ERRATUM.—In the Proclamation dated 18th November, 1925, taking land for the purposes of a gravel-pit in Block IX, Lindhurst Survey District, Southland County, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 82, of the 26th November, 1925, page 3240, substitute the words “eleventh day of December” for the words “eleventh day of November” as the date from which the Proclamation shall take effect.

Altering Boundaries of Woodville and Pohangina Counties, and including Area in Woodville Riding, Woodville County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section fourteen of the Counties Act, 1920, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the Counties Act is in force :

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Woodville County Council on the seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five :

And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Pohangina County Council on the eighteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of the Woodville and Pohangina Counties in the manner described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto :

And whereas it is expedient to make such alterations in accordance with the said resolutions, and that the area to be added to the Woodville County should be included in the Woodville Riding of that county :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, General Sir Charles Fergusson, Baronet, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Pohangina County, shall be added to and form part of the Woodville County; that the boundaries of the Woodville and Pohangina Counties as so altered shall be those set forth under the respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto; that the area added as aforesaid to the Woodville County shall be included in the Woodville Riding of the said county; and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule hereto :

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA EXCLUDED FROM POHANGINA COUNTY AND INCLUDED IN WOODVILLE COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at Whariti Trig. Station at the north-eastern corner of Section 6 (scenic reserve), Block VII, Gorge Survey District; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 6, 2, and 5, Block VII aforesaid, along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 11 and 13, Block II, Gorge Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundaries of Sections 13, 12, 10, and 9 to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundaries generally of Sections 5, Block II, Gorge Survey District, and 3 and 5, Block IV, Gorge Survey District, to the north-eastern corner of Section 7, Block IV aforesaid; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundary of the said Section 7 to the south-western boundary of Section 5, Block II aforesaid; thence north-westerly generally along the south-western boundaries of Sections 5 and 4, Block II aforesaid, to the easternmost corner of Section 9, Block IV, Gorge Survey District; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of Section 9, Block IV aforesaid, to the south-western corner of the said Section 9; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of Section 9, Block IV aforesaid, and Section 3, Block II, to the road forming the north-eastern boundary of the said Section 3; thence to and along the middle of that road to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 2, Block II aforesaid; thence to and along that boundary to the north-western corner of the said section; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the said Section 2 to its north-eastern corner; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the said Section 2 to the north-western boundary of Section 6, Block II aforesaid; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of Section 6, Block II aforesaid, and Sections 4, 3, 1, and 6, Block VII aforesaid, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of that section to Whariti Trig. Station, the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

WOODVILLE COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station 85 in the Ruahine Range, and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of the forest reserves to the Oruakeretaki Stream; along the aforesaid stream to its intersection with the northern boundary of Section 50, Block I, Woodville Survey District; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Sections 50, 51, and 54, Block I aforesaid, to a public road; across that road, and along the northern boundary of Section 13 to its intersection with the Oruakeretaki Stream; thence along that stream to its confluence with the Manawatu River; thence southerly along the right bank of that river to its confluence with the Otopo Stream; thence easterly and southerly along the Otopo Stream to its intersection with a public road forming the south-eastern boundary of the Otawhao Block; along the western side of that road to and along the south-eastern boundary of the aforesaid block to the most northerly corner of Section 38, Block XIV, Tahoraite Survey District; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Sections 38, 39, and 40, Block XIV, Tahoraite Survey District, Section 1, Block XV, Tahoraite Survey District, to a public road forming the eastern boundary of the said Section 1; thence southerly along the western side of that road to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 9, Block XV, Tahoraite Survey District; across the road, and easterly along that boundary to the north-eastern corner of the aforesaid Section 9; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Sections 9 and 8, and along the eastern side of the rabbit-fence reserve to the Wellington Land District, and westerly along the northern boundary of that district to a point in the middle of the Manawatu River; thence westerly along the middle of that river to a point opposite the south-eastern corner of Section 2, Subdivision X, of the Manchester Block; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that subdivision to the north-western corner of Section 3, Block II, Gorge Survey District; thence to and along the middle of the road forming the north-eastern boundary of the said Section 3, to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 2, Block II aforesaid; thence to and along the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of that section, to its intersection with the western boundary of Section 6, Block II aforesaid; thence north-easterly along the western boundaries of Section 6, Block II aforesaid, Sections 4, 3, 1, and 6, Block VII, Gorge Survey District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence south-easterly along the northern boundary of that section to Whariti Trig. Station; and thence northerly along the summit of the Ruahine Range to Trig. Station 85, the point of commencement.

POHANGINA COUNTY.

All that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Oroua River in line with the south-western boundary of Section 2, Block XII, Oroua Survey District, to its intersection with the south-western boundary of Awarua 1A No. 3 South; thence on the north-east by that boundary to Te Hekenga Trig. Station, and the production thereof to the summit of the Ruahine Range; thence towards the east generally along the summit of the Ruahine Range to Trig. Station 85, and along the western boundary of the Woodville County hereinbefore described to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section 1, Block II, Gorge Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and along the southern and western boundaries of the said Section 1 and the south-western boundaries of Sections 27, 39, and 29, Block XIV, Sections 44, 43, 41, 40, 39, and 34, Block IX, and Sections 11 and 10, Block XII, Oroua Survey District, to and along the public road forming the south-western boundaries of Sections 10, 9, 1, and 2, Block XII, Oroua Survey District, to the middle of the Oroua River, the place of commencement.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

WOODVILLE RIDING.—WOODVILLE COUNTY.

MANGAWARA DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

Special Order in connection with the Subdividing of the Board's District.

THAT the Mangawara Drainage Board resolves by way of special order to subdivide its district into two subdivisions

as provided for in section 16 of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, and that the names of these shall be "Northern" and "Southern" Subdivision respectively, and that the Northern Subdivision shall comprise and contain all those lands within the Board's district to the north of a line as described hereunder, and that the Southern Subdivision shall comprise and contain all the residue, being all those lands within the Board's district to the south of such line, which line shall commence at the south-west corner of Section 181, Taupiri Parish, thence eastward in a straight line to a point on the eastern boundary of this section 4 chains north of the south-eastern corner of the same section; thence east by a line running to a point 1 chain north of an angle in the road forming the southern boundary of Lots 179 and 178, Taupiri Parish; thence generally east to a point on the road which runs northward through Lot 1, being a subdivision of Sections 181, 179, 178, 465, and others 4 chains from a road junction on the southern boundary of the Lot 1 (above); thence by a line bearing 61° from true north, a distance of 13 chains; thence by a line to a point 10 chains from the south-east corner of Lot 1 of Lots 181, 179, and others, as mentioned above; and thence generally east by a line to intersect the eastern boundary of Lot 6, being a subdivision of part Lot 465 and others, Taupiri Parish, to a point 60 chains from the "tram-line," and that the Southern Subdivision shall have two members, and the Northern Subdivision three members.

Special Order altering Boundaries of Ridings and adjusting Representation.

THAT in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 23, 59, and 60 of the Counties Act, 1920, and any amendment of the said Act, and of every other power in that behalf enabling, the Waimarino County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

1. Amending Regulations for the Carriage of Deck Cargo.

WHEREAS by Warrant dated the 26th day of April, 1911, and the 13th day of May, 1923, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 36, of the 4th day of May, 1911, and No. 42, of the 22nd day of May, 1913, respectively, regulations were made governing the issue of licenses for the carriage of cargo and live-stock on the decks of vessels:

And whereas it is desirable to make an additional regulation as hereinafter prescribed:

Now, therefore, I, George James Anderson, Minister of Marine, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section 223 of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, do hereby make the following additional regulation:—

"30 (b.) On scows the whole or part of whose deck cargo is petroleum, such petroleum may be stowed from rail to rail with a flat and even surface fore and aft and athwartship; and it shall be properly secured to the satisfaction of the Superintendent. Such lines as he may require for the protection of life shall be properly fitted and secured and planking placed to enable persons to pass to and fro over the petroleum."

Alterations to Scale of Charges in force upon the New Zealand Government Railways.

IN pursuance of all powers and authorities enabling me under the Government Railways Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, I, Francis Henry Dillon Bell, acting for the Minister of Railways, do hereby make the following alterations in the scale of charges in force on the New Zealand Government Railways open for traffic made on the 10th day of August, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* of 11th August, 1925:—

PART III.—GOODS.

By adding the word "bone-char" after the words "in each case for bones" in the first line of paragraph 3 of Regulation 11.

By adding to Regulation 11 the following:—

7. When reloading or adjusting the load *en route* is necessary 2s. 10d. per ton may be charged for such reloading or adjusting.

By adding the words "Paragraph 6 of" immediately before the word "Regulation" in the last line of paragraph 1 of Regulation 24.

SIR,—With reference to my predecessor's despatch, Dominions No. 483 of the 6th October, 1924, I have the honour to

transmit to Your Excellency, for the information of your Ministers, copies of a circular issued by the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament regarding nominations for the Nobel Peace Prize for 1926.

2. I should be glad if your Ministers would cause the conditions of the prize to be made known to those bodies and persons who are qualified to nominate candidates.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1926, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified : (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute ; (b) members of Parliament and members of Government of the different States, as well as members of the Interparliamentary Union ; (c) members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague ; (d) members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau ; (e) members and associates of the Institute of International Law ; (f) university professors of political science and of law, of history and of philosophy ; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, par. 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to par. 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, *qualified persons* are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Oslo.

IN exercise of the powers and authorities vested in it by the New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities, the Council of the New Zealand Institute of Surveyors hereby makes the following scale of charges, which shall come into force on the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

(g.) Where traverse is an offset, as in the case of rivers or of fenced boundaries, an additional charge of £3 per mile is to be made in (c), (d), and (e).

(h.) Equitable arrangements to be made for road or railway legalizing surveys.

(i.) "Forest" includes all vegetation over 10 ft. Any clearing of lines in surveys under (c), (d), and (e) to be charged at same rates as in (d) of Class 2.

(j.) The above rates apply only to lines cut and observed, but adopted work from prior surveys is to be charged at the rate of £3 per mile.

(k.) To the rates set out in (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) a further charge is to be made at the daily rate for any grading or prospecting.

(l.) In all rural blocks charge road rates for the portions of road fronting or intersecting the block.

4. TRAVELLING-EXPENSES.

For all surveys a charge for the time of travelling to and from work shall be made at the daily rate plus actual travelling-expenses.

5. DAILY RATE.

When employed in the field by daily rate the surveyor's fee is to be £4 4s. per day, inclusive of the time taken in going to and from work, but exclusive of cost of labour, travelling, and other necessary expenses; and the rate for office work shall be £3 3s.

6. ENGINEERING CHARGES.

(a.) These charges apply to all engineering work done by a surveyor.

On work not exceeding £300 in value, 7½ per cent., but not less than £10.

On work over £300 up to £600 in value, 7 per cent., but not less than £20.

On work over £600 up to £1,000 in value, 6 per cent., but not less than £40.

For work over £1,000, 5 per cent., but not less than £60.

(b.) 50 per cent. of the amount is payable on completion of the plans, specifications, and estimates, and the balance on the completion of the work.

(c.) 25 per cent. of the above engineering charges may be deducted when only plans, specifications, and estimates are supplied, and where no supervision is required.

7. GENERAL CONDITIONS.

(a.) All rates and charges in Classes 1, 2, 3, and 6 include costs of labour, also all field and office expenses, except pegs and plan-forms, which shall be charged at cost.

(b.) For the survey of country lands it shall be optional for the surveyor to undertake the work at either acreage, mileage, or by daily rate.

(c.) Equitable arrangements on the basis of these charges to be made in cases unprovided for, or which may not come strictly within the foregoing rates, or for which, through special circumstances, the scheduled charge is inapplicable.

(d.) The plan of a survey is included in the survey charge, but a duplicate plan, or a tracing of the plan, is to be charged extra.

(e.) Duty stamps are to be charged at value.

(f.) In large surveys the surveyor shall be entitled to progress-payments. In all cases fees are due and payable on completion of the plan.

(g.) Daily rates are only to be charged when acreage, mileage, or engineering rates are not applicable or commensurate.

(h.) Charges for Deeds Surveys shall be at the same rate as for Land Transfer Surveys.

(i.) Subdivisional schemes, plans on tracings for Minister's or local body's approval shall be charged at daily rates.
