Districts constituted under the Marriage Act, 1908.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Tirau, Taupo, and Rotorua Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

PUTARURU DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Waikato River opposite the mouth of the Pokaiwhenua Stream, thence by a right line to and up the middle of the Pokaiwhenua Stream to its intersection with the northern boundary of Section 8, Selwyn Settlement, Block V, Patetere North Survey District; thence easterly and north-easterly along the northern and north-western boundaries of Sections 8, 7, 3, and 1, Selwyn Settlement, to the road forming the northern boundary of the said Section 1, Selwyn Settlement; across that road, and easterly along the northern side thereof to its junction with the Oraka Stream; thence south-easterly generally up the middle of the said Oraka Stream to the Auckland-Rotorua Railway; thence easterly generally along that railway to its intersection of a line running from Puwhenua Trig. Station to Uraura Trig. Station; thence south-westerly along that line and its production to the Lichfield-Atiamuri Road; thence by that road to the middle of the Waikato River; thence down the Waikato River to the mouth of the Pokaiwhenua Stream, the point of commencement.

TIRAU DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west by the north-western boundary-lines of Waipa and Mangawhara Blocks from the Waikato River to the Mangawhara Stream; thence by the Mangawhara and Mangawhero Rivers to the Waihou River; thence by the Waihou River to the Wairere Stream; thence by that stream to its source, and a right line thence running due east to the Tauranga confiscation-line; thence towards the east generally by the Tauranga confiscation-line to Puwhenua

Trig. Station; thence south-westerly along a right line running between Puwhenua Trig. and Uraura Trig. Station to the Auckland-Rotorua Railway; thence in a generally westerly direction along the northern boundary of the Putaruru Marriage District hereinbefore described to the Waikato River; thence down the middle of the Waikato River to a point in line with the north-western boundary of the Waipa Block; thence by a right line to that boundary, the point of commencement.

ROTORUA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line running due east from the summit of the Otane-Wainuku Trig. Station to the western boundary of the Matata Parish; thence southerly, north-easterly, and south-easterly along the western and southern boundaries of the Matata Parish, and southern boundary of the Rangitaiki Parish to the middle of the Whakatane River; thence up the Whakatane River to a point in line with the production of a line running from Paeroa Trig. Station through Tuwhirau Trig. Station to the Whakatane River; by that line to Paeroa Trig. Station aforesaid; thence by a right line to Uraura Trig. Station; thence by the eastern boundaries of the Putaruru and Tirau Marriage Districts (hereinbefore described) to a point due west of Otane-Wainuku Trig. Station; thence by a right line to Otane-Wainuku Trig. Station, the point of commencement.

TAUPO DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west by a right line running from the mouth of the Waihora Stream at Lake Taupo in the direction of Uraura Trig. Station, by that line to its intersection with the Waikato River; thence on the north-west and north generally by the Tirau and Rotorua Registration Districts (hereinbefore described) to the middle of the Whakatane River; thence by the middle of that river to its confluence with the Ruatahuna Stream; thence by that stream to its source; thence by a right line to the source of the Huiarua Stream; thence by the said Huiarua Stream to Lake Waikaremoana; thence by that lake to Block XXV, Waiiau Survey District; thence by Blocks XXV and V, Waiiau Survey District, and Block VIII, Mangahopai Survey District, to the Waiiau River; thence by that river to the Mangahopai Stream; thence by that stream, Te Putere B Block, and Rotokarangu Block to the Te Hoc River; thence by that river to the 39th parallel of south latitude; thence towards the south by the said 39th parallel to the Taharua River; thence towards the south-

west by the said Taharua River to its source; thence by a right line to the Hinemaia Stream at the northernmost corner of the Pahikohuru Block; thence by the said Hinemaia Stream to Lake Taupo; and thence by a right line across Lake Taupo to the mouth of the Waihora Stream, the place of commencement.

* And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

Districts constituted under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1924.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor-General by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1924, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Tirau, Taupo, and Rotorua Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into four registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Putaruru, Tirau, Rotorua, and Taupo Districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be continuous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

Constituting the Golden Bay Electric-power District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, that any area or areas of land may be constituted an electric-power district under the said Act, and in the manner therein provided:

And whereas a petition praying that the area described in the First Schedule hereto may be constituted an electric-power district under the said Act was presented to the Governor-General on the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five:

And whereas such petition was publicly notified in the *Golden Bay Times* dated the sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, being a newspaper circulating in the proposed electric-power district:

And whereas, after due inquiry, the Governor-General is of opinion that the petition should be granted subject to the proposed boundaries of the district being altered as hereinafter appears:

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, do hereby alter the proposed boundaries and proclaim the district with the altered boundaries as described in the Second Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district; and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "Golden Bay Electric-power District."

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land comprising the Takaka Town District and part of the County of Takaka in part Block III, Tōtaranui Survey District, Blocks III, VI, VII, X, and part Blocks II, IV, V, IX, and XI, Waitapu Survey District, and part Blocks VI and VII, Takaka Survey District.

Commencing at the northern corner of Section 17 of Block III, Tōtaranui Survey District, thence southerly along the eastern boundary of said Section 17; thence westerly along the southern boundary of said Section 17, Sections 18, 10, 4, and 5 of Block III, Tōtaranui Survey District, Sections 3, 19, 20, and 10 of Block VII, Waitapu Survey District, and Section 18 of Block XI, Waitapu Survey District; thence northerly along the western boundary of Sections 18 and 12, Block XI, Waitapu Survey District; thence westerly along the southern boundary of Section 17, Block XI, Waitapu Survey District, Sections 11, 10, 9, 8, part 1 of 1 of Block IV, Waitapu Survey District, Sections 11, 18, 17, 16, 15, 19, 6 of Block III, Waitapu Survey District, Sections 102, 35, 108, part 35, part 3, part 4, Block VII, Waitapu Survey District; thence northerly by the western boundary of Section 4 of Block VII, Waitapu Survey District, Sections 2, 120, part of 1 of Block VII, Takaka Survey District, and Sections 2, 5, 10, 9, and 3 of Block VI, Takaka Survey District; thence easterly along the northern boundary of said Section 3 of Block VI, Takaka Survey District, Sections 88, 21, 9, part 147, 149, part 2 of 165, part 1 of 165, 141 of Block II, Waitapu Survey District, Sections 142, 94, 93, 10, 13, 38, part 39, 215, 214 of Block IX, Waitapu Survey District, part 45, Sections 46, 47, and 48, 50, and 51 of Block V, Waitapu Survey District; thence in a southerly direction along the coast-line to the commencing-point.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Nelson Land District, being the Takaka Town District and part of the County of Takaka, and bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea-coast in line with the northern boundary of Section 17, Block III, Tōtaranui Survey District; thence to and along that boundary to the north-eastern corner of the said section; thence southerly generally along the eastern boundaries of Sections 17, 18, 10; 4, and 5, and the south-western boundary of the said Section 5, Block III, Tōtaranui Survey District, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the eastern boundaries generally of Sections 3, 19, 20, 10, and 18, Block XI, Waitapu Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the said Section 18; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of Sections 18 and 12 to the north-eastern corner of Section 17, Block XI aforesaid; thence along the eastern boundary of Section 17 aforesaid; the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 11, the south-eastern and southern boundaries of Sections 10, 9, and 8 to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the north-western and south-western boundaries of Section 2, the eastern and part of the southern boundaries of Section 17, the eastern and part of the southern boundary of Section 16, the eastern boundary of Section 15, the northern, eastern, and south-eastern boundary of Section 19, and the southern boundary of Section 6, Block III, Takaka Survey District, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the southern boundary of Section 102, the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of Section 108 and the southern boundary of Section 35 to and across the Takaka River; thence southerly along the western side of the Takaka River; thence up that river to the south-eastern corner of Section 4, Block VII, Takaka Survey District; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of Sections 4, 2, 120, and 1, Block VII aforesaid, to the stream forming the western boundary of the said Section 1; thence along that stream and along part of the southern boundary of Section 4, Block VI, Takaka Survey District, the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of Section 2, Block VI aforesaid, the southern boundaries of Sections part 1 and 5, the southern and western boundaries of Section 10, the southern boundary of Section 9, and the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of Section 3 to the Waingaro River; thence down the eastern side of the said Waingaro River to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 21, Block II, Takaka Survey District; thence along the western boundaries of Sections 21 and 9, Block II aforesaid, to Long Plain Road; thence north-easterly along that road to the north-eastern corner of part 1 of Section 143, Block II aforesaid; thence along the south-western and part of the north-western boundaries of Section 142; the south-western and western boundaries of Section 94, Block IX, Waitapu Survey District, to the Anatoki River; thence up that river to the south-western boundary of Section 93, Block IX aforesaid; thence along the south-western and northern boundaries of Section 93 aforesaid; thence along the north-western boundaries of Sections 10 and 13, the south-western boundaries of Sections 38 and 39, Block IX aforesaid, the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Section 215, the south-western and north-western boundaries of Section 214, Block IX aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along a right line, being the

production of the north-eastern boundary of Section 214 aforesaid, to a public road; thence north-easterly along that road, being the north-western boundary of Sections 45, 46, 47, 48, 50, and 51, Block V, Waitapu Survey District, to the sea-coast; thence easterly and northerly along the sea-coast to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 17, Block III, Totaranui Survey District, the place of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 62402, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District, and thereon coloured edged black.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,089, as against 1,079 in April—an increase of 10. The deaths in May were 445, a decrease of 6 as compared with the previous month. Customs Tariff.—Conditions entitling Goods to Entry under the British Preferential Tariff.

WITH reference to the notification published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on 19th February, 1925, with respect to the admission of goods to entry in New Zealand under the British Preferential Tariff, it is hereby notified for public information that it has been decided to further postpone until 1st January, 1926, the date upon which the amended conditions to be decided upon shall take effect.

Those interested will therefore understand that until 31st December, 1925, goods will, in New Zealand, be admitted to entry under the British Preferential Tariff under the conditions heretofore existing and set out in the Customs Regulations gazetted on 7th December, 1922.

Until 1st April, 1926, bar, bolt, rod, angle, tee, channel, girder, hoop, plate, or sheet iron or steel, and wire, and other goods, made wholly in Great Britain or other British possessions from any of the following kinds of iron or steel of foreign origin—viz., pigs, ingots, billets, and blooms—will be regarded as wholly manufactured in such British countries for the purposes of clause 5 (a) of the combined certificate of value and origin.

Until 1st April, 1926, paper made wholly in Great Britain or other British possessions from pulp of foreign origin will be regarded as wholly manufactured in such British countries for the purposes of clause 5 (a) of the combined certificate of value and origin.

This means (a) that paper made wholly in Great Britain or other British possessions from wood pulp of foreign origin, and (b) that bar, bolt, rod, angle, tee, channel, girder, hoop, plate, or sheet iron or steel, and wire, and other goods, made wholly in Great Britain or other British possessions from any of the following kinds of iron or steel of foreign origin—viz., pigs, ingots, billets, and blooms—will, if the other conditions

are complied with, be entitled until 31st March, 1926, to be entered for duty on importation into New Zealand under the British Preferential Tariff, irrespective of the percentage of the factory or works cost which is represented by expenditure in British material and/or labour.

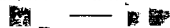
