licenses for the installation and working of apparatus for wireless telegraphy on board any ship registered in New Zealand, and whether on the high seas or in New Zealand waters.

And whereas it is expedient to amend such regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act and by all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke regulations numbered respectively two, eleven, fourteen, and seventeen, in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Order in seventeen, in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Order in Council, and also Regulation eight made by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and published at page 203 in the New Zealand Gazette on the twenty-fifth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and doth declare that such revocation shall take effect on the date of publication of this Order in Council in the New Zealand Gazette, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations est forth in in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth declare that the regulations the regulations hereby made shall form part of and be read together with the regulations first herein mentioned, and shall come into force on and after the date of publication of this Order in Council in the New Zealand Gazette.

#### SCHEDULE.

2. The Minister of Telegraphs may, at the request of any person or company desirous of establishing, installing, working, and using on ships to which Regulation 2 of the Shipping and Seamen Act Wireless Regulations, 1925, applies, apparatus for wireless telegraphy, grant to such person or company (hereinafter called "the licensee") a license, in the form of the Schedule hereto, for the period, upon the terms, and subject to the conditions and restrictions hereinafter appearing.

8. (1.) The licensed apparatus shall not be used by the licensee, or by any other person either on behalf of or by permission of the licensee, for the transmission or receipt of messages except messages authorized by these regulations; and the licensee shall not, except as hereinafter provided, or with the consent in writing of the Minister of Telegraphs, send or receive messages from or at the licensed apparatus when in any harbour of the Dominion of New Zealand.

(2.) When the ship is in any harbour of the Dominion of New Zealand, but not berthed—i.e., out of touch with the land-line telegraph system—the licensed apparatus may be used for the purpose of communicating, on minimum power, with the nearest coast station, or may be used in circumstances in which communication with the nearest coast station is impracticable, and where the interests of navigation would be facilitated thereby, to establish communication with a more distant coast station, or, if necessary, with another ship station.

station.

(3.) In exceptional circumstances, such as the non-operation from any cause of the land-line telegraph system, when the ship is in any harbour of the Dominion of New Zealand and berthed therein, the licensed apparatus may be used to communicate with the nearest coast station on matters affecting the interests of navigation. When it is impracticable to communicate with the nearest coast station, communication may be established with a more distant coast station, or if necessary with another ship station.

station, or, if necessary, with another ship station.

(4.) Nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to forbid the transmission of any message authorized or required by the Shipping and Seamen Act Wireless Regulations, 1925.

- 11. The licensee shall observe the provisions of any regula-tions from time to time made under the provisions of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and its amendments, by the Governor-General in Council or by the Minister of Telegraphs in re-lation to the conduct of wireless-telegraph business, and the provisions of the Shipping and Seamen Act Wireless Regula-tions, 1925, so far as any of such regulations are applicable to the licensee.
- 14. The licensed apparatus shall not, without the consent of the Minister of Telegraphs, or except as may be required by competent authority under Regulation 9 of the Shipping and Seamen Act Wireless Regulations, 1925, be altered or modified in respect of any of the particulars referred to in the license issued in respect thereof, and such apparatus shall at all times be maintained in good working-order.
- 17. (a.) The licensed apparatus at ship-stations shall be worked only by a person or persons holding a certificate or certificates issued or recognized by the Minister of Telegraphs. Certificates shall be granted to persons of British nationality possessing the qualifications prescribed by Regulation 17a hereof, and shall be in such form and subject to such con-

ditions, directions, or rules as the Minister of Telegraphs shall from time to time prescribe.

(b.) Any such certificate may at any time be withdrawn at the discretion of the Minister of Telegraphs in case of misconduct, or breach, on the part of the holder, of the Radiotelegraph Convention, 1912, or of these regulations, or of any conditions, directions, or rules prescribed by the Minister of Telegraphs for the guidance of operators or for the working of such ship-stations, or of any conditions, directions, or rules subject to which the certificate was issued.

(c.) Any certificate so withdrawn as aforesaid shall be forth-with surrendered to the Minister.

(d.) Any person who without just cause fails to surrender any certificate so withdrawn as aforesaid after having been required in writing or otherwise by the Minister, or by any other person acting on his behalf, so to do shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.

(e) The Minister may by notice in the Greatte or other

(e.) The Minister may, by notice in the Gazette or otherwise, publicly notify the withdrawal of any certificate, and may give notice to any person or company or any official of the New Zealand Government or any other Government of

receiving apparatus and its accessories, and of the care and adjustment necessary to maintain the equipment in an efficient condition.

THE following lists contain the principal results of the examinations held in August for the purposes of teachers' certificates. In the preparation of the lists consideration has been given to candidates' successes at previous examinations held by the Department and at University examinations of which notice has been received.

The first list (I) contains the names of successful candidates for Classes B, C, and D. Teachers' certificates will be issued to such of these as have produced satisfactory evidence of age and good character, have passed the special medical examination required, and have fulfilled the necessary conditions as to length of service and efficiency in teaching.

The second list (II) gives the names of those who have passed in two or more subjects of Parts II and III of Class C, but have yet to complete the examination.

The third list (III) contains the names of those who have obtained "partial passes" in the Class D Examination, and the fourth list (IV) those who have gained passes or partial passes in one or more "groups" of Class D. Those in List IV who obtained a pass in Group I are indicated by an asterisk. In the fifth list (V) are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of "special mention."

The next examination will take place in August, 1926. Notice must be sent to the Director of Education so as to reach him not later than the 31st May, 1926. Candidates who have yet to complete the examination must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to receive any further information of the date at which the Wellington, 9th October, 1925.

## SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1925.

August proved a dull and wet month in most parts of the country, the East Coast districts especially having a total rainfall considerably in excess of the average. The Auckland and Taranaki Provinces in the North Island, and the country about Westport, Greymouth, and Foveaux Strait in the South, had a deficiency. Westland, owing to a prevalence of east

A storm of somewhat local character occurred in Canterbury on the 6th and 7th, with heavy rain, snow, and bleak weather. A cyclone passed in the North between the 12th and 15th, accounting for high east to south-east winds and some heavy downpours. Anticyclonic conditions followed, and the highest reading of the barometer, 30.675 inches, was registered at Wellington on the morning of the 17th.

An intense westerly disturbance passed in the South, with a barometer reading of 28.95 inches, at the Bluff, on the 23rd, and was preceded and followed by very unsettled weather. Snow, hail, and thunderstorms were reported at various times on high country of the South, and some sleet at lower levels.

The wet weather was a great hindrance to farming operations in Canterbury, and growth of grass was delayed by several frosts and dull weather in many other parts of the country.

The total births registered for the urban areas amounted to 1,054, as against 987 in August—an increase of 67. The deaths in September were 562, a decrease of 17 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 272, females 290. Seventy-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 12.81 per cent. of the whole number. Fifty-one of these were under one year of age.
