N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section sixteen of the Finance Act, 1924, and section eighteen of the Forests Act, 1921–22, I, Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby set apart that portion of the Selwyn Settlement described in the Schedule hereto as a permanent State forest.

2. Not later than seven days after the service of such a notice on an owner of land all trapping shall cease, and thereafter for a period of three months from the date of service of the notice, the owner shall not, except with the written permission of the Board and subject to the conditions specified therein, trap rabbits or allow rabbits to be trapped on his

land.

3. Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten pounds (£10).

All such payment shall be made to the Superintendent of Mercantile Marine at Auckland, or such other person as the Minister may direct.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1924.

The total rainfall for November was above the average in the Auckland, Taranaki, Nelson, and Marlborough provinces, which was owing to two ex-tropical disturbances—one at the beginning of the month, and the other culminating about the 18th. These did not account for heavy rains in other parts of the Dominion, where records show that the aggregate fall was mostly below the average

Westerly disturbances passed on the 2nd, 16th, and 27th, but, except for the one about the 16th, they were only of moderate intensity.

Many parts of the country experienced warm and sunny conditions, and phenomenal growth occurred, except in some parts where rain was deficient.
