HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and section eight of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1923, and of every other power in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend and extend the terms and conditions set forth in the Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 20 of the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, authorizing the Taumarunui Borough Council to use water from the Wanganui River for the purpose of generating electricity, and to erect electric lines within the Borough of Taumarunui, the Manunui Town District, and portions of the Counties of Kaitieke and West Taupo (now Taumarunui), by adding to clause 15 of the said Order in Council the extended area of supply described in clause 1 of the Schedule hereto, by adding to clause 16 of the said Order in Council clause 2 of the Schedule hereto, and by adding to the said Order in Council clause 3 of the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. *Extended Area of Supply.*—The extended area of supply comprises portion of the Ohura County in part Block II, Piopotea West Survey District, Taranaki Land District; as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 60884, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon edged red.

2. *System of Supply.*—The transmission voltage shall be approximately 6,600 volts between phases along the route from the powerhouse at Piriaka to the No. 2 Substation in Taumarunui Extension No. 2, Taumarunui Borough, shown by means of a red line on plans marked P.W.D. 60986, deposited as aforesaid.

3. *Requirements of Ohura County Council.*—Notwithstanding anything herein or in the said Order in Council contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Ohura County, except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license, the said Order in Council, and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license, the said Order in Council, or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Ohura County Council.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 91 of the thirty-first day of the same month, the control of the foreshore as described in the First Schedule of the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council was granted to the Hutt County Council: And whereas it is desirable to amend the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General in Council of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Harbours Act, 1923, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the First Schedule of the hereinbefore-recited Order in Council of the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and doth prescribe the following Schedule in lieu thereof.

SCHEDULE.

THAT portion of the foreshore at Paraparaumu commencing at the northern boundary of Section 8, Block III, Kapiti Survey District, being a point approximately one half-mile north of the mouth of the Tikotu Creek, and extending south of the mouth of the Wharemouku Creek; and that portion of the foreshore at Paekakariki commencing at the mouth of the Wainui Creek and extending south to the northern boundary of Section 52, Block III, Paekakariki Survey District, being a point approximately one mile south of Beach Road, Paekakariki, as the same is shown in red on plan marked M.D. 5969, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

*Board of Trade Regulations.—Control of the Tailoring Trade: Sale of Garments made to Measure.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of February, 1925.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of the Board of Trade Act, 1919, and the Board of Trade Amendment Act, 1923, it is provided that the Governor-General, on the

recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, may make by regulations under those Acts (to be known as "Board of Trade Regulations") such provisions as he deems necessary in the public interest for the regulation and control of industries in any manner which is deemed necessary for the maintenance and prosperity of those industries and the economic welfare of New Zealand:

And whereas it is deemed necessary to make provision for the regulation and control of the sale of garments made to measure in the tailoring trade:

And whereas the making of the regulations hereinafter set forth has been approved and recommended by the Minister of Industries and Commerce in pursuance of the said Acts.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, and in pursuance of the authority conferred upon him by section twenty-six of the Board of Trade Act, 1919, and the Board of Trade Amendment Act, 1923, doth hereby on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce make the following Board of Trade Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Sale of Garments made to Measure) Regulations, 1925.

2. These regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1925.

3. Every person commits an offence who sells or agrees or offers to sell as hand-made or hand-tailored any garment that is not wholly made by hand and otherwise made in accordance with the requirements of these regulations respecting tailor-made garments.

4. Every person commits an offence who sells or agrees or offers to sell as tailor-made any garment that is not tailor-made.

5. A garment sold, offered for sale, or described as tailored, tailored to order, or tailored to measure, or in any other manner represented to have been tailor-made shall for the purposes of these regulations be deemed to have been sold, offered for sale, or described as tailor-made, as the case may be.

6. If any person sells, or agrees or offers to sell, or advertises for sale both tailor-made garments and other garments made to measure, he shall before selling or agreeing to sell any garment made to measure that is not tailor-made inform the purchaser that the garment is not tailor-made; and in any proceedings for a breach of this regulation it shall lie on the seller to prove that he so informed the purchaser.

7. For the purposes of these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a.) "Tailor-made" means made to measure by hand to the extent and in accordance with the conditions prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and so far as the work is performed by employees, carried out in accordance with the provisions of the current awards or industrial agreements relating to the employment of shop tailors and shop tailoresses in the locality. For the purposes of regulation 6 hereof the expression "tailor-made" shall be deemed to include "hand-made."

(b.) "Garment" means a man's or boy's coat, trousers, breeches, vest, or overcoat (other than an oilskin overcoat).

SCHEDULE.

THE minimum amount of work to be performed by hand in a tailor-made garment and the special conditions for the making thereof are as set out hereunder:—

COATS AND OVERCOATS.

- All canvases and lapels padded.

- All body seams in body-fitting coats.

- Sides, paddlers, and bottoms of linings felled.
- Buttonholes and buttons.
- All silk facings.

*Special Conditions.*

All coats made by a male coatmaker shall be pressed by him.

A coat made by a tailoress may be pressed by a tailor or presser.

VESTS.

*Minimum Handwork.*

- All pockets tacked.
- Edge stays fastened.
- Forepart linings felled.
- Neck felled.
- Buttonholes and buttons.
- Back straps tacked.
- Buckle sewn on.

*Special Condition.*

Vest shall be pressed off by a presser or tailor.

TROUSERS AND BREECHES.

*Minimum Handwork.*

- All pockets felled in and tacked.
- Pocket stays.
- Edge of button catch felled.
- Fly tacked.
- Seat-seam and leg-seam from crutch to knee.
- Band-lining and crutch-lining.
- Bottoms, buttons and buttonholes.

*Special Condition.*

Trousers and breeches shall be shrunk and pressed off by a presser or tailor.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 1, of the seventh day of January following, the Kauri Timber Company (Limited), of Auckland, was licensed to use and occupy parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Te Kopuru, in Kaipara Harbour, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2038, 2179, and 2420 respectively, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect thereon wharves, as shown on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for a term of five years, computed from the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen:

And whereas the Kauri Timber Company, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, made application for a fresh license and the same was granted for a term of five years:

And whereas the said license was, with the consent of the Minister of Marine, transferred to the Parenga Kauri Oils Company (Limited), who, with its successors and assigns, is hereinafter called "the company":

And whereas the company has made application for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of five years, computed from the expiry of the term of the above-mentioned license, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed, and to prescribe the dues and rates to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharves:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which are particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the aforesaid wharves in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken for the use of the said wharves, or any of them.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—
  - (a.) "Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;
  - (b.) "Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides;
  - (c.) "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore occupied by the said wharves, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2038, 2179, and 2420.
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £6 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April in each year, the proportionate part of such annual rental in respect of the period from the 21st day of December, 1924, until the 31st day of March following, to be paid on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said

B

wharves, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharves without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharves in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the company's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. The company shall clear all trucks and trollies off the tramways on the wharves at the close of each day's work.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharves and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharves, requiring the company, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the company shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, at any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

10. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharves shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for five years from the 21st day of December, 1924, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

13. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharves, or any of them, may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the company's part.

14. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

15. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the company shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharves entirely from the sites and restore the sites to their original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the company fails to do so, the Minister may cause the said wharves to be removed and the sites so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the company.
