HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Finance Act, 1921, and its amendments, it is provided that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act or in any rule of law, where a local authority or public body has been authorized before the passing of the said Act, or is thereafter authorized, to borrow money, whether pursuant to a poll of rate-payers or otherwise howsoever, whether the rate of interest or the term of years of the loan was or was not specified or determined, and such money or any part thereof has not been borrowed, the local authority may, with the precedent consent of the Minister of Finance, borrow such money, or such amount thereof as has not been borrowed, at such rate of interest, or for such term, as may be prescribed by the Governor-General by Order in Council :

And whereas the Featherston County Council has been authorized to borrow the sum of nine thousand pounds for the construction of a road and necessary bridges to give access to the Returned Soldiers at Taturumuri :

And whereas the Minister of Finance has given his precedent consent as required by the above-recited section eleven, and it is desired that the rate of interest at which the money may be borrowed be not exceeding six per centum per annum :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Vivian Hargreaves, Hartley Hargreaves, and Maxwell Hargreaves, of Batley, Kaipara (who with their executors, administrators, and assigns are hereinafter referred to as "the licensees"), have applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore in Mamerua Creek, Otamatea River, Kaipara Harbour, as a site for a jetty, to be built in the position and in accordance with plan marked M.D. 6044 (sheets 1 and 2), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is desirable that a license should be granted and issued to the licensees under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore on which the said jetty is to be erected, as shown on plan marked M.D. 6044 deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said structure thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions and terms—

"Foreshore" means such part of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore occupied by the said jetty as shown on the plan marked M.D. 6044 (sheet 1).

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £1, and thereafter an annual sum of 10s. in advance, payable on the 1st day of April each year, the first of such yearly payments to be paid on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said jetty without payment.

5. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said jetty, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned jetty in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the licensees' own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said jetty and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetty, requiring the licensees, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the licensees shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said jetty shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensees may be required to remove the jetty, at the licensees' cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said jetty may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the licensees' part.

13. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said jetty for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the licensees shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said jetty entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and if the licensees fail so to do, the Minister may cause the said jetty to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the licensee.

15. The erection of the said jetty shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensees of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

Coast-station and inland charges: 2s. 6d. per 100 words or fraction thereof.

The charge for the transmission of a Press radio-telegram to or from the mainland of New Zealand from or to Chatham Islands, Western Samoa, Rarotonga (Cook Islands), or Kawaii Island shall be as set out hereunder:—

Chatham Islands: 5s. per 100 words or fraction thereof.  
Western Samoa: 3d. per word, with a minimum charge of 5s. for each message.

Rarotonga (Cook Islands): 4½d. per word, with a minimum charge of 7s. 6d. for each message.

Kawaii Island: 5s. per hundred words or fraction thereof.

For Press radio-telegrams transmitted to a New Zealand coast station for places beyond the Dominion, the charge shall be the rates mentioned above for Press radio-telegrams, and in addition thereto, for the onward transmission, the charges published in the table of "Cable Press Rates" in the issue of the "New Zealand Post and Telegraph Guide," current at the date of making this Order in Council.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby vest the management of the said wharf in the Council, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. In these conditions the term—
  - "Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides :
  - "Low-water mark" means low-water mark at ordinary spring tides :
  - "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. All His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharf, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.

3. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

4. The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf and all erections on or in connection with the wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at the Council's own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

5. All dues and rates received on account of the said wharf by the Council shall be applied to keeping the said wharf and all erections on or in connection with such wharf in good order and repair.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and any buildings erected on the wharf or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon his leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good or repair the same, the Council shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharf any building or structure whatever except with the consent of the Minister.

8. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf and premises, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st day of March in every year, and shall send a copy of such account when balanced to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

9. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharf.

10. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or its amendments, or any regulation thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges hereby conferred shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 12th day of April, 1918, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

12. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

13. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused at the said wharf to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.

14. In case the Council shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty consecutive days,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

15. In the event of this Order in Council being revoked for any reason whatsoever, or upon the expiry of the period for which the license is granted, the Council shall, if required by the Minister so to do, remove the said wharf entirely from the site, and restore the site to its original condition within three months from the date of revocation or expiry, as the case may be; and, if the Council fails so to do, the Minister may cause the said wharf to be removed and the site so restored, and may recover the costs incurred by the said removal and restoration from the Council.

*Making Rule under the Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Act, 1908.*

WE, the undersigned Judges of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, of whom the Chief Justice is one, in pursuance and exercise of the powers for this purpose conferred upon us by the Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Act, 1908, do hereby revoke as from the 1st day of August, 1925, Rule 52 of the rules made under the said Act on the 15th day of December, 1910, and do hereby make the following rule in substitution therefor, to come into force on the 1st day of August, 1925:—

"52. All causes shall be tried as follows:—

- (a.) Where in a defended cause adultery is the ground or one of the grounds on which relief is sought the cause shall be tried before the Judge and a common jury of twelve.
- (b.) All other causes, whether defended or undefended, shall be tried before the Judge alone.
- (c.) Subject to the provisions of sections 24 and 38 of the Act, any cause may be ordered to be tried otherwise than is hereinbefore provided, and where in a cause in which an answer has been filed neither the respondent nor any co-respondent attends in person or by counsel at the trial the cause, in the discretion of the Judge, may be tried without a jury."

Now, therefore, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby appoint you, the said

Andrew Duncan Thomson

to be a Commission to inquire into and report as to the most suitable site, having regard to all circumstances, for the erection of a wharf in Tryphena Harbour, Great Barrier Island.

And you are hereby authorized to conduct any inquiries under these presents at such times and places as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place, as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath or otherwise such persons as you think capable of affording you information as to the matter aforesaid, and to call for and examine all such books, papers, plans, writings, documents, or records as you deem likely to afford you information on any such matter.

And, using all due diligence, you are required to report to me under your hand and seal not later than the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, your recommendation on the aforesaid matter.

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose, save to me in pursuance of these presents, or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report so made or to be made by you.

And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in force although the inquiry is not regularly continued from time to time or from place to place.

And, lastly, it is hereby further declared that these presents are issued under and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908.

*Additional Regulations under the Census and Statistics Act, 1910.*

CHARLES FERGUSSON, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, as amended by the Census and Statistics Act, 1915, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing additional matters in regard to which the Statistician shall collect statistics, the forms in which particulars shall be given, and the persons who shall supply such particulars; and do hereby order that these regulations shall come into force on the date of their publication in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. In addition to the matters specified in paragraphs (a) to (j) of section 21 of the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, the Statistician shall, subject to that section, collect statistics in regard to forestation operations in New Zealand.

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2. Any person engaged in, or proposing to engage in, or having been engaged in, forestation operations in New Zealand, whether on his own account with or without the intention of disposing of forest areas by sale or otherwise, or as agent for another person or other persons, shall at such time or times as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish to the Statistician the information specified in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions comprised in that form, and shall sign the form and transmit it by post or otherwise to the Statistician or to any person appointed by him.

3. A notice purporting to be signed by the Statistician or by any officer of the Public Service on his behalf shall be sufficient to require such person to supply the information aforesaid, and such notice shall be deemed to have been duly given if served on any person being an individual personally, or if left at any place of business of a partnership, firm, syndicate, or company or other corporation or organization with a person appearing to have the management of such place of business, or if sent by registered-post letter addressed to any individual or partnership, firm, syndicate, company, or other corporation or organization at his or its usual place of business or any of his or its usual places of business in New Zealand, or, in the case of a company or other corporation having a registered office or a notified office or place of business, at such office or place of business, and service as aforesaid upon any one member of a partnership, firm, or syndicate shall be deemed to be good service upon all the members thereof.

4. In these regulations, where not inconsistent with the context,—

“Person” includes any private individual, or any partnership, firm, syndicate, company, or other organization, or any manager, director, secretary, accountant, or any other officer thereof;

“Forest area” includes any legal or equitable right to any land which is or is intended to be the subject of forestation operations, or to any forest-produce as defined by the Forests Act, 1921-22, or to any legal or equitable interest in or benefit arising out of any such land or forest-produce, whether created by deed, bond, debenture, or other contract; and references to the sale of forest areas include any agreement or option for the sale or creation of any such legal or equitable right as aforesaid;

“Forestation operations” includes the raising of forest-trees, whether indigenous or exotic, from seed or by other means of propagation, the lifting and replanting or transplanting, the selling or otherwise disposing of such seedlings or trees, the preparation of land for the purpose of establishing nurseries or plantations of such trees, the planting, tending, or maintenance of such nurseries or plantations, the removal of trees or disposal of timber therefrom, and any other work or undertaking in connection with the growing or cultivation of forest-trees.

THE following copy of a Proclamation, declaring that the Maintenance Orders Act, 1923 (Union of South Africa), shall apply with respect to New Zealand, is published for general information.

## MAINTENANCE ORDERS ACT, 1923.—EXTENSION TO NEW ZEALAND.

WHEREAS by the Maintenance Orders Act, 1923, provision has been made to facilitate the enforcement in the Union of South Africa of maintenance orders made by Courts in any other part of His Majesty's dominions or in British protectorates or in British mandatory territories and *vice versa*;

And whereas by section one of the said Act it is provided that the said Act shall apply from a date to be specified by me in respect of—

- (a.) Any part of the United Kingdom;
- (b.) Any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom and the Union;
- (c.) Any territory under the protection of His Majesty;
- (d.) Any territory in respect of which a mandate is being exercised by the Government of any part of His Majesty's dominions;

whenever I have declared by Proclamation in the *Gazette* that in such part of the United Kingdom or in such part of His Majesty's dominions or in such territory (as the case may be) there is in force a law providing for the enforcement therein of maintenance orders made by Courts of the Union.

Now therefore, under and by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Act, I do hereby declare, proclaim, and make known that in New Zealand, a part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom and the Union, there is in force a law—to wit, the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1921, providing for the enforcement therein of maintenance orders made by Courts of the Union, and that the said Maintenance Orders Act, 1923, of the Union of South Africa shall apply in respect of New Zealand as from the date of publication hereof.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,056, as against 1,011 in June—an increase of 45. The deaths in July were 603, an increase of 62 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 314, females 289. Eighty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 13.6 per cent. of the whole number. Sixty-one of these were under one year of age.
