training college, who shall have general control of the training college and of the normal school attached thereto, and who shall, with the concurrence of the University college, act as Lecturer on Education at the University college. Salary, £700 per annum, rising to £750 per annum by annual increments of £25.

(b.) A Vice-Principal of the training college, who shall assist the Principal in the control and management of the training college and act as Lecturer in subjects of the approved curriculum for students. Salary, £550 per annum, rising to £625 per annum

by annual increments of £25.

(c.) One or more assistant lecturers as approved by the Minister. Salary, not exceeding in any case £430 per annum, rising to £475 per annum by annual increments of £15, together with a married allowance of £50.

(d.) Tutor and Librarian. Salary, £380 per annum.

(2.) The following shall be the staff of the normal school:—

(i.) Head teacher, who shall act as supervisor of students practising in his school and who shall, if required, act as Lecturer on Method or some other suitable subject or subjects of the curriculum of students. The head teacher shall receive a salary of £540 per annum, rising to £600 per annum by two annual increments of £25 and one of £10, together with a house allowance of £60 per annum.

(ii.) First assistant master, with a salary of Grade 4.

(iii.) Kindergarten mistress, with a salary of £340-£385. (iv.) One assistant, male or female, with a salary of Grade 3; two female assistants with salaries of Grade 2, with an additional £30 per annum; and two male assistants with salaries of Grade 2.

(v.) Such additional assistants at salaries of Grade 2 as are required to make up the total number of assistants to the number provided by the Regulations respecting Salaries of Teachers and Staffing of Public Schools, or to such greater number as the Minister may approve.

(vi.) Assistant in charge of Model I, with salary of £325-£370.

(vii.) Assistant mistress in charge of Model II, with salary of Grade 2, with an additional £30.

(viii.) In the secondary department, if the number of pupils in yearly average attendance is not more than thirty, an assistant with a salary of Grade 3; and if the number of pupils in yearly average attendance is more than thirty a male assistant teacher with a salary of Grade 4, and a female assistant teacher with a salary of Grade 2, with an additional £30.

(ix.) Assistant mistress in charge of Model III, with salary of Grade 2, with an additional £30.

(x.) Assistant mistress in charge of Model IV, with salary of Grade 2. Provided that where circumstances render it advisable the staffing and salaries for a normal school as prescribed in this clause may, with the approval of the Minister, be modified in such manner as he shall determine.

(3.) All the members of the staff of the normal school shall be deemed to be also members of the staff of the training college, and shall take such part in the tuition, training, and supervision of the students as the Principal may direct; in general, it shall be the duty, *inter alia*, of the staff of the training college as thus defined to conduct the various courses of the curriculum as defined in clause 22 hereof.

(4.) Every associated normal teacher shall, in addition to the salary and allowances otherwise receivable by him, receive by way of salary under these regulations such sum not exceeding £50 per annum as the Minister shall approve.

(5.) A married assistant on the staff of a normal school shall be entitled to additional salary of £50 per annum in the same manner as if he were an assistant in a public school other than a normal school.

(6.) (a). Any teacher, other than the head teacher, on the staff of a normal school shall receive by way of addition to the salary hereinbefore provided such grading addition as he would have been entitled to receive under the regulations relating to salaries of public-school teachers if he were a teacher on the staff of a public school other than a normal school: Provided that the kindergarten mistress shall be placed in Grading Group 5, and the assistant in charge of Model I in Grading Group 4.

(b.) Any teacher, other than the head teacher, on the staff of a normal school not entitled to an addition to his salary as provided in paragraph (a) of this subclause shall receive by way of addition to the salary otherwise payable under these regulations an amount not exceeding in any case £50 per annum, as may be approved by the Minister.

(7.) A teacher other than the head teacher on the staff of a normal

(7.) A teacher other than the head teacher on the staff of a normal school shall be entitled to the same annual increment as public-school teachers of the same grade. Those not receiving grade salaries will receive annual increments of £15.

(8.) The provisions of the regulations relating to public-school teachers respecting commencing salaries, salaries on transfer, leave of absence, and annual increments shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to teachers on the staffs of normal schools; and should any dispute or difficulty arise respecting the meaning or effect of the regulations as amended by this Order the question shall be submitted to the Minister, whose decision thereon shall be final.

(9.) The grades of salaries referred to in this clause are the grades of salaries prescribed for assistant teachers of public schools.

(10.) This clause shall be deemed to have been in operation as from the 1st day of April, 1924.

8. (1.) The following grants shall be paid to the Board:

(a.) For the incidental expenses of the normal schools, the same grants as are prescribed under the Act for public schools with the same average attendance.

(b.) For the incidental expenses of the training college, including a grant towards the library, such an allowance not exceeding £500 per annum as the Minister may approve, together with a grant not exceeding £100 per annum for clerical assistance in the training college.

(c.) Where expert assistance not provided by the regular staff of the training college is found to be required for instruction of students in manual work, elocution, singing, and other special subjects, such additional grants not exceeding £200 per annum as the Minister may approve.

as the Minister may approve.

(d.) For material approved by the Director as necessary for the instruction of the students in science and handwork, such annual grants as may be required.

(e.) For fittings and permanent apparatus for use in the instruction of students in science and handwork, such grants as the Minister may from time to time determine; provided that the purchase of such fittings and apparatus is first approved by the Director.

(2.) Every training college shall be open at all times to the visits of the Director or Assistant Director, or of any Inspector, or of any member of the Committee of Advice, or of any other person appointed by the Minister to visit such training college.

Entrance to Training Colleges and Allowances to Students.

9. In regard to admission to any training college, no distinction shall be made between applicants residing within the education district in which such training college is situated and applicants residing outside such district.

10. Students of Divisions A, B, and C, shall in the first instance be admitted to a course of training for a period of one year, but the Director may extend this period to two years in the case of those students of Divisions A and B who are recommended therefor by the Principal.

Studentships of Division A.

11. (1.) Except as hereinafter provided, to be admitted in Division A a student must satisfy all of the following conditions—namely, he must—(a.) Have within one year and six months immediately preceding—

(i.) Completed his course as a pupil-teacher or probationer in some education district in accordance with regulations and to the satisfaction of the Education Board of that district; or

(ii.) Completed to the satisfaction of the Director of Education a full-time two years' course as a student teacher in a technical school: or

a technical school; or
(iii.) Completed to the satisfaction of the Director of
Education a two years' course of training at a kindergarten
school under the control of a kindergarten association maintaining free kindergarten schools recognized by the Education
Department for purposes of subsidy.

Provided that, in cases approved by the Director, pupil-teachers or probationers who have completed not less than twelve months' service may be admitted as students of Division A if they have passed the examination for a Teachers' D Certificate or have secured a partial pass in the same examination, or have obtained some other educational qualification that in the opinion of the Director is equivalent thereto.

- (b.) If admitted as a pupil-teacher or probationer under the qualification (a) or (b) in clause 3 (1) of the regulations for pupil-teachers and probationers have passed in Group I of Class D, or have kept terms in two or more subjects at a college affiliated to the University of New Zealand; or, if admitted as a pupil-teacher or probationer under qualification (c) of the said regulations, have gained a pass in not less than three subjects in Groups I and II of the Class D Examination, including Drawing I and II, and one subject from Group III.
- (c.) Give satisfactory evidence of his suitability for the work of teaching (e.g., by a certificate to that effect signed by an Inspector of Schools).
- (d.) Give satisfactory evidence as to moral character, and produce a satisfactory certificate of health from a school medical officer or where this is impracticable, from a duly qualified medical practitioner approved by the Board.

(e.) Make a declaration of his intention to complete his course at the training college and thereafter to become a teacher in a registered school.

(f.) Enter into a bond as prescribed in clause 16 hereof.

(2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division A shall be at the rate of £85 a year for a male and £80 for a female student, together with the fees of the University college classes attended by the student, with the approval of the Principal.

(3.) In the case of a student who is obliged to live away from home or his usual place of residence in order to attend the training college there shall be paid to the Board controlling the college an allowance of £30 per annum, and the Board may, at its discretion, either—

£30 per annum, and the Board may, at its discretion, either—

(a.) Provide board and residence in a hostel under its control at a charge to the student of not more than £25 per annum in addition to the £30 boarding-allowance; or

(b.) Pay to the student the boarding-allowance of £30 per annum, provided that the place of board and residence is approved by the Board on the recommendation of the Principal.

(4.) In the case of a student who lives at home but is obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way in order to attend the training college there may be paid the actual cost of travelling (not exceeding £10 per annum).

Studentships of Division B.

12. (1.) To be admitted in Division B a student must satisfy all of the following conditions-namely, he must-

(a.) Be not less than seventeen years of age, and have obtained a higher leaving certificate, or a partial pass in accordance with regulations in the Class D Certificate Examination, or have obtained some other educational qualification that in the opinion

of the Director is equivalent thereto. conditions as to probation in teaching as the Principal of the training college, with the approval of the Committee of Advice, may require.

Satisfy conditions (d), (e), and (f) as for students in Division A. (2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division B shall be those set out in subclauses (2), (3), and (4) of clause 11 hereof for a student in Division A, except that the allowance provided in subclause (2) shall be £65 for a male and £60 for a female student.

Studentships of Division C.

13. (1.) To be admitted in Division C a student must satisfy all of

the following conditions—namely, he must—
(a.) Be a graduate of a recognized university, or have, as a matriculated student, satisfactorily completed a two-years course at a recognized agricultural college or at a school of home science recognized by the University of New Zealand, or have obtained some other educational qualification that in the opinion of the Director is equivalent thereto.

(b.) Give such evidence of teaching ability or promise as the Principal with the approval of the Committee of Advice may require.

(c.) Undertake to devote his whole attention to subjects of professional study and practice under the direction of the Principal.

(d.) Satisfy conditions (d), (e), and (f) as for a student of Division A.

(2.) The allowances payable to a student in Division C shall be at the same rate as for a student in Division A.

Short-period Studentships, Division D.

14. (1.) To be admitted in Division D a student must satisfy all of

the following conditions—namely, he must—

(a.) Have passed in Group I of the examinations for Class D, or have obtained some other educational qualification that in the opinion of the Director is equivalent thereto.

(b.) Have been, for such period as may be approved by the Director, regularly employed in teaching in a registered school or schools.

(c.) Be deemed, on the certificate of an Inspector of Schools, worthy of further training in professional work.

(d.) Satisfy conditions (d) and (e) as for a student of Division A.
(2.) The course for a student of Division D shall be for such period, being not less than three months or more than one year, as the Principal with the approval of the Committee of Advice shall determine, and shall be wholly professional or partly academic and partly professional, at the discretion of the Principal.

(3.) The allowances payable to a student of Division D shall be at the annual rate of the allowances payable to a student of Division B.

15. Notwithstanding anything in the above provisions the Principal may, on the recommendation of an Inspector of Schools, admit to the training college, for such period as the Director may approve, any teacher of a registered school for the purposes of observation of the methods of teaching. No allowances shall be payable in such cases.

General.

16. (i.) Every student of Division A, B, or C shall enter, by his parent or guardian, or by some other person approved by the Board and the Minister, into a bond with the Minister to return the amount paid in allowances and fees in case he shall fail to complete his course, or be dismissed on the grounds named in subclause (2) of clause 29 hereof, or fail to complete within the time required such term of service as a teacher as is prescribed in a public school, in a secondary or technical school, or in a free kindergarten school under a kindergarten association maintaining free kindergarten schools recognized by the Education Department for the purposes of subsidy, or in any school under the control of the Department, or in a University college in New Zealand. The bond shall be on the form supplied by the Department, and shall provide-

(a.) In the case of a male student, for a teaching service of not less than five years, to be completed immediately after the close of the training-college course; and

(b.) In the case of a female student, for a teaching service of not less than three years, to be completed immediately after the close of the training-college course:

Provided that the Director may in special circumstances approve of an extension of time within which the prescribed service shall be completed.

(2.) The term of service as a teacher required by this clause shall include service as a student assistant for the year immediately following the trainingcollege course in a public school to be selected by the Education Board of the district in which the student's home is situated or in some other school approved by the Director. This subclause shall apply only to students who, after one year's service as probationers or pupil-teachers, are admitted to a training college subsequent to the 31st December, 1926.

(3.) No allowances shall be paid to or for any student of Division A, B, or C until the said bond has been executed.

17. (1.) A studentship shall not be tenable with a Junior Scholarship of the University, or a Senior National Scholarship, or any other scholarship unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Director that the holding of such scholarship would not interfere with the student's training as a

(2.) None of the allowances named in clauses 11 to 14 hereof shall be payable in the case of any student for a greater period than two years; nor shall any allowance be payable to a student for any period during which he has been in receipt of salary or allowance as a teacher, pupil-

teacher, or probationer.

18. The allowances to any student shall not include University college fees in respect of any classes at which the student's attendances and progress have not been satisfactory, and, if such fees have been paid, the amount shall be deducted from any allowances due to him, or be otherwise recoverable from him by the Board.

19. In no case shall the number of students admitted in any year under Divisions B, C, and D conjointly be so great as thereby to make the total number of all students in attendance at the training college more than 250, or such larger number as the Minister may decide.

20. All allowances to students shall, subject to the restrictions named in these regulations, be paid monthly, save that the first payment of a student's allowance may be a quarterly payment.

Curriculum.

21. The curriculum of each training college shall provide for a twoyears course of training, and shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Education.

22. (1.) Every training college shall make provision for the follow-

(a.) Instruction in the principles and history of education (including elementary psychology) in school and personal hygiene (inclusive of ambulance work), and in methods of teaching.

(b.) Courses in elementary practical science as suited to the requirements of public schools, namely—

(i.) For men students an approved course of general experimental science, the material for which shall be drawn

largely from agricultural sources.

(ii.) For women students an approved course of general experimental science, the material for which shall be connected chiefly with matters relating to home and domestic affairs.

[It is to be understood that the main purpose of the courses named in paragraph (b), and to a material extent the purpose of the courses named in paragraphs (c) and (d), is to train the students in the methods of teaching the subjects named.]

(c.) Courses in-

(i.) Kindergarten work;

- (ii.) Elementary handwork, especially modelling in plasticine or clay, paper-work, and bricklaying;
- (iii.) Elementary woodwork;
- (iv.) Modelling in cardboard.

(d.) Courses in-

- (i.) Physical instruction (including swimming), which may be arranged with the Director of Physical Instruc-
- (ii.) Singing;
- (iii.) Drawing;
- (iv.) Needlework (for women).

(e.) Opportunities for observation of the child and of the methods of teaching and school-management.

(f.) Sufficient, regular, and co-ordinated practice in teaching.

(2.) The opportunities for observation of the child and of the methods of teaching referred to in paragraph (e) shall be provided at the normal school, or in any class or classes of a school or schools within convenient distance of the training college, if the teacher or teachers of such class or classes are approved for this purpose in terms of clause 4 hereof.

23. In the arrangement of the curriculum special regard shall be

23. In the arrangement of the curriculum special regard shall be paid to the opportunities of instruction presented by the lectures given at the University college, and, where possible, the general education of the student shall in the main be so continued; but no student shall be permitted to take University classes that are, in the judgment of the Principal, inconsistent with the requirements of his professional course, nor shall a student be permitted to take classes forming a recognized step towards a University degree unless his capacities and attainments are of a character to fit him therefor without detriment to the interests of his training as a teacher.

24. With the limitations and exceptions contained in clauses 23 and 25 hereof, no course of training for any student shall be deemed complete that does not include attendance at at least one course of lectures in a subject other than education at the University college, together with the following:—

(a.) The subjects named in paragraph (a) of clause 22 hereof.

(b.) A course of nature-study, and at least one other of the courses named in paragraph (b) of clause 22 hereof; such courses in elementary science occupying two hours a week, half of which must be devoted to individual practical work: Provided that any student who completes, to the satisfaction of the Principal, a course in science in a University college may be excused from all elementary science except nature-study.

(c.) At least two of the courses named in paragraph (c) of clause 22, the total time devoted to elementary science and handwork

together being not less than four hours a week.

(d.) All the courses named in paragraph (d) of the clause, two hours

a week being given to physical instruction.

- (e.) Observation of the child and of methods of teaching and practice in teaching as prescribed in paragraphs (e) and (f) of clause 22, the time devoted to observations and practice being, in general, not less than four hundred hours in the two years of the course. It is important that the observation should be such as to form a basis for the work in elementary psychology and the principles of education, and that the practice should be regular and co-ordinated
- 25. (1.) Students who are University graduates, or who have satisfactorily completed an approved course of not less than two years at an agricultural college or at a school of home science recognized by the University, or who have already satisfied the requirements of the examination for Class C, may be excused from attendance at University lectures; such students, together with those who have already passed in the subject for Class D or for Class C, may also be excused from needlework. Exemption from attendance at science may also be granted in the case of graduates who have taken a science subject in their degree course, and of students who have completed an approved course of two years at an agricultural college.

(2.) A student who is taking a science course at the University college may be exempted from attendance at a science class at the training

college during the year in which he is so attending.

(3.) Students having no ear for music may be excused from attendance at singing and musical theory if an approved equivalent therefor is taken as an extra subject or subjects, selected from amongst those named in paragraphs (b) and (c) of clause 22 hereof, and occupying not less than two hours a week throughout the period of training, the total requirement under these paragraphs being thus raised to six hours a week in all.

26. The observation of methods of teaching for which provision is made shall include particularly observation of the methods of teaching English, arithmetic, drawing, singing, nature-knowledge, geography, civics, as prescribed for public schools. It shall also include either (a) methods of teaching as specially adapted to the requirements of infant classes; or (b) the methods of teaching the following subjects in secondary classes—English, elementary mathematics, and the elementary stages of a foreign language; or (c) the methods adopted in

teaching two or more branches of elementary science and handwork as suited to the requirements of the higher primary classes. The practice in teaching shall correspond thereto.

Certificates.

27. At the close of their period of training, students duly admitted under these regulations as students of Division A, B, or C, who have satisfactorily completed the prescribed course of work during their attendance at the training college, and who are favourably reported upon in respect both of professional promise and of educational progress, may, on the recommendation of the Principal of the college and with the concurrence of the Director of Education, receive without further examination, in such subjects as are approved for this purpose by the Director, and subject to compliance with the necessary conditions of service, age, and health, as prescribed by the regulations for the time being in force for the Examination and Classification of Teachers, a trained teacher's certificate, which shall rank in respect of attainment with certificates of Class C or with certificates of Class D, as may in each case be determined.

General.

28. (1.) Subject to the general control and management of the Board, the Principal shall have full control of the staff of the normal school and training college and of the students; he shall also have power to arrange for the several courses of instruction in accordance with the requirements named above, to allot to himself and the other members of the staff such subjects of instruction as he may find convenient and the Committee of Advice may approve, to choose text-books, and to determine the course of study and training of each student.

(2.) A statement shall be furnished to the Professorial Board giving the names of all training-college students in attendance at the University college, and the classes approved by the Principal for each student, in order that the Professorial Board may be in a position to report to the

Principal on the progress made by the students.

29. (1.) Every student shall, when required by the Director, submit to re-examination by a School Medical Officer or other approved medical practitioner.

(2.) The Board may at any time, on receipt of a report from the Principal, dismiss a student, or direct him to cease attendance at the training college, on the ground of repeated neglect of duty or gross misbehaviour, and all allowances to such student shall thereupon cease.

(3.) A studentship may also be terminated at any time if it shall appear to the Board and the Minister that the holder does not possess sufficient aptitude for the teaching profession to warrant further expenditure in training, or is considered on the report of a School Medical Officer to be physically unfit to continue his course of training.

30. The Principal shall make an annual report to the Board of the work of the training college, and the Board shall forward that report, with such other report as it may desire to make, to the Minister of

Education before the 31st January in each year.
31. The Director of Education shall inspect each training college from time to time, and shall report annually to the Minister.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of January, 1925. Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

'N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act (herein referred to as "the Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations relating to public schools: salaries, grading, staffing, house allowances, &c., in

force at the date of the coming into operation of this Order, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set forth in Schedule A hereto; and further doth hereby amend the regulations in force regarding organizing teachers and model country schools as set out in Schedule B hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that, except where expressly stated to the contrary, this Order shall be deemed to have been in operation from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

SCHEDULE A.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS: SALARIES, GRADING, STAFFING, HOUSE ALLOWANCES, ETC.

1. For the purposes of these regulations—

A "mixed school" means a school to which all boys and girls of

school age are admitted:

A "separate boys' school "means a school to which there are admitted boys belonging to any of the standard classes, or to any of the standard classes above Standard 1 or above Standard 2, but no other pupils:

A "separate girls' school "means a school to which there are admitted girls belonging to any of the standard classes, or to any of the standard classes above Standard 1 or above Standard 2, but no

A "separate infants' school" means a school to which there are admitted all pupils belonging to classes not higher than Standard 1

or not higher than Standard 2: A "side school" is a school which is attached to another school and is distant more than a quarter of a mile, but not more than three miles, therefrom, and to which are admitted pupils up to a class not higher than Standard 4 or up to an age not higher than eleven years:

"main school" is a school to which a side school is so attached: One school is attached to another within the foregoing provisions

when they have the same head teacher:
A "part-time school" is one of a group of two or more schools taught by the same sole teacher, each school being situated at least three miles by the nearest practicable means of access from any other school of the same group, all the schools being open for not less

than twenty hours a week in the aggregate:
A "relieving teacher" means a teacher employed as locum tenens for a teacher granted leave of absence, or a teacher appointed under subsection (3) of section 72 of the Act pending the appointment of a permanent teacher, or a teacher re-employed while receiving a superannuation allowance, or a teacher from another country employed in New Zealand under the Exchange of Teachers Regulations:

The term "temporary teacher" means a teacher temporarily appointed under the provisions of subsection (1) of section 71 of the Act until a teacher who is the holder of a teacher's certificate or a license to teach can be obtained, or a teacher appointed

temporarily to any position on probation:

The term "relieving position" or the term "temporary position" means the position in which a relieving teacher or a temporary

teacher respectively is for the time being employed.

A "student-assistant" is a teacher who, after completing a course of one or two years at a training college, is attached to the staff of a public school for a period not in general exceeding one year.

2. If any dispute or difficulty arises respecting the meaning or effect of any clause of the regulations named in the preamble hereto, such dispute or difficulty shall be submitted to the Minister, whose decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

- 3. Where the salary or allowance attached to any position is altered by this Order the salary and allowances payable under these regulations from the date of such alteration shall be determined by the Director, provided that the total amount payable in salary and allowances to any teacher who occupies a permanent position shall not, so long as he remains in the same position, be less than the total amount received in salary and allowances immediately prior to such date. The Director shall also determine all questions which may arise regarding the assignment of positions of assistants on the staffs of schools under these regulations.
- 4. Position Salary.—(1.) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, the salaries payable to teachers holding permanent positions in public

schools shall be the salaries of the grades (as defined in Schedule IV hereunder) prescribed for those teachers in Schedules I, II, and III hereunder.

And so on, a subgrade of school and a female assistant of Grade 1 being added for each additional 40 in average attendance.

Notes.—(a.) Where on the coming into operation of this Order a position assigned to a male assistant teacher in this schedule is filled by a female or *vice versa*, the present holder shall continue in the position unless, on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector, the Board decides that a transfer to another position is necessary in the interests of the school.

(b.) A female assistant of the same grade may be substituted for a male and vice versa where, in the opinion of the Board and the Senior Inspector, such a substitution is necessary in the interests of the school, provided that the provisions of clauses 38, 39, and 40 of these regulations are complied with.

(c.) Where the grade of salary attached to any position of an assistant teacher in this Schedule is higher than the grade provided for such position in the regulations heretofore in force, such higher grade shall not operate till 1st February, 1925, unless the Director shall approve of an earlier date.

- (2.) The salaries of the infant mistresses in mixed schools of Grades VB, Vc, and VIA, of the second female assistants in mixed schools of Grade VII, of the assistant (if a woman) in the secondary department of a district high school of Grade A, and of the second assistant (if a woman) of Grades C and D shall be £30 per annum higher than the salaries prescribed in Schedule IV above.
- (3.) Similarly the salary of the infant mistress in schools of Grade IIIc shall be £25 higher than that prescribed above.
- (4.) The annual salary of a student assistant shall be £135 for a female, and £140 for a male teacher, but a student assistant will not be entitled to any other salary or allowance.
- 5. Grading Additions.—(1.) Every certificated teacher who is permanently employed in a public school of Grade 1 or a higher grade who is graded in accordance with the regulations for the time being in force for the grading of teachers, and whose position on the grading list is sufficiently high, shall be entitled to receive by way of addition to the salary payable to him under the provisions of clause 4 hereof an amount determined in accordance with Schedule V hereof.

(2.) Such addition to salary shall be payable from the 1st February in each year until 31st January next ensuing, in accordance with the grading numbers of the teachers on the grading list for the year; provided that if a teacher is first graded, or is regraded, from any date subsequent to the 1st February, the addition to salary, or amended addition to salary, shall be payable from such subsequent date.

6. Married Allowance.—A married assistant teacher shall receive by way of further addition to the salary provided by clauses 4 and 5 hereof the sum of £50 per annum, except where the husband or wife of such assistant is a head or sole teacher, in which case no such addition shall be made:

Provided that no married woman assistant shall be paid the additional salary herein provided unless payment is approved by the Minister on account of special circumstances.

For the purposes of this clause the expression "married assistant" includes an assistant who is a widow or widower having one or more children under the age of sixteen years.

7. House Allowances.—Head or sole teachers who are not provided with residences shall be paid house allowance as follows:—

Provided that, at the discretion of the Minister, the allowance shall be half the amount specified above in the case of any school where the teacher has the use of a movable room or rooms: Provided, further, that a married sole or head teacher who would, if an assistant, be entitled to married allowance under clause 6 hereof shall receive a house allowance of at least £50 per annum.

- 8. District High Schools.—(1.) The Headmaster of a district high school shall receive by way of further addition to the salary provided by clauses 4 and 5 hereof the sum shown in column (4) of Schedule III hereof.
- (2.) The salaries of the certificated assistant teachers in the secondary department of a district high school shall be the salaries of the grades (as defined by Schedule IV to clause 4) prescribed for the teachers in Schedule III.
- (3.) The salaries of the assistant teachers in the primary department of a district high school shall be the same as in a public school of the same grade as the primary department.
- 9. Remote Allowances.—(1.) Assistant teachers of schools of Grade III situated in districts distant from a centre of population or in districts where

living conditions are difficult may receive by way of additional salary such a sum not exceeding £30 per annum as the Director shall determine.

- (2.) A teacher in the Chatham Islands or other remote place, or in a district where living conditions are difficult, shall receive such special addition to the salary otherwise provided for his position as the Minister shall determine, provided that his salary so increased shall not be greater than the next higher grade.
- 10. Grade 0 Schools.—(1.) In the case of a school of Grade 0 the Board shall pay for or on account of the salary of the teacher the sum of £15 per annum for every pupil in average attendance:

Provided that in no case shall the salary exceed £160 per annum.

- (2.) Subject to the provisions of clause 16 hereof, the average attendance on which the amount payable for any quarter for or on account of the salary of the teacher of a school of Grade 0 shall be determined shall be the average attendance for the current quarter or the yearly average attendance for the year immediately preceding, whichever is the higher.
- 11. Part-time Schools.—The salary and house allowance of a teacher of a group of part-time schools shall be those for the grade of the group determined in accordance with clause 27 hereof:

Provided that if the teacher of a group of part-time schools is required by the Education Board to teach or travel on six days during the week and to teach for at least twenty-four hours in each week he shall receive the salary and house allowance for the grade or subgrade of school next higher than the grade in which that group of schools is placed.

- 12. Additional Assistants.—The salary of an assistant added to the staff of a school in accordance with the provisions of clause 29 hereof shall be that of Grade 1, provided that a higher grade of salary may be paid in special cases approved beforehand by the Senior Inspector when it is shown that such a higher salary is necessary to avoid a change of staff should the school rise in grade on the 1st February following.
- 13. Commencing Salaries.—Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding clause, every teacher who is permanently appointed to any position in a public school shall, on his appointment, receive the minimum salary of the grade attached to his position in accordance with clause 4 hereof, together with such additions to his salary (if any) as are otherwise provided by these regulations.
- 14. (1.) If a teacher is transferred from one permanent position which he has occupied for at least one year to another permanent position his commencing salary payable on transfer to his new position shall be determined in the manner following:—
 - (a.) If the amount of the final salary which he received in his former position is less than the minimum salary for his new position, he shall receive as his initial salary in his new position the amount of such minimum salary.
 - (b.) If the amount of the final salary which he received in his former position is greater than the maximum salary for his new position, he shall receive as his commencing salary in his new position the amount of such maximum salary.
 - (c.) In any other case he shall receive as his commencing salary in his new position the amount of the final salary which he received in his former position.
- (2.) The provisions of this clause may, with the approval of the Minister, but subject to such modifications as he shall determine, be extended to—
 - (a.) A teacher who resigns from a permanent position and is not appointed to another permanent position for a period not exceeding one year:
 - (b.) Λ teacher transferred from a temporary or relieving position to a permanent position:
 - (c.) A person who resigns from any position in the education service (as defined by the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Act, 1908) on appointment to a position in a public school.
 - (d.) Other similar cases.
- (3.) Salary for the purposes of this clause includes the total salary payable under these regulations, except married, house, and remote allowances, and adjustments may be made between salary and allowances so that the total payable shall be that prescribed.
- 15. Annual Increments.—Every teacher employed in a permanent position in a public school shall, until he receives the maximum of his grade of salary, receive on the 1st February (if employed on that date) in each year

the annual increment provided in clause 4 of these regulations, provided that his total salary (exclusive of remote, married, and house allowances and increases due to regrading or the issue of a certificate) has not been increased since the 1st day of August immediately preceding:

Provided that the first increment in a new position will be the amount necessary to increase the salary to the next higher salary for the position

or such higher amount as the Director shall approve:

Provided further that no increment shall be paid to an assistant of Grade 1 so as to make the position salary higher than £175 per annum in the case of a man, or £160 per annum in the case of a woman—(a) unless the Board is satisfied that the teacher has served in public schools for six years as an adult teacher, or for two years as a sole teacher, or for two years as an assistant in a school below Grade IV or in a school that is regarded as remote; or (b) unless the teacher is employed in a school below Grade IV or in a school that is regarded by the Board as remote.

16. Reduction in Grade of Salary.—(1.) If on the 1st February in any year any school is placed in Grade I or a higher grade, and that school is thereafter reduced in grade, any teacher who remains in the same position therein shall continue to receive the same salary and allowances as if no such reduction had taken place; but in any such case the Board shall take the first opportunity to transfer such teacher to another suitable position to which is attached an equal grade of salary:

Provided that if, after such reduction in grade appears to the Board to be imminent, the teacher has been offered and has declined to accept in a public school, secondary school, technical high school, or in any school under the control of the Department, any position to which he could transfer without loss in salary and allowances, then he shall continue to receive, until the school is actually reduced in grade, or for a period of three months after the date on which the offer was made, whichever is the longer, the same salary and allowances as if no reduction in the grade of his school had taken place; but thereafter, until new conditions arise, he shall receive as his salary and allowances the maximum salary and allowances prescribed for his position according to the grade to which the school has been reduced:

Provided further, that in no case shall any teacher be entitled to receive salary and allowances in excess of those payable for the reduced grade or subgrade of the school for a longer period than five years.

- (2.) The provisions of this clause shall, mutatis mutandis, apply to a teacher who holds a position the grade of salary attached to which is reduced through an amendment of the regulations or any other cause, provided that with the approval of the Minister the transfer of such teacher to another position may be postponed sine die.
- 17. In the case of a reduction in the staff of a school, such amount shall be paid to the Board in respect of the teachers whose services are dispensed with as will enable the Board to comply with the provisions of the Education Act; but in no circumstances shall payment be made to the Board on account of the salary of any teacher for a longer period than four months after the end of the quarter in which the school ceases to be entitled to the services of such teacher if such teacher had been permanently appointed, or for a longer period than two months in any other case.
- 18. If at any time between the annual grading of public schools on the 1st February in any year and the 1st February immediately following, the quarterly average attendance of a school falls below the minimum average attendance of the grade or subgrade in which the school is placed to such an extent as to satisfy the Board or the Minister that a reduction in the grade or subgrade of the school is imminent, and a position on the staff of such school thereafter becomes vacant, the grade of salary for such position as from the date of such vacancy shall be the grade of salary which would be attached to the position if the grade or subgrade of the school were determined on the reduced average attendance.
- 19. Holiday Pay.—The salary of a teacher shall be paid from the date he enters upon his duties until the date on which his duties cease, including payment for holidays during his period of engagement, and for the period necessarily occupied in transferring from one school to another: Provided that a teacher commencing duties during the first week in February in any year may be paid from the 1st February; and provided further that a teacher who has been employed throughout a school year commencing 1st February, and whose engagement terminates at the beginning of or during the long midsummer school vacation, shall be entitled to receive salary until the end of such vacation or until 31st January, whichever is the earlier.

20. Temporary Teachers.—(1.) Temporary teachers who are not holders of licenses to teach, and who are appointed in accordance with the proviso to subsection (1) of section 71 of the Education Act, 1914, shall be paid salaries according to the following scale:—

Provided that teachers recommended by the Senior Inspector on account of special qualifications or proficiency may be paid at such rate not exceeding the salary provided for a permanent teacher as the Director shall determine.

- (2.) Temporary teachers when first appointed shall be paid the minimum salary of the grade unless the Senior Inspector approves of a higher commencing salary.
- (3.) Temporary teachers shall also receive the same house allowances, married allowances, and remote allowances as are provided for certificated teachers for the same positions.

GRADING OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

21. Annual Grading.—Public schools and departments of district high schools shall be classified in the grades and subgrades specified in Schedules I, II, and III of clause 4 hereof. It shall be the duty of the Board on the 1st February in each year to determine, according to the yearly average attendance for the year ended 31st December immediately preceding, the grade and subgrade to which every school or department under the control of the Board belongs:

Provided that a school or department may be placed in a lower grade if the Board is satisfied that the increased average attendance qualifying the school for a higher grade is not likely to be permanent.

- 22. If at the beginning of any quarter it appears that a school in Grade 0 has an average attendance for the last preceding quarter of eleven or for two or three quarters immediately preceding of ten or nine (as the case may be), the school shall be placed in Grade I.
- 23. Until the first annual grading of a new school under clause 21 hereof the grade and subgrade of that school shall be determined in accordance with the average attendance as follows:—
 - (i.) For the period from the date of opening until the end of the quarter in which the school was opened, on the average attendance for such period;
 - (ii.) For the first quarter during the whole of which the school is open, on the average attendance for that quarter; and
 - (iii.) Thereafter on the mean of the quarterly average attendances for the several quarters until the 31st December next ensuing:

Provided that in any special case where the circumstances are exceptional a new school may, with the approval of the Minister previously obtained, be provisionally graded in a higher grade or subgrade than that in which it would be placed under the provisions of this clause, or on its first grading under the provisions of clause 21 hereof.

- 24. The grade or subgrade of a District High School shall be determined in accordance with the average attendance in the primary department.
- 25. If the average of the secondary department of a district high school for any quarter falls below 12 the Board shall draw the attention of the Minister to the fact so that the question of disestablishment may be considered
- 26. For the purpose of determining the grade of a school to which one or more side schools are attached, the main school and the side school or schools attached thereto shall be deemed to form one school.
- 27. In ascertaining the grade of a group of part-time schools the group of schools shall be treated as one school, and the average attendance shall be the combined average attendance of the group.

STAFFING OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

28. (1.) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, the number of teachers and offstudent assistants in any school other than a district high school, and in the primary department of a district high school, shall be the number shown in Schedules I and II of clause 4 hereof for the grade of school shown in column (2) of the schedules.

(2.) The number of teachers in the secondary department of a district high school shall be the number shown in Schedule III of clause 4 hereof

for the grade of school shown in column (2) of that schedule.

(3.) In separate boys' and girls' schools and in schools from which the pupils transfer to a junior high school when promoted from S4 or S5 the total number of assistants shall be the same as is prescribed in subclause (1) hereof for a mixed school of the same average attendance, but the numbers of male and female assistants of each grade may be modified in such manner as the Minister shall determine.

(4.) On the 1st February in each year the Board shall determine the number of teachers and of student assistants aforesaid in accordance with

the grade of school or department:

Provided that, until the Minister is satisfied that student assistants are available, one assistant of Grade 1 may be substituted for a student assistant in each school of Grade VA upwards, and a pupil teacher may be substituted for each of the other student assistants.

29. Increases and Decreases in Staffs.—If at the beginning of any quarter it is found that the attendance in any school or in the primary or secondary department of any district high school has increased so that the averages for two consecutive quarters are both greater than the maximum for the grade in which the school or department is placed by four in the case of schools below grade IV or D, and by ten in the case of other schools, the Board may, with the approval of the Senior Inspector, add an assistant to the staff of the school, provided that in any special case of increasing attendance not equitably provided for herein the Board may, with the approval of the Minister, increase the staff at an earlier date.

30. If at the beginning of any quarter it is found that the attendance in any school or department has decreased so that the averages for two consecutive quarters are both less by four in the case of a school of Grade IIIa or IIIB, or by seven in the case of any other school, than the minimum for the grade in which the school is placed, the staff shall be

reduced as the Senior Inspector shall direct:

Provided that the Board may reduce the staff of any school or department at any time as soon as it is satisfied that the average attendance has fallen below the minimum of the grade or subgrade of the school or department, as the case may be: Provided further that if at the end of the quarter first mentioned it is found that the average for the quarter is at least equal to the minimum of the grade in which the school or department is placed, the staff may be maintained till the end of the subsequent quarter, and so on from quarter to quarter till the 1st February next ensuing.

31. Nothing in the two preceding clauses shall be deemed to affect the salary of any member of the staff who shall not have been appointed

or removed thereunder.

32. As soon as under the provisions of the Act and of these regulations a reduction in the staff of a school is imminent it shall be the duty of the Board to give notice to every teacher whom it is necessary to discharge in order to carry out such reduction.

33. Main and Side Schools.—No main or side school, taken separately, shall have a smaller number on its staff than if it were a mixed school of the same average attendance; and the Board shall appoint such additional assistants of Grade I or student assistant (if any) as are necessary to conform to this requirement.

34. Modification of Staffs.—An assistant of Grade 1 may, with the approval of the Minister previously obtained, be substituted for two student

ssistants.

35. Subject to the approval of the Minister, an uncertificated teacher who has completed not less than one year's service as an adult teacher may be appointed as an assistant of Grade 1 to the staff of any school in lieu of a student assistant. Such an appointment shall not in general be for a term of more than one year.

36. If circumstances make it appear expedient that a modification of the staffing of a school or department otherwise provided by these regulations is reasonable or necessary, the Minister may authorize the Board to modify the staffing in such manner and for such period as he thinks fit. Any teacher appointed in accordance with such modification shall be paid such salary and allowance as the Minister may approve;

Provided that in no case shall the total salaries and allowances payable to the staff exceed by more than the amount of the salary of an assistant of Grade 1, the total of which would have been payable had the modification in staffing not been authorized.

37. Special Classes.—(1.) If a special class for children is established under section 56 of the Act in connection with any public school, an additional assistant of a grade not higher than Grade 2 may with the precedent approval of the Minister be appointed to the staff of such school.

(2.) If such a class or classes are established as a separate school the staff shall consist of such number and receive such salaries as the Minister shall

- 38. Male and Female Assistants.—Except in special cases approved by the Director, the number of male assistants in any mixed school shall not exceed the number of female assistants.
- 39. At least one of the first two assistants in any mixed school of Grade IV, V, VI, or VII must be a woman. At least two of the first four and three of the first six assistants in any mixed school of Grade VI or VII must be women.
- 40. (1.) The position of first female assistant in every mixed school of
- Grade IVA or a higher grade shall be that of infant mistress.

 (2.) For the purposes of this clause "infant mistress" means the assistant teacher on the staff who has charge, subject to the control of the headmaster, of the classes in the school not higher than Standard 1.

RELIEVING TEACHERS.

- 41. The Board may from time to time appoint suitable persons as relieving teachers; but, unless under exceptional circumstances and with the approval of the Senior Inspector, no assistant teacher holding a permanent appointment in any school may be appointed as a relieving assistant teacher in the same school.
- 42. Every teacher employed as a relieving teacher shall be classified by the Senior Inspector of Schools in one of the grades specified in clause 43 hereof, but such classification may be revised at any time by the Inspector or by the Director of Education.
- 43. (1.) The grades of relieving teachers and the salaries payable for those grades respectively shall be as follows:-

Provided that if the Senior Inspector is of opinion that the relieving teacher should not be paid a salary of Grade A such teacher shall be paid at such lower rate as he shall determine.

(2.) A relieving teacher who is classified in any grade in accordance with clause 42 hereof shall be paid the minimum of the grade of salary unless the Senior Inspector with the approval of the Director, shall approve

of a higher commencing salary within the grade.
44. A relieving teacher shall receive the annual increment specified in subclause (1) of clause 43 hereof in the manner, mutatis mutandis, prescribed

in clause 15 of these regulations:

Provided that such teacher shall not receive an annual increment unless his service in the year immediately preceding amounts in the aggregate to at least six months.

45. A relieving teacher shall not be paid house allowance, married allowance, or the addition to salary provided in clause 5 hereof.

46. The salary of a relieving teacher shall be payable for the period during which he is actually engaged in teaching together with the period reasonably necessary to travel from and to his usual place of residence; and the Board may also pay such teacher for any year ending 31st January for school holidays not exceeding one-fourth of the time of actual teaching during that year.

47. A relieving teacher who is obliged to live away from his usual place of residence in order to occupy a relieving position shall be paid actual and reasonable expenses of transit to and from the place in which he is so employed, and shall also, during the period of absence, be paid an allowance

at the rate of £40 per annum, and a relieving teacher who does not receive this allowance and requires to travel more than four miles daily to school shall be paid actual and reasonable travelling-expenses not exceeding £24 per annum. Where a relieving teacher has no fixed abode the Board shall determine the usual place of residence.

48. In general, no relieving teacher shall be appointed to any position unless his services in that position are likely to be required for a period of more than one week; and in no case, unless the circumstances are exceptional, hall a relieving teacher be appointed during the absence on leave of the eacher of a Grade 0 school.

REMOVAL EXPENSES OF TEACHERS.

- 49. In any case where, owing to a reduction in the grade of any school or to a reduction in the average attendance of any school, a teacher is transferred without increase of salary and allowances, or where a teacher is transferred under the provisions of section 9 of the Education Amendment Act, 1919, or through no fault of his own, there may be paid to any such teacher the reasonable expenses of his removal to another position.
- 50. Such expenses may include the actual cost of conveyance of the teacher and his family (if any), and also of his household furniture and effects, by the cheapest route, but the amount shall in all cases be subject to the approval of the Minister.
- 51. Before a teacher is transferred he shall, where practicable, obtain offers from at least two carriers and submit them to the Board, which shall authorize the acceptance of the more suitable.
 - 52. Vouchers must be produced for all sums paid in excess of 5s.
- 53. Cost of removal shall not be allowed on the effects such as the following:—

Plants in boxes or pots; wood and coal; horses, vehicles, harness, except when such are portion of equipment in connection with official work; live-stock and poultry; garden-seats, timber, or material connected with outside structures; aviaries and beehives; boats.

54. Clauses 14, 15, 20 (so far as it refers to assistant teachers and head teachers), 28 to 40 inclusive, and 41 to 54 inclusive, shall come into operation on the 1st February, 1925, and until that date the corresponding clauses of the regulations which these clauses replace shall operate.

SCHEDULE B.

ORGANIZING TEACHERS.

- 1. CLAUSES 11, 12, and 13 of the regulations relating to organizing teachers are hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—
- "11. The salary of an organizing teacher shall be £325 per annum, rising to £370 by annual increments of £15, together with the same additional salary according to grading (£10 to £60) as for a public-school teacher graded in Group 5, and a house allowance of £60 per annum.
- "12. The regulations regarding public-school teachers referring to leave of absence, commencing salaries, annual increments, and removal expenses shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to organizing teachers.

MODEL COUNTRY SCHOOLS.

2. The regulations relating to model country schools are hereby amended by (a) omitting from paragraph (ii) of clause 6 thereof the words "Grade 6," and substituting "Grade 3," and (b) omitting from paragraph (iii) of the same clause the words "Grade 4," and substituting "Grade 2."

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments of that Act, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations at present in force relating to pupilteachers and probationers, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

SCHEDULE.

EMPLOYMENT, EDUCATION, AND EXAMINATION OF PUPIL-TEACHERS AND PROBATIONERS.

1. (1.) As soon as practicable after the commencement of each year the Board shall proceed to make appointments of probationers and pupil-teachers in accordance with these regulations: Provided that all vacancies for pupil-teachers shall be filled before any probationers are appointed.

(2.) The most suitable candidates shall be selected irrespective of their

place of residence, and every candidate so selected shall be appointed as far

as possible to the school nearest his place of residence.

- (3.) Probationers and pupil-teachers may, at the Board's discretion, be transferred from one school to another within the district, and may, with the approval of the Director, be transferred from one education district
- 2. The number of probationers that may be appointed each year in any education district shall be such as is determined from time to time by the Minister. No probationer shall be appointed to a school below Grade II; not more than four probationers shall be appointed in any year to the same school; and, in general, not less than one-half of the probationers selected in any year shall be appointed to schools of Grades II, III, and IV.
- 3. (1.) All candidates for employment as pupil-teachers or probationers must have qualified-

(a.) By obtaining a higher leaving certificate; or

- (b.) By passing the Matriculation Examination of any British university, or by gaining a lower leaving certificate; or
- (c.) By obtaining a pass in Group I in the Teachers' Class D Certificate Examination; or
- (d.) By obtaining some other qualification that is in the opinion of the Director of Education equivalent to any of the above:

Provided that candidates possessing the lower qualifications hereto-fore prescribed may be appointed on or before the 1st July, 1925.

(2.) In selecting candidates for appointment as pupil-teachers or pro-bationers, other things being equal, preference shall be given to candidates

qualified under (a), (b), (c), and (d) as above, in the order named.

4. (1.) Each candidate for appointment as probationer or pupil-teacher shall forward to the Board with his application—(a) Satisfactory proof that he has reached the age of sixteen years; (b) a certificate from the head teacher of the school last attended, or from an Inspector of Schools, testifying to his moral character, good health, and general fitness for the position

of probationer or pupil-teacher.

(2.) No one shall be appointed as a probationer or pupil-teacher until he has been examined by a school medical officer and reported by him to be of sound health and good constitution, and free from all physical defects as are incompatible with efficiency in teaching: Provided that where this is impracticable an examination by a private medical practitioner may, with the approval of the Director, be accepted in lieu of an examination by a school medical officer

Provided further that a candidate may be accepted for appointment if the physical defect disclosed by the medical report is not of such a nature as in the opinion of the Minister should debar appointment.

5. (1.) Subject to any modification hereinafter made, the term of service of a probationer or pupil-teacher shall be one year: Provided that in the case of those appointed prior to 1st July, 1925, the term of service shall be two years.

(2.) For the purpose of this clause a year of service means a year beginning with the 1st February and ending with the 31st January following: Provided that the first year of service shall be reckoned as dating (a) in the case of a pupil-teacher appointed on or before the 1st July of any year, as from the 1st $\hat{\mathbf{F}}$ ebruary of that year; and (b) in the case of a pupil-teacher appointed after the 1st July in any year, as from the 1st February following. with the approval of the Director of Education, no appointment of a probationer shall be made after the 1st March in any year.

(3.) The term of service of a pupil-teacher, or of a probationer, may, with the approval of the Director, be extended for an additional year.

6. Probationers and pupil-teachers who have completed their term of service and have satisfied the conditions of entrance may be admitted to a training college in accordance with the regulations pertaining thereto:

Provided that in cases approved by the Director of Education pupilteachers and probationers who have completed not less than twelve months' service, may, on compliance with the other conditions of admission, be admitted to the training college as students of Division A if they have passed the examination for a teacher's D certificate or obtained a partial pass

7. (1.) The allowances payable to probationers and pupil-teachers shall be £80 per annum, with an addition of £5 per annum in the case of a male pupil-teacher or probationer.

(2.) Where a probationer or pupil-teacher is obliged to live away from home there shall be paid to him in addition to the amount above specified a

boarding-allowance of £30 per annum.

(3.) Where a probationer or pupil-teacher lives at home but is obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way to attend school there shall be paid to him an additional sum (not exceeding £10 per annum) sufficient to defray the actual cost of travelling.

8. Probationers and pupil-teachers' salaries and allowances shall be payable in monthly instalments as from the date of entry upon the duties

of their position.

9. (1.) The headmaster shall report to the Board at the end of each quarter (or oftener if occasion requires) on the conduct, diligence, and progress in the art of teaching and in studies of the probationer and pupilteachers employed in his school.

(2.) The Inspectors shall report twice a year on the probationers and

pupil-teachers attached to the schools which they visit.

- 10. (1.) The appointment of every probationer and pupil-teacher shall regarded as probationary. If a probationer or pupil-teacher does not be regarded as probationary. show reasonable promise of suitability for the teaching profession, or if he fails to obtain a satisfactory report as to his diligence and behaviour from the head teacher of the school in which he is employed, or fails to pass any examination prescribed, or otherwise on the unfavourable report of an Inspector, the Board may terminate his engagement on one month's notice. For gross negligence, incompetence, disobedience, or immoral conduct a probationer or pupil-teacher shall be liable to summary dismissal without claim on the Board.
- (2.) No probationer or pupil-teacher shall be at liberty to relinquish his engagement without giving to the Secretary of the Board at least one month's notice in writing of his intention to do so.

(3.) Pupil-teachers during their period of service or subsequently shall not be eligible for appointment as probationers, and vice versa, except with

the approval of the Minister.

- 11. (1.) The head teacher shall be responsible for the training in teaching and class management and for the direction of the studies of the probationers and pupil-teachers attached to his school. In every case the course of study shall be so directed, in continuation of previous studies, as to form as far as circumstances admit, a preparation for entrance to the training college on the completion of the probationer's or pupil-teacher's service. Among special subjects of instruction for which provision is to be made, physical instruction, school method, vocal music, nature-study, drawing, needlework or other branch of handwork shall be included.
- (2.) All probationers and pupil-teachers must attend approved special classes in drawing, singing, science, and physical instruction or other classes as required by the Board:

Provided that, where a pupil-teacher or a probationer cannot attend such classes, the head teacher and his staff shall, as far as practicable, provide the

(3.) As part of the training given the head teacher shall make provision for frequent observation by the probationers and pupil-teachers of lessons given by the certificated teachers on the school staff, and for lessons to be given by the probationers and pupil-teachers in his own presence or in that of an approved assistant.

12. (1.) Probationers and pupil-teachers shall receive instruction in their subjects of study for not less than five hours a week on not less than four

days in the week before or after school hours.

(2.) Such instruction shall be given by the head teacher, provided that with the sanction of the Board previously obtained this instruction may in part be delegated to other certificated members of the school staff; provided further, that the Board may reckon attendance with satisfactory progress at approved classes outside the school as part of the time prescribed for

(3.) A time-table showing the hours and subjects of instruction must be drawn up by the head teacher and submitted by him for approval of

the Inspector on his first visit in the year.

13. (1.) A probationer or pupil-teacher who has passed the Matriculation Examination, or in Group I of the Teachers' Class D Examination, will be required to present himself for the next Teachers' Class D Examination.

(2.) When a probationer or pupil-teacher has passed the examination for a teachers' D certificate the head teacher shall draw up a scheme of work with a view to the preparation of the probationer or pupil-teacher for higher examination, and shall draw up also a time-table showing the distribution of the work. The scheme of work and the time-table shall be submitted to the Inspector for his approval.

14. It shall be the duty of the head teachers to cause every probationer

and pupil-teacher attached in their schools-

- (1.) To keep in convenient form a journal or log-book in which the amount and character of each day's instruction and observation as distinct from teaching shall be briefly shown, and which at the end of each week shall be signed by the probationer or pupil-teacher and countersigned by the head teacher.
 (2.) To keep a record for each year of "special lessons" which he
- has taught under the immediate direction and supervision of the head teacher or of an approved assistant. This record shall be the property of the probationer or pupil-teacher, and shall show for each lesson-

(a.) The class to which the lesson was given:

(b.) The title and aim of the lesson:

(c.) The time occupied in teaching the lesson:

- (d.) The teacher's criticism of the notes of the lesson and of the probationer's or pupil-teacher's handling of it:
- (e.) The teacher's signature or initials at the end of the above entries:
- (f.) The date on which the lesson was taught and the record
- made.
 (3.) The number of "special lessons" taught during each year of service as above prescribed should be considerable (one at least should be given every fortnight); and during the course of preparation for these lessons the probationers or pupil-teachers should be made familiar with special portions of some modern work of recognized merit on school method bearing directly on the subjects treated.
- 15. (1.) No probationer shall have sole charge of any class, nor shall be engaged in teaching for more than four hours per day inclusive of any time given to correcting or marking registers. The remainder of the time during school hours shall be devoted to study, or to observation of teaching, or to attendance at classes approved by the Board, as the headmaster may direct.

(2.) No pupil-teacher shall be required permanently to teach or do school duty, other than occasional supervision of the playground, for more than four hours daily.

(3.) Probationers and pupil-teachers shall, as far as possible, be given a variety of experience by being from time to time attached to different classes.

17. When an Inspector makes a visit of inspection to a school he shall inquire into the character of the instruction given to the probationers and pupil-teachers there employed, and shall examine the time-table and the statement of progress, and, if he deem it necessary, report to the Board thereon; and he shall further report on the general work of each probationer and pupil-teacher on the staff of the school, and also on the "special lesson" which each probationer and pupil-teacher shall give which each probationer and pupil-teacher shall give in his presence.

18. Probationers and pupil-teachers shall be required to conform to the ordinary rules and by-laws of the Board in all matters not otherwise

provided for in these regulations.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Board of Trade Act, 1919, the Board of Trade Amendment Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said

powers enabling him in that behalf, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby revoke the said Board of Trade (Wool Industry) Regulations, 1921, and make the following regulations in lieu thereof, and doth further declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Carette. of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

These regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Wool Industry) Regulations, 1925.
 In these regulations "Minister" means the Minister of

Agriculture

3. The Minister may appoint a Committee, to be known as the New Zealand Wool Committee (hereinafter referred to as "the Wool Committee"), consisting of a Chairman (who shall be a producer), two representatives of wool-brokers, two representatives of wool-growers, and such other producers are because from time to the decide to hold office.

brokers, two representatives of wool-growers, and such other persons as he may from time to time decide, to hold office during his pleasure. At any meeting of such Committee three shall form a quorum.

4. The Wool Committee may from time to time determine the maximum aggregate quantities of wool that may be offered for sale by public auction in any period, and may with respect to any specified sale by public auction fix the maximum quantity of wool that may be offered.

5. (1.) It shall not be lawful for any person holding a license under the Auctioneers Act to offer wool for sale by public auction, except subject to the following conditions, viz.: That he shall have obtained a permit issued by the Wool Committee on behalf of the Board of Trade, and shall have deposited with the Wool Committee an undertaking (in Wool Committee on benar of the Board of Trade, and shall have deposited with the Wool Committee an undertaking (in such form and subject to such guarantee as the Wool Committee may require) that he will faithfully adhere to such directions as the Wool Committee may give in writing from time to time to the local Woolbrokers' Association of which he is a member as to the maximum quantity of wool that

may be offered at any specified auction sale.

(2.) Any auctioneer who sells wool without a permit, or who fails to adhere to the directions of the Wool Committee as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations and shall be liable accordingly.

8. In the event of more than one person being nominated the Returning Officer shall prepare and post to each elector at his address as appearing on the roll of electors a printed voting-paper in the Form No. (2) in the Schedule hereto.

9. (1.) No elector shall have more than one vote.

(2.) Where the elector is a firm or body corporate the vote may be exercised by any member of the firm or by any person appointed under the seal of the body corporate to exercise such vote.

(3.) No person who exercises a vote on behalf of any firm or body corporate shall be debarred from voting on his own behalf if he himself is qualified to vote as an elector.

The master, owner, or agents of any vessel, or vessels licensed as lighters shall, whilst such vessel or vessels are actually employed at lighterage within the Port of Waikokopu, pay the sum of 2s. 6d. per trip upon each and every trip to the said wharf as a berthage rate; provided that this charge shall be paid whether any such vessel as aforesaid shall lie alongside of the said wharf or outside another vessel berthed at the said wharf: Provided also that no fee shall be paid by any boat used merely as a tow-boat and carries no cargo while towing.

while towing. (d.) No berthage charge shall be payable for Sunday, unless goods or live stock are loaded or discharged, and the vessel leaves on that day.

(e.) The master of every vessel shall, on demand, produce the certificate of registry of such vessel to the Collector or other person appointed by the Department to collect this charge.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,175, as against 977 in November—an increase of 198. The deaths in December were 488, an increase of 18 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 251, females 237. Sixty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 13.93 per cent. of the whole number. Forty-five of these were under one year of age.
