Regulations under the Health Act, 1920, and the Social Hygiene Act, 1917, with respect to certain Venereal Diseases.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 6th day of July, 1925.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by notice under the Health Act, 1920, dated the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, certain venereal diseases—namely, gonorrhoea, syphilis, and soft chancre—were declared to be infectious diseases within the meaning of the said Act :

And whereas, by section one hundred [and thirty-two] of the said Act, the Governor-General is empowered to make regulations for the isolation, disinfection, and treatment of persons suffering from any infectious disease ; for the isolation or medical observation and surveillance of persons suspected to be suffering from any such disease ; and otherwise for the purpose of effecting the cure and preventing the spread of any such disease :

And whereas by the Social Hygiene Act, 1917, further power to make regulations with respect to venereal diseases is conferred on the Governor-General in Council :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him as aforesaid by the Health Act, 1920, and the Social Hygiene Act, 1917, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as the Social Hygiene Regulations, 1925, and shall come into force on the 9th day of July, 1925.
2. In these regulations—
“ Director-General ” means the Director-General of Health :
“ Venereal diseases ” means syphilis, gonorrhoea, and soft chancre.

VENEREAL DISEASES IN COMMUNICABLE FORM.

3. (1.) Every person suffering from syphilis shall be deemed to suffer from such disease in a communicable form unless the following conditions obtain, namely :—
 - (a.) That not less than two years have elapsed since the first appearance of the primary manifestations :
 - (b.) That the patient has undergone treatment for a period of not less than one year to the satisfaction of a registered medical practitioner :
 - (c.) That at least three months have elapsed since the completion of the last course of treatment, and there have been no further manifestations of syphilis since the completion of such course :
 - (d.) That (in cases where the patient has been treated with injections of salvarsan or of any substitute therefor) a sample of the patient's blood, taken at least forty-eight hours after any such injection, shall have given a negative Wassermann reaction when examined by a bacteriologist or other person approved for the purpose by the Director-General ; or, in the alternative (in cases where salvarsan or a substitute therefor has not been used as aforesaid), a negative Wassermann reaction has been given in at least two tests made at an interval of not less than one month.
- (2.) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause, a person shall be deemed to be free from syphilis in a communicable form, even though the Wassermann reaction may be positive, if not less than three years have elapsed since the first appearance of the primary manifestations, and the patient has received satisfactory treatment extending over a period of not less than two years.

4. (1.) Every person suffering from gonorrhœa shall be deemed to suffer from such disease in a communicable form unless the following conditions obtain, namely:—

- (a.) That the affected parts have been entirely free from inflammation for at least one month; and
 - (b.) That a bacteriologist or other person approved for the purpose by the Director-General has reported that a microscopical examination as hereinafter provided of the discharges from the sexual organs of the patient has failed to show the presence of Gram-negative diplococci resembling the gonococcus.
- (2.) Where the person suffering from gonorrhœa is a male, the discharges to be examined as hereinbefore provided shall include—
- (a.) Specimens from the secretion of the urethra, taken both before and after the administration of massage to the prostate gland;
 - (b.) A specimen from the urinary sediment obtained after the administration of massage to the prostate gland.
- (3.) Where the person suffering from gonorrhœa is a female, the discharges to be examined as aforesaid shall include—
- (a.) A specimen from the secretion of the urethra;
 - (b.) A specimen from the secretion of the cervical canal; and
 - (c.) A specimen from the secretion of the vulva.
- (4.) For the purposes of the microscopical examination to be made as aforesaid, at least two specimens of each of the classes of specimens referred to in subclauses (2) and (3) hereof shall be taken at an interval of not less than one week.
5. Every person suffering from soft chancre shall be deemed to suffer from such disease in a communicable form unless the lesions have completely healed.

NOTIFICATIONS IN CASES WHERE PATIENTS FAIL TO CONTINUE TO ATTEND FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT.

6. (1.) It shall be the duty of every medical practitioner or Medical Officer of any hospital who has been treating any person suffering from any venereal disease in a communicable form to send to the Director-General a notice in the form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto, if such person fails for more than two weeks after the date fixed in that behalf by the medical practitioner or Medical Officer to attend for treatment, unless, to the knowledge of such medical practitioner or Medical Officer, he has in the meantime placed himself under treatment by some other qualified person.

(2.) For every notice as aforesaid given by a medical practitioner (other than the Medical Officer of a hospital) there shall be paid out of moneys appropriated by Parliament and available for the purpose a fee of 3s. 6d.

(3.) Every notice given as aforesaid shall be marked "Confidential," and shall be forwarded to the Director-General in a sealed envelope marked "Confidential."

(4.) Every person who fails to comply with the requirements of this regulation commits an offence, and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of £10.

DIRECTOR-GENERAL MAY REQUIRE SUSPECTED PERSON TO FURNISH CERTIFICATE.

7. (1.) Whenever the Director-General has reason to believe that any person is suffering from any venereal disease in a communicable form (whether or not a notice in respect of such person has been given as provided by the last preceding clause) he may give to such person a notice in the form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto, requiring him, within a time specified in the notice, to submit himself for examination to some medical practitioner, and to forward to the Director-General a medical certificate as to the state of his health in relation to venereal disease.

(2.) A certificate for the purposes of the last preceding subclause may be obtained free of charge from the Medical Superintendent of any public hospital, or from the Medical Officer in charge of any venereal clinic established by any public hospital or by the Department of Health.

8. (1.) If a medical certificate, as required by the the last preceding clause, is not produced to the Director-General within the time limited by the notice, or if the certificate produced in any case does

not definitely disclose whether or not the person to whom it relates is suffering from any venereal disease in a communicable form, the Director-General may, by writing signed by him, authorize any two medical practitioners to examine such person and to report as to his state of health in relation to venereal disease, and shall give the person concerned notice in writing in the form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto requiring him to attend for examination at a time and place to be therein specified.

(2.) Where the person to be examined as aforesaid is a woman, at least one of the medical practitioners authorized to conduct the examination shall be a woman, unless such a medical practitioner is not available within twenty miles of the place where the examination is to be held.

(3.) Every person to whom a notice is given under this regulation and who fails to attend for examination as therein required, or who, having attended, refuses to submit to the required examination, commits an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable to a fine of £20.

DETENTION ORDER.

9. (1.) If any person required by a notice under these regulations to furnish to the Director-General a medical certificate as to the state of his health in relation to any venereal disease fails to furnish such certificate within the time limited by that notice, or if any such person is medically certified to be suffering from venereal disease in a communicable form, the Director-General may, if he thinks it necessary or expedient in the public interest so to do, authorize a Medical Officer of Health to make an order under section 84 of the Health Act, 1920, for the removal of such person to a hospital or other place where he may be effectively isolated.

(2.) The Medical Officer in charge of the hospital or place to which any such person has been removed as aforesaid may make such examination of, and apply such treatment to, such person as may in his opinion be necessary for the diagnosis and cure of venereal disease, and may for that purpose detain such person for a period not exceeding six weeks: Provided that the Director-General may from time to time, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer in charge of such hospital or other place, extend the said period for not more than six weeks at any one time, until he is satisfied that the person detained is no longer suffering from venereal disease in a communicable form.

(3.) Any person detained as herein provided may, subject to the provisions of this clause, make application in writing to a Stipendiary Magistrate usually exercising jurisdiction in the locality where he is detained to be examined by two medical practitioners, and thereupon such Magistrate shall make an order for his examination accordingly by two medical practitioners to be named in the order, who shall be directed to report to the Magistrate in writing as soon as conveniently may be, but not later in any case than seven days after the date of the order.

(4.) If it appears from the report that the medical practitioners are agreed that such person is free from venereal disease in a communicable form, but not otherwise, the Magistrate shall make an order for his release directed to the Superintendent or other officer in charge of the hospital or place where such person is detained, and he shall be released accordingly.

(5.) An application for examination as aforesaid shall not be received by a Magistrate within three calendar months from the receipt of a like application from the same person.

FREE TREATMENT IN EXCEPTIONAL CASES.

10. (1.) In any case where the Director-General is satisfied that treatment is not conveniently obtainable at a public hospital or public clinic, he may authorize any registered medical practitioner to administer free treatment, subject to the provisions of this clause, to any person suffering from any venereal disease.

(2.) In any such case the medical practitioner shall, before commencing a course of treatment, obtain from the patient a statement in writing that he is unable to pay for treatment, and the medical practitioner shall forthwith forward such statement to the Director-General, together with a statement signed by him to the effect that

he has made due inquiry and is satisfied that the case is one in which free treatment may properly be given.

(3.) If the Director-General is satisfied that the case is one meriting free treatment, he may authorize the payment to the medical practitioner, out of moneys appropriated by Parliament and available for the purpose, of the following fees :—

(a.) For each intravenous injection, a fee of 10s.

(b.) For each mercurial injection, a fee of 10s.

(c.) For each sample of blood transmitted for examination by an approved bacteriologist, a fee of 10s.

(4.) In any such case the Director-General may cause to be supplied to the medical practitioner, without charge, such drugs as may be required for the adequate treatment of the patient.

(5.) Every person who obtains free treatment under these regulations by reason of any false representation as to his inability to pay for treatment commits an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable to a fine of £10; and the cost of such treatment may be recovered at the suit of the Director-General as a debt to the Crown.

DUTIES OF MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS WITH RESPECT TO PATIENTS SUFFERING FROM VENEREAL DISEASE.

11. It shall be the duty of every medical practitioner who is consulted by any person suffering from any venereal disease, if such person is of the age of sixteen years or upwards, to give to such person a notice in the form No. 4 in the Schedule hereto. A sufficient supply of printed copies of such notice shall, on application to the Director-General, be supplied to medical practitioners without charge.

OFFENCES.

12. (1.) Every person shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations who, while suffering from any venereal disease in a communicable form, is engaged in any employment, or acts in any capacity, in or about any factory, shop, hotel, restaurant, house, or other place if by reason thereof any food intended for consumption by any other person is exposed to infection from venereal disease or is likely to be so infected.

(2.) Where an offence against these regulations is also an offence against any other regulations or against any Act, no person shall, in respect of the same offence, be convicted both under these regulations and under such other regulations or Act.

13. Every person who, while undergoing medical treatment for any venereal disease, fails to carry out faithfully the directions of the medical practitioner by whom he is being treated commits an offence against these regulations, and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of £10.

14. Every person who hinders, delays, or obstructs any officer in the performance of his duties under these regulations, and every person who by act or default contravenes any of the provisions of these regulations for which no other penalty is provided, shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of £10.

AVOIDANCE OF PUBLICITY.

15. (1.) Every person concerned in the administration of these regulations shall maintain and assist in maintaining secrecy with regard to all matters and things in relation thereto which come to his knowledge in respect of any person suffering or suspected to be suffering from venereal disease, and shall not communicate any such matter or thing to any person except in the performance of his duties under or arising out of these regulations, or out of any Act or regulations administered by the Minister of Health.

(2.) Every person who contravenes the provisions of this clause shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of £50.

16. (1.) All notices and other communications sent through the post for the purpose of these regulations shall, if relating to any person suffering or alleged to be suffering from any venereal disease, be conspicuously marked with the word "Confidential," and shall be securely enclosed in an envelope which shall also be marked on the outside with the word "Confidential."

(2.) The provisions of this clause shall relate to communications sent to or by the Director-General, and to or by any medical practitioner.

And whereas it is provided by section fifteen of the Wellington City Empowering and Amendment Act, 1924, that for the purposes of the said section three hundred and fifty-five the Upper Hutt Town District shall be deemed to be within five miles of the City of Wellington, and the provisions of that section shall, in relation to heavy-traffic by-laws and heavy-traffic licenses of the Wellington City Council, operate accordingly:

And whereas the Wellington City Council has made application for the issue of an Order in Council under the said section three hundred and fifty-five, and it is desirable to issue the said Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section three hundred and fifty-five of the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby direct that heavy-traffic licenses granted by the Wellington City Council under the Wellington City Heavy-traffic By-law, 1924, made pursuant to the provisions of paragraph nine of section three hundred and fifty-four of the said Act shall extend and be available within the district of every local authority any part of which is within five miles of any part of the boundary of the City of Wellington, and also within the Upper Hutt Town District.

License authorizing the Napier Borough Council to erect Electric Lines within the Borough of Napier.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council dated the fourth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, authorizing the Napier Borough Council to erect electric lines within the Borough of Napier, and doth—subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act and dated the ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of the same month, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (and

hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations") and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein—hereby authorize the Napier Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described; and the electric lines already erected within the said area of supply shall be deemed to be erected under this license, and the provisions hereof shall apply as fully and effectively as if this were the license originally issued.

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises the Borough of Napier as at present constituted.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (b) (1) and (e) of clause 2 of the regulations.

(a.) The generating voltage shall be 460/230 volts direct current and 3,300 volts between phases alternating current.

(b.) The primary distribution voltage shall be approximately 3,300 volts between phases. The secondary distribution voltage shall be approximately 460 volts between outer conductors and 230 volts between any outer conductor and the intermediate conductor for direct current and approximately 400 volts between phases and 230 volts between any phase and neutral for the alternating current.

3. CONDITIONS AS TO CHANGE-OVER.

The following provisions shall apply in respect to the allocation of the cost of adjusting, altering, or replacing installations consequent on the change over to the system of distribution as prescribed by paragraph (b) of clause 2 of these conditions.

Consumers' installations shall be classified as follows:—

(i.) Class A: Installations in which the wiring is found to be in accordance with the licensee's rules and regulations in force at the time the installation was made, and only require alterations necessitated by the change of system.

(ii.) Class B: Installations in which the wiring is found to be defective under the licensee's rules and regulations in force at the time the installation was made.

(iii.) Class C: Installations in which the wiring is worn out and under any conditions of supply would require to be rewired within a short period.

The cost consequent on the change-over shall be allocated between the licensee and the consumers in the following manner according to the class of the installation:—

(i.) Class A: The whole of the cost shall be paid by the licensee: Provided always that in the case of extensions and alterations which have not been authorized by the licensee the cost of alterations thereto shall be borne by the consumer.

(ii.) Class B: The cost of removing all defects shall be paid by the consumer, and the cost of alteration due to change in system shall be paid by the licensee.

(iii.) Class C: The whole cost shall be paid by the consumer.

In case of any dispute arising in respect of matters affected by this clause between the licensee and a consumer a Board of Appeal (whose decision shall be final) shall be set up to decide such dispute, which Board of Appeal shall consist of the following:—

(i.) One representative appointed by the licensee.

(ii.) One representative appointed by the consumer on whose premises the alterations are necessary.

(iii.) The Stipendiary Magistrate for the district, who shall be Chairman.

The licensee shall arrange for any legislation necessary for the validation of this clause.

4. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

6. LOCATION OF OVERHEAD LINES.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, one side of every road or street shall be left free by the licensee for telegraph-lines. Lines shall not be erected on both sides of a road or street unless the permission of the Minister of Telegraphs or the Post and Telegraph Department is first obtained in accordance with clause 5 of the regulations. Except at crossing-places, the minimum separation between a telephone-line and poles carrying high or extra-high tension circuits shall be equal to the height of the taller pole.

7. CONVERSION OF LINES FROM EARTH-WORKING TO METALLIC.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the licensee shall bear the cost of converting the Railways Department's lines which are now erected from earth-working to metallic if required by the Minister of Railways owing to electrical interference arising from the licensee's lines.

8. TELEGRAPH-LINES.

The licensee shall rectify to the satisfaction of the Minister of Railways or the Minister of Telegraphs any interference or disturbance caused by the erection or operation of the licensee's system that affects the satisfactory working of the telegraph-lines which are the property of the Railways Department or the Telegraph Department, and which were erected prior to the licensee's lines.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Ernest Wilford Gillett, of Cannibal Cove, Picton (who with his executors, administrators, and assigns is hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore at Cannibal Cove, Queen Charlotte Sound, as a site for a jetty, to be built in the position and in accordance with a plan marked M.D. 6038, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation; and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is desirable that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said jetty is to be erected, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6038 deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said jetty thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term—

"Foreshore" means such part of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore occupied by the said jetty, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6038.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, payable on the 1st day of April each year, the proportionate part of such rental in respect of the period from the date hereof until the 31st day of March following to be paid on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said jetty without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said jetty, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned jetty in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensee's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said jetty shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the jetty at the licensee's cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. 12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said jetty may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said jetty for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for

which the license is granted, the licensee shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said jetty entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of the revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensee fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said jetty to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

REGULATIONS.

1. EVERY Harbour Board shall supply and keep readily accessible on every wharf which is under its control and on or from which cargo is landed or shipped, a stretcher for use in case of accident in the hold or holds of any ship berthed thereat.

2. The stretcher shall be constructed to the specification of the St. John Ambulance Society, and provided with slings so as to enable it to be safely lifted from the ship's hold by the ship's or shore lifting-gear, and no injured person shall be lifted by any other means.

3. Any Harbour Board failing to comply with the requirements of these regulations shall be liable to a fine of twenty pounds.

Vesting Crown Land in the Whakatane County Council for Tree-planting Purposes.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section seventy of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1924, it is provided that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, vest the land described in the said section seventy (being the land described in the Schedule hereto) in the Corporation of the County of Whakatane for tree-planting purposes, subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed or embodied in such Order, and subject also to the payment by the Whakatane County Council of such price (if any) as the Governor-General may determine :

And whereas the Governor-General has determined that no price should be paid in respect of the said vesting :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said section seventy, doth hereby declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the land described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Corporation of the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the County of Whakatane for tree-planting purposes, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say :—

1. The Whakatane County Council shall, within six months of the date hereof, or within such extended period as the Commissioner of State Forests may decide, prepare a general forest working-plan of future operations to cover a period of not less than five years ; such working-plan shall fully specify the silvicultural operations proposed to be carried on during the currency of the plan and such other matters as the Director of Forestry thinks fit.

2. It shall not be lawful for the said Council to carry on such silvicultural operations unless and until such plan has been approved by the Commissioner of State Forests, and all such operations shall be carried on according to such plan as approved by the said Commissioner and under the supervision of the Director of Forestry.

3. Any officer of the State Forest Service shall have free access to the said land at all times for the purpose of inspecting planting or other forestal operations, or for the purpose of reporting on proposed forest activities.

4. The said Council shall, as soon as practicable after the date hereof, appoint some fit person to supervise and manage all tree-planting operations which may be undertaken by the said Council, and generally to advise the said Council on all matters pertaining to its forestry operations.

5. The said Council may dispose of, by private sale, tender, or auction, any timber, trees, tree-seeds, firewood, or other forest produce on or from the said land.

6. The payment of expenses of administration, management, and development of the said land for forestry and other purposes incidental thereto (including any expenses of supervision incurred to the State Forest Service) shall be a first charge on all moneys received therefrom, whether by way of rent, fees, proceeds of sales of forest produce, or from any other source whatsoever ; and no such moneys shall be spent

otherwise except with the approval of the Commissioner of State Forests.

7. In April of each year the said Council shall furnish to the Commissioner of State Forests a report for the year ending on the preceding thirty-first day of March, presenting in complete detail full particulars of the technical operations, and of the administration of the land hereby vested in the said Corporations and of the financial operations relating thereto, and shall at the same time submit a plan of operations and management for the ensuing year, which shall be effective on approval by the Commissioner of State Forests.
